May 7 1777: The will of Jacob Beck is proved by William Cate, Catherine & Jacob Beck Jr. are the executors.

The will of Jacob Beck Sr. (book A page 237) made while "weak in Body" on Nov. 2 1775. He may be a Dutchman. Wife Catherine (where I live while a widow). Sons: Jacob & Ludwick (who are to have the land equally). Exrs: wife & son Jacob. Witnesses: two Dutchmen (?) & William Mitchell.

Mr. Buerbaum, a German, says Beck means a small stream. In Census of 1790, Ludwick Peck has 1 male over 16 & 2 females including heads of family. In Heidelberg Lutheran Evangelical Church in 1793, Ludwig Beck & wife were communicants, also in 1810. Voluntine Beck was a Moravian Minister in 1778. (over)

Book 11 page 63: On Sept. 14 1786, John Brunts & wife Elizabeth let Abraham Welty--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 500 acres on east side Dutchmans Creek & both sides of Seder & Cubb Creeks next west end of Wiltey's mill-dam, for 735 pounds, witnessed by Marge Brunts & John Hendricks & proved by the latter in Aug. 1787. (This had originally been granted Peter Beam who let John Allen, who let Joseph Bryan, who let Richard Jacks, who let John Brunts have it).

Book 7 page 242: On , Dr. Henry Freeling--no wife signs--lets John Baxter have 115 acres on Hunting Creek & Bear Creek next Michael Beam's warrant, Charles Baxter, Peter Beam & Abraham Renshaw, for 150 pounds, witnessed by Elizabeth & George Hice & proved by the latter in May 1800. (This is part of a State Grant to William Hall on Oct. 25 1786 & he let Dr. Henry Freeling have it on March 31 1790).

Book 17 page 244: On April 17 1797, Dr. Henry Freeling & wife Elizabeth, let Charles Baxter & wife Ann--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 100 acres on Hunting Creek & Bear Creek next Michael Beam, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Robert Deal & John Baxter & proved by the latter in May 1800.

Book 12 page 342: On March 1 1791, William Hall--Abigail also signs--lets Dr. Henry Freeling have 215 acres on Hunting & Bear Creeks next Michael Beam, Peter Beam & Abraham Renshaw, for 140 pounds, witnessed by R.Pearson & H. Pearson, while Alexander Caerns testified that Abigail relinquished her dower right. (This had been granted William Hall by The State).

Book 9 page 617: The State lets Jacob Beck. The will of Sentleger Beck (book H page 143) made May 15 1820 probated in May 1822. Three eldest boys (Nathan, James & Sentleger) where I now live & 4 other sons: Edward, Tsirel, Amos & Enoch. 3 daughters: Jane Armenta & Margaret (3 shillings each). Witnesses: Joseph Jones & Henirita Jones.

Mocksville, Davie Co.N.C., book 1 page 78: the will of James Beck--no date--but probated in Feb. 1846. Wife Mary. Daughters: Rachel E.Brooks, Edy & Nancy. Sons: James M.N.(one of the younger children as are Edy & Nancy). First wife's children: Mary Davis, Freeland St.Leger & Alfred (some money owed by Jehu & Jonah Moore. Witnesses: Enoch Beck & Isaiah Jones.

Marriage bonds: Catharine Peck to John Johnston July 18 1811 signed Lewis Peck
Ellender Peck to Adam Crow Aug.14 1786 signed Will Peck.

Book 31 page 158: Oct.1 1824, Aquilla Peck out of love for his daughter, Editha Peck, gives her the 190 acres where he now lives on Dutchmans Creek with the plantation utensils, household & kitchen furniture, and after her death, they are to go to my son, John Peck, witnessed by Haynes Morgan & Elizabeth Morgan & proved by the latter in Feb. 1831.

Book 24 page 58: April 14 1803, Samuel Beck pays John Trivitt (both of Rowan Co.--no wife signs) \$160.00, for 100 acres on Dutchmans Creek next James Bedwell & Aquilla Beck, witnessed by Nathan Craft & Scarlet Glasscock & acknowledged in Feb. 1817.

Book 30 page 111: Nov.1 1827, Madden Beck lets Sarah Casey (both of Rowan) have his right in tract on Bear Creek next Jacob Trout, Jno.Little & Beal Ija which was formerly owned by deceased Nathan Madden, for \$20.00 witnessed by David Tu

Book 31 page 168: On Oct. 20 1830, Sentleger Becke Sr.--no wife signs--lets Elijah Marlow--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 116 acres for \$70.00, witnessed by W.Marlow & Thomas Ratledge & proved by the latter in Feb. 1831.

Book 30 page 607: On March 13 1800, Isaac Updegrove--no wife signs--lets Aquilla Beck--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 100 acres on waters of Dutchmans Creek next ----Dagley, John Johnson & on the Georgia road, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Asa Cox, Paul Kester & George Moore & proved by the last named in May 1829. (Part of 250 acres granted said Updegrove in ----)

Beck didn't sign. by the latter in Nov. 1819. (Beck didn't sign). Book 23 page 242: Oct. 21 1814, James Beck (7) & Pleasant Oliver--no wives sign--let Wm. Steelman of Rowan Co.N.C., have 498 acres on waters of Cheathenquamins next Jno. Beeman, ---Granfil, Thos. Thompson & Henry Spier, for \$250.00, witnessed by Abraham Depoyster & R.Powell & proved

Book 28 page 190: Jan. 28 1817, Lewis Peck, Lewis Walter & Benjamin Brown (all planters of Ash Co. N.C. -- no wives sign) let Peter Sauer Jr. & George Sauer of Rowan Co. N.C., have 196 acres on west side of Dutchmans Creek next Col. Mumford & the old corner of Jacob Trees, for \$800.00, witnessed by G.P. Mumford & Peter Sauer & proved by W.L. Willson in Nov. 1824.

Book 6 page 468: July 10, 1767, John Allen - no wife signed - let Joseph Bryan, both of Rowan Co. N.C., have _____ acres on both sides of Dutchmans Creek, Cedar Creek & Cubb Creek next Squire Boone & Isaac Free, beginning on the corner of Tree & line of Boone at a W.O.S. & going with Tree's line north 85 chains to a mulberry, east 83 chains to a white oak, south 85 chains to a red oak, then west 83 chains to the beginning - it being what Peter Beam let him have April 12, 1763 - for 5 shillings

May 3 1785: "Administration on the personal Estate of Jacob Beck deceased, is Ordered to issue to Catharine Beck Widow of the deceased, who qualified and gave Bond with Elijah Renshaw & Gasper Seand(?) in the Sum of 100."

Aug. 1 1785: Account of Sales of Jacob Beck's estate. (Refer to back of the Minute Book of 1800 to 1807 for inventory of Jacob Beck's estate made in 1785 or 1786).

Book 17 page 412: On Dec. 2 1799, Catharine Beck & her son Daniel of Sevier Co. Tenn., let Ludwick Beck of Rowan Co. N.C. by power of attorney from Daniel (who is lawful age,) & her daughter & son-in-law (Elizabeth & husband Joseph Lanning), have 196 acres on Dutchmans Creek, (or 1/2 of land left two sons Jacob & Ludwick

by her deceased husband, Jacob Beck, until death then to be divided between the two said sons, however she now being willing &c.) lets him have it for 127 pounds & 10 shillings, witnessed by Isaac Linster & John Nearl & proved by the latter in Nov. 1800. (This refers to the boundaries made by the said testator by Michael Beam & land is on west side of Dutchmans Creek next Squire Boon & Isaac Free being part of 697 acres originally granted by Earl Granville to Peter Beam on Dec. 21 1761, he transferred it to John Allen, he let Joseph Bryan, he & wife Alice let Richard Jacks, he & wife Ann let Abraham Adams, he & wife Trifina let Michael Beam & he & wife Elizabeth let Jacob Beck have it).

Sept. 26? 1767: Peter & Michael Beam, Germans, are naturalized. Deed from Earl Granville to Peter Beam for 697 acres Dec. 21 1761 proved by a witness, John Frohock.

April 15 1763: Lease & release from Peter & Mary Beam to John Allen for 697 acres April 11 1763 is proved

Book 10 page: : On April 11 1763, Peter Beam & wife Mary let John Allen have 697 acres on both sides of Dutchmans Creek, Cedar & Cubb Creeks next Squire Boone & Isaac Free, for

Feb. 14 1771: Lease & release from Richard Jacks & wife to John Brunts for 500 acres Feb. 9 1771 proved by William Roberts. (over).

Feb. 10 1775 : Deed from Michael Beam & wife Elizabeth to Jacob Beck for 196 acres Sept. 10 1774 proved by Peter Beam.

Feb. 10 1775 : Deed from Abraham Adams & wife Triphina to Michl. Beckim(?) for 197 acres Sept. 10 1774 proved by Saml. Stephenson.

Book 8 page 284: On Sept. 10 1774, Abraham Adams & wife Trifena, let Michael Boehem, a planter, have 197 acres on the west side of Dutchmans Creek next Squire Boon & Isaac Free, for 61 pounds, 14 shillings & 8 pence, proclamation money, witnessed by George Smith & Samuel Stevenson & proved in Feb. 1775. (This had been "Originally Granted to Peter Boehem" by Earl Granville on Dec. 21 1761, & conveyed to John Allen, who let Joseph Bryan, who with wife Alice let Richard Jacks & he & wife Ann let Abraham Adams have it).

Feb. 8 1772 : Deed from Richard Jacks & wife to Abram Adams for 127(?) acres

Nov. 1 1771 proved by John Brunts.

The will of Peter Beam is proved by John Brunts & William Roberts in Nov. 1771. The will of Michael Beam is proved by John Brunts & William Roberts in Nov. 1771.

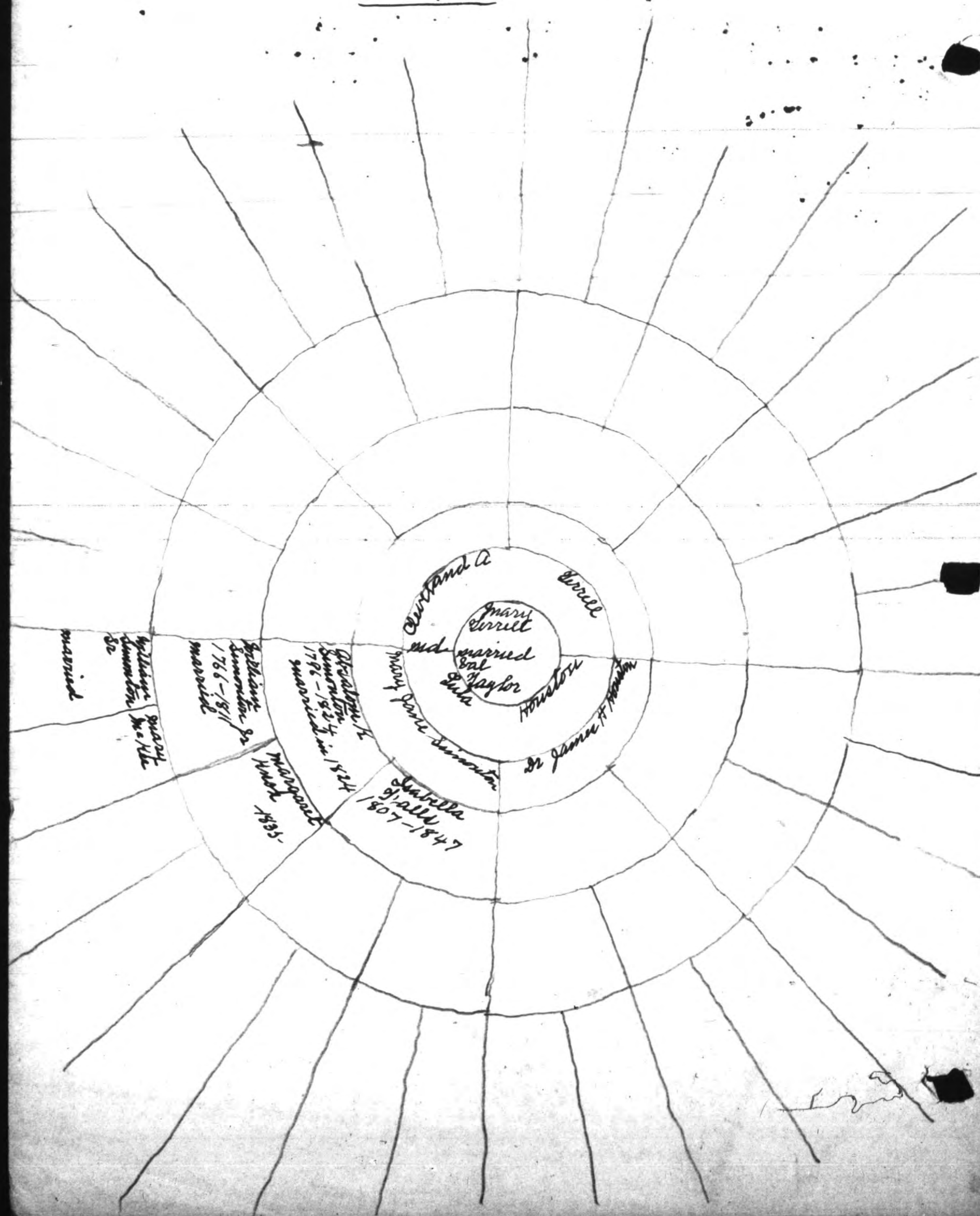

Hermoore with James Adkins & John Cabord as C.B.S, for Henry Peck husband of Ann, a daughter of the said deceased. The land is in the forks of Yadkin on Andrews Mill Creek next Thomas Dedman & Humphrey Marshall.

Book 22 page 392 or 492; Feb. 29 1812, Henry Beck & Anney Beck let Jesse Datim have 69 acres in the forks of the Yadkin River on Andrew's mill-creek next Jesse Knighten, Sarah Denman, James Andrews & Humphrey Marshall, for \$150.00, witnessed by Ph. Beck & Thomas Deadman & proved by the latter in May 1812.

Book 21 page 41: April 29 1805, Solomon Beck--no wife signs--lets Dolly Williams (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 110 acres on Lick Creek next John Wyatt, William Coles, & Anthony Peeler, for \$1000.00, witnessed by William R. Allin, Ryland Roberts & David Cox & proved by the last named in Aug. 1807.

Book 11 page 141: A State Grant, to Jacob Beam on Oct. 11 1786 for 335 acres on both sides of Reedy branch of Dutch Second Creek next John Redwine & John Hess, see #1273.

Deed from Michael Beam & wife Elizabeth, to Jacob Beck for 196 acres Sept. 10 1774 proved by Peter Beam. Also deed from Abraham Adams & wife Triphina to Michl. Beckim for 197 acres Sept. 10 1774 proved by Saml. Stephenson. (MCA)

Nov. 4 1777: Michael & Peter Beam are among those "Agreeable to a Citation the following persons appeared at this Court and took the Oath of Fidelity to this State".

Deed: Jno. VanEtten to Daniel Beam for 300 acres April 7 1785. Francis Neely.

A girl named Mary (nolatto) to have deraey of 100 pounds & to be taught Dutch & freed. Wife = exx. Wit: Basil Gaither, Elizabeth Sims? & John Rees. Nicholas Click =

Thursday Feb. 10 1791: "The Will & Testament of Michael Beam (now living) at his request was proved in open Court by the Oath of John Rees a Subscribing Witness, and the probate ordered to be certified".

Nov. 7 1791: "Last Will and Testament of Michael Beam deceased proved in Court by Basil Gaither; Letters Testamentary issued to Elizabeth Beam sole executrix qualified according to Law".

(697 acres lease & release on April 11 1763 recorded) Peter Beam & wife Mary let John Allen have land on both sides of Dutchman's, Cedar & Cubb Creeks adjoining Squire Boone & Isaac Free in 1762. (Joseph Bryan & wife Alice let Richard Jacks have 697 acres, (lease & release) for 5 shill (see below)

Peter Beam buys land from Earl Granville for 697-acres Dec. 21 1761 proved by John Frohock (Granville's agent).

Nov. 3 1784: "Administration on the Estate of Peter Beam, granted to Mary Beam the Widow & Relict of the deceased who qualified, & gave Security Francis Neely and Kuliff Vancleave in 400:0:0".

Marriage bond of Elizabeth Beam to George Wilcoxson 1767. Signed by George Boone & John Wilcoxson. (These are probably buried in Eaton's grave yard--if so Elizabeth died Dec. 15 1782 age 48 yrs, making her born in 1734 & George died Sept. 16 1785 age 55 yrs. & his Exrs = David & John Wilcox, his will probated on Aug. 8 1786 by David Jones.)

It had originally been granted Peter Beam but was conveyed to John Allen who conveyed it to Joseph Bryan, & was next land of Squire Boone & Isaac Free on both sides of Dutchman, Cedar & Cubb Creeks. Witnessed on Sept. 8 1768 by William Steel, John Braly & John Jacks. (Book 10)

All of the above appear to me as occurring about Mocksville, where Squire & Sarah Boone were buried, possibly some miles to the northwest. (Have read that the Boones moved up to Holman's ford when Daniel was about 17.) One Squire Boone married Jane Vancleft (bond dated July 11 1765, was stolen from the frame in our courthouse some years back).

It is witnessed by R. & H. Pearson, while Alexr. Gaerns testifies he examined the sd. Abigail Hall as to her right of dower. The land was granted Hall by the

Book 14 page 236: Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (#1031 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Peter Slagle, 121 acres on both sides the south fork of Swan Creek next James Stinson.

Book 19 page 301: July 17 1805, Abraham Slagle--no wife signs--lets George Peck (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 39½ acres on the south fork of Swan Creek next Barnet Cooper, original tract granted by The State to Peter Slagle, for 80 pounds witnessed by John Beck & David Lukenble & proved by the latter in Aug. 1805. (This was allotted said Abraham out of the estate of deceased Peter Slagle, by the commissioners).

Book 19 page 783: June 2 1806, Barnet Cooper--no wife signs--lets George Beck (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 40½ acres on both sides Swans Creek next George Beck, for 80 pounds, witnessed by Robert Bradshaw & Jonathan Morrell & proved by the latter in Aug. (This is part of the State Grant to Peter Slagely, who died & this was allotted to John Slagely as dower).

Mr. Jacob Beam of 52 Bayard Lane, Princeton, N.J. on Dec.3 1922 wrote for information of the Boehm or Beam family. His 4great grandfather, Jacob Boehm of Berks Co. Pa., After the death of his wife about 1752, the family scattered Adam (the eldest) & Peter (the youngest) remained at home, but Michael & Jacob went west or south, and as he saw in Census of 1790 2 Jacobs & 1 Michael in Rowan, he thought they might have been of his family. Mr. B-- corresponded with Prof. Michael A.Beam of Lincolnton Co.N.C. but feared he had offended him, for he stopped answering his letters, and hoped to get someone to find out more without letting Prof. know who wanted it. Another letter from Mr. B. on Dec.23 1922, saying that he is writing a book on the family, and wishes to mention all members of it in the U.S. Noticed that there were 2 Jacobs & Michael in Salisbury District in 1790 census &c. Arrivals in Philadelphia were as follows: Peter Bohm on Oct.27 1738, John Jacob Bone on Sept.24 1742, Jacob Bom on Sept.30 1743, Peter Bem on Aug.28 1750 & Michael Behm on Sept.26 1750. According to the histories of Bernheim & Williamson, certain Berks Co.Pa. settlers went to western part of Rowan, & he believes there is a relationship. The early migration to the interior was to the South or Southwest -- Ohio coming later. Jacob, Peter & Michael were commonest in his family.

This land "Originally Granted to Peter Bechem" by Earl Granville on Dec. 21 1761, was conveyed by Peter to John Allen, by Jno. Allen to Joseph Bryan, by Joseph Bryan & wife Alice to Richard Jacks, by Richard Jacks & wife Ann to Abraham Adams).

Deed from Richard Jacks & wife to Abram Adams for 127 acres of land on Nov.1 1771 proved by John Brunts.

Virginia Militia in the Revolutionary War, (by J. T. McAllister of Hot Springs, Va) Among the Declarations of Virginia Militia Congress, page 57, section 9: "BECK, JESSE - Amherst, Aug. 21, 1832. Born in Albemarle, 1758. Prior to March, 1781, performed two terms of three months each in the Albemarle militia, guarding British prisoners. Was under Captain James Garland, who was killed by a sentinel at Albemarle Barracks. Was also under Capt. Hunton, or Capt. Montgomerie. Col. Taylor, of Orange, was in charge. About March 1, 1781, under a draft of every fourth militia man for 18 months, he became sergeant under Capt. Benjamin Harrison. The company made rendezvous in Hanover, where it was attached to the regiment under Col. Paddy and Maj. Tinley. At Yorktown he saw the army of Cornwallis ground their arms. The regiment went into winter quarters at Old Cumberland C.H. In February, 1782, the corps was moved into Southern Service and was in Georgia under Gen. Wayne, till November. Was discharged at Old Cumberland C.H. in December, 1782, after nearly 21 months' service instead of eighteen. Remembers that when drafted that each man was paid a bounty of \$4.00, which by reason of depreciation was of little value. While in Georgia the army under Wayne watched Savannah, where the British were waiting transports to carry them home. Wayne's headquarters and his own encampment were at Mulberry Grove, the property of a tory, which, after confiscation, was purchased by Gen. Wayne."

Simpson was the principal at the time), Wake Forest College in 1882, from which he was graduated in June, 1886, to Dick & Dillard's Law School of Greensboro, N.C., in 1886 from which he was licensed to practice law in Sept. 1887, he then opened an office in Mocksville, N.C., through which he has managed to live & attain &c.

On June 5, 1890, he was married to Miss Fannie M. Dulin, (daughter of P.N. Dulin, a native of Davie Co., N.C., by Harriet E.---- born & bred in Mississippi), by whom has nine children; Alma, Jacob, Jr. (of the U.S. Army,) Edna, Philip (in the Medical Department Hospital Corps at Fortress Monroe, U.S.A.), Janet, Roger H., Sallie Mabel, Marjorie & Helen. The daughter Alma, married Wilbur Collins of Gates Co., N.C., & has a child, Stewart Collins. (This volume was published in 1919 so perhaps he has many grandchildren by 1944).

His father, Archibald Henderson Stewart, was a schoolteacher, Justice of the Peace (which exempted him from military duty in the Civil War), Deputy-Sheriff of Davie Co., N.C., moved to near Fork Church where he farmed until his death in 1905, in his eighty-fifth year. His wife, Jane Pack, was born in Davie Co., N.C., but descended of an old & honored family of Virginia--she died in 1907, in her eighty-ninth year, leaving seven children.
