Revolutionary soldiers of Washington County, October 21, 1920. The State Regent was a guest of the Chapter, and gave an interesting talk concerning the work of the National Society in this direction. The grave of the Revolutionary soldier, William Wright, was found in an old family burial ground and covered with myrtle. William Wright served in the Revolution in North Carolina under Captain James Robinson, Captain Rawles and Captain William Gray, a three months' service each time, making nine months in all. He came to Washington County in the early days of pioneer life, following his youngest brother, Philbird Wright, who came about 1809. William Wright married Betsy Morgan, and their family of eight children became worthy citizens, establishing homes in the county and state. One son, Arwin Wright, was chosen as one of the escorts to Lafayette when he visited Jeffersonville, Ind., in 1824. It seems very probable this honor was conferred upon Arwin because of his father's service in the War of the Revolution.

The Wright family has been an interesting one in the history of Washington County, and men and women of sterling worth to the community have been characteristic of the name. The Christopher Harrison Chapter considers it an honor to begin the work of marking the graves of Revolutionary heroes with the name of William Wright.

A letter to Mrs. Ida Finch of Linwood, N.C. in early March 1942, from Bella W. Atkinson of 2611 E. 73rd, Chicago, Ill. about her ancestors of Rowan & Randolph Cos., N.C., saying she had written Minnie Zink (of Chicago, who had visited Davidson Co., N.C., last year), but no answer. It seems she might be descended of Gottlieb Zink, through Rev. Jacob (a brother of Mrs. Atkinson's Daniel Zink). A genealogy is in the making of the Richard Wright pioneer, of old Rowan (now probably Davidson Co. or Randolph), which a rich old lady is willing to publish gratis, & as both of Mrs. Atkinson's parents were of the Wright family, she is anxious that they be included. Her father comes from Philbird or Philburt & her mother from Nancy Wright (born 5-4-1799 in N.C., died 4-10-1860 in Indiana) married 5-24-1797, Richard Gilstrap, in Rowan Co., N.C.--she may be descended of the three or four sons of Richard Wright (born about 1730 died 1785 in N.C. Richard Wright, born about 1730 in England, came to America about 1746, married about 1748, Ann, Jane or Nancy who may have been a Morgan--she signed Ann when estate was settled (Richard Wright died in Rowan in 1785). Issue: Benjamin, born 1752, Peter born 1754, Richard, born 1757, John born 1759, William born 1761, Evins or Evans born 1762, Amos Sr? born 1764 & Philburt born in 1768.

It seems that each of the three eldest sons had a Nancy--very little of known of John W., but the last four brothers have been traced, therefore it slumbers down to the others. Nancy was the second wife of Richard Gilstrap--his first wife, Mary Pruitt, died in N.C. The Gilstraps journeyed from Craven County to the "back country" in N.C. & the Bible says Nancy Wright married in Rowan Co., N.C. When on Mrs. Atkinson's visit in 1928, she failed to get this marriage bond & has made many efforts to locate what is needed & is willing to try again if someone is able to take charge of the search.
