

Joseph Tomlinson (Elishas Creek of Dutchmans Creek)

Book 15 page 281: Oct. 10 1797, Zachariah Allen--no wife signs--lets John Fox (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 300 acres on Elishas Creek next Thomas Allen, Joseph Allen, Joseph Dial & Thomas Brewer, for 300 pounds, witnessed by Rebeckah Hughes & Joseph Dial & proved by the latter in Nov. 1797.

Book 21 page 520: April 19 1804, John Fox--no wife signs--lets Joseph Allen (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 30 acres next Joseph Allen, for 30 pounds, witnessed by W. Moore & William Moore & proved by the latter in May 1809. (This is part of the 300 acres which Zachariah Allen let said Fox have). It begins at a dead pine, goes north 70 degrees east 29 chains to a small black Jack, south 16 chains to a small hickory, south 87 degrees west 22 chains to a post oak, north 38 degrees west 8 chains & 50 links to the beginning.

Book 23 page 430: April 8 1811, John Fox--no wife signs--lets Joseph Dial have 270 acres on Elishas Creek of Dutchmans Creek next Joseph Allen the said Dial, Thomas Allen, John Cheshier, Brumley Coker & Nicholas W. Gaither, for 350 pounds, witnessed by Peter Eaton & John Dial & proved by the latter on Oct. 11 1814.

Book 23 page 373: Sept. 28 1814, Joseph Dial--no wife signs--lets Joseph Tomlinson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 263 acres on Elishas Creek of Dutchmans Creek next Joseph Allen, Joseph Dial, Brumley Coker, John Cheshier & Nicholas W. Gaither, for \$900.00, witnessed by Samuel Smith & John Tomlinson & proved by the latter in May 1815. It begins on the corner of Joseph Allen & the line of Joseph Dial, goes south 87 degrees west 22 chains & 50 links to a post oak on the corner of said Allen, north 38 degrees west 8 chains & 50 links to an old pine, west 11 chains & 25 links to a hickory on the corner of Brumley Coker, south 42 chains to a pine on the corner of said Brumley Coker, west 8 chains & 40 links to a stone on the corner of John Cheshier & the line of said Coker, south 17 chains & 35 links to a black oak grub & a stone on the line of John Cheshier, east 42 chains to a black gum, north 11 chains to a hickory saplin on the corner of Nicholas Watkins Gaither, east 20 chains to a white oak on the corner of said Gaither, north passing a pine on the corner of said Gaither & Joseph Dial (on his north line), 22 chains to a black oak, west 14 chains & 15 links to a hickory grub, then north 22 chains & 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ links to the beginning.

Joseph Tomlinson (Elishas Creek)

Book 31 page 327; July 2 1831, Joseph Tomlinson--no wife signs--lets William Mock (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 148 acres & 20 poles on the waters of Elisha Creek on the original line, for \$440.71, witnessed by J. Tomlinson & Tho. Ratledge & proved by the latter in Aug. 1831.

Book 33 page 96; March 25 1836, William Mock--no wife signs--lets Fielding Slater (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 148 acres & 20 poles on Elishas Creek by the original line, for \$475.00, witnessed by C. Harbin & T. Cheshire & proved by the latter in May 1836. (The said Mock bought this of --- Tomlinson).

Book 33 page 85; April 15 1836, Fielding Slater--no wife signs--lets Tennessee Cheshire (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 148 acres & 70 poles on Alishas Creek on the original line, by a little branch, for \$475.00, witnessed by J. W. Etchison & Wm. Hawkins & proved by the latter in May 1836. (This is part of the tract which Joseph Tomlinson sold William Mock, who sold it to the said Slater).

Book 31 page 365. Joseph Tomlinsen--no wife signs--lets Tenneson Geshire, (both of Rowan Co., N.C.,) have 14 acres, 2 roads & 36 poles on the waters of Elishas Creek, beginning on the line of John Hunter at a post oak & going west 8 chains & 50 links to a stone on the corner of said Hunter & the line of John Geshier, north 17 chains & 35 links to a stone on the corner of John Geshier, east 8 chains & 50 links to a stake where a pine formerly stood, then south to the beginning, for \$45.00, witnessed by J. Tomlinsen & Thomas Ratledge & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1831.

Book 22 page 492 Or 592 (numbered twice); March 7 1812, John Tomlinson--no wife signs--lets James Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 133 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek, beginning on the original corner at a pine, going north 27 chains & 4 links to a stone, west 48 chains & 54 links to a black oak saplen, south 27 chains & 4 links to a black oak on the southeast corner of John Dwiggins, then east with the original 48 chains & 54 links to the beginning, for 400 pounds current money of N.C., witnessed by John Powell & R. Powell & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1812.

Book 19 page 790; Dec. 30 1805, Shadrack Dail & wife Susanna of Rowan Co.N.C., let John Tomlinson late of Guilford Co.N.C., have 133 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek, beginning on the original corner &c., for 391 pounds, witnessed by William Lane Sr. & Joseph Dail & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1806.

Book 16 page 87: Nov. 7 1797, Isaac Johnson & wife Elizabeth of Fittle Co., Kentucky, let Shadrack Dial of Rowan Co., N.C., have 133 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek beginning on the beginning corner of the original tract of the said Isaac Johnson at a pine & going north 27 chains & 4 links to a stake, west 48 chains & 54 links to a white oak, south 27 chains & 4 links to a stone on the original line of the said Isaac Johnson, then east 48 chains & 50 1/2 links to the beginning, for 29 pounds & 2 shillings & 6 pence, witnessed by Martha Whitehead & James Bryson & proved by the latter in Feb. court of 1798.

Book 10 page 112; Nov. 4, 1784, The State grants, (\$1009 at 50 shillings the 100 acres), To Joseph Smith 360 acres on Dutchmans Creek, beginning on the corner of George Eaton at a pine & going east 60 chains to a box elder on the corner of the said Eaton on the creek bank, north 58 chains & 30 links to a stake on the line of William Hunt, west with his line 63 chains to an ash, south 34 chains & 30 links to a post oak saplin on the line of Jonathan Eaton, east with his line 3 chains to a post oak on the corner of the said Eaton, then south with his line to the beginning.

Book 22 page 475 or 575, (numbered twice): Nov. 24, 1808, Alexander & Thomas Smith of Buchanan Co., N.C., Joseph Smith of Lincoln Co., Kentucky, & Lewis Smith of Rowan Co., N.C., --no wives sign--let James Smith of Rowan Co., N.C., have 360 acres on Dutchmans Creek, beginning on the corner of George Eaton at a pine & going east 60 chains to a box elder on the creek bank & corner of the said Eaton, north 58 chains & 30 links to a stake on the line of William Hunt, west with his line 63 chains to an ash, south 34 chains & 30 links to a post oak saplin on the line of Jonathan Eaton, east with his line 3 chains to a post oak on his line, then south with his line to the beginning, for 350 pounds, witnessed by Benjamin Garner & Ransom Powell & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1812.

Book 10 page 117, Nov. 4, 1784, The State of North Carolina, (1700) at 50 shillings the
 100 acres, the Town of Dutchmans Creek, beginning on the cor-
 ner of George Raten at a pine & going east 60 chains to a box elder on the cor-
 ner of the said Raten, north 58 chains & 30 links to a stake
 on the line of William Hunt, west with his line 63 chains to an ash, south 34
 chains & 30 links to a post oak sapling on the line of Jonathan Raten, east
 with his line 3 chains to a post oak on the corner of the said Raten, then
 south with his line to the beginning.

Book 23 page 32: March 17, 1812, James Smith--no wife signs--lets John Tomlinson,
 (both of Rowan Co., N. C.,) have 360 acres on Dutchmans Creek, beginning on the
 corner of George Raten at a pine & going with his line east 60 chains to a box
 elder on the creek bank & the corner of the said Raten, north 58 chains & 30 links
 to a stake on the line of Wilson Hunt, west with his line 63 chains to an ash,
 south 34 chains & 30 links to a post oak sapling on the line of Jonathan Raten,
 east with his line 3 chains to a post oak on the corner of the said Raten, then
 with his line south to the beginning, for 512 pounds & 10 shillings, wit-
 nessed by J. Powell & James Power & proved by the last named in the court of
 1814.

Book 10 page 90: Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (#818 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to James Scott 640 acres on both sides of Little Dutchmans Creek, in the fork of the Yadkin River, at the Mouth of Homes Branch, next John Little, Hugh Curren?, George Lock & on the east bank of Rocky Creek & up it next John Dobbins & Nathan Homes up to ---Lock's.

Iredell Co.N.C., book B page 792; Sept. 19 1797, James Scott Sr.--no wife signs--lets John Tomlinson (both of Iredell Co.N.C.) have 167 acres on the west side of Little Dutchmans Creek next Robert Holmes, Henry Clagett, William Summers, James Andrews & John Current, for 167 pounds, witnessed by David Bell & Henry Claygett & proved by the latter in Nov. 1797. (This is part of a Grant to the said James Scott Sr. on Nov. 4 1784).

John Tomlinson (Dutchmans Creek)

Iredell Co.N.C., book Q page 162: Dec.27 1832, Sarah Current lets John Tomlinson (both of Iredell Co.N.C.) have $13\frac{1}{4}$ acres on the bank of Dutchmans Creek next John Tomlinson, for \$39.75, witnessed by Carter D.Ham & George W.Locke & proved by the latter in May 1833.

John Tomlinson (Little Dutchmans Creek)

Book 10 page 90: Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (#818 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to James Scott 640 acres on both sides of Little Dutchmans Creek, in the fork of the Yadkin River, at the Mouth of Homes Branch, next John Little, Hugh Curren?, George Lock & on the east bank of Rocky Creek & up it next John Dobbins & Nathan Homes up to ---Lock's.

Iredell Co.N.C., book B page 792; Sept. 19 1797, James Scott Sr.--no wife signs--lets John Tomlinson (both of Iredell Co.N.C.) have 167 acres on the west side of Little Dutchmans Creek next Robert Holmes, Henry Clagett, William Summers, James Andrews & John Current, for 167 pounds, witnessed by David Bell & Henry Claygett & proved by the latter in Nov. 1797. (This is part of a Grant to the said James Scott Sr. on Nov. 4 1784).

James Tomlinson (Cedar Creek)

Book 27 page 531; Dec.22 1818, William White--no wife signs--lets James Tomlinson (bot of Rowan Co.N.C.) have $78\frac{3}{4}$ acres on Cedar Creek next Asa Cox, southeast side of the Georgia road, next ---Dagley & Joseph Howell, for \$150.00, witnessed by Nancy Brown, & John Pierce & proved by the latter in Feb. 1823.

Book 11 page 114: Oct.25 1786, The State grants (#1427 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Richardson Owens 400 acres on Jameys Creek of Abbotts Creek near the ford of said creek.

Book 11 page 660: Feb.17 1789, Richardson Owen of Caswell Co.N.C. let Benjamin Ward of Rowan Co.N.C., have 400 acres on James Creek of Abbotts Creek near the ford, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Josiah Tomlinson & Joseph Sutlive & proved in

May 9 1789; Deed from Richardson Owin to Benjamin Ward for 400 acres Feb. 17 1789 proved by Joseph Sutlive.

Book 16 page 175: Nov. 17 1797, Benjamin Ward of Randolph Co.N.C. lets Robert Moffitt of Chatham Co.N.C., have 400 acres on Jameys Creek of Abbotts Creek, for 200 pounds, witnessed by Samuel Tomlinson, David Vestal & L.Ward & proved in Feb. 1798. (The State granted this to Richardson Owen Oct. 25 1786 & he let Benjamin Ward have it

D.A.R.Records Vol. XXXII. page 80: Miss Dolly Williams Kirk, born in Tuscaloosa, Ala. joined as #31212 from Richardson Owen (1744-1821) born in Henrico Co.Va., went to North Carolina in 1762, died in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. He was a zealous whig, firm friend to liberty, a commissioner of Guilford Co.N.C. during the Revolution. See also #9440. She is the daughter of George Hamilton Kirk married Julia Ann Owen; granddaughter of Thomas Owen married Dolly Payne Williams; great-granddaughter of Richard Owen married Sarah Duty.

Book 11 page 119: Oct.25 1786, The State grants (#1084 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Richardson Owens 640 acres on Hunts Fork of Abbotts Creek.

Book 11 page 656: Feb.7 1789, Richardson Owen of Caswell Co.N.C.--no wife signs--let Samuel Tomlinson of Guilford Co.N.C., have 640 acres on Hunts Fork of Abbotts Creek, beginning in a field, for 500 pounds, witnessed by Joseph Sutlive Josiah Tomlinson proved by the latter in May 1789.

Book 11 page 159: Oct.25 1787, The State grants (#1129 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Richardson Owen 400 acres on Little Creek of Abbotts Creek next Richard Hanks & Samuel Parks.

Book 11 page 653-4: Feb. 17 1789, Richardson Owen of Caswell Co.N.C.--no wife signs--le William Tomlinson of Randolph Co.N.C., have 400 acres on Little Creek of Abbotts Creek next Richard Hanks & Samuel Park, for 210 pounds, witnessed & proved by Josiah Tomlinso in May 1789.

May 9 1789: Deed from Richardson Owen to William Tomlinson for 400 acres Feb.17 1789 proved by Josiah Tomlinson.

Book 11 page 654: Sept.8 1788, James Hilton--no wife signs--lets Josiah Tomlinson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 246 or 146 acres on Hunts Fork for 156 pounds, witnessed by John Viech, Jonathan Hilton & Moses Mendenhall & proved by the last named in May 1789.

May 9 1789: Deed from James Helton to Josiah Tomlinson for 146 acres Sept.8 1788 proved by Moses Mendenhall This is 146 acres beginning on the original corner at a stake & going west 18 chains to a pine, south 28 degrees west 28 chains to a stake, west 5.65 to a pine, south 23 chains to a post oak on the old line, east with said line 36.65 to a post oak then north to the beginning & is a part of 246 acres.

Susan Thompson

Aug. 1843: Ordered that George W. Brown who was appointed Administrator of deceased Susan Thompson in last term of court, relinquish it to R.J. Witty as next of kin (he having married the daughter of said Susan Thompson) who gave bond of \$6000.00 with John I. Shaver, Joel Jenkins & William Sheldon

Book 40 page 104: Nov. 29 1853, George Thomason? makes a deed of trust to George O. Tarrh (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) for 111 acres next Jesse Thomason, Joseph Mingus & others on Second Creek, some negroes &c, as he

Book 14 page 843: July 17 1794, Samuel Tomlinson--no wife signs--lets the "over-seers of the society of the people Called Quakers of the county", have 5 acres on Hunts Fork of Abbots Creek, beginning on the line of Nathan Hunt at a white oak, going west 20 poles to a black oak, south 40 poles to a post oak, east 20 poles to a hickory, then north to the beginning, for 10 shillings, witnessed by Joseph Tomlinson, Charles Pedglen & Nathan Hunt & proved by the last named in Feb. court of 1797.

(Mr. Tomlinson of Thomasville, N.C., who is descended of both Samuel & William Tomlinson, says he lives quite near this old meeting-house, north of the town, which was formerly a Quaker one but later became Methodist).

William Tomlinson (Abbotts Creek)

Book 18 page 605; April 10 1801, William Tomlinson of Randolph Co.N.C.--no wife signs-- lets Peter Myers of Rowan Co.N.C., have 50 acres on the east side of Abbotts Creek next John Avery, Abraham Cane, the said Myers, west side of said creek & David Fouts, for \$1.00 the acre, witnessed by Josiah Tomlinson & William Hoggatt & proved by William Tomlinson in May 1803.
