ARABIAN ETHNIC DAY

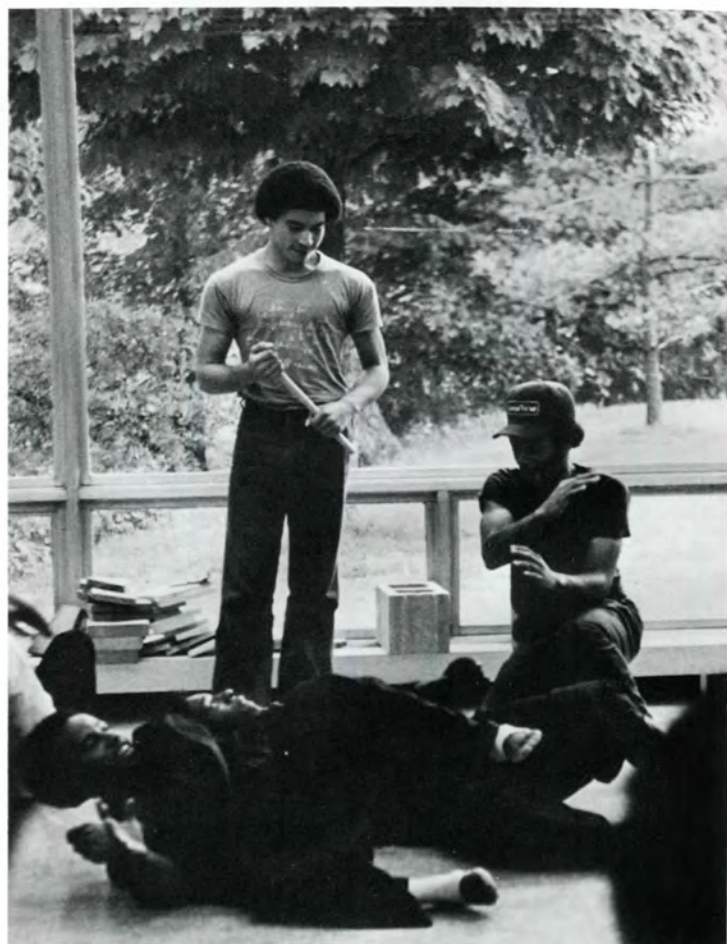
The first of these was the Arabian Ethnic Day. The festivities included Arabian food, an Arabian band, and to everyone's delight, genuine belly dancers.

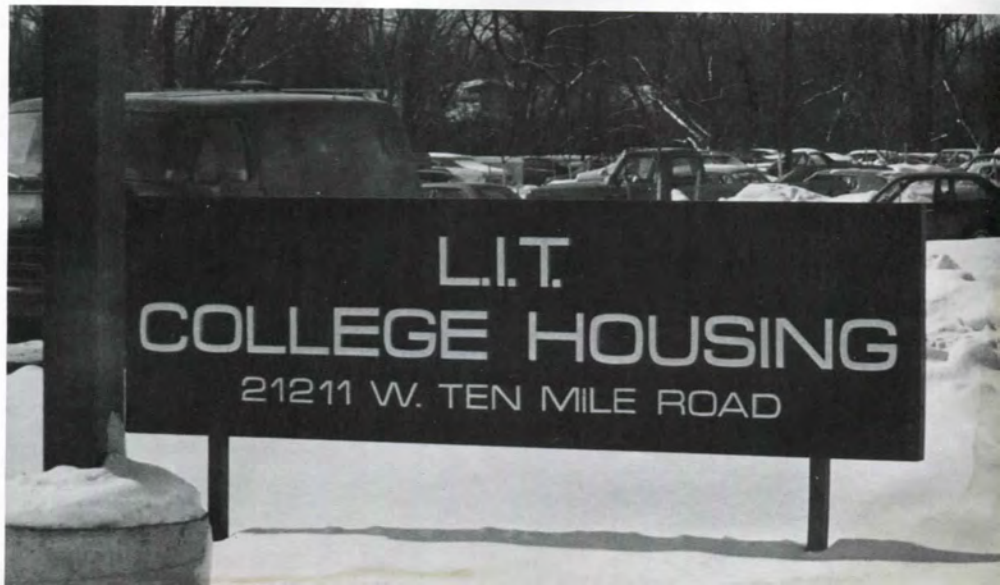


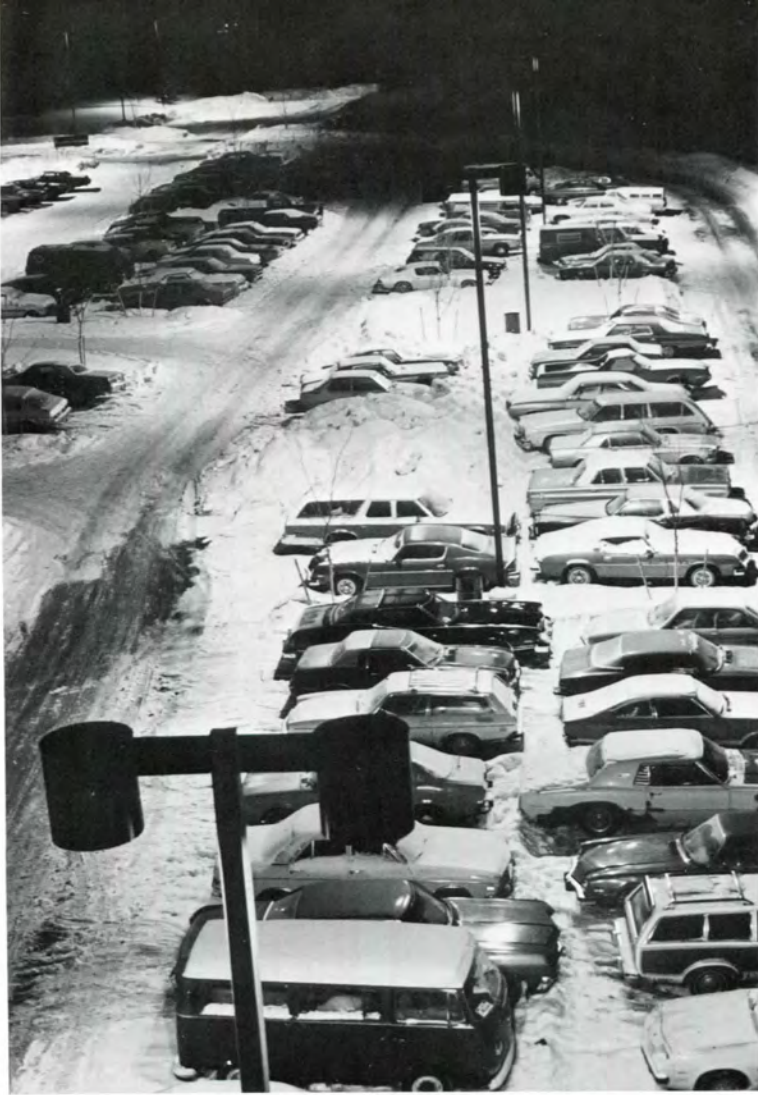
CHRISTMAS NOON EVENT

SIGMA PHI EPSILON

Sigma Phi Epsilon is a national social fraternity with over 200 chapters and 115,000 initiates spread from coast to coast. Sigma Phi Epsilon began on November 1, 1901 at Richmond College in Virginia with 12 men. Since then, we have grown to be the third largest national fraternity. Our fraternity has the largest staff of full-time personnel of any fraternity in the world. We have thoroughly trained professionals who visit each chapter to help us with our problems. Sigma Phi Epsilon also offers many other services and assistance to its members and chapters. These include educational grants, loans for housing, and headquarters bulletins keeping the chapters informed as to the happenings of every aspect of the fraternity. Educational academies are held once a year for the exchange of ideas among Brothers from similar chapters in other states in the same region. National meetings, or conclaves, are held bi-annually with all chapters around the country being represented.

Our chapter at L.I.T. is the youngest of the three fraternities, just six years old. But we have grown to have the largest active membership. We also have a little sister organization, known as the Golden Hearts. These girls help the Brothers at social functions and by generally keeping the spirit.

The Sig Eps are involved in most every phase of college life. We have many members holding positions in the student government, i.e. Vice-President and Secretary. We participate in the intramural sports, having reached the playoffs in baseball and football the last two years. Sig Eps feel that there has to be more to college than four years in the classroom. The LCF has chosen to affiliate itself with Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship, a national organization which supplies resources otherwise unavailable in order to aid its three purposes: to give all students and faculty the opportunity to carefully consider and respond to Jesus Christ's claims; to help Christian students mature as followers of Christ through Bible study, prayer, and sharing with each other; and to aid students in understanding the purpose and work of missionaries and how students can fit into the total picture, at home or abroad. The organization is committed to basic biblical truth and has no official stand on tangential issues; the resulting diversity in backgrounds has proved to be a strength rather than a weakness.

The core of the LCF is the small group Bible study, usually once a week. There are usually several small prayer groups which meet at different times during the week. Occasionally there are outside speakers. In the Bible studies the approach is to observe what the passage is actually saying and to discuss how that can be carried out in the students' lives rather than seeking to prove preconceived ideas.

Why would someone want to be a part of the LCF? Here are a few reasons: to grow as a person, work with fellow students who share a bond far deeper than the fact that they are at the same school, learn skills and gain experience in Bible study and leadership which will be useful long after graduation, and to help others wrestle with the ultimate issues of human life.

TAU BETA PI

Formerly known as Sigma Pi, the engineering honor society at L.I.T. has been recognized by the National Engineering Honor Society, Tau Beta Pi. Sigma Pi was founded in 1970 by Professor Richard S. Maslowski, Chairman of the Electrical Engineering Department, with the intention that in the future a Tau Beta Pi Chapter would be sought. Petitioning efforts were started several years ago; and in October of 1977 the final petition was presented to and accepted by the National Tau Beta Pi convention. Thereby, the 7th Chapter of Tau Beta Pi in Michigan, designated Michigan Eta, was granted to L.I.T.

The qualifications for membership into Tau Beta Pi, and previously for Sigma Pi, are not strictly academic. Although members are selected, according to grade point average, from the upper 1/5 and 1/8 of the senior and junior classes respectively; the character of the individual is equally important. All eligible candidates must also be recommended by a faculty member.

Election of new members is held in the fall and winter of each year. Electees are required to perform a project aimed at fostering a spirit of liberal culture.

After completion of the project, electees are inducted into the society at a formal initiation ceremony and presented with a pin and certificate, followed by a banquet held in their honor.

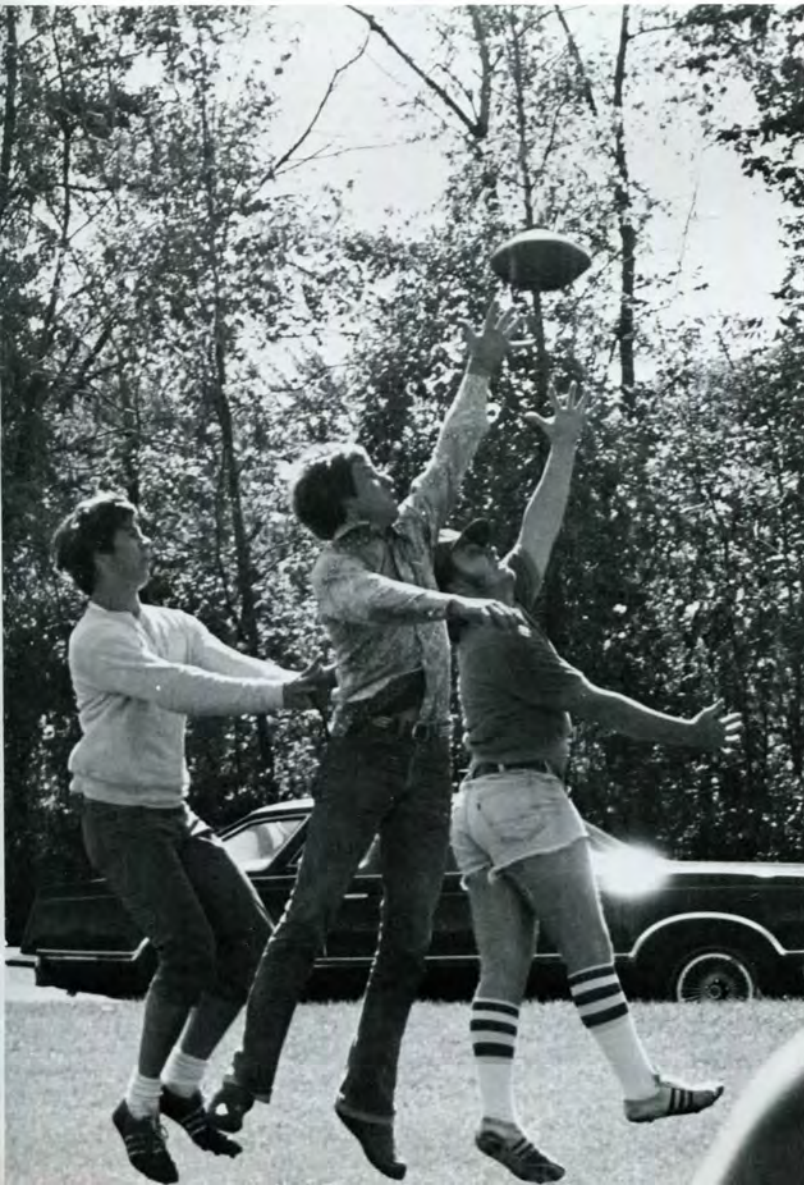
INTRAMURAL FOOTBALL 77-78
