Marriage bond of: William Riddle to Nancy Slater May 27 1817
Signed by Benjamin Riddle.

Fielding Slater to Alice Smith Oct. 5 1826 signed Henry Giles.

Mary
Benjamin Riddle appointed guardian of Elizabeth, Fielding, Mary, Sara, Annie & Thomas Slater, orphans of Thomas Slater, and gave bond of 500 pounds each with John Smith & Samuel Jones as securities in 1810. John Thornton (guardian of Nancy Slater) and Benjamin Riddle (the guardian of Polly & Fielden Slater) to Upton (?), Elizabeth, Ann, & Sarah Slater in Feb. 1811. (page 374. Minute Book.) Benjamin Riddle (guardian of Elizabeth, Fielding, Apton & Sarah Slater in 1812 (page 537).

Henry Sleighter is adm. of Richard Dickson May 16 1811.

In our first courts 1753 ? "Henry Sluder Sr. Petioned this Court to be Recomend to the Genl Assembly, of this Province as an Object of Charity and Prays to be Levy Free Granted"

Book 24 page 150: On Oct. 16 1815, John Thornton lets George Hanes have 75 acres on the south side of Linvilles Creek next William Phillips, Philip Hanes' Mill tract, & others, for \$100.00 witnessed by W. Phillips & D. Orrell in May term of 1817 & proved by the latter. (This is 1/3 of a tract formerly belonging to the deceased Thomas Slater & dower of Jane, the wife of John Thornton, during her lifetime).

Marriage bond in Surry Co. N.C.: Jane Slater to John Thornton Sept. 3 1808 signed by James A. Thornton.

Henry Basensy to Henry Slaughter deed 1/4 of 2 lots (#73-74) in E. sq Salisbury, proved by Mat. Troy Aug. 1786 (over) Please to release from Henry Sluder & wife to Peter Cain for 261 acs Dec 10-11 1763 proved by Jacob Waggoner. (over) (Chas. Slagle.

Deed from Geo Koons & wife to Henry Sluder for 125 acres Aug. 1 1789 proved by

Lease & Release from Henry Sluder & wife to Jacob Waggoner for 597 acres on Sept 24-5 1766 prov-d by John Braley. (over)

April 15 1763: Lease & release from Henry Sluder & wife to Jacob Wagner for 170 acres --- 13-12 1763 proved by Will Lynn. Another (?) for same acreage on April 13 1763 proved by Esq. William Lynn.

Feb. 8 1794: "Henry Sleighter from George Smiths to Beard's Ferry" is appointed overseer of the road.

Book 18 page 694: July 18 1803, Wm. Lane--no wife--lets Lazarus Hege (oth of Rowan), have 167 acres on Bear? Creek & Reedy Creek next Phil Sowers, Henry & Charlie Tayers, Jas. Hill & A salom Goss, witnessed by Isaac Sluder.

Marriage bonds: Elizabeth Sludder to Manning Brookshire Dec. 14 1790 Jesse Brookshire.

Mary Sluder to Hugh McCreary Aug. 6 1787 signed Reuben Pew (Jno. Macay). Nancy Lloyd Wilson July 1 1789 Wm. Daney (Wm. Alexander).

Will of Henry Sluder (Book D page 23) made July 18 1799 probated Wife Elizabeth. Sons: Isaac (all the land). Daughters: Patsey McCleary, Nancy Wilson, Elizabeth Brooksher & Charly McCleary. Exrs: wife & son Isaac. Witnesses: Joseph Clark, William Worner & Peter Easter Jr. The will of Henry Sluder proved by Peter Esther on Feb. 3 1801. Elizabeth & Isaac Sluder qualified as Exrs.

Book 25 page 197: On March 2 1818, Colonel Joseph Clarke (no wife signs) of Lincoln Co. Tenn., lets James Douthet have lot # 3 or his portion of the estate of Esq. Thomas Felps deceased (which he bought at public sale on an attachment due him,) for \$174.50, witnessed by Mack Crump & Alpha Peebles in May term of 1819. (This may have been something over 82 acres? faulty deed).

Book 23 page 229: On Oct. 14 1814, Harrod B. Pruett--a planter of Rowan Co. N.C. lets Esq. Thomas Clark of Lincollen Co. Tenn., have a negro slave, Lewis, (who is all right excepting a sore on his leg caused by a burn when a child) now aged 13 or 14 years old, for \$355.00, witnessed by Joseph Clarke & Joseph Chaffin & acknowledged in Nov. 1814.

Book 18 page 454: On Oct. 18 1802, Edward Hughes, a mill-right, lets Elizabeth Sluder (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have his goods & chattels for to be paid Feb. 15 1808, witnessed by Henry Cooper & Joseph Clarke & proved by latter in Nov. 1802. (These are household things too numerous to include here).

Book 18 page 270: On --- 182-; Isaac Gail & wife Elizabeth of Wilkes Co. N.C., let Fielding Slater of Rowan Co. N.C., have their undivided 1/7 of 250 acres on Bryan's Mill Creek next Joseph Locker, David Enochs & Joel Johnson, for \$40.00, acknowledged on March 16 1826 by them before Judge J. J. Daniel at Wilkesborough.

Book 14 page 148: On May 4 1795, Michael Whorley--no wife signs-- lets Peter Easter (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 300 acres next val Leonard, Geo. Spraker, Michael Easter, Daniel Waggoner & Michael Sheckly on Abbotts Creek, for 150 pounds, proved by Michael Sappen

Book 5 page 474: Henry & Mark Sluder witness a deed from Mathias Sapefield & wife Catharine to Christopher Elrod (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) for 284 acres on north side of Yadkin River on its bank, on Feb. 14 1764. (this had been part of 587 acres which Earl Granville let William Linville have on April 28 1753, he let Adam Sell have by indenture on June 16 1753 & he let Mathias Sapefield have in same way on Oct. 4 1754).

The will of Peter Kane (Book C page 235) made while in good health on Dec. 10 1791. Wife Catharina. Sons: Leonhard & Abraham (who are the executors, and get the land bought of Henry McCulloch, also a State Grant on both sides Farmers Creek, also 190 acres with horses & farm utensils, but they are to keep the widow unless she remarries), Peter & Jacob (who are to have 30 pounds each) & John. Daughters: Elizabeth (wife of Daniel Waggoner), Catharina (wife of Peter Worlow) & Susannah. Witnesses: Catharina Van Hogler Philip Sink & Henry Davis. The 260 acres bought of Henry Sluder is to be sold & proceeds divided among the children.

Book 13 page 764: On Dec. 25 1794, Leonard & Abraham Cain (executors of the will of deceased Peter Cain late of Rowan Co. N.C.) let Daniel Waggoner of Rowan, have the plantation on the north west side of Daniel Waggoner's plantation, on Farmers Creek (a prong of Abots Creek), (which the deceased Peter Cain bought from Henry & Elizabeth Sluder), for 216 pounds & 5 shillings witnessed by Sion Daniel & Frederick Miller & proved by the latter in Feb. 1795.

Jan. 12 1764: Lease & release from Henry Sluder & wife to Peter Cain for 261 acres Dec. 10-11 1763 proved by Jacob Wagner.

Book 5 page 440: On Dec. 10 1763, Henry Sluder & wife Elizabeth, let Peter Cain (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 261 acres on north side of Farmers Creek waters of Abbots Creek--part of a survey to Henry--for 5 shillings witnessed by Jacob Wagner & proved in Jan. court of 1764. The release price on Dec. 11 1763, is 20 pounds. This begins at a pine & goes south 45 chains to a post oak, east 58 chains to a pine, north 45 chains to a poplar then to the beginning.

Oct. 20 1762: Deed from Earl Granville to Henry Sluder for 597 acres May 10 1762 is proved by John Frohock.

Book 5 page 61: Aug. 28 1762, Earl Granville lets Henry Sluder of Rowan Co. N.C., have 597 acres on vacant land on the fork of Abbots Creek next Samuel Farmer, beginning at a post oak & going north 50 degrees west 15 chains to a pine corner of --Farmer, then with his line west 43 chains to a dogwood, north 102 chains to a pine, east 60 poles to poplar then south to the beginning, for 10 shillings with yearly rental of

Book 6 page 317: On Sept. 24 1766, Henry Sluder & wife Elizabeth, let Jacob Waggoner have 166 acres on Farmers Creek waters of Abbots Creek next Peter Cane, for 5 shillings--the release price on following day was 90 pounds--witnessed by John Braly & William Steel. This is in the middle of a survey of 597 acres which Earl Granville let Henry Sluder have on Aug. 28 1762.

Book 20 page 123: On Oct. 10 1807, Charles Fredric Bagge lets Joseph Mengelberg have 1/4 of lots #73 & 74 running on Corbin St. next Peter Rape & Peter Little & next the two lots which were conveyed to Peter Little, for \$212.00, witnessed by ? & Lazarus Hege & proved in 1809. (These had been conveyed by Daniel Little to Henry Ezensen in 1774, he let Henry Sleather(?) have them in 1786, he let Martin Basinger, he let Christian Shrott, he let George Frolich, he let Peter Foltz, he died & his executor-- Henry Ripple-- let Peter Foltz have them & he let Charles Fredric Bagge have them).

Aug. 12 1786: Deed from Henry Sluder to Martin Basinger for parts of two lots in east sq. Salisbury, Feb. 8 1786 proved by Peter Faust.

Aug. 12 1786: Deed from Henry Easonsy to Henry Slughter for 1/4 two lots (#73 & 74) in east sq. Salisbury proved by Mathew Troy.

Rowan Co. N.C. Census of 1790 (page 1035) Henry Sluder had 1 male over 16 yrs. 2 females & 2 others in his family next John Stuart Sr. & Isaac Sluder. Isaac Sluder had 1 male over 16 yrs. 2 under & 2 females (next Henry Sluder & Christian Simermon Jr.).

Book 31 page 34: On Aug. 13 1830, Valentine Pence owes William H. Slaughter-- (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) \$20.00, also owes Jacob Travis money & is unable to pay, so lets Wm.H.Slaughter have 1/5 of his crop of wheat (30 bushels) & 1/5 of his crop of corn & other produce, also his household & kitchen furniture, witnessed by S.Silliman. A Deed of trust.

Book 32 page :Thomas Hague's tavern went broke

Book 46 page 541: April 5 1850, Elizabeth Slaughter, James M.Slaughter, Samuel P.Beasley & wife Elizabeth H. of Madison Co. & Lewis G.Slaughter of Hines Co.Miss., let Mace C.Pendleton of Rowan Co.N.C., have (now in possession of the Editors of the Watchman, the said Pendleton, ---Bruner & ---Jones) in the great south square of Salisbury next lot #3 --- Roberts (formerly Slaughter's Tavern) & the brickhouse of C.W.West, for \$800.00,

Book 33 page 256: William H.Slaughter intending to pay up some debts as "I am about to visit the South west, where I may probably remain for one year", makes a deed of trust to Samuel Silliman (both of Salisbury,N.C.) on June 30 1837, witnessed & proved by Isaac Burns on Aug. 7 1837.(For \$1.00.) The Kern's tract, the lot next Hague's Tavern, 2 back lots--all in the south square of Salisbury, crop, farming tools, wagon, two sections of land bought in copartnership with Gabriel S.Book, 5 mules, 3 horses, 1 carriage & harness, slaves (Hercules, July, Jordon, John, Henry, Charles, Milly & her 2 children, Saby, Nancy, Darkess, Phebe, Weaver, Betsy, Milly & her 3 children, & Tempey), as he is indebted to the State Bank at Raleigh for \$6000.00 with his friends William Chambers & William S.McCay as security; also indebted to Ross Simonton of Wredell Co.N.C. for between three & four hundred dollars.

(In 1758, James Hagan was ordinary keeper on lot #1 in the west square of Salisbury, but possibly was not prosperous).

Book 33 page 122: Aug.19 1835, John McClelland & John Giles--no wives sign--let William H. Slaughter (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have lot # in the great south square of Salisbury on Main St. & the tavern where Lewis Slaughter lives, for \$100.00, witnessed & proved by Henry Giles in May 1838.

March 1820 Court Minutes Case #23: Wm.H.Slaughter vs John McClelland & others. The Jury decides that the defendants McClelland convey all his undivided moiety to the complainant & that the other defendants (Robert Turnbull, Edward Randall & wife Margaret, Benjamin Harrison & wife Nancy, Ara ---- & wife Mary) convey their undivided moiety of houses & lots--the said Robert H. & Mary W.Turnbull to do within six months after they become of age) & Esq. Montfort Stokes to pay equal portion likewise the admrs. of deceased Robt Torrance

Book 28 page 170: On Oct. 11 1824, John Beard Sr. & John Beard Jr.--no wives sign--let John Giles, Junius Sneed, Moses A.Lock, George Vogler & William H. Slaughter (Commissioners of Salisbury, & their successors, subject to their restrictions), have lots #68, 75 & 76 in the great east square of Salisbury next lot #67 upon which the Church stands, for \$100.00, witnessed by R.Macnamara & John McClelland & proved by the latter in Feb. 1825. (This is to be used as a graveyard for the citizens of Salisbury).--See Lutheran Church.

Book 11 page 477: Feb.18 1788, Martin Basinger--no wife signs--lets Christian Shret have 1/2 of lots #73 & 74 being 72 sq.poles on Corbin St., for 70 pounds, witnessed by Is.Beard & James McEwen & proved by the latter in Aug. 1788. (This was formerly conveyed to Peter Little, Daniel Little let Henry Essenca have who deeded it to Henry Sleighter in 1786).

Book 10 page 453: Feb.8 1786, Henry Sleighter (a German & no wife signs) lets Martin Basinger--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 72 sq. poles being 1/2 of lots 73 & 74 in the east square of Salisbury, beginning next the part of those two lots formerly conveyed to Peter Little, & going along Corbin St. 3 poles wouth west to Peter Rape's, then south-east along his line to Peter Little's, then northwest along his line, for 70 pounds, witnessed by George Dunn & Peter Faust & proved by the latter in Aug. 1786. (Henry Easeney let Henry Sleighter have this).

Sept Court 1819: William H.Slaughter vs John McClelland & others. The Clerk & Master of Equity is appointed guardian of the infants Robert & Mary Turnbull in said Case. (Sept.1820 John Murphry succeeds Esq. Montfort Stokes as guardian--see to the right).

Book 31 page 37: On May 15 1830, Henry Slichter is indebted to Fielding Slater for about \$60.00 (with John Clement trustee,) for two horses with Jacob March security, proved May 1830. (This may be inaccurate).

Aug. 1834: Administration on the estate of Henry Slichter is granted to William March who gave bond of \$400.00 with William B. Wilson & William Wyatt as security.

Nov. 19 1814: Henry Slichter, Thomas L. Cowan, Daniel Cress & Esq. John Murphy are to lay off the dower for the widow of John Hampton.

Book 27 page 494: April 26 1823, Henry Slichter (a German & no wife signs) lets Stephen L. Ferrand (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have $\frac{1}{4}$ of lot #10 in great south square next said Ferrand, Thomas Allison & Samuel Lemly, for \$200.00, witnessed by D. McGill & Samuel Lemly & proved by the latter in May 1823.

The Carolina Watchman of Oct. 26 1876 (published by J. J. Bruner, with T. K. Bruner as associat Ed.), gives a list of the enterprises of Salisbury, N.C., in 1815, which shows that Wm. H. Slaughter was an hotel keeper & Henry Slichter was a shoe-maker.

Feb. 10 1809: Administration on the estate of Richard Dickson is granted to Henry Slichter who gave bond of 100 pounds with G. Bettz.

Feb. 9 1813: Henry Slichter is appointed administrator of deceased Peter Bettz & gave bond of 50 pounds with George Bettz security & qualified.

Book 26 page 745: Nov. 20 1821, Henry Slichter--no wife signs--lets Charles Biles (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have $\frac{3}{4}$ of lot 14 in the east square of Salisbury for \$200.00 witnessed by John Fulten & John Albright & acknowledged in Nov. 1821.

Book 27 page 358: Nov. 16 1822, Esq. John Beard as high-sheriff (on vendition Exponas against Benjamin Pearson & Henry Slichter for \$829.29 debt with 4 pounds 19 shillings & 3 pence costs with orders to sell, did so Feb. 21 1822 for \$200.00 lots #7 & 15 in the east square of Salisbury (which belonged to said Benjamin J. Pearson) witnessed & proved by John Giles in Nov. 1822.

Book 26 page 633: Feb. 1 1820, Henry Slichter (a German?--no wife signs) lets Stephen L. Ferrand--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 36 sq. poles of $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot 10 in the great south square of Salisbury, for \$200.00, witnessed by Henry Allemeng & Isaac Burns & proved by the latter in Feb. 1820.

Marriage bond: Mary Slichter to Duncan McGill Feb. 27 1823 signed by Michael Swink.

Feb. 19 1827: Administration on the estate of deceased Duncan McGill is granted to Henry Slichter (as the widow relinquished), who gave bond of \$500.00 with Alexander Boyd & Aquilla Chesher.

Book 32 page 327: June 21 1834, John McClelland of Sumpter District S.C.--no wife signs--lets John H. Hardie of Rowan Co. N.C., have lots #7 & 15 in the great east square of Salisbury, N.C. (which he bought of Henry Slichter) & his interest in lots #8 & 16 (which he bought of Fullenwidars), for \$250.00 witnessed & proved by Junius Sneed in Feb. 1835.

Book page 45: June 15 1785, Henry Issensey of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Henry Slichter of Salisbury N.C., have $\frac{1}{2}$ or 72 sq. poles of lots 73 & 74 in the east square of the town, including the house & improvements where Bartholomew Coffey formerly lived next the parts formerly conveyed to Peter Little & Peter Rape, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Michael Troy & Mat Troy & proved by the latter in Aug. 1786. (The trustees of the town let Daniel Little have this).

Book 5 page 61: Aug. 28 1762, Earl Granville let Henry Sluder of Rowan Co., N.C., have 597 acres of vacant land on a fork of Abbots Creek, next Samuel Farmer, beginning at a post oak, going north 50 degrees west 15 chains to a pine on the corner of Farmer, west with his line 43 chains to a dogwood, north 102 chains to a pine, east 60 chains to a poplar, then south to the beginning, for 10 shillings sterling, with the yearly rental of 23 shillings & 11 pence (which is at the rate of 3 shillings sterling the 100 acres),
