

Book 5 page 511: On Dec. 11 1763, Richard Smith, a planter of Rowan Co.N.C., mortgages to Henry Eustace McCulloh of Halifax Co.N.C., 520 acres crossing the fork of Potts Creek, for 35 pounds, witnessed by John Frohock & Griffith Rutherford & acknowledged in Jan. 1764.

Jan. 12 1764: Mortgage from Richard Smith to Henry Eustace McCulloh for 520 acres on Dec. 20? 1763 is proved.

Oct. 14 1763: Deed from Henry McCulloh to Richard Smith for 520 acres May 3 1763 proved by John Frohock.

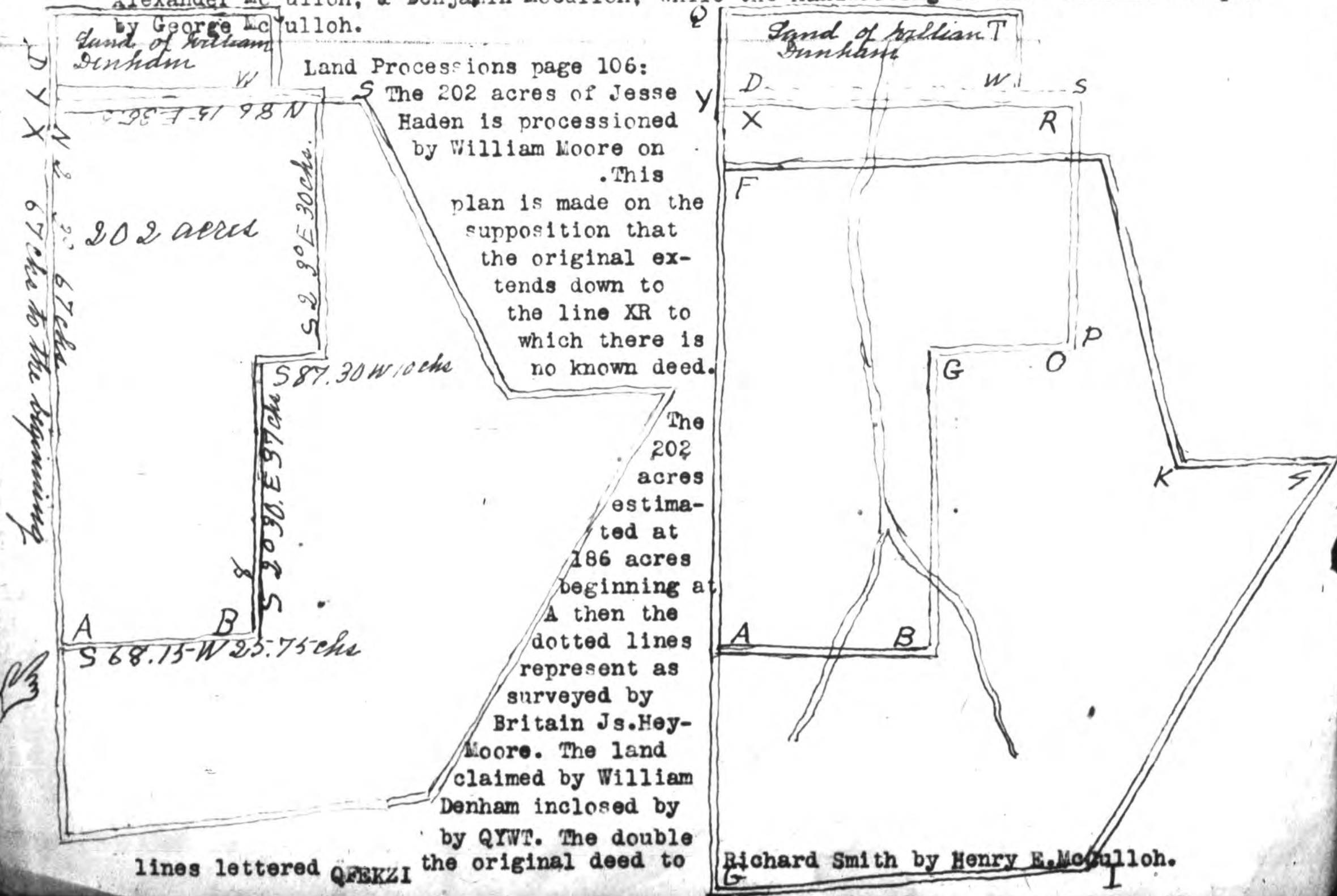
Book 5? page 329: On May 3 in the reign of King George III., Esq. Henry McCulloh lets Richard Smith have 520 acres in tract #9 crossing a fork of Potts Creek, for 25 pounds, witnessed by Griffith Rutherford & John Frohock & proved in Oct. 1763.

Feb. 14 1769: Deed from Hon. Henry Eustace McCulloh to Mathias Carn for 186 acres March 29 1765 proved by John Frohock, John Dunn & Alexander Martin, esquires.

Book 7 page 339: Aug. 7 1771, Mathias Carn--no wife signs--lets Samuel Merrell (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 186 acres on Potts Creek "known by the name of Richard Smith place" on the line of Henry Eustace McCulloh, in the forks of the creek next a spring branch, for 55 pounds, witnessed by John Frohock & John Merrell & acknowledged in Aug. 1771. (Henry Eustace McCulloh granted this to Mathias Carn on March 29 1765).

Book 8 page 187: June 1 1773, Samuel Merrell, a yeoman--no wife--let Henry Sloan, a gentleman (both of Rowan) have this for 85 pounds.

Book 19 page 8: Nov. 20 1772, Hon Henry Eustace McCulloh lets Godfrey Ratz, a planter of Rowan Co.N.C., have 96 acres on Potts Creek including the former improvements of Richard Smith next John Sloan & Henry Clement on the original line, for 75 pounds, witnessed by Alexander McCulloh, & Benjamin McCulloh, while the handwriting of the Hon.H.E. was proved by George McCulloh.



Book 32 page 496: Nov. 3 1835, Elizabeth Grub lets Pleasant Redwine (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have her dower in the land of deceased John Fraley next John Arey, Jacob Brown & Henry Fitte, for \$135.00 witnessed & proved by Obadiah M. Smith in Nov. 1835.

Book 32 page 498: Nov. 16 1835, Moses Freeman & wife Rachel let Pleasant Redwine--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have their one seventh of the two tracts which are undivided in the land of deceased John Fraley, for \$35.00, acknowledged in Nov. 1835. (They are 105 acres on south fork of Crane Creek next Jacob Brown, Henry Fite, Obadiah Smith; also 100 acres on Panther Creek next John Bame & Peter Lyerly Phillips)

Book 32 page 507: Nov. 3 1835, William Walton--no wife signs--lets Pleasant Redwine (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have two of the seven undivided parts of two tracts which formerly belonged to the deceased John Fraley now belonging to his heirs of whom said Walton? is one, for \$67.50, acknowledged in Nov. 1835. (They are as above)

Durham as their minister to the ministry of their church, they sent Abraham Lewis, Joseph Todd, Joseph Warford, Thomas Smith & James Scrivner to the church of brother Mc.grigor to carry letters. " a complaint came to the church that brother cornelious Smith Drank too much liquor and abused his wife and the church appointed

Dec. 1 1792: "those Brethren that was sent to site Brother Cornelious Smith to the Church made their return and he neglected to come and no fellowship gained and the church agreed to send Brother John Hollis & Brother Abraham Lewis to try to reclaim Brother cornelious Smith"

Jan. 5 1793: "a Matter of Brother C.Smiths referd from last Meeting Brother Lewis and Brother Hollis apointed by the Church to cite him thereto he failing to come the church apointed Brother Reed & Brother Smith to give him a second citation to our next church meeting Brother Thomas Durham was ordained to the ministry By Brother M,c,Grigger and Brother Whitehead who met on that purpose"

Feb. 2 1793: " and proceeded to the matter of Brother Smith was agreed by the church to stand Still as it was"

March 2 1793: "Brother Cornelias Smith appears and after acoledgment of his transgression requests further patience of the Brethren and is allow,d further indulgence hoping for his Better conduct".

May 4th 1793: "Cornelias Smith appeared and requested the patience of the church and they agree,d to wait Some longer"

June 4 1793: "the mater conserning Brother Cornelius Smith Continued and Brother James Scrivner & Brother Abra Lewis is appointed to go to him and inquire with him and Make Report to the next Church Meeting"

July 5 1793: "Brother cornelias Smith when Sent to the order of the church Appeard himself and Requested the patience of the church"

Aug. 3 1793: "the request of Brother Cornelious yet attended to and the agree to wait"

Nov. 2 1793: "the Church agreed to wait with cornelius Smith until their next church Meeting"

Nov. 30 1793: "the Church agreed to send a citation to cornelous Smith to appear at our next Church Meeting and Nathan Smith and John Hunt was appointed for that Business"

Jan. 4 1794: "Brother John Hunt who was one that was apointed to cite cornelious smith appeared and made Return and likewise Desired the church to wait untill next Meeting"

Feb.1 1794: "the Church considered the matter conserning cornelous Smith after confering together Jointly agree,d that hs should be excommunicated

Oct. 10 1812: "A matter taken up between Thos. durham & Jno.Smith wherein the former Charged the latter with false Swearing no testimony To prove the assertion he the Said Thos. durham was finally after serious investigation Excluded Bro. Jno. Smith applied for a letter of dismission Granted"

Saturday July 10 1813: "Recd an old woman Of Colour Sarah Wiseman & Eve Smith by Experiance"

Dec. 7 1816: "Enterd into Conferance a matter of Controversy between brother Rd. Owen and Jno. park taken up by the Church left to A Committee of 6 brethren Bennet Sollomon James brigs Henry Lynn Smith merrel Josiah Wiseman & george Smith Who Settled it to the Satisfaction of the two brethren"

Aug. 9 1817: "Enterd into Conferance proceeded to appoint messengers to the Association to be held first saturday in October next to wit George Smith Isaac Wiseman and Jas. brigs and Isaac Wiseman to write the letter"

Sept. 5 1818: "the brethren George Smith & Isaac Wiseman As messengers to the peedee asso. the saturday before the Third Sabbath in October next"

April 3 1819: " a matter of Controversy between hezekiah Owen And Sister Lidda Wood Come forward, was refered to a select Committee to wit Bro Rd. barns George Smith & henry Lynn the brethern appointed Settled and reported the same to the Satisfaction of the Church"

July 9 1825: "a request by letter from Abbots creek Church for messenger to consult about forming a new asso. AnSwerd by the appointment of Hezk. Owen George Smith & Isaac Wiseman"

Oct. 8 1825: "entered into conferance proceeded and chose hezekiah owen George Smith & Isaac Wiseman to attend the abbots creek union Association the Saturday before the second lords day in november next"

Dec. 16 1826: " a request from brethern near Jno.Charle's School house answered by the appointment of the brethern namely Jas. badget George Smith & Josiah wiseman"

May 16 1829: "brother Josiah Wiseman Rd.Owen & George Smith nominated to enquire and gain all the in fer mation nesesity withe respect to a report on brother Rabling"

July 18 1829: "the matter of brother Rabling taken up, the report found to be true and withdrew from his fellow ship,"

Nov.19 1831: " a door for experiance was opend and Margaret Smith Came forward"

Aug.17 1832: "agreed that we send messengers to the asseation appointed Brother Josiah Wiseman, George Smith and humphry Owen"

Feb. 16 1833: "took up the request from Lick Creek Church agreed that we send members Namely brethern Josiah Wiseman George Smith & Humphrey Owen"



April 20 1833: "agreed that there be a committy to arrange the Church Book & ascertain the number of members and report to the Church next meeting committy appointed namely br George Smith sister Meguire (sister) Elizabeth Owen & Rd. Owen jr"

June 1 1833: "Committy to arrange the Church book and ascertain the number of members report the number to be 68"

Oct. 5 1833: "took up the complaint against br Warford laid over untill next meeting brother Smith to give him Notice to attend then". (Warford was excommunicated Oct. 19 1833 at a call meeting).

Sunday Nov. 17 1833: "a door opened for reception of members when the following offered by Experience & was received (to wit) Jacob Long, Ebenezer Smith, & his wife Jane Smith, Polly Durham, Elizabeth Wamock, Richard O Wiseman, Susan Smith, (Henry's wife) Jonathan Herrell, Ruth Durham," &c.

Dec. 1 1833 Sunday: "a door opened for Reception of members when the following offered by Experience & was received (to wit) Alfred Smith, Elizabeth Reesor, and Patience (a woman of colour widow Elliss)"

Dec. 21 1833, Saturday: "The Church chose three deacons (to wit) Alfred Smith, Isaac Ainney, & Jacob Long."

Saturday Jan. 4 1834: "a door opened for the reception of members when the following offered by Experience & was received (to wit) a woman of colour named Milly (George Miller's), George Miller Jur. Benjamin Smith, John Jarratt, & John A Winders"

Saturday, Feb. 15 1834: "a door opened for Experience when the following offered & was received (to wit) Isabel Smith, William Willis" &c

Sunday, April 20 1834: "met & proceeded to ordain two deacons (to wit) Alfred Smith & Wilson Wiseman, which ordination was performed by Elders Pickler & Wiseman"

May 10 1834, Reeds meeting House: "a door opened for reception of members when the following offered & was recd. (to wit) Jacob Gimble, & his wife Nancy Gimble, Nancy Smith, Polly Cunningham and cloe, (Jane Parks)"

May 17 1834: "A door was then opened for reception of members when the following offered by Experience & was received (to wit) Margret Cornelison, Rebeckoh wisemon, Edith Wiseman, Ezekiel (Colo. Smith's) Grace, (H. Wilsons) & John Myers."

Saturday Aug. 2 1834: "a door opened for reception of members, when the following offered by Experience & was received (to wit) Jane Smith, (wife of Casper) Elizabeth Meguire, Henderson Wilson, & his wife Polly Wilson, Polly Mauh (?), Abigail Myers, Ned, old Jim, and Arther (all belonging to widow Ellis)"

Sept. 6 1834, Saturday: "a door opened for reception of members, when the following offered by experience & was received (to wit) Gershom Tussey, Hugh Maley, Barbara Myers, Jane Clark, Polly Trentham, Susannah Smith, Sibby Haden, Ben, (Hadens) Harem(?) (widow Elliss) and Jim (H. Wilsons)"

Sept. 20 1834: a door opened for reception of members when the following offered by Experience & was received (to wit) Susannah Owen, Mariah, (Jesse Hadens) & Jack (James Smiths)"

Saturday, Oct. 11 1834: "a door opened for reception of members when the following came forward & offered by Experience & was received (to wit) Jane Haden senr., Eliza Smith Martha (David Smiths) & Dave (Jesse Hadens)"

Dec. 6 1834: "a door opened for reception of Members when Hannah (Ebenezer Smiths) offered by experience & was recd."

Saturday, Dec. 20 1834: "a door opened for Experience. The Church appointed Brethren Alfred & Ebenezer Smith to converse with & cite Brother Wm Williams & John Myers to the next church meeting to concerning their intemperate use of Ardent Sperits"

Saturday, Jan. 3 1835: "a reference taken up from last meeting brother Alfred Smith rose & informed the church that he had cited Brother John Myers, who was then present & acknowledged he had been intoxicated after expressing sorrow for the same & promising to drink no more ardent sperits, the church forgave him & restored him to his former standing in the church.-- The case of Bro Wm Williams continued until next meeting", Feb. 28 1835: Wm. Williams acknowledged & was forgiven.

April 4 1835: "A door opened for Experience when the following offered & was recd (to wit) Nancy (F. Billins) Ben & Ison (widow Elliss) Cubit (James Smiths)"

Saturday, June 6 1835: "Alfred Smith appointed to converse with Doors Ringo, concerning his Experience & report to next meeting"

Friday, July 17 1835: "appointed Brethern Isaac N. Wiseman & Alfred Smith to represent this Church in the next Liberty association to be held at Liberty meeting House on Saturday before the 2nd Lords Day in August next"

Sept. 5 1835: "a door opened for reception of members when the following offered & was recd (to wit) William Douis(), Allice Kinney, Crissey (James Smiths) Sally, Vinson, & Fanny--belonging to R.L. Hancock"

Saturday, Feb. 6 1836: "owing to a report being in circulation that Bro. Jesse Haden is in the continual practice of drinking Ardent Sperits to intoxication & other immoral conduct, appointed Brethern Alfred Smith & James Wiseman to visit & converse with him about said report & report his answer to next meeting"

Saturday, March 5 1836: "the committee appointed to converse with Jesse Haden reported report received & committee discharged--The church unanimously excommunicate Jesse Haden from their fellowship:-- Brethern Ebenezer Smith & Daniel William appointed to converse with (James Elliss) Ned concerning an alledged falshood & to collect such testimony as then can about the matter & report to next church meeting"

April 2 1836: "the committee appointed to admonish & cite Ned (Jas Ellis's) to this meeting reported, Ned appeared & was heard by the Church, the church postponed until next meeting & laid Ned under censure until he gives more satisfaction"

Saturday, April 30 1836: "the reference of Ned taken up. Brother Alfred Smith appointed to converse with Ar McDonald concerning the report against Ned & report to next meeting"

Saturday, June 4 1836: "The recerence of (James Ellis's) Ned taken up, Brother Alfred Smith reported which was received. The church excommunicated Ned from the fellowship of the church for acting fraudelently & fals speaking. Brethern Jacob Long & Ebenezer Smith appointed to cite John Myers to the next church meeting to answer for intemperate drinking Sperits--"

July 16 1836: John Myers was suspended for further consideration.

Sept. 3 1836: John Myers was excommunicated.



Oct. 1 1836: "A door opened for Experience, when Hannah & Grace (both belonging to Jasper Smith Jr) offered & was received. Brother George Smith appointed to attend the convention to meet at Holloways on Saturday before 2nd. Sabbath in October 1836 to consult on the best plan to obtain a preacher to labour in the bounds of the Liberty association for the Term of Twelve months & to employ one if their means should be sufficient."

Saturday, Dec. 31 1836: "Henderson Wilson, Wilson Wiseman, George Smith, Jacob Long & Jacob Feezar appointed as a committee to to say what the Pastor Josiah Wiseman out to have for his services the ensuing year & repo to the Church forthwith--The committee reported that we ought to pay Elder Josiah wiseman for his services \$100.00 whereupon the church agreed to try & raise the Sum of \$100.00 as aforesaid--The Clerk appointed to ascertain how much money has been made up & paid over to Elder Josiah wiseman for his services for the the year 1836"

Saturday April 1 1837: "letters of dismission granted to John A Winders & Elizabeth his wife, Mary Winders & Nancy (Formerly Leguire) now Smith--" Saturday, July 1837: "Wilson Wiseman & Alfred Smith appointed as delegates to represent us in the next Liberty association to be held at Dick creek in August next & that the Clerk write a letter"

Saturday, Nov. 4 1837: "letters of Dismission Granted to Alexander Haden & Rebecca his wife & Nancy (Formerly Long) now Smith"

Saturday, Jan. 6 1838: "The reference of last meeting concerning Allen (Robt. Elliss) taken up. Brethern George Smith, Jacob Feezor, & Matthias Long appointed a committee to investigate his case & report forthwith-- after a short time the committee reported that they thought Allen ought to be excommunicated, which was done unanimously for the crime of Adultery+"

Saturday, Feb. 3 1838: "The reference of a complaint laid in this Church by Elder Peter owen of Liberty Church against Isaac Kinney taken up--the church agreed to accept the propision of the Liberty church that a Joint select Committee of four members from each Church be appointed to meet their part of the Committee at Brother John Turners on Friday to take into consideration both charges & hear the testimony on both Sides and report to both churches & to decide anaiding to their best Judgment, whereupon Alfred Smith, George Smith, James Wiseman & Aaron Yarbrough were appointed on behalf of this Church"

Saturday, March 3 1838: "The reference of last meeting conserning Elder Peter owen & Isaac Kinney taken up, the committee reported the case continued until next meeting-- The Church agreed to try & procure a Pastor to go in & out before us--it was moved & seconded that we procure the services of Elder Paul Phifer which was carried by a Majority of the Church whereupon Brethern Mathias Long & Alfred Smith appointed to Visit him & if his Services cannot be obtained, to apply to Elder Eli Carroll & procure his services for one year--the report of committee between Elder Peter owen & Isaac Kinney are in the words following" (about a letter written by Owen to Alice Kinney requesting secrecy which seems to have been misinterpreted by Kinney). The report was signed by Joshua Lee, George Smith, Peter Fine, Abner Wa , Reuben Deer, Aaron Yarbrough, James Wiseman & Alfred Smith & dated Feb. 9 1838 at John Turner's.

Saturday, March 31 1838: " entered into conference. Brother Alfred Smith appointed Moderator, the case of (Ratts) Fanny taken up the church appointed a committee George Smith, Wilson Wiseman & Jacob Feezar. The committee reported that they thought the ought to be excluded, whereupon Fanny was excluded from the fellowship of the church for the crime of having a bastard child she having no husband. The reference of last meeting between Elder Peter owen & Isaac Kinney continued until nest meeting: "

May 5 1838: "The reference of last meeting between Elder Peter owen & Isaac Kinney taken up--Brother Kinney restored to his former Standing--"

June 2 1838: "Isaac Kinney moved the church to dismiss him & family from the church or to allow him & family to withdraw from the church whereupon it was continued until next meeting-- A petition handed in by Richard owen Clerk of the Branch at Reeds: praying that the following named members be dismissed from this church to be organised into a church at that place (to wit) Richard Owen, Polly Warnack, Polly owen, Joseph Lanning, Sarah Lanning, James Camish, Polly Minor, Enos Lanning, Rosannah Lanning, James Womack, Benj: Myers, Elizabeth Myers, Joseph Tranthan, Nancy Camish, John Low, Paschal Minor Zebulin Minor, Rachel Minor, Alexander R. Craver, Sarah Craver, Benjamin Smith, Sarah Warnack, Daniel Warnack, Nancy Smith, Polly Hage, Nancy miller, Polly Cunningham, Polly Crouer, Nancy Grubb, Polly Grubb, Sally Crauer, Jacob Gimbell, Elizabeth Gimble, Polly Low, Jacob Crauer, Robert Cox, Azariah Williams, Lucy Crauer and Polly Gobble-- which petition was heard & when the above named members are organized into a Church at Reeds are dismissed from us--"

Saturday June 30 1838: "the reference of Brother Kinney taken up--he agrees to bear with those with whom he has been hurt until he shall become more dissatisfied--the reference of caty (Ellis) taken up the church appointed Alfred Smith, Wm Thomas & Humphrey owen to hear the evidence & report to the church forthwith, after retiring a few minutes return & reported that caty is guilty of fornication whereupon the church excluded her from their fellowship-- "

Saturday 6 Oct. 1838: "Church met in the absence of our Pastor Brother Alfred Smith appointed moderator,"

Saturday, April 6 1839: "The reference of Brethern Durham & Minor taken up, the church appointed a committee of five (to wit) Alfred Smith, Wm Thomas, James Wiseman humphroy owen & John Wilson who are to try & settle the disput between the parties-- The committee retired & Examined the Witnesses came into the church reported which is the following+ we the under signed a committee appointed to settle a dispute Brethern Durham & Minor beg leave to report that Zebulon Minor did do wrong in making charges which was disgraceful against the House & family of Robert Durham in saying things about one of the members of said family which he failed to prove & that there is a flat contradiction between the parties, we your committee do report that we called on Minor to make satisfaction which he failed to do, we hereby Exclude him from the fellowship of the church April 6th 1839 Alfred Smith Humphrey owen James Wiseman Wm Thomas John Wilson which report was received & committee discharged" (Minor accused Durham of keeping a disorderly house).

May 4 1839: Minor petitioned for a new hearing on condition that he can present testimony to change the nature of the case.

June 1 1839: John Wilson being absent, Mathias Long is added to the committee for hearing case of Durham & Minor "We the under Signed a former committee appointed to enquire into a difficulty existing between Robert Durham & Zebulin Minor on a new hearing beg leave to report, that they have had the parties before them, after being heard & witnesses examined they are satisfied, that the nature of the case is materially changed, that Minor still stands as excluded--And that Robert Durham & Agnes his wife for their disobedience & flat contradiction to Brethern & sisters who were witnesses in the case--And refuseing to become reconciled are both Excluded from the fellowship of the Church--June 1st 1839 Alfred Smith Humphrey owen Mathias Long James Wiseman Wm Thomas."

July 6 1839: "Brother Alfred Smith appointed to write the associational letter & present to the next church meeting"--association to be held at Barnes Meeting House on 2d Sunday of next August.

April 4 1840: John Wiseman acknowledged fault, was forgiven & restored to full fellowship.

June 6 1840, Saturday: "Church met Pastor Absent after prayer, Alfred smith appointed Moderator"

July 4 1840, Saturday: "Church met after prayer & sermon by Elder Josiah wiseman entered into conference Bro Alfred Smith appointed Moderator Brethern Humphrey owen, Alfred Smith & Wm Turner was appointed to represent this Church in the next Liberty Association to be held at Hollaways M.H. on the second sabbath in August next commenseing the day before-- the Clerk to write an associational letter"

July 3 1841, Saturday: "Brethern Alfred Smith, Henderson Wilson & James Wiseman appointed deligates to the Liberty association to be held at new friendship on the saturday before the second sabbath in August next & that the clerk write a letter & present it to the next meeting"\*\*\*"the Church agreed to procure a Paster to attend during the balance of the year whereupon the church agreed to call Elder Josuih Wiseman, the following Brethern appointed to confer with him & obtain his services (to wit) George Smith, Henderson Wilson, Wm owen, Alfred smith & Humphray owen= The committee retired & consulted with him & reported that he was Willing to serve the church until the first January next+"

The Smiths came to North Carolina about 1740 from Philadelphia with a colony of friends and neighbors and settled in Alamance County, Orange, Rowan and the southeast part of Guilford. They were of German extraction and mostly Lutheran in faith, but DAVID SMITH, the first, connected himself with the Church of England. For, as one of the Trustees we find him serving with Martin Frank, Frederick Billing and Henry Lookinber. They were deeded as Trustees, 53 acres on Abbotts Creek, including the meeting house and burying ground.

A David Smith lived for three generations on a portion of this Abbotts Creek plantation, for we find the heirs of DAVID SMITH selling it out of the family in 1851.

DAVID SMITH the first was the son of Peter and Barbara Smith. Peter had several brothers who came with him to North Carolina. All had families that were active in the affairs of State, both as a Colony and a Province fighting for Independence. Their descendants have since been active in "supporting her constitution and defending her flag."

PETER SMITH was one of the Regulators who protested against the prevailing atrocities suffered at the hands of the unscrupulous officers and requested relief from the king. He was loyal and obedient to all legitimate authority and gave of his service and substance, to further the interest of his community. In this he had the sympathetic cooperation of his good wife. We do not know the nature of their services but Governor Tryon issued the following vouchers to them, these being paid after Peter's death.

The Family of Peter Smith of Rowan Co. N. C.

1-Peter Smith, a German, and his wife Barbara received from Earl Granville a grant of 584 acres of land on Crane Creek in Rowan County, N. C. Aug. 23, 1759. Peter Smith lived and died in Rowan Co. His will dated Sept. 19, 1767, was proven in court Feb. 5, 1775. Barbara Smith survived him but he does not mention her name in the will but mentions his children: George, Peter, John, Margaret, Mary, Susanna, Elizabeth, Magdalen, and Eva. He also mentions his grandchildren: John, George, Peter and Barbara, children of the deceased John Adams. Of his children we know of only the following:

- (1) George Smith, further
- (2) Peter Smith Jr. married Margaret.
- (3) John Smith the only legal heir of Peter Smith living in 1830.
- (9) Eva Smith married George Christopher Natzer, Knatzer, from York Co. Penn. who was naturalized in Rowan Co. N. C. Sept. 23, 1765, removed to the forks of the Yadkin River in what is now Davis Co. N. C. where he was living in 1782.

2-George Smith Sen. was executor of his father's will. In 1775 served in the Revolutionary War as private in Dixon's Company of the 1st Regiment of North Carolina. Enlisted Oct. 6, 1777 for three years. Was wounded and promoted to Sargent Nov. 1778. In contemporary records he is called "Colonel" George Smith, probably a Colonel of Militia. His will was dated April 30, 1814, and proven in Rowan Co. N. C. Nov. term of court, 1814. He does not mention his wife, but does mention the following children: Susan, Elizabeth, Mary, William, George, Barbara, and Jacob. Of these we know as follows:

- (7) Jacob Smith, who lived in Rowan Co. N. C. was the executor of his father's will in 1814.

3-George Smith Jr. born in Rowan Co. N. C. in 1766, married in Rowan Co. N. C. Oct. 24, 1792, Elizabeth Roblin. They settled in Pulaski Co. Ky. about 1800, where they lived and died, she on May 20, 1840 and he in 1845. They had the following children: Peter, Sarah, Martin, George, Bassille, Daniel, Joseph, Jence, William, Phoebe, Wesley, George, Anna, and Polley.

 Henderson Crawford (son of William by wife Jane who was a daughter of Charles Smith who lived to right of Jersey Settlement Church--this Charles Smith married Adderton of Jackson Hill section, his father was Casper Smith (father of Lindsay Smith who lived at Jersey Church on Frohock place). Casper owned the brick house in which Charles lived awhile but traded off to lawyer Welborn, then bought at Jersey Church. Casper Smith 1st lived near Jackson Hill where Charles married Miss Adderton, then he built the brick house which Charles traded off, because of the timber on land, to lawyer Welborn of Lexington, N.C.

Col. George Smith, who died about 1890; living in 1892, had the following children: Jim, Frank, Bob, Jeff, Caroline (married Sink), Jim (married Idol), Frank (married Tilla Spain), Francis (married the widower Swicegood when she was rather elderly) & Alice (the youngest married Butner or Butler?)

Col. George Smith's brother, Alexander called "Sandy" was very prominent in Methodism. He married Mary Pinkston of near Wesley's Chapel Church, lived between Jersey Settlement Church & road to Healing Springs, had no children.

James Ellis (a merchant & probably a brother of Gov. Ellis) lived near Jersey Settlement Church, married Mary (daughter of Mathias Long of the river) who was pregnant at the time and whom he returned to her father when the child arrived. She was bright and pretty, & later married Rev'd Parsons who knew all about circumstances and took her out west--after her father's death she returned to get her patrimony.

The youngest Anderson Ellis married a daughter of Dr. Holt of Lexington & moved out west. He too may have been a brother of Gov. Ellis.

Freeland & moved still further west possibly to Ill., Mary married Beard of Rowan Co. N.C., & one who married Fry.

Jesse Holmes was the eldest son of Reuben #1. He married & had: Reuben Lindon (father of Miss Ada Holmes the maiden of 60 or more years who is telling the family history), Cicero Kohler(?) the youngest boy, Sallie (married Miller), Nancy (married Harris a brother of Miss Ada's mother), Jane (married P.A. Hoover), Amanda (married George F. Palmer--their eldest son B. married Fannie Meroney of Salisbury), Emeline (the youngest married Wiley Welborn of Randolph Co. N.C. (someone married 1st to Etheridge & had one daughter, Elizabeth who ran away when about 16 years & married Wiley Bean having a number of children: Moses L., Elizabeth. Elizabeth (Holmes) Bean is buried in the Holmes graveyard near Healing Springs. Eugene Bean mother, was the grand-daughter of Jesse Holmes, while his father, Moses Bean, was a grandson of Moses Holmes. Miss Ada Holmes' mother was <sup>Clarinda</sup> Jane Harris, was a daughter of William & a grand-daughter of Jesse Harris.

William Harris represented Davidson Co. & married Evelina Finch, daughter of Pettus Finch whose ancestors were of Franklin Co. N.C.--see Wheeler's History of N.C.

G.W. Palmer (who married Miss Ada's aunt) was a brother of Chrissie Palmer who married "Little David Smith", a son of "Big David Smith"--her youngest brother, Henry Palmer is still living in Davidson Co. N.C.--she spends much of her time in Charlotte. Her father was Abraham Palmer & his wife was a

Miller. This is the Henderson Madison Smith family--"Big David" being his father--and they lived on the Yadkin River near South Mont. About 1870, Reuben L. Holmes (father of Miss Ada), Hargrave & Jesse P. Wiseman were the commissioners to lay out "Big David's" land among the heirs who were: "Little David", Frank, Mrs. Philip Owen & the heirs of Henderson M. Smith--one of the sisters who married David Owens was dead without heirs as was an un married one names Ellen Smith. Mr. Holmes said he had trouble in allotting enough to Henderson M. Smith's heirs as they lived in Rowan, and somewhat out of the picture. Reuben L. Holmes was one of the three judges of equity for many years. His wife, Jane Harris, had the following brothers & sisters: Hammett J. (a Capt. of Confederacy, named for a preacher, married Harriet Lyons of Thomasville N.C. where he lived), Thomas Dow (also named after a preacher, was a conductor on Southern & ran the 1st train into Lexington, married Roxanna Coffin, daughter of Dr. Coffin of Jamestown, N.C. where he moved), William Otho (a farmer of Randolph Co. N.C., married Nancy, daughter of Moses & Anna (Riley) Holmes, a sister of Miss Ada's father), ~~Francis~~ Maria (married Jeffery H. (married Emily Myers of near Thomasville, N.C.), Jesse Franklin (married Joicie Ann Kettler, daughter of Isaac Kettler of Rowan Co.
