Book 6 page 531: On Dec. 17 1767, John Miller & wife Mary of Rowan Co. N.C., let John Paterson of Mecklenburg Co. N.C., have 300 acres on north side Buffalo Cree for 5 shillings--release price next day being 60 pounds--witnessed by David & Benjamin Miller & proved # in Jan. 1768. (Earl Granville sold this to John Kirk-

Book 16 page 214: On April 21 1798, David Miller lets James Miller have 109 acres on the waters of Buffaloe Creek next Peter Eddeman, George Roseman, & David Miller for 5 shillings & the "natural affection of a father to a son" witnessed by Matt Brandon & Will or Witt Miller & proved by Matt Brandon in May term of 1798. (No wife signs deed.) This is part of a tract now occupied by the said David Miller.

Book 16 page 340: On April 16 1798, David Miller lets Hugh Horah have 288 sq. poles, or two lots in the Borough of Salisbury, for 30 pounds, witnessed by Robert Gay & Hugh Graham in Aug. term of 1798 (no wife signs). This land begins at the lower corner of the land formerly granted to William McConnell Jr. at or near the "Middle of the Swamp Commonly Called the Gallows Branch".

Book 6 page 89: Nov. 23 1764, James Miller & wife Ann let David Miller--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 407 acres on the bank of Buffaloe Creek next Abraham Miller & on up the said Creek, for 5 shillings--the price on preceding day was 15 pounds--witnessed by Francis Johnston & John Miller & proved in Jan. 1765.

June 8 1765: Lease & release from James Miller & wife Ann to David Miller for 407 acres Nov. 23-24 1764 proved by John Miller.

Book 6 page 202: On Sept. 22 1764, Esq. Walter Lindsay of Rowan Co. N.C., lets William Hall of Mecklinburg Co. N.C., have 560 acres on Fifth Creek next Mr. Thompson, for 15 shillings, witnessed by Alexander Osborn & Joseph Alexander & acknowledged in Oct. 1765. (The release price on next day was 90 pounds, and the land had been granted James Miller on March 25 1752 but sold by order of court by public vendue by Benjamin Milner & bought in by said Walter Lindsay Esq.

Book 4 page 531: Oct. 21 1761, Esq. Benjamin Milner as sheriff sold this on order from motion of John Dunn in July court 1761, (as James Miller got the land on north fork of Fifth Creek/ & had agreed to sell it to Esq. Lindsay for 30 pounds, but dying intestate, said Lindsay was debarred title, but came into court of April 1761 obtained administra

July 22 1761: Deed of sale from Earl Granville to James Miller for 560 acres on March 25 1752 proved by Esq. John Brandon. (over)

Book 23 page 314: On July 18 1812, Richard Miller--no wife signs--of Rowan Co., lets Samuel Miller Sr. have 73 acres on Fourth Creek next George Niblack, James Dickey & the heirs of deceased Robert Hughey, for \$250.00, witnessed by Alexr. Lowrence & Thomas Miller & proved by Alexr. Lowrence in Feb. 1815. (This is the land which Henry Hunter let Richard Miller have lately).

Jan. 12 1764: Deed from John Killpatrick to John Miller for 300 acres Jan. 11-12 1764 (lease & release),

Book 17 page 390: On Feb. 1 1800, William Anderson--no wife signs--gives his son Richard 300 acres on Buffaloe Creek next David Miller, witnessed by Matt Brandon & Moses Bellah & proved by latter in May 1800. (Earl Granville let John Kirkpatrick have it, he let John Miller have it, he let John Peterson have it & he let William Anderson have it).

July 21 1756: Lease & release from John Brandon & wife Elizabeth to James Miller for 640 acres is acknowledged.

Book 3 page 368: On July 20 1755, John Brandon Jr. (Elizabeth also signs) lets James Millar--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 640 acres on Buffelow Creek between the Western Path & John Nisbet's place, for 5 shillings--the release price on next day was 60 pounds, va. money--witnessed by Griffith Rutherford & James Linn.

July 22 1761: Deed from McCulloh to ---Miller for 332 3/4 acres Feb. 1759? proved by Andrew Hunt.

Jan. 8 1765: "orderd. John Miller have Letters of Administration of all & singular the goods & chattles of James Miller Decsd, the widdow having Relinquished her right in Open Court & Gives for Security John McConnell & John Scott in the sum of 400 Pro. & Quallified, according to Law &c".

May 3 1785: "Administration on the Estate of James Miller, is ordered to issue to Agness Miller, who qualified, and gave Security Robert and Willm. Nevins in the Sum of 300".

Book 4 page 417: On Sept. 17 , Earl Granville lets James Miller of Anson Co.N.C., have 560 acres in Anson on north Fork of Fifth Creek next William Thomson, for 3 shillings, witnessed by James Campbell & William Alexander & proved in July 1761 by Esq. John Brandon.

July 22 1761: Deed from Earl Granville to James Miller for 560 acres March 25 1752 proved by Esq. John Brandon.

Aug. 20 1768: Deed from Abraham Miller to Joseph Ross for 231 acres April 20 1768 is acknowledged.

Book 6 page 558: On April 20 1768, Abraham Miller, a farmer of Mecklenburg Co.N.C., lets Joseph Ross, a blacksmith, have 231 acres on the west side of Dutch Buffelo Creek on the bank of said creek next Robert McPherson, for 65 pounds, witnessed by Samuel Woods, Moses White & John Braly & proved in April term of 1768. (No wife signs). This land had been conveyed to Abraham by James Miller on April 21-22 1762.

July 20 1762: Lease & release from James & Cathrine Miller to Abraham Miller for 231 acres April 21-22 1762

Book 4 page 750: On April 21 1762, James & Katharine Miller let Abraham Miller have 29/ acres on west side of Dutch Buffelo Creek next Robert McPherson for 5 shillings--release price on next day was also 5 shillings--witnessed by John Brandon & William Williams & proved on July 22 1762.

Book 4 page 391: On April 2 1761, John, Earl Granville, lets Robert McPherson a planter of Rowan Co.N.C., have 588 acres on the ridge between Cold Water & Buffalow Creek next James Miller for 10 shillings, witnessed by John Frohock & W. Lucas & proved in April 1761.

Book 15 page 7: George Henry Berger, John Rantleman & Lewis Beard the surviving Exrs. of the will of John Lewis Beard deceased, let David Miller have 353 acres on Crain Creek next John Carson, ---Mourer & Reubin Phillips for 54 3/4 pounds, witnessed by Peter Faust & Jon. Beard in May term of 1797. (This land was granted by The State to John Lewis Beard) and he requested that it should be

Book 17 page 350: On May 9 1799 , David Miller of Guilford Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Andrew Holtzhouser Sr. of Rowan Co.N.C., have 353 acres on Crane Creek next John Carson, ---Mowrer & Reubin Phillips near the Rocks, for 95 pounds, witnessed by Hu Braly & Henry Leonard & acknowledged in Aug. 1800.

Book 13 page 492: On Aug. 2 1793, Reuben Phillips & wife Judith, let George Gents have 200 acres on Crain Creek & Dutch Buffelow next Timothy Brown, for 120 pounds, witnessed by ? & proved by Peter Eddleman in Feb. 1794. (This was granted him by the State on Dec. 20 1791).

Book 17 page 401: On April 29 1797, Timothy Brown Sr.--no wife signs--lets his son Timothy Jr. (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 150 acres on Middle Fork of Crane Creek next Captain Nathaniel Johnston, witnessed by Matt Brandon & David Anderson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1800. (This is part of a State Grant to Timothy Sr.)

:Deed from John Patton to David Miller for 1/4 of lots #6 & 14 in the east square of Salisbury Aug. 6 1790 is acknowledged.

Aug. 8 1797: "David Miller is appointed Guardian of Tunis and Charles Miller, his Sons for security of their estates descending from Andrew Pitts who gave bond with John Patton in the Sum of each bond £ 200, -0- £ 400-".

Aug. 4 1795: Letters of administration of Andrew Bettz (spelt Pitts occasionally) is granted the widow, Barbara (was a Bruner).

Marriage bond: David Miller to Elizabeth Petts Nov. 26 1789 signed Christian Shroat.

Book 17 page 655: May 1 1801, David Miller--no wife signs--lets Wm. Wheeler--lets Henry Slone, for both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 291 acres on Potts Creek next Henry Slone, for 577 pounds 10 shillings, witnessed by Jas. Colles & Ls. Beard & proved by latte in May 1801. (A State Grant to Elizabeth Dummon who deeded it to Bryal? Beard

Feb. 6 1794: "Fredrick Miller Esq. qualified as a Justice of the Peace".

May 4 1780: Jesse Philips & Conrod Grub appointed Constables in Capt. Miller's Company.

May 2 1780: magistrates in Hopewell District: Henry Davis for Captains Lopp & Billingsly, Thomas Phelps for Captains Ayckle & Heydrick, James Smith for
May 9 1781: Capt. Eakle is appointed Collector of Capt. Miller's Company.

May 8 1781: Hugh Morgan appointed overseer of the road from the Rocks to Anson Line.

Aug. 7 1781: "Ordered that Frederick Miller serve as Constable in the room of Jesse Phillips".

Feb. 8 1783: "Hugh Morgan appointed Constable in the stead of Fredk. Miller".

Nov. 6 1784: "Jno. Hampton appointed Constable in the Room of Hugh Morgan".
This is southeast of Salisbury.

Book 22 page 905: On Dec. 5 1795, Esq. Frederick Miller of Rowan Co. N.C., lets Alexander Cook have 150 acres on miry or "Mery fork waters of Muddy Creek" next Isaac Wilborn, Phillip Fox & Henry Lowry for 50 pounds witnessed by Lawrence Clinard & Stevan Osborn in Noc. term of 1813.

Book 18 page 397: On March 25 1797, John Fox--no wife signs--lets Esquire Frederick miller--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 240 acres on Brushy Forks of Abbots Creek next "Said Foxes homestead Lott which was left to Said John Fox by his honoured father Phillip Fox Ser. Deed.", & Robert Deal's old line, for 80 pounds, witnessed by Sion Daniel & Joseph Clark & proved by the latter in Feb. 1802.

Book 18 page 376: On Aug. 19 1801, Esq. Frederic Miller--no wife signs--lets John Anderson--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 200 acres on Brushy Fork of Abbots Creek next Jacob Houck & William Standley, for \$700.00, witnessed by William Standley & Britain Jones Heymoore & proved by the latter in Aug. 1802.

Book 18 page 427: On Oct. 27 1802, Esq. Frederick Miller--no wife signs--lets Henry Miller--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 45 acres next Henry Miller's old line, for \$90.00, witnessed by John Delap & Britain Jones Heymoore & proved by the latter in Nov. 1802.

Book 18 page 523: On Feb. 5 1803, Esq. Frederick Miller--no wife signs--lets William White--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 150 acres on Muddy Creek next Henry Miller, for \$300.00, witnessed by John Lindsay & Elijah Charles & acknowledged in may 1803.

Book 18 page 420: On July 31 1800, Ebenezer Jones--no wife signs--lets Reuben Standly--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 140 acres on Brushy Fork next Phillip Cink, William Standley & the Moravian Line, for \$400.00, witnessed by Jacob Mock & Britain Jones Heymoore & proved by the latter in Nov. 1802. (This is part of a State Grant to Frederick Miller Sr. who let Ebenezer have it).

Book 11 page 812: On Feb. 16 1789, Frederick miller gives to his grandchildren, George, Mary, Susannah, Catharine, Magdalene & Eve Grimes (children of Jacob & Catherine Miller Grimes) 300 acres on Farmers Creek

Nov. 3 1789: Deed of gift from Fredk. Miller to the children of Jacob Grimes for 300 acres Feb. 16 1789 proved by Devolt Mock.

Nov. 9 1787: "Ordered that the following Jury, viz: Fredrick Miller John Zanker (?), Jacob Mock Henry Rebbel, Devolt Mock, Jacob Clinehard Henry Betner Philip Craver, Phillip Fox, Adam Harmon & John Foc & Edward Burke to lay off & continue a Road the Nearest & best Way from the Dan River Road leading by David Morrows, from the County to Longs Ferry Road with John Zerker Overseer of said Road"

Book 22 page 452 of 552 (numbered twice): Esq. Frederick Miller--no wife signs--lets Barnabas Gilman (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 20 1/2 acres on Ready Creek & Fileys Creek next Capt. Francis Williams & Joseph Evans, for \$40.50 witnessed by Britain J. Haymore & Joseph Evans & proved by the latter in Aug. 1812.

Book 21 page 501: Esq. Frederick Miller lets Esq. Lazarus Hege--both of Rowan Co. N.C., have 243 1/2 acres on Reedy Creek (including the home plantation where sd Miller now lives & his mill) next sd. Hege, ---Felps, crossing Reedy Creek, Valentine Leonard, ---McDowell? (now Hufmans) for \$600.00 witnessed by Britain J. Heymoore & John Sco? in May term of 1809. (no wife signs deed).

Book 24 page 351: On March 12 1816, Joseph Clarke--no wife signs--lets Henry Grimes (both fo Rowan Co. N.C.) have acres on waters of Reedy Creek, for \$40.00, witnessed by Henry Cooper & Jacob Bareier & proved by the latter in Nov. 1817. (William Moore let John Matherly have this & Daniel matherly got it by law when his father, John, died & let Francis Williams have it).

Book 19 page 347: On Aug. 6 1805, Esq. Frederick Miller of Rowan Co. N.C., lets Daniel Day have 49 acres next Val Leonard on Abbotts Creek (which Joseph Greenwood conveyed to Edward Parnell) & another of 51 acres (in same vicinity and adjoining this,) of 51 acres (which John Thomas of Rockingham Co. let Edward Parnell have) for \$150.00 witnessed by J.A. Clinard & Britain J. Heymore in Aug. term of 1805. (Refer to another page)

Book 19 page 349: On , Peter Clinard lets Esq. Frederick Miller have the legacy left by his father, Philip Clinard deceased, which was to be used by his mother until her death then descend to him according to his father's will, for \$50.00, witnessed by Jno. Monroe & Andw. Caldclaugh.

Book 18 page 579: Feb. 23 1803, Esq. Frederick Miller--no wife signs--lets Joshua Wilson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on Frys Creek on both sides the main road leading to Salisbury next Philip Craver & Elisha Daniel near the old apple orchard & on the Moravian line, for \$200.00, witnessed by Anthony Hinkle, Britain Jones Heymoore & John Livingood & acknowledged in May 1803.

Book 19 page 350: On Aug. 3? 1805, Esq. Frederick Miller lets Elisha Daniel have 229 3/4 acres on the head branches of Fry's Creek & on both sides of the main road to Salisbury, next the Moravians' line, Peter Hinkle, John Serrechors(?) & John Wilson for \$500.00 witnessed by J. Willson & John Burkley in Aug. term of 1805.

On May 8 1790, the Minutes of the court of Rowan: a deed from Nathan Hinkle to Windle Hinkle for 30 pounds for 250 acres next Frederick miller, the Moravian corner, Jacob Long & Jacob Houk witnessed by John Grove & Jacob Fox & proved by John Grove.

Book 17 page 383: On Aug. 8 1799, Abraham Mason--no wife signs--lets Reubin Mason (both of Rowan) have 73 acres on Brushy Fork of Abbots Creek (part of a tract bought of Frederick Miller) next Abraham Farrington, Wintle Hinkle & the Parish Corner, for 27 pounds 10 shillings, witnessed by Wm. Horney & Solomon Farrington & proved by the latter in Aug. 1800.

N.C.) have two tracts of land for \$500.00, witnessed by Britain Jones Heymoore, Jacob Tacker & Frederic Raker & proved by the latter in Nov. 1799. They are adjoining: one of 150 acres on head of Simmermans Branch next Moravian corner (had been granted by The State to Henry Connely & he let Jacob Wyke have it Dec. 31 1786) & the other 126 acres on Reedy Creek next the Moravians, Ralph Picket, --Wykes homestead & Widow Whirlow (which had been granted Wyke by The State).

The next page shows that Esq. Frederic Miller--no wife signs--lets Jacob Miller have these for \$500.00, on Nov. 5 1799, witnessed by J. Clark

Book 5 page 60: May 10 1762, Earl Granville lets John Miller of Rowan Co. N.C., have 453 acres vacant land on both sides Sparks Creek, beginning next ---Lisbet's, for 10 shillings, witnessed by John Agar & John Frohock & proved in Oct. 1762.

Miller, (Sparks Creek).
May 12 1787: Deed from "John Miller & wife to Henry Miller Sr. 140 acres dated August 7th 1779, proved by Benoni Banning".

Book 11 page 20: On Aug. 7 1779, John Miller, a planter, & his wife Mary Magdalen, let Henry Miller Sr., a shoe-maker, have 140 acres on both sides of Spark's Creek next Frederick Bakle & crossing a creek two^{or} more times, for 84 pounds, witnessed by Benoni Banoung & Mary Pitts & proved by Benoni Banoung in May 1787. (This is part of a tract of 453 acres which Earl Granville let John Miller have on May 6 1762).

Oct. 20 1762: Deed from Earl Granville to John Miller for 453 acres May 10 1762 proved by John Frohock--a witness.

Book 5 page :
Nov. 6 1803: Administration on the estate of Frederick Pickle is granted to Tobias Pickle & Henry Shoave who gave bond of 1000 pounds with Lazarus Hegey & Phillip Hain.

Feb. 8 1772: Frederick Beckle is appointed overseer of road leading from Dobbs Parish to Reedy Creek, instead of George Hartman.

Book 6 page 340: On Oct. 9 1765, John Miller--a planter--(someone else also signs deed) lets Fredrick Böckel have 100 acres on both sides of Sparks Creek next George Hartman, for 15 pounds, witnessed by Geo. Hartman & Adam Spaugh & proved in Jan. 1767. (This is part of 453 acres got from Earl Granville on May 10 1762--see book #5 page 60).

Jan. 13 1767: Deed from John Miller to Fredrick Backle? for 100 acres Oct. 9 1765 is proved.

Book A page 106 of Division of Estates: The estate of Frederick Pickle, is divided on Jan. 24 1810, by Horatio Hamilton, George Fry, John Wesner, Jacob Wesner & D. Leathermon. It is on Spock's line, next Lazarus Hege & others, & lot #1 goes to Valentine Pickle which is 55 3/4 acres; lot #2 to Anthony Pickle is 55 3/4 acres; lot #3 goes to John Shore & is 55 3/4 acres; lot #4 goes to the heirs of Ingram & John Shore is 55 3/4 acres; #6 goes to Henry Shore & George Sheet being 111 1/2 acres; lot #7 goes to Tobias Pickle & is 55 3/4 acres.

Davidson Co. N.C., book 7 page 317: May 13 1840, Jacob Kimmel & wife Nancy, Henry Brewer & wife Elizabeth, Joseph Pickle, David James & wife Lucy (legatees of deceased Anthony Pickle) let William Weaver have their interests in land of deceased, next Christian Hege, for \$60.00, witnessed by Samuel Cecil & B. Str. Weesner & acknowledged in May 1840.

Division of Estates, book A page 74: A division of Henry? Miller's estate according to his will, for land on Speck's Creek next ---Miller, ---Beckle, Andrew Wesnor, Lazarus Hege, John White, Jacob Rominger, Horatio Hamilton & Peter Fishel is reported in May court 1812. Jacob Rominger & John White get the land:

The will of Henry Miller (book G page 129) made Feb. 23 1809 & probated in Wife Susan. Sons: Henry & Jacob. Daughters: Sarah & Susanna. Exrs: friends Lazarus Hege & Valentine Miller. Witnesses: Andrew Wesnor & Thomas Yarrell?

Book 21 page 66: On April 25 1807: Henry Miller & wife Susannah of Rowan Co. N.C., let Horatio Hamilton, of Stokes Co. N.C. (a farmer), have 41 3/4 acres on Sparks & Bear Creeks next the deceased John Miller's old tract, for \$167.00, witnessed by Lazarus Hegey & Nathaniel Markland & proved in May 1807. (This is 1/8th part of 334 acres belonging to the deceased John Miller and according to his will was divided among the eight children after the death of the widow).

Book 12 page 590: Jan. 25 1792, Frederick William Marshall of Salem, Stokes Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Rudolph Heier Jr., a planter of Rowan Co. N.C., have 171 acres on Muddy Creek next John Miller, George Hartman & the Wachovia line, for 8 pounds, witnessed by John Matthew Michrnt? & Gottlieb Shober & proved by the latter in May 1792. (The State granted this to said Marshall being tract #1164, on Oct. 25 1786)

Book A page 86? of Division of Estates: John Miller bequeathed, to his son Valentine Miller, 37 3/4 acres of land on Muddy Creek next ---Michael & Rudia Hyatt, so on April 3 1807, Britain Js. Heymoore D.S. surveyed it & the commissioners, George Fry & George Fisher, report to court of May

April 10 1765: "This day came into Open Court Jacob Lash & Qualified as a Justice of the Peace for said County &c". (Refer to Archives of the Moravians

Jan. 15 1767: "Christian Fry, in the room of George Hartman" is appointed Constable.

July 16 1767: Christian Fry is the Constable for Town Fork & Muddy Creek settlement in which Esq. Jacob Lash is the Justice.

Jan. 16 1768: Adam Spaugh is appointed Constable instead of Christian Fry.

Feb. 17 1769: Edward Parnall is appointed Constable instead of Adam Spaugh.

Aug. 1770: Esq. Jacob Bonn is Justice for Moravians & others from mouth of Bershabby to mouth of Muddy Creek including the Waters thereon" for taking taxables. Feb. 16 1771: Pearse Gwin instead of Edward Parnall, Jos. Edward

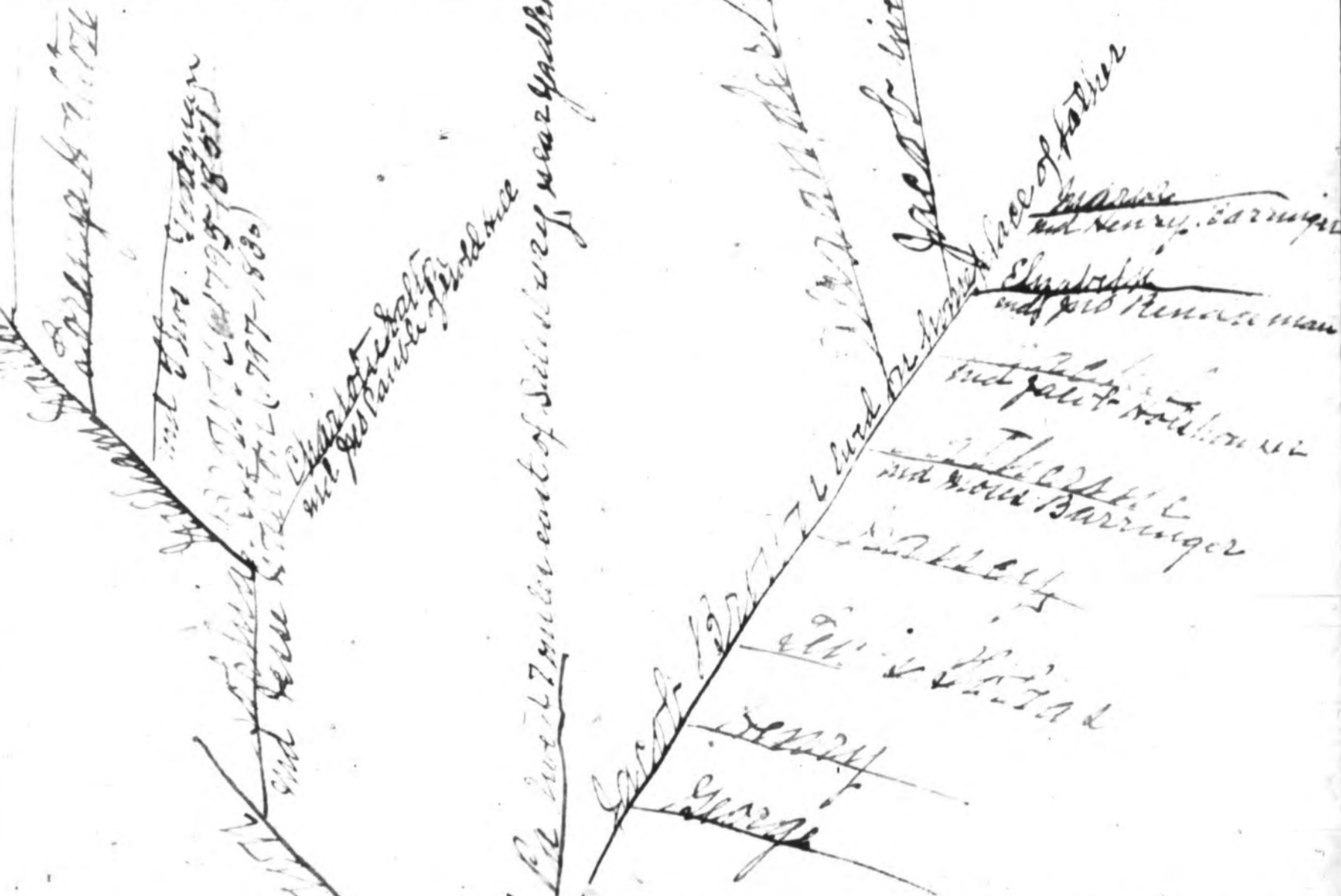

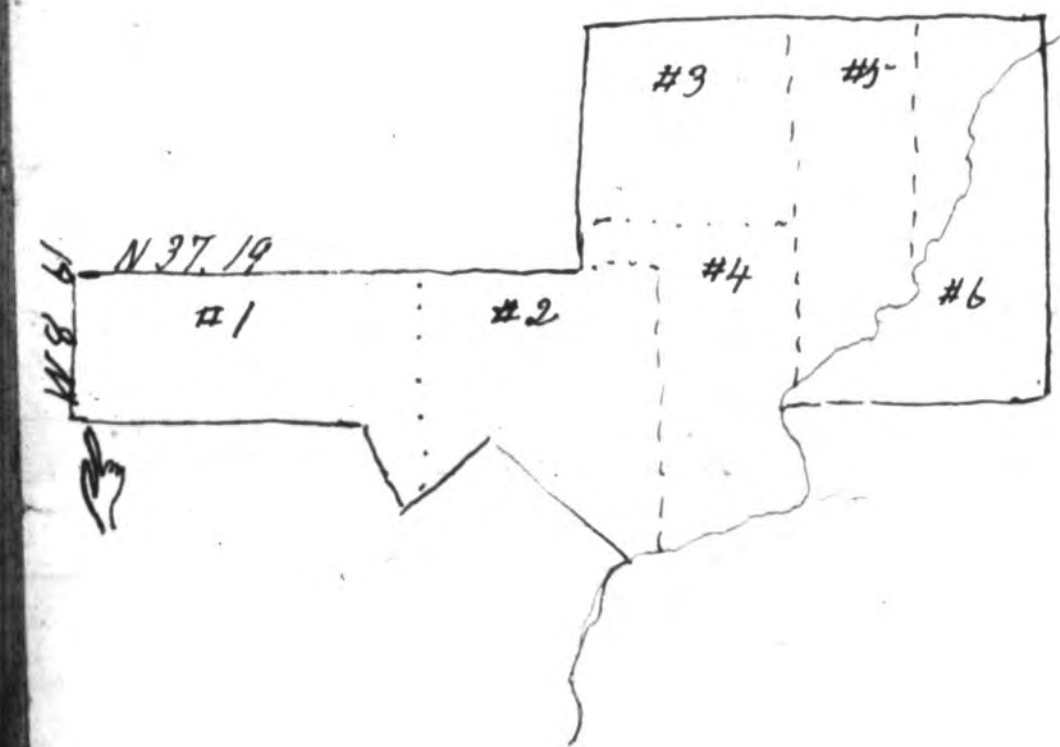

Brown, son of David (who married Miss Sarah Miller, &c), born July 12, 1802 died March 29 1879 & buried at St. Paul's Church, as was his first wife, Elizabeth Miller, born Sept. 27, 1810 died _____, by whom he had six children, Elizabeth G. born Nov. 28 1833, Mary A.L., born Jan. 11 1837, John D.A. born Oct. 10 1838, Sophia Mariah born Oct. 16 1839, Isabell G. born Feb. 25 1844--all of the above were buried at St. Pauls-- Simeon Jeremiah Michael, born April 29, 1846, buried at Chestnut Hill (Cemetery of Salisbury, as was his wife).
