Book 32 page 504: Sept.13 1833, Knox Armstrong--no wife signs--of Rutherford Co.Tenn. for himself and as attorney for his brother, Zenas Armstrong of Randolph Co.Illinois, lets the blacksmith, Samuel Luckey of Rowan Co.N.C., have their parts of 230 acres (which formerly belonged to Samuel Armstrong) on Neils Branch next John Boston,---Mc Knight, Thomas Mock, heirs of Caleb Webb & said Luckey, for \$322.00, witnessed by Elizabeth Fleming & R.N.Fleming & proved by the latter in Nov. 1835.

Book 32 page 502: March 3 1834, Davis Bibb & wife Margaret of Dickson Co.Tenn., let Samuel Luckey, the blacksmith of Rowan Co.N.C., have their third part of 230 acres on Neils Branch next John Boston,--- McKnight, north of Thomas Mock. & John Steel, east of the heirs of Caleb Webb & above said Luckey, for \$161.00, (being land formerly owned by Samuel Armstrong) proved in May 1834.

(Both of the above deeds show that Samuel Luckie got adjoining land from Allen Lorrow).

Book 33 page 116: Dec. 17 1835, Esq. Samuel Silliman (as Clerk & Master of Equity, on a petition from the heirs of deceased Caleb Webb who died several years ago owning about 110 acres which he willed to his wife during her life & other to his five children & the widow has since died, also one of the children which leaves four children as tenants in common & two of these children are infants with Jacob Krieger as their regular guardian, but one of them, Daniel Webb, sold his undivided share to Samuel Luckey while the rest cannot well be divided, so the decree of April Term of Court 1834 ordered it sold, & it was sold on the premises, June 2 1834) so he now delivers to Samuel Luckey 165 $\frac{1}{4}$  acres on Fourth Creek, beginning on the west bank of Webb's Branch, next Allen Morrow, the heirs of Samuel Armstrong, bank of McNeill's Branch, Robert Luckie, north bank of a branch Mary Webb & Elisha Brown, for \$190.00, acknowledged in . (This is parts of two tracts of Caleb Webb--one of 119 acres from Samuel Luckey in 1807 & the other of 16 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres from Allen Morrow in 1815).

N.C., have 8 1/2 acres on Beverdam next Samuel Orton, John Dobbins, the old field of --- Dickey & Catherine Hall, for \$116.75, witnessed by A.B. Cowan & Michael Brown & acknowledged in Aug. 1823. (John Beard as sheriff of Rowan sold this to the said Cowan as the property of Samuel Luckie).

Book 32 page 502: March 3 1834, David Bibb & wife Margaret of Dickson Co. Tenn. let Samuel Luckey, blacksmith of Rowan Co. N.C., have their one third of 230 acres on Neils Branch next John Postian, --- McKnight, on north of Thomas Mock & John Steel, east of the heirs of Caleb Webb next said Luckey on the south, for \$161.00, proved in May 1834. (This is part of the land formerly owned by Samuel Armstrong).

Book 32 page 504: Sept. 13 1833, Anox Armstrong of Rutherford Co. Tenn. --- no wife signs --- for himself and as the attorney of his brother, Zenas Armstrong of Randolph Co. Ill., lets the blacksmith, Samuel Luckey, of Rowan Co. N.C., have their portions of 230 acres (formerly owned by Samuel Armstrong) on Neils Branch next John Boston, --- McKnight, Thomas Mock, heirs of Caleb Webb & said Luckey, for \$322.00, witnessed by Elizabeth Fleming & R.N. N.C., have 93 acres on the north side of Third Creek next Neely's mill-pond, T.A. Burke, the old race path & J.G. Fleming, for \$700.00, witnessed & proved by J.G. Fleming in May 1859.

Book 42? page 310: Dec. 6 1856, F.T. Burke (by his attorney W.P. Burke) lets W.A. Luckey of Rowan Co. N.C., have 93 acres on the north side of Third Creek beginning on the edge of Neely's mill-pond next T.A. Burke, between the old race path, J.G. Fleming & A.R. Rice, for \$160.00, witnessed & proved by J.G. Fleming on May 6 1861.

Book 41 page 594: Oct. 20 1849, Nathaniel B. Lester of Iredell Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets William A. Luckey of Rowan Co. N.C., have 50 7/100 acres (being lot #1 in estate of Abel Cowan allotted Margaret & valued at \$200.00), next William Hall & ---Lowry for \$195.00, witnessed by William F. Haynes & Samuel Luckey, B.S., who proved it

Robert Luckey (Hunting & Bear Creeks)

Book 11 page 258: Oct. 25 1786, The State Grants (#1188 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Robert Luckey 640 acres on Hunting Creek & Bear Creek next John Bryan, Thomas Penry & Samuel Reed. It begins on the line of John Bryan at a post oak, goes south 25 chains & 32 links to a maple on the corner of said Bryan, south 25 degrees east 33 chains to a post oak on the corner of said Bryan, east 12 chains to a black oak on the line of said Bryan, south 32 chains to a hickory grub on the line of Thomas Penry, west 88 chains to a pine on the corner of Samuel Reed, north 87 chains & 12 links to a chestnut, then to the beginning.

Book 13 page 851: Dec. 9 1793, Isaac Jones & Thomas Penry (as executors of the will of John Luckey) let John Little--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 640 acres on Hunting Creek & Bear Creek next John Bryan, Thomas Penry & Samuel Reed, for 297 pounds, 1 shilling & 11 pence, witnessed by Jeremiah Jacob, Richard Leach & James Leach & acknowledged in Feb. 1795. (Dimensions as in above State Grant).

Book 18 page 339: Jan. 13 1802, John Little--no wife signs--lets John Wells (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 104 acres on Hunting Creek, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Beal Liams & Samuel Little & acknowledged in Feb. 1802. (This is part of State Grant #1188 made to Robert Luckie on Oct. 25 1786).

Joseph Locker (Bryans Mill Creek)

Book 9 page 378: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#561 at 80 shillings the 100 acres) to James Robinson 347 acres on the waters of Bryans Mill Creek, beginning on the corner of Isaac Enoch at a stake on the line of Gabriel Enochs, south with his line 20 chains to a white oak on his corner, west with his line 15 chains to a hickory, south 43 chains to a black oak on the line of Jeremiah Melon, east with his line 39 chains to a post oak, north 64 chains to a pine on the line of Isaac Enochs, then west to the beginning.

John Luckie, Jr. (Fourth Creek & Beaver Dam Branch on South Yadkin River)

Book 11 page 724: June 17 1788 John Luckie--no wife signs--lets Isaac Anderson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have three tracts on the waters of Fourth Creek & Beaverdam Branch on the South Yadkin River,--in all 656 acres: one of 300 acres beginning on the old corner of Robert Tate & going north 50 chains to a pine, east 60 chains to a black oak, south 50 chains to a black oak, then west to the beginning (it being the plantation upon which the said John Luckie now lives, having been granted by Earl Granville to Robert Tate on Jan. 29 1755, who let William Esloven have by sale & which the said Esloven let the said John Luckie have by lease & release on April 20 & 21 1756); one of 160 acres beginning on the corner of John Culbertson at a pine, going west 87 chains to the corner of Andrew Shield & line of the said Luckie, north 14 chains to a post oak on the corner of Robert Johnston, east 39 chains to a black oak on the corner of said Johnston, north 8 chains to a post oak on the corner of said Johnston, east 48 chains to a stone on the line of James Marlin & corner of the said Johnston, south 28 chains to the beginning (which had been granted by The State to the said John Luckie on March 21, 1780), while the third tract is 196 acres on both sides of Beaver Dam Branch on the south side of the South Yadkin, next the land originally granted Robert Tate & Robert Johnston, beginning on the line of the said Tate at a maple on the south side of the said branch, going with his line north 40 chains to a pine on his line, east 49 chains to a post oak on the line of said Johnston, south with the line 40 chains to a hickory, then west to the beginning (which Earl Granville originally granted the said John Luckie, Samuel Luckie & Joseph Luckie (who is now deceased) & came to the said John Luckie under the Constitution by lease & release from the said Joseph Luckie by lease & release on May 1 1770?), for 656 pounds N.C. money, witnessed by Samuel Lowrie & Will Brown & proved by the latter in May court of 1789.

(This is part of the land originally owned by Gabriel Enech who let the said Joel Johnson have this). It begins at a sweet gum & goes north 84 degrees west 15 chains & 30 links to a white oak on the bank of a small branch, west 16 chains & 50 links to a stone & a stake on the line of ---Hilton & the said Johnson, south 5 degrees east 20 chains & 50 links to a small hickory sapling, west 5 chains to a small dogwood bush, south 20 chains & 85 links to a black oak sapling on the corner of Joseph Locker, north 84 degrees east 38 chains to a post oak on the line of said Locker & Johnson, north 1 1/2 degree east 21 chains 7 20 links to the beginning.

N.C. have 171 1/2 acres on the north bank of Fourth Creek next ---Teague, ---Current, mouth of Falls Branch, ---Daniel, M.T. Bryant, P. Snyder, L. McCubbins & Wilkesboro for \$200.50 acknowledged on the same day.

Oct. 24 1755; Lease & Release from Robert Tate to William Eslaven for 300 acres is acknowledged.

Book 3 page 40; Oct. 25 1755, Robert Tate --lets William Eslaven (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have all the plantation of 300 acres on Fourth Creek for 5 shillings--the release price on Oct. 27 1755 is not named--

Oct. 19 1756; Lease & release from William Eslaven & wife Isable to John Luckie Jr. for 300 acres acknowledged (Fee of 9/4 pd to J.P.)  
Book 3 page 418; April 21 1756, William Eslaven & wife Isabel Luckie--both make their marks--let John Luckie (both men are planters of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 300 acres on the north side of Fourth Creek of the South Yadkin next Robert Tate, going north 50 poles, east 60 poles, south 50 poles then west to the beginning, for 5 shillings--the release price being 30 pounds on the next day, witnessed by Andrew Allison & Robert Luckie & acknowledged Oct. 19 1756. (This is all of the plantation which Robert Tate got Jan. 29 1755 by indenture & let the said William Eslaven have by lease & release

Book 44 page 82; April 9 1863, William A. Luckey--no wife signs--lets Samuel Luckey (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 16 1/2 acres next Dr. James Ramsay, place of Samuel Luckey, George Gillespie ---Webb, place of ---Webb, & Thomas Hall, for \$200.00, witnessed by A.J. Fleming & William Sheek & proved by the latter in May 1863.

Book 1 page 46: On Jan. 17 1753, John Linn & wife Naomi of Anson Co.N.C., let the Congregation of Dissenters have 12 acres between the Yaddin & Cataba Rivers on the north line of James Cathey, for 5 shillings--the release price being 8 pounds on the next day--witnessed by Ed Cusick, John Gardiner & William Brandon & proved \_\_\_\_\_ (This is for the Presbyterian congregation belong ing to the old synod of Philadelphia, & is \_\_\_\_\_ the lower lower meeting house).

William Brandon got 350 acres from Earl Granville on March 25 1752, next the meeting-house, John Sills & James Cathey, married Ann (daughter of James Cathey ) & died in 1756. In April 1761, Thomas Galispee & William Luckey are appointed commissioners to let out the share of his son, James, for two years--the other son <sup>JOHN</sup> is made ward of Matthew Lock

Book 26 page 236: On Sept. 16 1819, Samuel Steele & Isiah Reed of Surry Co.Fenn. & James Steele of Burke Co.N.C. (no wives sign) as heirs of the deceased Robert Luckie, let Josiah Owens of Rowan Co.N.C., have 30 acres on Sills Creek on the southwest corner of Robert Luckie & between him and Thomas Gillespie, for \$50.00, witnessed by John S. Carson & Thomas Gillespie & proved by the latter in Feb. 1821.

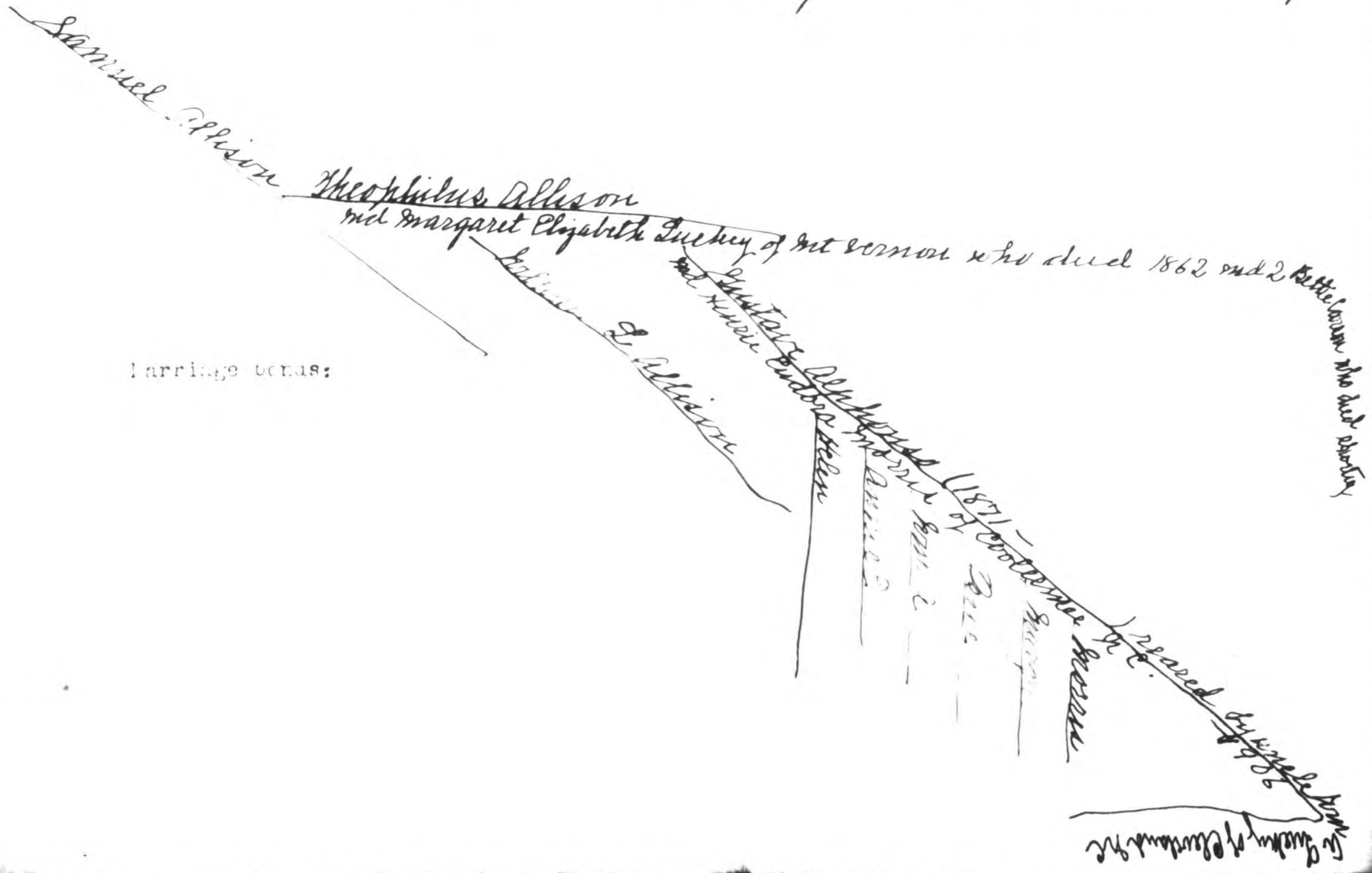
