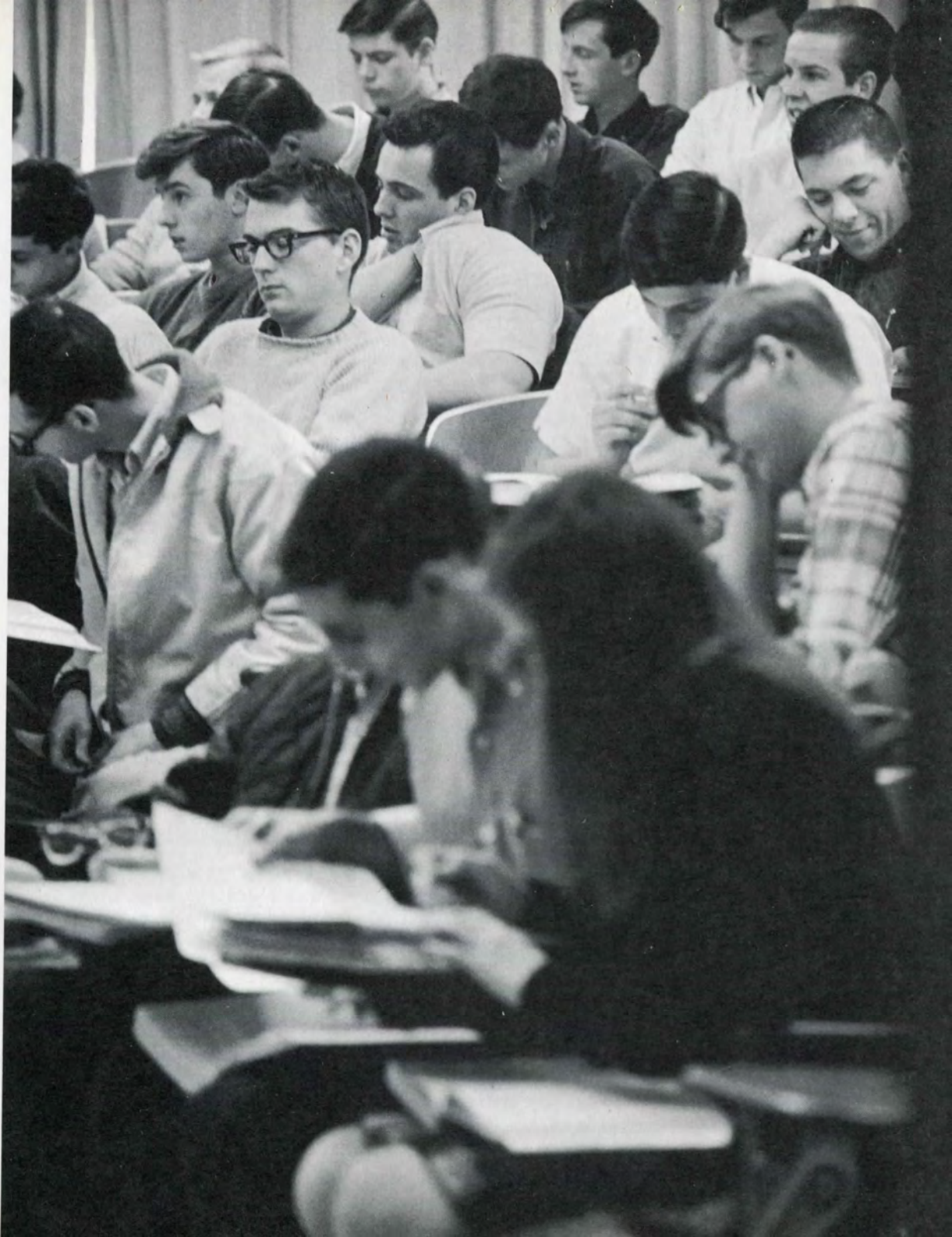

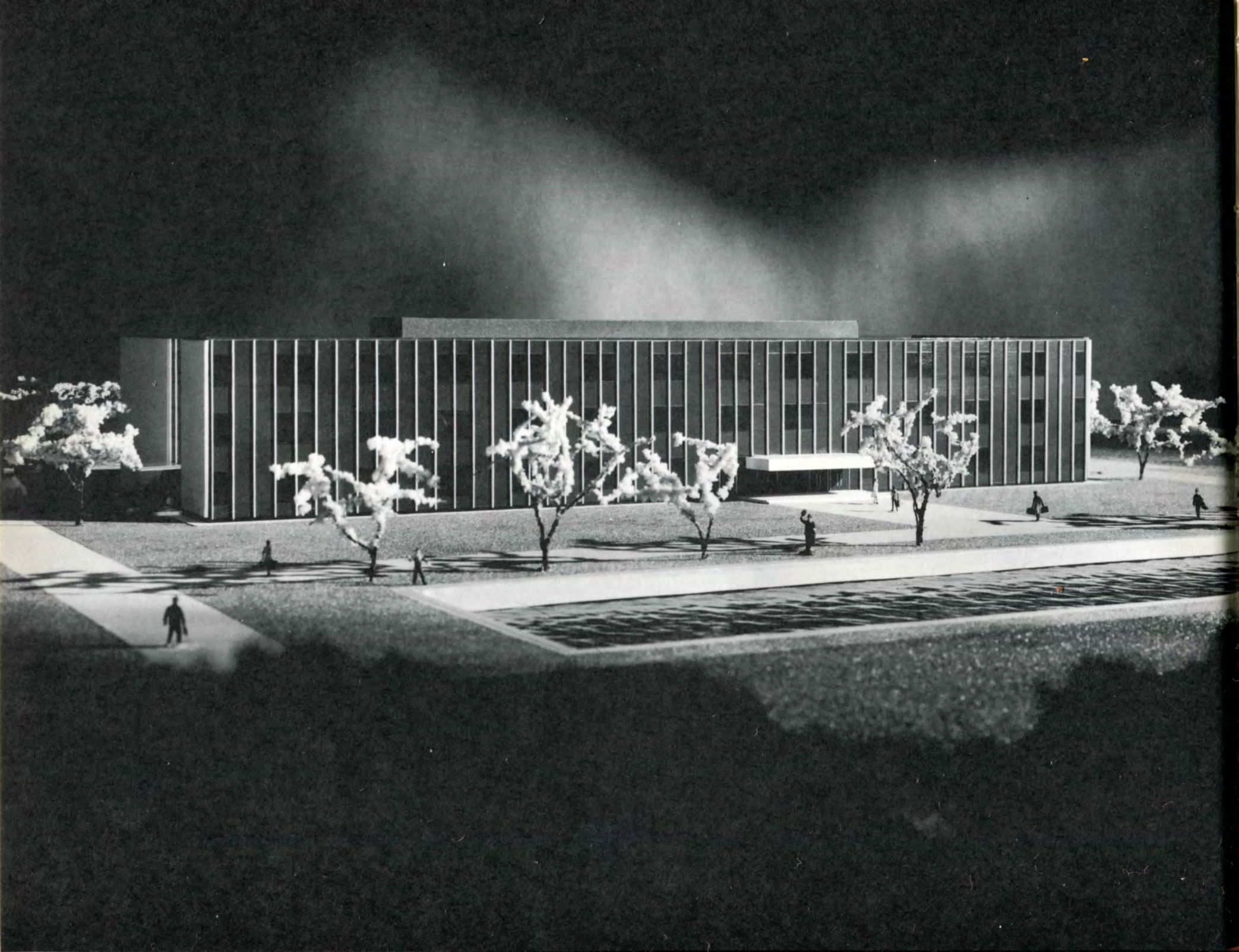

THE L.I.T. SCIENCE BUILDING and FUTURE CAMPUS

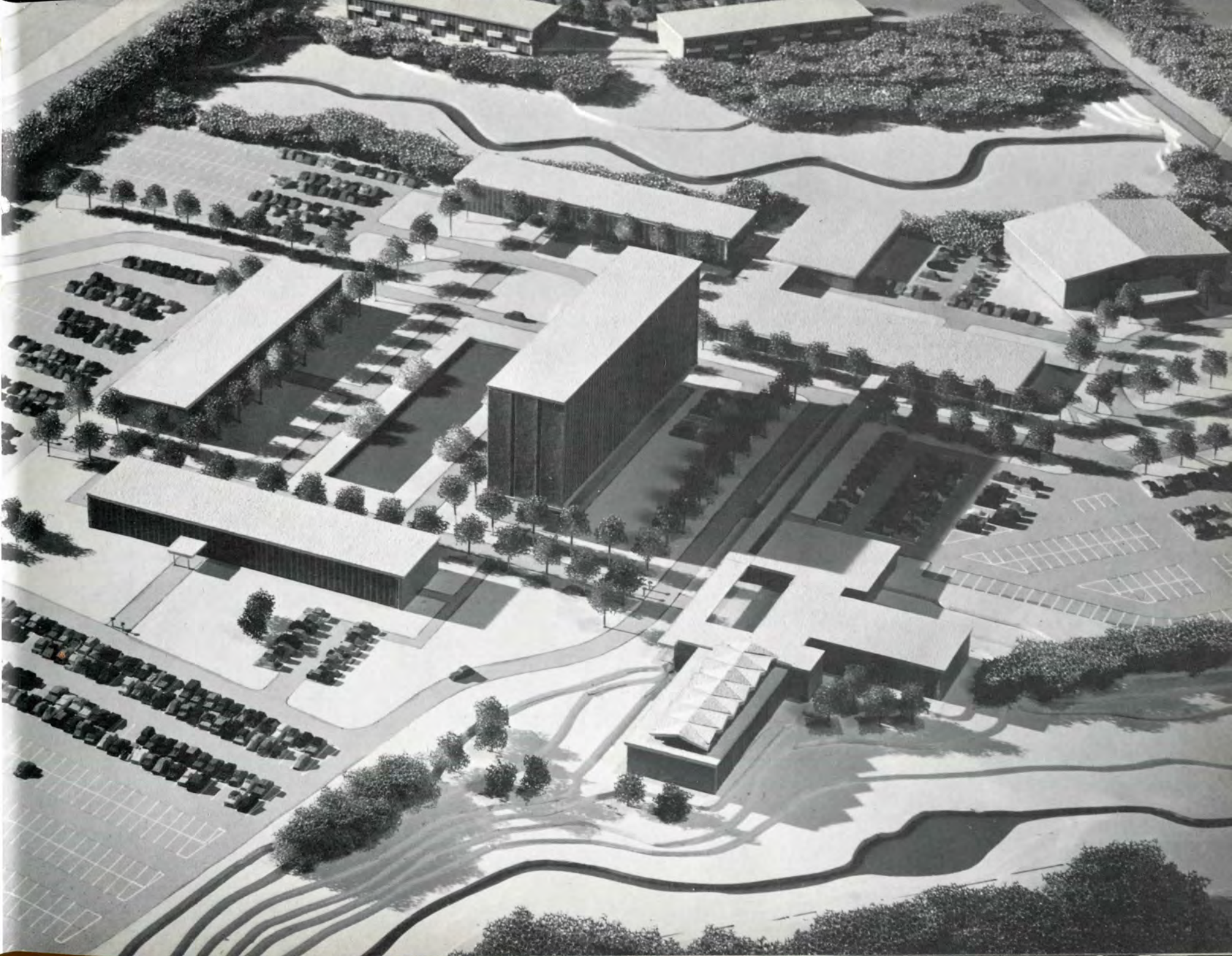
Lawrence Institute of Technology has been expanding rapidly since it was founded in 1932. This expansion has been especially notable since 1955 when the school moved to its new Southfield campus. In 1962 the library group of buildings was constructed to meet the needs of increased enrollment and curriculum. Since its construction the school has continued to grow at a rate faster than most private colleges. The new science building is a part of this continuing growth.

The science building will be the largest single structure on campus. Its floor area of 80,000 square feet will expand present academic facilities by sixty percent. The estimated cost of the three story building is \$2,200,000. It should be completed by the beginning of the school year in September of 1967. The building will house the departments of mathematics, physics, and chemistry on the first, second, and third floors respectively. These departments will be under the jurisdiction of Dr. Robert Luttermoser, the Director of Arts and Sciences. The heads of the departments of mathematics, physics and chemistry will continue to be Mr. Henry Nace, Mr. Nandor Zimmersmann, and Dr. George Mach, respectively. The departments of the social sciences and the humanities will also be under Dr. Luttermoser's jurisdiction.

The new science building will make it possible for Lawrence Tech to offer students Bachelor of Science degrees with majors in mathematics, physics, or chemistry. All present classes that are taught by these three departments will be conducted in the science building. With the departments of mathematics, physics, and chemistry completely contained within one building, it will be possible to expand the existing schools of study which include Architecture, Engineering, Industrial Management, and the Technical Institute since rooms now being used by these departments in the present buildings will be vacated. The new building will also contain an auditorium and several large lecture rooms which will be available to all departments for classes and special educational and cultural events. There will also be a study hall for the use of all students. Thus, the science building will create more of the basic facilities needed while expanding the scope of the programs offered at Lawrence Tech.

Though the science building is not built yet, it is indeed a reality. Other additions and improvements of the school that are under serious consideration include the doubling of the size of the cafeteria and the construction of the student activities center and field house. Accreditation is also in the process of becoming a reality. In March of 1965, Lawrence Tech was granted "Candidate for Membership" status by the North Central Association, Commission on Colleges and Universities.

At present, Lawrence Institute of Technology is the second largest private college in Michigan and it is expected that the number of yearly graduates will double by 1972. With this growth, the quality of the educational opportunities available to a student will inevitably increase. The science building will be a milestone in the history of the school. Programs that the construction of this new addition will instigate will surely display the continued growth and improvement of our college. The 1966 L-Book staff along with the entire student body would like to sincerely thank Dr. Wayne H. Buell, L.I.T. President, Dr. Stephen Kalmar, Director of Development and Research, Dr. Earl W. Pellerin, Architect F.A.I.A., and all others whose efforts are soon to be rewarded with the construction of the science building on this dynamic campus.





The recent addition of the library building to the campus, like the science building, is a part of the school's master plan. The goal of the master plan is to create a total environment conducive to education. The library building has been in use for four years and has proven adequate in fulfilling the complex demands made of it by the student body. It has given the students an enjoyable place to study and learn as well as an access to the natural beauties of the campus. Rather than destroying the beauty of the land around it, the library building has preserved and enhanced it. This has helped bring the school a step closer to having the type of atmosphere desirable for an institution of learning.

Lawrence Tech. is now in a state of metamorphosis on its way to becoming the best private school in Michigan by any measure of quality.

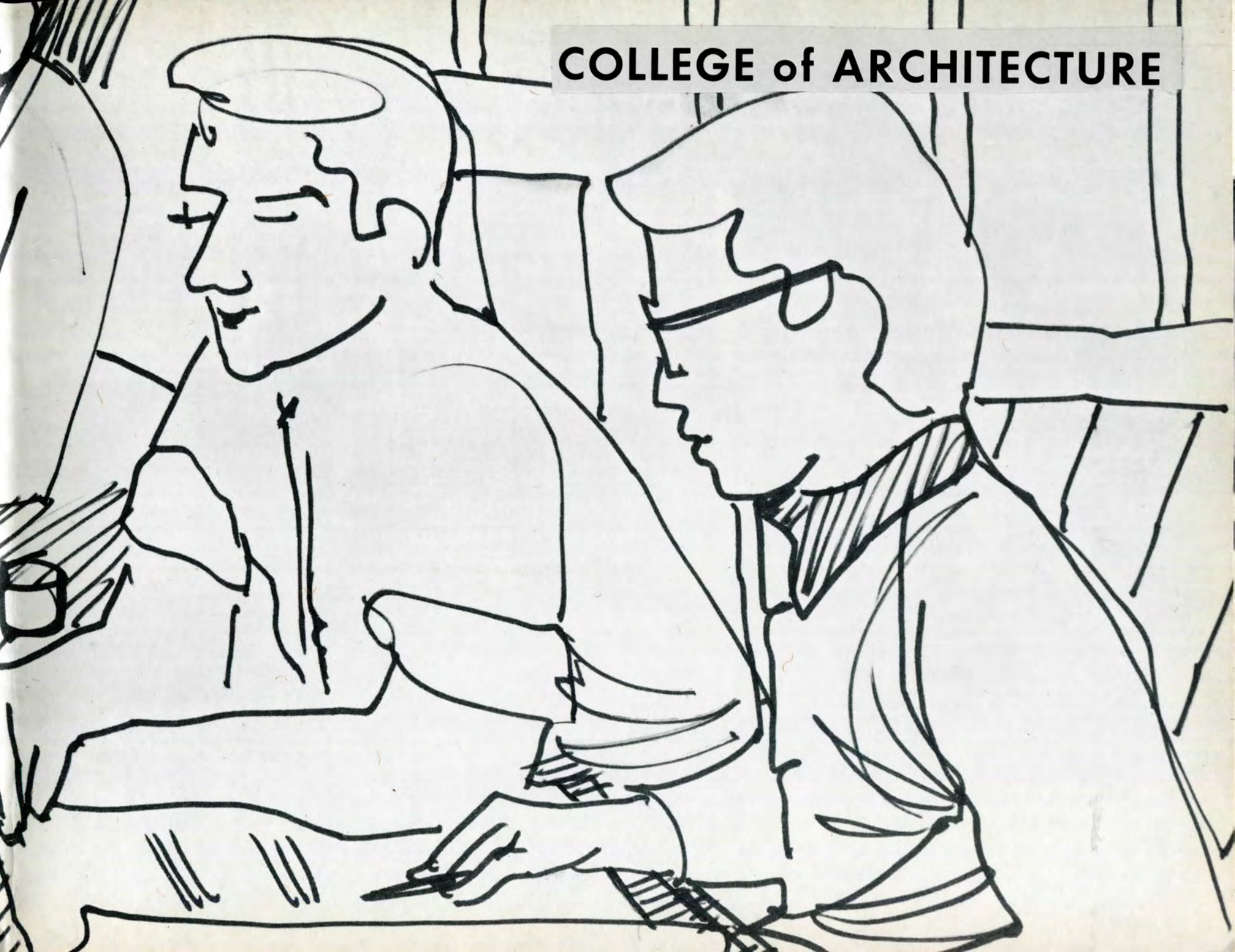


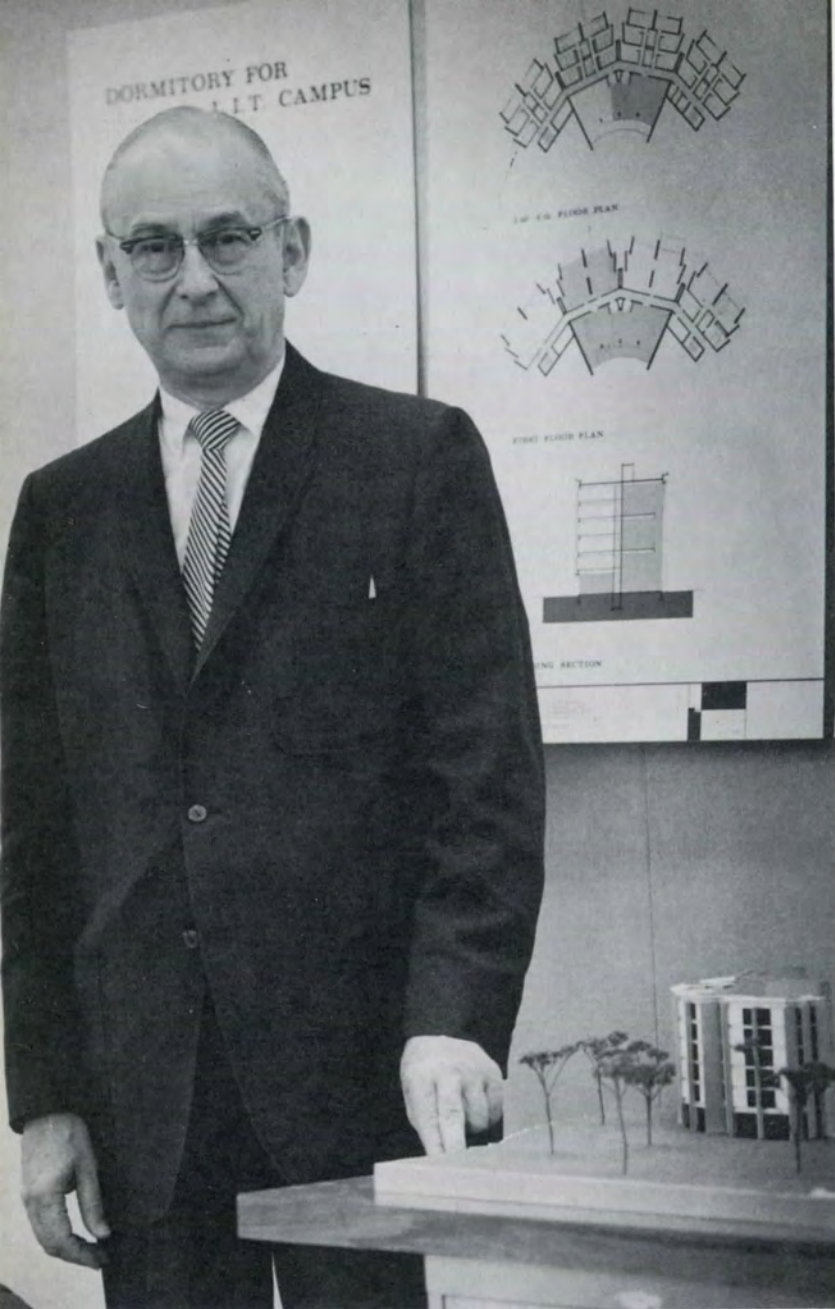
