Steele letters written about by Miss Steele of Carlisle

of Pa. about papers in her home.

Mrs. Q.J. Scott handed me this:

"In a letter to his brother Ephraim dated March 17. 1790. Rev. Ninian Steel speaks of his mother having lived at Mr. Hogg's ever since the death of her daughter, taking care of her daughter. Also that Mary Hogg, Jinny's oldest daughter, spent a month with him the previous summer; that she is a fine girl of 14 years of age; that he requested Mr. Hogg to leave her with him some longer that she might have the advantage of the company of people in a genteel sphere of life but he would not; that he thinks Mr. Hogg wrong in not spending something on her by giving her a proper education.

In a letter to his brother Joseph dated April 10 1790, he says he has long considered their brother Joseph dead for if he were alive he would long before this have written to some one of his friends, therefore, his long silence makes him conclude that he is no more.--Also asks how Samuel is conducting himself and whether he is prospering, for he fears that to overcome bad habits requires greater resolution than Samuel is master of. He requests Ephraim to conceal nothing from him. He also inquires after John Stephenson & family; that he is a relation for whom he has great regard & hopes he'll do well. His brother Archy? lately arrived safely at Derry. The expression "My dear Lucy" in this letter indicates that "Lucy" was his wife's first name---Lucy Maden

In a letter to his brother dated July 7. 1792, Ninian Steele says he now has 10 children, 7 living, the last two but 5 months old, being twins, Frederick & Dorothea. His mother was then living with him, above 80 years old. Mary Hogg, his sister Jinny's oldest daughter, lived with him for a year past. She is a very good girl. Her father, since his second marriage, has neglected his children of the first.

" Under date of June 30. 1786, Rev. Ninian Steele wrote from Magherafelt, Ireland, to his brother Ephraim of Carlisle in which he expresses sorrow that his letters of the year before had not reached Ephraim. He had written 2 to Ephraim, 1 to Ephraim's wife, 1 to his brother Thomas, 1 to his sister Jordan and one to his dear friend Jane Steele in answer to her very kind and sensible letter to him. All these went to the bottom of the devouring deep.

At the date of this letter, he had 4 children living and one dead. 1. Sarah, died when 8 mos. old. 2. John, who was sickly 4 yrs & 2 mos old; 3. William, 3 yrs & 1 mo. old. 4. Elizabeth 1 yr & 5 mos. Old. 5 Samuel 5 weeks old.

When this letter was written Ninian Steele's father was dead but his mother was living and in indifferent health. She was then living in Litterkenny with her daughter Jenny. Ninian Steele had a brother named James. James and his mother had a quarrel and James refused to make concessions and be reconciled.

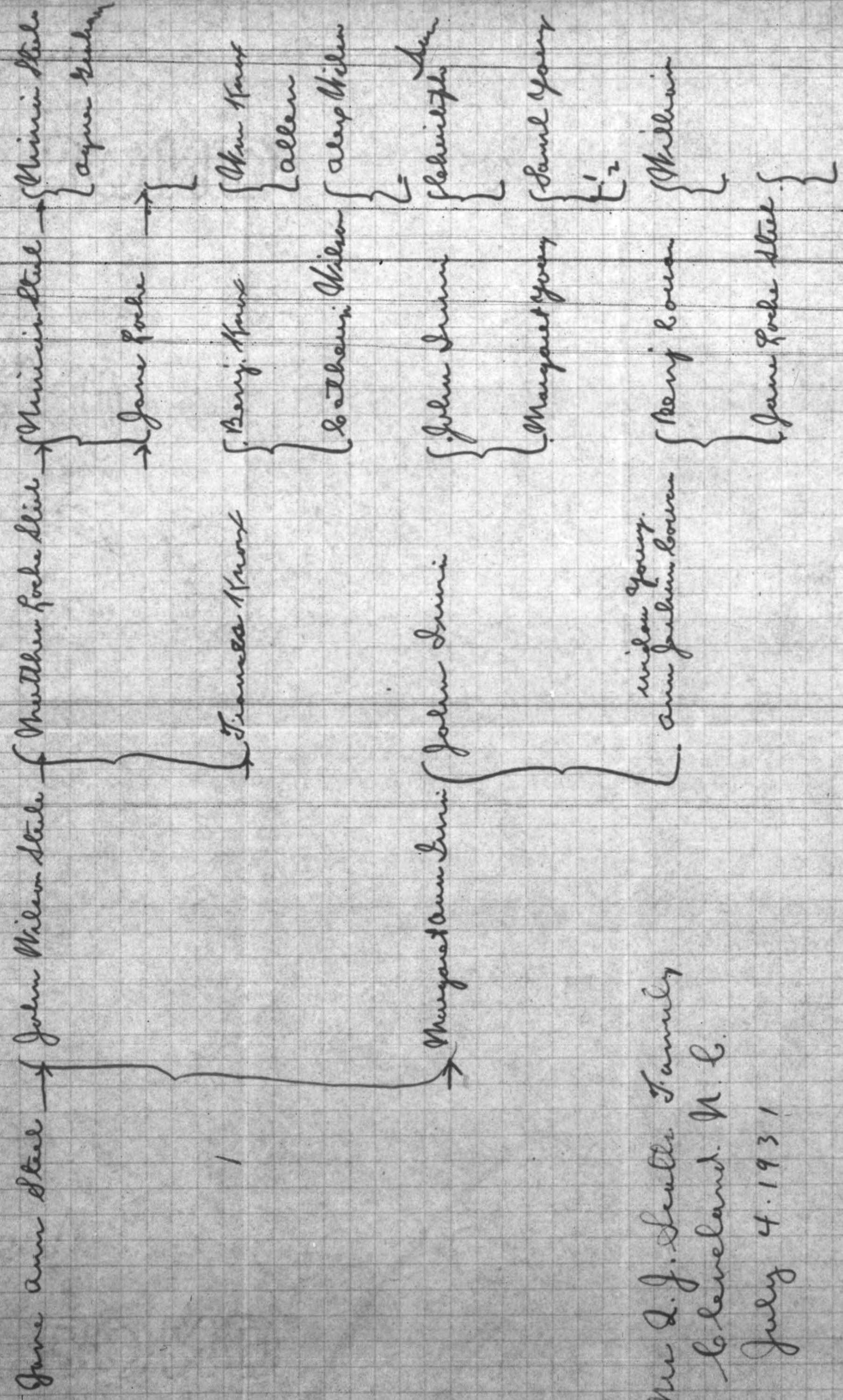
Ninian Steel was educated at Trinity College, Ireland, while the American Revolution was in progress. In a letter written on July 26. 1786, he speaks

In one of Ephraim's letters he asks Ninian to tell him about the Irish Volunteers and Ninian tells him at some length, paying the Irish Volunteers a glowing tribute.

In the same letter he explains the difference between the benefits an Irish Rector enjoys and those a Curate enjoys. A Rector has a fine house and farm & perhaps £500 or £600-- the tithes of his Parish-- yearly for doing nothing; and a Curate must do the duties and receive but £50"

Kincaid -- see book 72 page 63) on both sides of the Statesville road next --- Hall, lot #1m a small swamp, --- Fraley & --- Rice, for \$400.00, witnessed by Horation A. Nelson & acknowledged on the same day.

Ninian Steele's father was named Samuel and his brothers Samuel and Robert came to N.C.

Miss Annie Steele of Hico Texas, was a great grand daughter of Henry Chambers says his wife was Jane Farley and her sister became the wife of Henry Chambers Jr.

The Steeles that came to Christ Church with the Barbers, Burroughs, et al, not related.

Archibald Steele of S.C. was the paternal great grandfather of Dr. Newton Chambers Steele

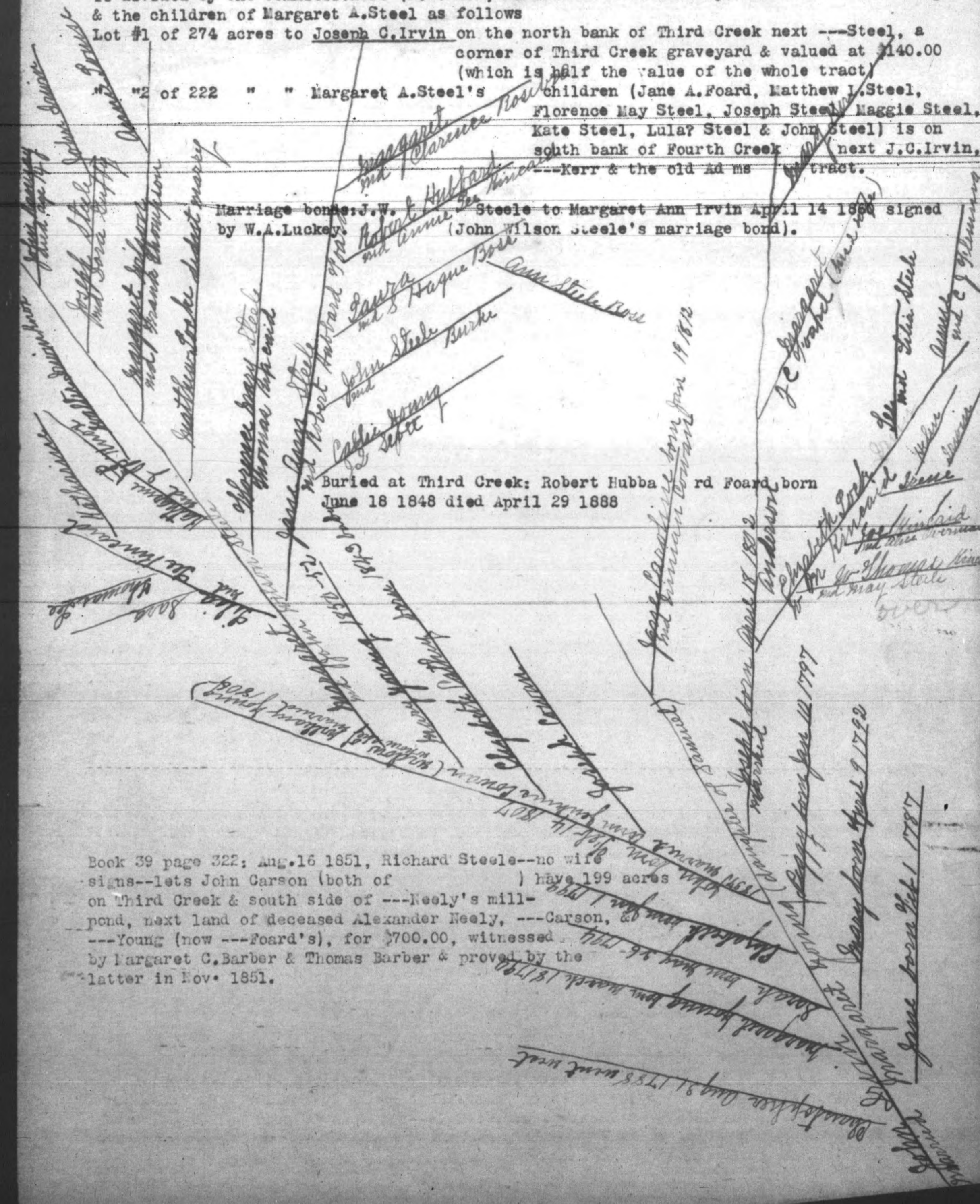
Archibald Steele was born in Scotland or England about 1722, went to Ireland and there married a Scotchwoman, Agnes Edwards, who was born in Dublin Ireland in 1720. They came to America in 1766, settling first in Lancaster Pa. but in 1772 moved to Fishing Creek Fork, S.C. and had 5 children-- all sons: John, Joseph, William, James and Robert. Four of these were soldiers under Gen. Francis Marion, Joseph King the Capt. Robert was refused on account of his youth, being only 14. 1st. John Steele born about 1758 in Ireland died 1808 in York Co. S.C. having 7 children: Archibald, Robert, William, John, Hugh, James & Jane; 2nd. Capt. Joseph Steele born 1740 in Ireland died Aug. 28 1798 in York Co. S.C. He married Rebecca Anderson and had 6 children: John, William, Archibald, Samuel, Jane & Alexander; 3rd. William born in Ireland in 1762 died Nov. 29 1806 in York Co. N.C. married Margaret Johnston and had 2 children: Joseph and Samuel Johnston Steele; 4th. James Steele born 1765 died Oct. 6 1811 in York Co. S.C. married Mary Workman and had: Josepha, Louisa Anna & Margaret Steele; 5th. Robert Steele born Sept. 7 1767 in Lancaster Pa. died in Ala. 1851-2 married Martha Starr 1798 and had: Mary, Rev. Archibald Jackson, Dorcas, Martha Stuart, John Newton (who married Mary Ann Steele a descendant of Ninian Steele) and Anna Jane.

S.C., was a patriot of York County. His wife was threatened with death because she refused to tell where her husband & four sons were (they were in the army). See also #64877. She is the daughter of David Parks Hutchison (born 1853) & wife Sarah White Steele (born 1856) whom he married in 1876; granddaughter of Abram C. Steele (1826-63) & wife Margaret Adelaide White (1829-93) whom he married in 1855; great-granddaughter of William Steele (1785-1829) & wife Eliza Beth Miller (1794-1829) whom he married in 1816; great-great-granddaughter of Joseph Steele (1760-95) & wife Rebecca Anderson (married in 1782); great-great-great-granddaughter of Archibald Steele & wife Agnes Edwards (1720-1813) whom he married in 1857.

Feb. 6 1777. "Joseph Steel and Robert King appointed as Justices of the peace for Rowan County were qualified according to Law, and gave their Votes for Adlai Osborn to be Clerk of the said Court". Same date: Robert King appointed to serve as a Juror at March court of Oyer.  
Robert King among the Esquires present at court of Feb. 7 1777.

Aug. 6 1777. "Griffith Rutherford, James Smith, Robert King, Robert Moore, Thomas Felps, Thomas Todd and Henry Davis were also Qualified as Magistrates for this County, according to Act of Assembly".

By permission of the Court of Aug. 7 1777, the following is inserted: July 30th 1777 "Ordered by the Court That Moses Winsley Robert King, Robert Moore and James Kerr Esquires members of this Court be a Committee to settle the following Estates Vist. "Eleoner Robey, John Getchey, John Dickey & John Kerr-- all deceased.

Aug. 7 1777. "The Court proceeded to lay out the County into districts and to appoint Constables and Sessors in each district agreeable to Law, and appointed as follows, (To wit) \*\*\*18 Captain Jacob Nicholl's district Comprehending his Company, William Sharpe Justice, Robert Hardin Constable, Jacob Nicholls, Robert Boyd and James King Sessors issd. 19th. Captain Patrick Morrison's district, comprehending his Company, Robert King Justice Robert Dobson Constable, John Montgomery, John Slone and James McGaney Sessors issd 20 Capt; Samuel Reid's district comprehending his Company, Robert King Justice, John Brandon Constable, Samuel Read, Samuel Luckey and Andrew Mitchell Sessors \*\*\*"

Wednesday Nov. 5 1777. John Cowden is deceased and "Ordered that Letters Testamentary on said Will issue to William Sharp and Robert King Executors nominated in said Will".

Wednesday Nov. 5 1777. "Ordered That William Sharp, Robert King, Robert Moore and Michael Brown Esqrs. be a Committee from this Court to value the Taxable property of the Sessors of the respective districts in this County and make their reports accordingly".

Feb. 3 1778. "Griffith Rutherford, William Sharp, Robert King, James Brandon Junr; William Cathey, Joseph Steele, John Johnston, John Vanata, James Brandon Senr; Andrew Hunt, & Robert Moore, took the Oath prescribed by Law for the Qualification of public Officer and the Oath of a Justice of the peace and took their Seats accordingly".

Wednesday, 5 1777. "Ordered That William Sharp, Robert King, Robert Moore and Michael Brown Esqrs. be a Committee from this Court to value the Taxable property of the Sessors of the respective districts in this County and make their reports accordingly".

John Steele and wife Sarah or Sally, of Iredell Co. on Aug. 9 1809 let Solomon Hall have 16 acres on North Waters of Fourth Creek next that of John Graham, John Hall & Solomon Hall ( being lot # 4 in the division of Dr. John Hall's estate, deceased, which was given by court to Sally Steele) witnessed by F. Neely. Book 20 page

Marriage bond of Robert Steel to Sarah Stuart Nov. 21 1787 signed by Abraham Gillian.

John Steele = 3rd. Sergt. in Gen. Muhlenberg's Reg. called "Buck's Minute Men", which was mustered in 1777 at Woodstock Va. Thomas Buck = Captain. See American Monthly Mag. May 1913 # 2731.

In 1774, Reg. Office Here, Robert Steel, late of New River Va. is now of Rowan Co. Joseph Steel is here too. William Steel = tavernkeeper here in 1773.

Andrew Steel gets 339(?) acres, lease & release, on Nov. 19-20 1766, from Thomas Bell & wife, proven by John Culbertson.

Among the inhabitants of Third & Fourth Creek in 1763 is Robert Steel.
