liam A., Charlotte L., Mary A., Benjamin F., Flora V., Isabella, Richard & Martin L.  
Walton--for \$196.00 recovered by William Walton, with orders to sell said land &  
did sell the land of said deceased on May 7 1839, for \$23.85) lets Jacob G. Smith of  
Rowan Co. N.C., have 35 acres on the waters of the Middle Fork of Grane Creek, begin-

but excepts 2 acres, for \$500.00, witnessed & proved by Edward Wise on Jan. 31 1891.

Jacob Smith (Potts Creek)  
Book 10 page 231: Nov. 4 1784. The State grants (#974 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Jacob Smith 263 acres on the South Fork of Potts Creek next Maxwell Chambers, & a conditional line between the said Smith & Thomas White.

Book 18 page 386: May 3 1802, Michael Wilson--no wife signs--lets Wilson Russum (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 277 acres on the waters of Cedar Creek, beginning on the corner of Charles Hunt at a hickory, going south 45 degrees west east 24 chains & 50 links to a hickory on the corner of the said Hunt, south 22 chains to a post oak on the corner of the said Hunt, east 39 chains & 25 links to a hickory & a black oak grub on the line of Peter Eaton, north 4 degrees west 71 chains & 50 links to a pine, west 15 degrees south 55 chains to a pine, then to the beginning, for \$1131.00, witnessed by JY Hunt & George Hunt & proved by the latter in May court of 1802.

Book 18 page 385: May 3 1802, Wilson Russum--no wife signs--lets Ebenezer Jones (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 50 acres on the waters of Cedar Creek, beginning on the corner of Charles Hunt at a post oak, going east 39 chains & 25 links to a black oak grub on the corner of the said Hunt, north 4 degrees west 12 chains & 75 links with the line of Peter Eaton to a post oak, west 39 chs. to a post oak on the line of Charles Hunt, then south to the beginning, for \$100.00, witnessed by JY Hunt & George Hunt & proved in May court of 1802.

Book 41 page 64: July 14 1856, Joel Smith of Washington Co., Indiana, appoints Jacob Shuping of Rowan Co.N.C., his attorney to get & what should come to him from the estate of his father, Jacob G. Smith of Rowan Co.N.C., acknowledged there

Book 37 page 165: Jan. 11 1844, William H. Smith--no wife signs--lets John Canble Sr. (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 77 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on the South Bank of the River, beginning on the old corner of Adam Shroat at a Spanish oak, going south 136 poles to a post oak on the corner of --- Swink, south with the line of Swink 49 degrees east 58 poles to a stone, north, a new line, 45 degrees east 44 poles to a white oak, north 1 degree east 166 poles to a Spanish oak on the river bank, then up the river to the beginning, for \$212.50, witnessed by Zechariah Lyerly & John H. Hardie & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1844.

Book 56 page 392: Oct. 15 1879, John Canble--no wife signs--lets William F. Canble (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have the above for \$500.00, acknowledged on the same day.

James Smith of Pennsylvania.

National Register of Sons of American Revolution, page 856: Tod Buchanan Galloway of Columbus, Ohio, joined the Ohio society as #2210, son of Samuel Galloway by Joan (Wallen); grandson of John Galloway by Elizabeth (Smith); great-grandson of Robert Smith by Elizabeth (Buchanan); great-great-grandson of James Smith, a Signer of the Declaration of Independence & of John Galloway, a private in the Pennsylvania Troops.

*Genealogist of Aug 1913, vol. 9, #8, page 79: "Inscriptions from the First Presbyterian churchyard, York, Penn.: James Smith, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, died July 11, 1806, aged 43 years. Eleanor Smith, wife of James Smith, Margaret, wife of James Johnson, and daughter of Hon. James Smith, died Jan. 18, 1838, aged 76 years, 8 months, 4 days."*  
*Baltimore Sunday American of 1919 (Gene. Column): "James Smith, the Signer. Hon. James Smith, born 1720 in Ireland, died, York, Pa., July 11, 1806. Book 11 page 700; July 11 1788, The State grants (#1665 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Thomas Williams 173 acres on the south bank of the Yadkin River, next the mouth of William's spring-branch, John Bemly?, Gasper Miller, Leonard Swink & William Turner, then down the river.

Book 19 page 300; April 26 1805, Thomas Williams--no wife signs--lets Alexander Long (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 173 acres on the south bank of the Yadkin River, at the mouth of William's spring-branch, next John Burkly, Gasper Miller, Leonard Swink & William Turner (now Adam Shout's), then down the river, for 225 pounds, witnessed by George Cusick & Vincent Tabb & acknowledged in May 1805.

Book 44 page 281; March 30 1869, the commissioners (Joseph Mahaley, George V. Best & William H. Russell) who had been appointed to lay off a homestead on the application of Ritty Smith & Stephen C. Ketchey, met at the home & allowed 172 acres--see more details May 1881 Vol. 1 Adams & Michael (Brown) & Michael H. (his two children Michael & Rita). Exrs: sons Daniel & George W. Witnesses: Jeremiah M. Brown & John D. Scheck.

The will of Jacob G. Smith (book K page 205) made Sept. 6 1854 & probated in Children: Joseph, Margaret & Ann (all get land on Middle prong of Crane Creek) Maria (gets her mother's furniture), John D. Scheck & Malinda (two youngest), William, Julius & Francis (three eldest) & George E.  
Wife: Ritter (gets land where I live on the north side of Middle Crane Creek).  
Exrs: nephew D. W. Smith & son-in-law Jacob Shuping.

Mr. Ben Ketchie (born about 1845) says George Smith, (son of Jacob Smith who lived 4 miles east of Salisbury & buried in the Smith family burial ground, whose last wife was Rittie Brown who lived east of Spencer on Miller's Ferry road which turns to the right from Long's Ferry road) was a deacon in church, died aged 70 years Nov. 15 1872, leaving a large family--one daughter married Jim Ketchey being Jane the youngest, Francis married Jess Kluttz (William, Julius & George--George married Diana Cauble, then Polly Smithdeal, widow of Alexander Brown).

Book 13 page 99: Dec. 19 1786, Charles Drury--no wife signs--lets Daniel Smith (both of Warren Co. N.C.), have 250 acres on the waters of Jameys Creek, beginning at a pine tree, going south 50 chains to a pine on the corner, east 50 chains to a pine on the corner, north 50 chains to a pine on the corner, then west 50 chains to the beginning, for 25 pounds Va. money, witnessed by Winsford Darnel & Joseph Darnel & proved by the latter in Feb. court of 1793. Book 87 page 170: Nov. 9 1899, Pleasant E. Sowers & wife Sarah F. of Rowan Co. N.C., let Matilda Smith of Davidson Co. N.C., have (part of lot #6 in the Barnhardt property) in Spencer south of the railroad next ---McCrary, ---Currey, & ---Sowers, for \$650.00

(Both sides of Swearing Creek).

Book 13 page 65; Aug. 9 1787, The State grants (#1524 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to James Tucker 640 acres on both sides of Swearing Creek, beginning on the south-west corner of Charles Drury & going west 63 chains & 90 links to a white oak, south 10 chains to a post oak, west, crossing said creek, 25 chains to a pine, north 79 chains to a white oak, east 89 chains & 90 links to a stake, south 69 chains with the branches of the said creek to the beginning.

Obadiah M. Smith (Grants Creek & road from Salisbury to Charlotte)

Book 34 page 123; Nov. 23 1838, Thomas G. Polk & wife Mary E. let Samuel Lemley--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 705.6 acres on the west side of Grants Creek on the north side of a branch; also 170 acres on the road from Salisbury to Charlotte (which is the remainder of 378 acres which Thomas G. Polk bought of Moses A. Lock who got it of James Childress) for \$3500.00, witnessed by Alexander Long & William Howard & acknowledged in Nov. 1838.

Book 35 page 43; Oct. 28 1840, Samuel Lemly Sr.--no wife signs--lets Obadiah M. Smith (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 520 acres on the west side of Grants Creek next M.S. McKensie, on the west side of the road leading from Salisbury to Charlotte; also 170 acres (which is the remainder of the 378 acres bought by Moses A. Locke from James Childress & bought by Thomas G. Polk of La. Locke) for \$3000.00, witnessed by Samuel Reeves & Henry Smith & proved by the latter in Nov. 1840.

Book 41 page 48; Dec. 1 1851, Archibald H. Caldwell, as C.M.E. (on a petition for sale by the heirs of deceased Obadiah Smith, in Nov. court of 1849, & was sold to Burton Graige, as the highest bidder for \$2500.00 on Dec. 26 1849 & confirmed by order of court in May 1850), now delivers to Burton Graige--both of Rowan Co. N.C.-- 520 acres, beginning on the west side of Grants Creek on the corner of the Original deed, at a black oak stump, going east, allowing a variation of 5 degrees from the magnetical meridian, 112 chains to a stake, south 64 chains to a white oak, west 39 $\frac{1}{2}$  chains to a persimmon on the corner of M.S. Smith), for \$35.00, acknowledged on Oct. 17 1881.

Book 68 page 421; March 5 1883, S.D.A. Smith of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Henry Turner of Iredell Co. N.C., have his  $\frac{1}{2}$  interest in the above tract (but subject to the dower of Marie, widow of Silas L. Smith who is the father of said S.D.A. Smith), for \$64.00, witnessed & proved in Iredell County by Samuel Turner on Dec. 14 1885.

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Book 20 page 126; May 2 1808, George Smith--no wife signs--lets Jacob Smith (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), have 181 acres on the north fork & middle fork of Grain Creek, beginning on the original corner of the tract & going east 50 chains to a black oak, south 55 chains to a post oak, west 30 chains to a poplar, then north to the hickory beginning, for 500.00, witnessed by John Adams & Maxwell Chambers & acknowledged in Aug. 1809.

Book 26 page 572; Nov. 27 1816, Thomas & Jane Varner & Jesse Peeler as heirs of deceased Alexander Smith let Eli Carrel--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have their undivided interests in the land of deceased Alexander Smith, for \$30.00, witnessed by Thomas Holland Davis, Nathan Woods & David Cox & proved by the last named in May 1821.

Book 12 page 559; Oct. 3 1791, Robert Porter, a weaver of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets William Fanning Lynn of Iredell Co. N.C., a farmer, have 200 acres on South Yadkin next Charles Bailey & John McGinnis, for 75 pounds, witnessed by David Beall & Thomas Archibald & proved by the latter in Feb. 1792. (This was granted said Porter by The State on Nov. 4 1784.) Feb. 11 1792: Deed from Robert Porter to William Fanning Lynn for 200 acres Oct. 3 1791 proved by Thomas Archibald.

The will of Isaac Hendricks (book H page 132) made while sick & weak on Oct. 7 1821. Daughters: Polly Carter & Elizabeth G. Lucas; Sons: Thomas (75 acres) & John. Others mentioned: Catherine Lisle & Sally. Exrs: son Thomas & Sally. Witnesses: John W. Linster & Frederick Ford.

May 11 1792; Deed from Humphry Marshall to Thomas Smart for 170 acres Feb. 18 1792 acknowledged. Book 17 page 420; Jan. 17 1801, Thomas Smart--no wife signs--lets Isaac Hendricks (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres for 100 pounds, witnessed by Leroy Smart & Benjamin Hudgins & proved by the latter in Feb. 1801. (This is part of the tract bought from Humphrey Marshall on Feb. 19 1792)

The will of Thomas Smart (book D page 71) made while "weak in body" on Jan. 19 1801. Wife Elizabeth (gets considerable until she remarries, then it goes to grandson, Frederick Gholson.) Sons-in-law: Isaac Hendricks (the land bought of Humphrey Marshall) & Jasper Collins (5 shillings to acknowledge esteem). Exrs: wife & Isaac Hendricks. Witnesses: Benjamin Hodgins, Leroy Smart, Thomas Coats & Pally Hodgins.

Book 16 page 166; Jan. 15 1798, Robert Andrews--no wife signs--lets Levi Silvers (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 40 acres on the west side of the Big Yadkin next Obadiah Smith, James Andrews, Thomas Smart & Humphrey Marshall, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Jr. Collins & Thomas Smart & proved by the latter in Feb. 1798.

Book 9 page 406: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#551 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Joseph Smith 566 acres on Potts Creek next Zeulun (said).

Book 9 page 498: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#632 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Zeulun (said) 170 acres on Potts Creek next said (said), John Dancey & Joseph Smith.

Book 11 page 717: Nov. 16 1785, Zeulun (said), a cordwinar & wife Lydia of Rowan Co.N.C., let Godfrey Rattz have 170 acres on Potts Creek next John Dancey, Joseph Smith & --- (said's deeded land, for witnessed by Thomas Carson & proved in May 1789. The will of Levi Silvers (book D page 34) made while "very sick and weak" April 2 1798. Wife Mary Ann (who gets 14 acres in the forks of the Yarkin). Delilah Walker gets 26 acres next the above mentioned tract--but both of the tracts go to James Reedy later & the rest of the last is to be sold. Witnesses: ? Collins & Frederic Gholson. The latter proved this will on Dec. 2 1800.

Book 24 page 2: Nov. 1 1816, Nathaniel Pearson of Anson Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets John R. Hodgins of Rowan Co.N.C. have 200 acres on the west bank of the Yarkin River next Jesse Haden (now owned by the heirs of Wm. Moor).--Pearson, old line of Humphrey Marshall (now Isaac Hendrick's), Obediah Smith (now Herod B. Pruitt's) but reserving the 40 acres on the northwest side of said tract (which Robert Andrews conveyed to Levi Silvers but is now Billy D. Haden's). for \$181.00, witnessed & proved by Nicholas W. Gaither in Feb. 1817.

Book 17 page 574: May 27 1799, William Lane--no wife signs--lets William Holeway (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 50 acres on Jacobs Creek above its mouth on the original corner of said Lane, for \$50.00, witnessed by Thomas Carson & Abraham Peppinger & proved by the latter in May 1801. (This is part of a State Grant on Oct. 18 1797)

Book 16 page 435: Dec. 18 1797, The State grants (#2531 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to William Lane 250 acres on both sides Jacobs Creek next Jacob Cross. (Warrant dated May 10 1779).

Book 10 page 240: Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (#698 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to George Fezir 200 acres on the west side of Abbotts Creek next Conrad Cornelison & said Fezir's deeded land.

Nov. 1812; Deed from John Richmond Stokes to Thomas Smith for 184 acres Sept. 16 1812 proved by George. Dunn.

Book 20 page 330: Sept. 16 1812, John Richmond Stokes--no wife signs--lets Thomas Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 184 acres on the north side of the Yarkin River next what was formerly Martin Walk's, for \$500.00, witnessed by Ls. Beard & George Dunn & proved by the latter in Nov. 1812. (This is part of the tract which the former sheriff, Lewis Beard, sold on execution of John Penn against Solomon Walk to my father, Esq. John Stokes now deceased). It begins on the corner of the corner of Martin Walk, formerly on the river bank, & goes north 40 degrees east 25 chains & 50 links to a red oak where a maple formerly stood on the corner of the said Walk, north 16 degrees west 13 chains & 50 links to a post oak sapling on the line of the said Walk, east 17 chains & 8 links to a white oak, north 44? chains & 30 links to a maple, west 31 chains & 50 links to a line on the line of the said Walk, south 16 degrees east 19 chains to a post oak, south 66 degrees west 18 chains & 50 links to the river bank, then with the said river to the beginning.

Book 22 page 713 or 813 (numbered twice): Sept. 17 1812, Esq. Lewis Beard, as High Sheriff of Rowan Co.N.C., lets John R. Stokes, the heir-at-law of deceased Esq. John Stokes of Rowan Co.N.C., have 184 acres on the north side of the Yarkin River next what was formerly Martin Walk's, for \$500.00, witnessed by Ls. Beard & George Dunn & proved by the latter in Nov. court of 1812. (This had been sold on an execution May 1 1779, to the said deceased, Esq. John Stokes for 130 pounds, being the land recovered by his executors, for 41 pounds against Solomon Walk.)



Book 19 page 187: On Jan. 25 1805, the heirs of deceased David Smith, of Rowan Co. N.C. (all Smith but Jacob Miller, & possibly two written in German? being: Fredrick, George, Peter, John, & Leonard Smith & Jacob Miller) let Peter Kern, also of Rowan Co. N.C., have 200 acres on the head of Adams Creek next the land of George Fezer, crossing creek & east side of Abbots Creek near Jacobs Branch, for 100 pounds, witnessed by John Beck who also proved it in Feb. 1805. (This had been granted to Barbara Smith by The State on Dec. 22 1797.) Feb 1805: Deed from the heirs of David Smith to Peter Kern for 200 acres Jan. 25 1805 proved by John Beck.

Book 16 page 442: Barbary Smith has a grant (#2534) for acres on the east side of Abbots Creek next George Feazer, crossing Adams Creek near Jacobs Branch, on Dec. 18 1797 (dated Nov. 15 1787).

Book 26 page 38: Nov. 26 1807, Benjamin Scrivner--no wife signs--lets Jasper Smith--both of Rowan Co. N.C., have 300 acres next David Smith & about three chains from Adams Creek, for \$500.00, witnessed & proved by John Billings in Aug. 1820. (This is part of a State Grant).

Book 13 page 100: Jan. 15 1793, Thomas Scrivener of Wilkes Co. Georgia,--no wife signs--lets Benjamin Scrivner of Rowan Co. N.C., have 300 acres on both sides of Adams Creek next David Smith on the west side of the creek, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Frances Floyd & William Moore & proved by the latter in Feb. 9 1793.

Book 5 page 41: On Dec. 11 of the 2d year of King George III., Esq Henry McCulloh lets Frederick Smith, a planter of Rowan Co. N.C., have 200 acres in tract #9, for 13 pounds & 10 shillings sterling.

It begins at a stake & goes south 85 degrees east 71 poles to a white oak, south 70 poles to a post oak, west 48 poles to a red oak, south 75 poles to a red oak, west 186 poles to a red oak, north 120 poles to a stake, then east 150 poles to the beginning.

Feb. 9 1792: "Administration on the Estate of Fredrick Smith deceased issued to Maxwell Chambers Esq. and Albert Terrence who qualified and entered into bond with Henry Young Security in the Sum of 50,000" Inventory filed.

Book 12 page 82: Sept. 27 1786, Capt. Frederick Smith--no wife signs--lets David Smith (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 250 acres on the waters of Branch, beginning on the corner of David Smith & the line of David Bierly at a black oak, going south 18 chains to another corner of David Smith, continued in all 5 chains to a white oak, east 607 chains to a red oak, north 38 chains to a white oak near or on the line of David Bierly, north with the line of David Bierly 82 west to the beginning, for 14 pounds

Book 19 page 811: Sept. 3 1806, Obadiah Smith--no wife signs--lets John Smith (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 260 acres on the west bank of Yadkin River on the upper corner of Obadiah Smith, going south to Deadman, John Poyans, Ready Run, down the branch to its junction with the river, for \$300.00, witnessed by Andrew Kerr & Peter Brown & proved by the latter in Nov. 1806. (See elsewhere)

Book 23 page 649: Jan. 11 1816, John Smith--no wife signs--lets Billy D. Haden (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 260 acres on the west bank of Yadkin River next said John Smith,--Dedmon, John Poiners on the bank of the creek, for \$2450.00, witnessed by John Click & Richard Barnes & acknowledged in Feb. 1816. (See elsewhere)

May 3 1785: "Administration on the personal Estate of Fredrick Smith is Ordered to issue to John Lukinby & Michael Summey, (the widow relinquishing in open Court), qualified & gave Bostain Lentz Security in the Sum of "200".

Aug-7-8? 1787: "Ordered that Jacob Smith Orphan of Fredrick Smith deceased, be bound Apprentice to Michael Summey, till he attains the Age of 21 Years, being now seventeen Years old, to learn the Trade of a Weaver; said Master to comply with the Law" "Ordered that Fredrick Smith Orphan of Fredrick Smith deceased, be bound Apprentice to Gasper Prinkle to learn the Trade of a Wheelwright, 'till he attains the Age of 21 Years, being now fourteen Years old; said Master to comply with the Law &c"  
May 12 1787: Deed from Fredrick Goss to Michael Summey for 200 acres May 7 1787 is acknowledged.

Book 2 page 4: On Dec. 11 of the 24 year of King George III. Wm Henry McCulloch lets Fredrick Smith a planter of Rowan Co. N.C. have 100 acres in tract # 9 for 18 pounds & 10 shillings.

Book 24 page 291: June 10 1817 John Beck Sr. (A German? & no wife signs) lets John Beck Jr. -- both of Rowan Co. N.C. -- have 146 acres on west side of Pounders Fork of Abbotts Creek next John Smith, Ephraim Goss & Lewis Mergets near the mouth of a branch, for \$350.00, witnessed by Owen Strange & John Gause & proved by the latter in Aug. 1817. (This is part of the tract of deceased Frederick Smith as divided among his heirs & fell to his son Jacob who let Michael Sumy have it and also part of a tract which is adjoining & was entered by said Jacob Smith who let said Sumy have it)

Book 21 page 677: Feb. 22 1802, Jacob Smith (a German? -- no wife signs) lets Michael Summey -- both of Rowan Co. N.C. -- have 82 1/3 or 1/2 acres on both sides of Pounders Fork of Abbotts Creek next the original & John Smith, for \$207.00, witnessed by Frederick Smith & Britain Jones Haymoore & proved by the latter in Feb. 1810. (This is part of the land of deceased Frederick Smith divided between the legates).

Book 21 page 578: Feb. 25 1802, Jacob Smith -- no wife signs -- lets Michael Summey (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 63 1/2 acres on Pounders Fork of Abbotts Creek next Peter Carn & Frederick Smith, for \$68.00, witnessed by Adam ? & Frederick Smith & proved by ---- in Aug. 1809.
