Book 9 page 557; Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#361 at 50 shillings the .100 acres) to Michael Peter(?) 200 acres on both sides of Reedy Branch waters of Dutch Second Creek next John Hess & Francis Hoffman, beginning at a red oak & going north 55 chains to a post oak on the line of the said Hoffman, west with his line & crossing the branch, 57 chains & 15 links to a black oak, south 35 chains to a stake, east 57 chains & 15 links to the beginning.

Book 20 page 531: March 7 1801, Michael Peeler Sr. (a German & no wife signs), lets John Hess Jr.--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 200 acres on both sides of Reedy Branch waters of Dutch Second Creek next Francis Hofman & crossing the branch, for 130 pounds, witnessed by George H.Berger & Peter Casper & proved by the latter in May court of 1816. (The State granted this to the said Michael Peeler Oct. 10 1783

Adam Winkler (Reedy Creek waters)

Aug. 6 1791: Deed from Christian Leatherman to Adam Winkler for 100 acres Oct. 27 1790 proved by Wm. Moore.

Book 12 page 433: Oct. 27 1791, Christian Leatherman--no wife signs--lets Adam Winkler (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 100 acres on the waters of Reedy Creek, beginning above Jacob Hesleys field at a stake on the north west corner of the said tract (being a part of 400 acres whien The State granted the said Christian Leatherman), & going east 13 chains & 70 links to a nickory near a heap of rock, south 73 chains to a black oak on the line of Jonas Leatherman, west 13 chains & 70 links to a small pine, north 73 chains to the beginning, for 30 pounds, witnessed by Peter Jacobus & William Moore & proved by the latter in Aug. 1791.

Book 11 page #65: On or 25 1786, The State grants (#146 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Christian Leatherman 400 acres on the waters of Reedy Creek, beginning at a stake on Peter Jacobus N.E. in line of Valentine Beard, going north 36 chs. to a stake on valentine Beard's corner, west 80 chains to a stake, south 78 chs. to a small line, east 30 chains to a stake in line of Peter Jacobus, north 37 chains to a stake, then east to the beginning.

Adam Winkler (Waters of Pounders Swamp)

Book 11 page 231; Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1216 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Adam Winkler 300 acres on the waters of Pounders Swamp, beginning on the line of John Lookebell (25 chains from his northeast corner) at a pine, going with his line 25 or 75 chains to a small white oak, north 40 chains to a pine, west 75 chains to a heap of stones, then south 40 chains to the beginning.

Book 11 page 841: Adam Winkler--no wife signs--lets Jacob Lopp (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), have the above land for 150 pounds N.C. money, witnessed by ? & W. Bodenhamer & acknowledged in Feb. court of 1790.  
(The State granted this to the said Adam Winkler on Oct. 25 1786)

: Deed from Adam Winkler to Jacob Lopp for 300 acres Jan. 27 1789 proved by William Botinhammer.

Thomas Winkler (West side of Catawba River & Sherrill's Ford). T

Feb. 8 1776: "In a Return of Constables; William Best returns Thomas Shuford & Henry Rutherford (+)

Feb. 9, 1775; "Constables; Ordered by the Court that William Best serve as Constable in Mr. Beekman's District in the year of Thomas Winkler"

Aug. 5, 1774; Mr. Beekman is Justice from the Horse Ford to Tryon line;

May 6 1774; Thomas Winkler is appointed Constable instead of John Killian;

Feb. 4, 1773; John Killian is appointed Constable instead of Abram Anthony for the year 1773;

May 5, 1772; Abram Anthony is appointed Constable instead of Bestian Cline;

Feb. 7, 1772; "Bestian Cline along the Tryon Line at Rowan Side from Sherrills ford & the West Side of Catawba to Andw. Killians & the Adjacent Settlmt", is appointed Constable;

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The will of Adam Winkler Rowan Co.N.C., book D page 261.

"IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN! I Adam Winkler of the county of Rowan and state of North Carolina being weak in body but in perfect mind and memory calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die, I make and ordain this my last will and testament in the following fork:

FIRST I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God and my body to the earth, to be buried in a christian manner at the discretion of my executors and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it had pleased God to bless me with it I will and bequeath in the following manner, viz:

First of all I order that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid and also order that my moveable estate shall be appraised and shall continue on the land so long as my well beloved wife Catherine Winkler lives or else till my son Adam comes to the years of one and twenty and then the moveable part of my estate to be equally divided.

SECONDLY I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Winkler the land that Lyes on the west side of the creek with all its appertenances to his and his heirs Forever, lawfully begotten of his body, one yearling colt a mattock, one ax.

ITEM I give and bequeath unto my son Adam the home place with all its appertenances thereunto belonging to him and his heirs forever, lawfully begotten of his body.

ITEM that it is my will and desire that all the moveable part of my estate shall be equally divided amongst the following viz: my beloved wife Catherine Winkler and my well beloved daughter Dianna Motzinger and my well beloved daughter Mary Foughts and my well beloved daughter Magdelena Ham and my well beloved daughter Catherine Burkhardt and my well beloved daughter Barbara Perrin and my well beloved daughter Elizabeth Winkler.

AND LASTLY I do ordain and constitute Daniel Motsinger, and Dermottt Foutts the whole and sole executors of this my last will and testament and do hereby utterly disannull all and every will before named in any manner whatsoever, rati-

fying and confirming but this and no other to be my last will and testament.

Lewis Winkler (West bank of Abbotts Creek)

Book 12 page 408: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1369 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Lewis Winkler 105 acres on the west side of Abbotts Creek, beginning on its bank & the corner of William Frank at a beach, going with his line west 21 chains to a Spanish oak on the line of Henry Hinkle, south with it 12 chains to a black oak, west 12 chains to a black oak on the line of John Claver, south with it 64 chains & 50 links to a stake on the line of George Miller, east with it 29 chains to a stake, north 18 chains to a stake on the corner of Jacob Richard, west with his line 25 chains to a hickory on his corner, north 45 chains to a post oak, east 30 chains to a black --- on the bank of Abbotts Creek, then up its meanders to the beginning.

(Waters of Swearing Creek)

Book 12 page 686: Nov. 20<sup>th</sup> 1784, The State grants (#526. for 130 pounds) to Lewis Winkler 379 acres on the waters of Swearing Creek & both sides of a branch, beginning on the line of Lewis Winkler at a black oak, going with his line west 53 chains to a hickory, south 70 $\frac{1}{2}$  chains to a white oak on the corner of lot #15, east 53 chs; to the corner of Calvin? Shavers, north 70 $\frac{1}{2}$  chains to the beginning. (This is part of the confiscated real estate of Henry Eustace McCulloch at public vendue &c).

Book 26 page 903: June 6 1818, James Walling--no wife signs--lets Gasper Smith (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), have all of those lots of eight acres each (which were laid off out of the estate of Francis Winkler deceased to his heirs: Michael Warner & wife Catharine, Francis Winkler, Peter Winkler & Rinehart Winkler, Henry Clement, John Dancey & Beachem Hilton who gave a power of attorney to Henry Ratts, & the heirs of said Henry Ratts & in right of his wife, Barbary Ratts gave power of attorney to the said James Walling, as did? Jacob Miser or Miers & wife Polly), which the commissioners allotted Hannah Winkler, who was the widow & relict of the said deceased Francis Winkler, for ----, witnessed by Joseph Clark & Daniel Huffman & proved by the latter in May court of 1822.

Book 26 page 611: Nov. 21 1815, Esq. Henry Ratz--no wife signs--lets James Walling (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), have 61 acres on the waters of Potts Creek, beginning at a post oak stump on the original ----, going with the same north 70 degrees west 20.75 chains to a hickory on the original corner, south 20 degrees west 30 chains to a small hickory on the line of Conrod Grub, south 70 degrees east 20.75 chains to a stake, north 20 degrees east 30 chains to the beginning, for 50 pounds N.C. money, witnessed by Samuel Duceberry & W. Moore & acknowledged by the said Esq. Henry Ratz in Feb. court of 1816. (This is four of the lots in the division of the land of deceased Francis Winkler, allotted Rinehart Winkler, Peter Winkler & Frances Winkler & Beechim Hilton, who gave the power of attorney to the said Esq. Henry Ratz, being part of the 200 acres which Godfrey Ratts conveyed to the said deceased Francis Winkler).

(Waters of Potts Creek) & Reeds Branch.

Book 13 page 307; May 8 1793, Godfrey Rats (a German & no wife signs) lets Francis Winkler--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 200 acres on the waters of Potts Creek, beginning on the east side of Reeds Branch at a white oak, going north 20 degrees east 180 poles to a white oak saplin, north 70 degrees west 72 poles crossing the branch--in all 180 poles to a black oak, south 20 degrees east 120 poles, crossing the branch--in all 180 poles to the beginning, for 200 pounds specie, witnessed by Garshon Hunt & Thomas Carson & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1793. (Esq. Henry E. McGullich let George Reed have this May 1 1765, who indentured it to Zebulon Baird Oct. 21 1776, who let the said Godfrey Rats have it by indenture Nov. 22 1785).

Book 21 page 7: March 30 1807, John Sutton of Rowan Co., N.C.--no wife signs--lets Esq. Samuel Dusenbury of ----, have (which fell to the said Sutton from his deceased wife, Hannah, to whom it had been willed by her deceased husband, Francis Winkler, as her dower), on the waters of Potts Creek, beginning on the east side of Reeds Branch at a white oak, going north 20 degrees east 180 poles to a white oak sapling, north 70 degrees west 72 chains, crossing the branch--in all 180 poles to a hickory, south 20 degrees west 180 poles to a black oak, south 70 degrees east 120 poles, crossing the branch--in all 180 poles to the beginning, in trust & for 50 pounds  
(This is part of the 200 acres which Godfrey Ratts let the said deceased Francis Winkler have & it came to his widow during her natural life).

Lewis Winkler (Abbotts Creek)

Book 9 page 594: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#616 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Lewis Winkler 200 acres on Abbotts Creek, beginning on the line of —Burkham & the corner of Philip Gardner at a stake, going with the line of Burkham west, crossing said creek at 9 chains & 5 links--in all 29 chains to a white oak on his corner, north 40 degrees east with the line of Burkham, crossing a branch at 10 chains--in all 30 chains to a post oak saplin, west 35 chains to a post oak saplin on the line of John Wilson, south with his line 4 chains & 75 links to a black oak on his corner, west with his line 23 chains & 50 links to a white oak saplin, south 35 chains to a stake on the line of Philip Gardner, then east with his line to the beginning.

Lewis Winkler (Peach Branch & line of McCulloch).  
Book 9 page 607: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#610 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Lewis Winkler 200 acres on Peach Branch, beginning on the south side of the said branch at the corner of a tract of ---McCulloch, at a poplar, goinge east, crossing a branch at 20 chains--in all 35 chains to a black oak, north crossing Peach Branch at 15 chains--in all 20 chains to a black oak, east 15 chains to a pine, north 26 to a white oak saplin, west crossing a branch, 50 chains to a black oak on the line of McCulloch, then with his line to the beginning.

ook 13 page 667: Aug. 1 1794, Jacob Helsley--no wife signs--lets Adam Winkler (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 16 acres on both sides Reedy Creek next the original line & said Helsley, for 10 pounds, witnessed by Joseph Shell & William Michael & proved by the latter in Aug. 1794. (See elsewhere).

## Francis Winkler.

ook 25 page 444: Oct. 16 1813, Nash Glidewell--no wife signs--lets James Wallen (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 104 acres on Potts Creek & east side of Reeds Branch, for \$150.00, witnessed by Robert Wilson, George Wilson & Andrew Swisegood & proved by the last named in Aug. 1819. (This is the land of deceased Francis Winkler being the dower of the widow Hannah, now wife of John Sutten, who sold it to said Glidewell since her marriage).  
 ook 25 page 418: Dec. 9-1809, John Sutton & Hannah Sutton let Nash Glidwell--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have her life interest in some land on Reeds Branch, for \$75.00, witnessed by Gasper Freedle & Pascal Minor & proved by the latter in Aug. 1819.

Feb. 1803: Administration on the estate of Francis Wingler is granted Daniel Dusenbury & Hannah Wingler who gave bond of 500 pounds.

Feb. 7 1805: Additional amount of sales of estate of deceased Francis Wingler= 5.12.6

ook 21 page 7: Aug. 30 1807, John Sutten of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Esq. Samuel Dusenberry have acres on Potts Creek on the east side of Reeds Branch, crossing it twice, for 50 pounds in trust. (This fell to said Sutten by right of his wife Hanna through the will of her deceased husband Francis Wingler & by law of dower during her natural life & is part of the land, 200 acres which Godfrey Ratts let said Francis Wingler have).

ook 13 page 307: May 8 1793, Godfried Ratz--no wife signs--lets Francis Winkler (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 200 acres on Potts Creek on the east side of Reeds Branch & crossing it , for 200 pounds, witnessed by Garshom Hunt & Thomas Carson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1793. (Esq. Henry Eustace McCulloh let George Reed have this on May 1 1765, he let Zelulon Laird have it Oct. 21 1776 & he let said Ratz have it Nov. 22 1785).

 ook 11 page 661: Nov. 22 1785, Zelulon Laird, a 'Cordwainer' & wife Lydia, let Godfrey Ratz, a planter--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 200 acres on Potts Creek on Reid's Branch, for 200 pounds, witnessed by ? & Thomas Carson & proved in May 1789. (Esq. Henry Eustace McCulloh let George Reed have this on May 1 1765 & he let Zelulon Laird have it Oct. 21 1776).

ook 23 page 600: Jan. 26 1816, Esq. Henry Rats as attorney of the heirs of deceased Francis Winkler (who are Michael Warner & wife Catharine, Francis, Peter & Rheinhart Winkler, Henry Clement, John Daency, Seechim Helton & said Esq. Henry Rats in right of his wife Barbara) lets James Walling--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have their shares (8 acres in each when the widow's dower was laid off) for witnessed by Samuel Dusenberry & Wm. Moore & acknowledged in Feb. 1816. (Page 611 says 61 or 64 acres, for 50 pounds, & this is part of the 200 acres which Godfrey Rats let Francis Winkler have).

ook 23 page 644: Aug. 26 1805, Henry Clement Jr. of Rowan Co. N.C., appoints Henry Rats his attorney to collect 'all that of my Father in law (viz) Francis Wingler Deceased Estate that lawfully hath or doth fall or come to me being one of the lawful heirs or Legatees of the said Francis', witnessd Lawrence Clement & proved in Feb. 1816.

Feb. 1821: Deed from Godfrey Winkler to Robert Wilson for his right in the land of Francis Winkler Oct. 23 1820 proven by Christian Sink.

Same day: Deed from John B. Ford & Docy Ford to Robert Wilson for rights in land of Francis Winkler Oct. 23 1820 is acknowledged.

Book 26 page 67: Oct. 23 1820, Godfrey Winkler sells his portion of Hannah Winkler's dower to Robert Wilson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) on Potts Creek & Reeds Branch which was to be divided after her death, for \$14.00, witnessed & proved by Christian Sink in Feb. 1821.

Book 26 page 69: Oct. 23 1820, John Ford & wife Docy let Robert Wilson have their portion of Hannah Winkler's dower in estate of deceased Thomas Winkler (her husband) and fell to said John & Docy Ford, for \$14.00, witnessed, proved by Christian Sink at Lexington Court in Feb. 1821.

Marriage bond of John Ford to Dotia Winkler Aug. 16 1815 signed by Daniel Ford. (This is John B. Ford).

May 1820: Deed from Jacob Miars & Polly Miars to Henry Rats for their right in the land of Francis Winkler, May 12 1820 is acknowledged.

Marriage bond: Polly Winkler to Jacob Myers May 7 1816 signed Ephraim Daniels (John Gilesp?)

Book 13 page 580: May 13 1793, Henry Yarrough--no wife signs--lets John Owen (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 40 acres on Swaring Creek next said Yarrough & his old line at the head of a branch, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Robert Owen & Thomas Carson & proved by the latter in May 1794. (This is part of the State Grant to Lewis Winkler who let Henry Winkler have it, Aug. 17 1792, he let Thomas Owen have it Aug. 2 1792 & he let said Yarrough have it Feb. 17 1793).

The will of Ludwig or Lewis Winkler (Book E page 13) made April 13 1798. Wife. Sons: Henry & Francis. Daughters: Elizabeth Garner, Mary Peck, Catharina Ruckshire, Phoebe Ricker & Eliza Blaze. Exrs: sons Henry & Francis. Witnesses: Britain Heymore, Decey Dusenberry & John P. Saie

Book 16 page 315: Aug. 1 1798, Lewis Winkler--no wife signs--lets John Rickert (both of Rowan Co. N.C.,) have 60 acres on Abbotts Creek next John Claver, George Miller & Jacob Rickert, for 30 pounds, witnessed & proved by Owen Strange.

Book 12 page 408: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1369 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Lewis Winkler 105 acres on west bank of Abbotts Creek next William Frank, Henry Hinkle, John Claver, George Miller & Jacob Richard.
