




EDITORIAL

With a few changes in the right directions Lawrence Tech could readily be changed from the Lawrence Tech of the 1930's into a new Lawrence Tech facing the 1970's. Without these changes the 1970's will have no need for Lawrence Tech, because Lawrence Tech will still be teaching the rhetroic of the past.

Comments on life at Tech: "Very rewarding and stimulating experience. Size of school permitted me to get to know many professors, and make many lasting aquaintences with other students."




