Lieutenant Ralph K. Adkins, son of Mr. and Mrs. G. R. Adkins, was born in Cedar Hill, Texas, December 14, 1914. He was graduated from Peabody Demonstration School in 1929. He enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1942. While serving as bombadier instructor, he was killed in a Liberator crash at Tuscon, Arizona, January 24, 1944.

Lieutenant Anderson Austin, son of Dr. and Mrs. G. L. Austin, was born in Stevenson, Alabama, May 19, 1912. He was graduated from Peabody Demonstration School in 1930. Veteran of thirteen engagements in the Pacific theater and wearer of the Navy Cross, he was killed in a plane crash at Daytona Beach, Florida, where he was serving as flight instructor.

Captain Henry B. Cain, son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry B. Cain, was born in Nashville, Tennessee, May 31, 1908. He was graduated from Peabody Demonstration School in 1927. He enlisted in the United States Navy, and died in the service at Norfolk, Virginia, March 21, 1942.

Lieutenant Dan Cockrill, son of Mr. and Mrs. Goodloe Cockrill, was born in Nashville, Tennessee, March 27, 1914. He was graduated from Peabody Demonstration School in 1929, where he had been a member of the Volunteer Staff. As a reserve officer of the United States Navy, he was called to active duty in 1941. He died from wounds received in action with the enemy while serving on the U.S.S. Meredith, in October, 1942.

Staff Sergeant Jackson D. Hardeman, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Hardeman, was born in Nashville, Tennessee, November 16, 1918. He was graduated from Peabody Demonstration School in 1938. He joined the Armed Forces in 1942. Tail gunner of a B-17 Flying Fortress, he was killed in a bombing raid over Germany, February 10, 1944.

Conrad Haston Jamison Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Conrad Jamison, was born in High Point, North Carolina, July 10, 1922. He was graduated from Peabody Demonstration School in 1940. He entered the service of the Armed Forces in August, 1944, and was killed in action in Germany, February 25, 1945.

Ensign John T. Manchester, son of Dr. and Mrs. Paul T. Manchester, was born in Nashville, Tennessee, August 14, 1923. He was graduated from Peabody Demonstration School in 1940, where he had been a member of the <u>Volunteer</u> Staff. He volunteered for the Naval Air Corps; and while serving as pilot of a Navy Helldiver, in the Pacific theater, he was killed in action, November 12, 1944.
