Deed From: John Garrett to Daniel Wood for 150 acres Nov. 1 1787. James Wood.
" Richmond Pearson to Vincent Wood for 200 acres March 22 1792. Ackn.

Book 11 page 210: On Oct. 6 1787, John Patterson, a skindresser--no wife signs--lets Thomas Frohock have 200 acres on the south side of Second Creek next Laurance Tompson, James Kincaide & said Patterson, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Wm ? & Charles Dunn & proved by the latter in Nov. 1787. (This had been granted by The State on Oct. 25 1786) proved by Charles Dunn on Nov. 10 1787.

Book 13 page 970: On Feb. 10 1794, Charles & Ann Burroughs of Rowan Co.N.C., let Thomas Hatch Dent of Charles Co.Maryland, have acres on south side of Second Creek next John Patterson, Mrs.Wood & Charles Boyle, for \$120.00, witnessed by Joseph Renshaw & Joseph Owens & proved by the latter in Sept. 1795. (See the State Grant on Oct. 25 1786 with platt annexed)

Book 18 page 254: On Jan.22 1802, Charles Burroughs (no wife signs) lets Sarah Wood have 80 acres on the south side of Second Creek next Thomas Hatch-dent, James Kinkaid & Charles Biles, for 48 pounds, witnessed by Thomas H. Dent & Allen Burroughs & proved in May 1802. (This was a grant from the State to him?on Oct. 25 1786).

Book 18 page 263: On Feb. 1 1802, Sarah Wood lets Thomas H.Dent have 80 acres on south side of Second Creek next Thomas Dent, James Kincaide & Charles Biles for witnessed by Charles Biles & Andrew Kincaid & proved by Charles Biles in May 1802. (This was a Grant from the State on Oct. 25 1786).

May 2 1842: "Thomas H.Dent, guardian of Ann G.Dent, filed his account".

Book 9 page 524: Jan. 4 1784, Richard Holland of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Thomas Anderson of Salisbury,N.C. have 288 sq. poles in the west square of Salisbury, for 20 pounds, witnessed & proved by Mich Troy in Aug. 1784. (This is the lower half of one of the four lots which Hugh Forster granted said Holland on Feb. 25 1784).

Book 31 page 252: Esq. Samuel Silliman as Clerk of County, on Oct.13 1826 (by a decree of court of April term 1824 directing that he sell the lands of late Robert Baird of Rowan Co.N.C., for the benefit of the heirs & he sold it to the highest bidder, Daniel Wood, for \$2500.00, and another decree in Oct. 1825 that he deliver the land) lets Daniel Wood have 714 acres on Second Creek on the great road from Salisbury to Wilkesborough next Samuel Lewis, Phillip Rice, John Howard, --- Jones; Isaac Lirely, John Fraly, Thomas Gheen & John Holoough, acknowledged in May 1831.

The will of Thomas Anderson (Book H page 55) made while weak of body on June 25 1820 & probated in Aug. 1820. Wife Mary (home & land during her widowhood. Sons: John (home after widow's death & large Bible &c), Joseph, Michael & Thomas. Daughters: Polly Cowan & Mary (some leather, iron & steel at Joseph Cowan's smithshop). Exrs: friends Adam Srete & Ezra Allemong. Witnesses: George W.Brown & Ezra Allemong.

Daniel Wood is a nonjuror in Cap. Moore's district in 1778 (tory)

Those permitted, (should they wish) to take the oath of allegiance to this state Aug. 5 1778: John Garret, John Wood, Mayson Wood, William Wood, (tories); James Kincaid & Charles Dunn & proved by the latter in Nov. 1787. (this had been granted by the state on Oct. 25 1785) proved by Charles Dunn on Nov. 10 1787.

Samuel Woods & wife to Jacob Frize lease & release for 387 acres dated June 29 1778. Proved by oath of Jas McCulloh Aug. 1778. Book 8 page 522: July 30 1778, Samuel Woods & wife Sarah let Jacob Frieze--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 387 acres on south side of Grants Creek next Matthew Gillespie, for 800 pounds, witnessed by Mickel Albright & James McCulloh * proved by the latter in Aug. 1778.

May 5 1778. Michael Anderson dead. Letters of administration issued to Samuel Luckey and William Johnston, (as the widow relinquished) and bond of 700 with John Brandon & John Luckey as securities is given.

Inventory is filed May 5 1778.

Inventory of Michael Anderson's estate returned by adms. Aug. 1778.

Samuel Woods will probated by Robert Lynn on May 7 1778. Andrew & Samuel Woods qualify according to the will and return an inventory of the estate.

Aug. 7 1781. The will of James Wood proved by Andrew Hays. John Ross = Exr.

Refer to page 16 of Minute Book from 1800 to 1807 for an account of the sales of James Wood's estate on Feb. 1787.

Nov. 9 1791: Thomas Carson is appointed Guardian of Mary Wood Orphan of James Wood deceased who gave bond with Jacob Gauble in £200. (Probably another James whose widow is Elizabeth Anne Wood who qualified on Nov 8 1786) &

Nov. 9 1791: Administration on the Estate of John Anderson deceased granted to William Anderson, who qualified and gave Griff: Rutherford Secuy. in 200

Andrew Kennady & William Wood are fined as absent jurors on Nov. 9 1791 but the fine was remitted. 20/.

The will of James Woods (Book C page 26) made while 'sick and weak' on March 2 1781. Samuel Woods Ross gets most of the things but the rest to be divided among brothers, Samuel & Alexander & sister Margaret. Exrs: Andrew Woods, Samuel Woods & John Ross. Witnesses: Andrew McClannachan & Andrew Hays.

Aug. 7 1781: The will of James Wood is proved by Andrew Hays. The executor, John Ross qualified. An account of the sales of James Wood's estate in the minute book (from 1800 to 1807) page 16.

The will of the widow, Jane Macay (Book K page 253) made Sept. 11 1857 & probated in Nov. 1857, mentions her sisters: Matilda Wood of York District S.C. (or her children), Nancy Gibson & Rachel Hosley. Brother Reason Mayhew. Friend Adelaide Rouzie (wife of William Rouzie). Exrs: friends William Rouzie & James E. Kerr.

Oct. 12 1764: Deed of gift from William Wood to John Weylie? for Sundry goods & Chattles on Sept:--- 1764 is acknowledged.

Book 6 page 30: On Sept.-- 1764, William Wood of Rowan Co.N.C., gives to John Weylie(?), out of his love and affection, a set of shoemaker's tools, a bay horse branded A.A., a bay mare & cold branded N.M., a cart, two cows & calves (the cow is yellow & marked with 1/2 crop & the other one is spotted & marked with a crop), 1 man's saddle, 1 woman's saddle, 1 spinning wheel; 2 feather beds & furniture, all the moveable household goods, &c. witnessed by James Carter & William Temple Coles, & acknowledged in Oct. term of 1764.

Book 27 page 396: On Feb. 18 1822, Esq. Samuel Jones, the Sheriff of Rowan Co. N.C., lets Daniel Wood have 350 acres next Samuel Hall on the southwest side of Beaver Dam Branch between Samuel, Isaac & Jo. Hall, next Mary Webb, Martin Speak, Solomon Hall & John Graham, for \$230.00, witnessed by Andrew Hunt & acknowledged by Esq. Samuel Jones in Feb. term of 1823. (This land is sold by virtue of an execution against John & James Speake).

Book 17 page 609: On Nov. 16 1791, William Boyers & wife Jean let Martin Spake have two pieces of land on south side of Yadkin River on Beaver Dam Branch for 40 pounds, witnessed by Isaac Cowin, David Cowan & William Law & proved by last in May 1801. These are 73 acres next Walter McCall(Hall?), John Graham (heir of deceased William Graham) & William Law which had been sold to William Boyers on Oct. 2 1783 & the other is 17 acres next William Law, (which is part of a tract Benjamin Graham let William Boyers have on Aug. 2 1784).

Book 6 page 315: On Oct. 29 1765, Henry McHenry & wife Elenor let Archibald McHenry have 256 acres (or 1/2 of 512 acres which Robert Woods & wife let him have) next John Hagin & Thomas Bell for 5 shillings (release price on next day was 40 pounds) witnessed by John Culbertson & John Braly & proved in Oct. 1766.

Oct. 10 1765: Lease & release from Robert Woods & wife Margret to Henry McHenry for 512 acres Dec. 8-9 1764 is acknowledged.

Book 7 page 216: On March 28 1770, Samuel Woods Jr. & wife Elizabeth let Hugh Linn (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 148 acres on west side Cold Water Creek next Samuel Woods Sr., Samuel Galbreath & Griffeth Rutherford & witnessed by John Cochran, Thos. Galbreath, Andrew & George Woods & proved in May 1770.

The will of Samuel Woods (book A page 265) made Sept. 11 1772 & probated. Wife Ann (1/3 movable estate). Sons: Andrew (1 shilling), Samuel (1 shilling), Alexander (1/3 movable estate) & James (reversion of movable estate). Daughters: Rebeckah (1 shilling), Elizabeth (1 shilling), Martha (1/3 part of movable estate) & Elizabeth if she behaves (something from movable estate). Exrs: wife & sons: Andrew & Samuel. Griffith Rutherford & John Ross to oversee the execution of will. Test: Robert, Mary & Susanna Linn.

Book 13 page 245: April 20 1793, Henry Bear & wife Elizabeth let Henry Setzer all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 179 acres on east side Cold Water next Charles Wood, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Thos. Galbraith & Peter Eddleman & proved by the latter in May 1793.

Book 4 page 908: On April 4 1761, Earl Granville lets Samuel Woods, a planter of Rowan Co.N.C., have 700 acres on both sides of Cold Water Creek next George Tate, Samuel Galbreath, Griffith Rutherford & John Russell, for 10 shillings, witnessed by John ffrohock & W. Lucas.

Book 9 page 526: Dec. 2 1783, Griffith Rutherford--no wife signs--lets William Woods (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 200 acres on east bank of Cataba River next John McCoun, Jno. Baird & Griffith Rutherford, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Joseph McMullin & Patrick Graecy & proved by latter in Aug. 1784. (Part of

Oct. 9 1765: Lease & release from Samuel Woods & wife Ann to Andrew Woods for 250 acres Oct. 8 1765. Another from them to Samuel Woods Jr for same amount at same time.

Book 12 page 170: On Sept. 30 1790, Samuel Woods of Burk Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Frederick Shulingberger of Rowan, have 120 acres on Cold Water Creek next Nicholas Beever, John Lightacker & Robert Lynn, for 120 pounds, witnessed by ? & Griffeth Rutherford & proved by Esq. Griffeth Rutherford in Nov. 1790.

Book 12 page 76: Aug. 20 1789, James Woodes Sr. no wife signs--lets Wm. Woods (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 150 acres on both sides Cold Water Creek next Thos. Gilbreath, Jno. Graham & Jno. Ross, for 150 pounds, witnessed by Jno. Graham & Thos Gilbreath & proved by latter in May 1790.

Deed: James Woods to William Woods for 150 acres Aug. 20 1789 proved by Thomas Galbraith. (over)

An inquiry in D.A.R. Mag. of 1915 # 4039 for Sion Harrington's 2nd. wife Anne Dalrymple & their families. He is said to have been in Commissary Dpt. and twice captured-- once by Fanning. His father, Charles Harrington and a brother said to have come to America from England about 1745. The brother went to Md. but he went to Halifax Co. Va. thence to Orange Co. N.C.-- now Chatham-- and patented lands where Pittsboro now stands, dying there just before Rev. War. His wife was Agnes Wells and they had 1 daughter & 9 boys.

Vinson Wood gets land on Swearing Creek & Indian Grave Branch Nov. 6 1809 from Jacob Waggoner-- 300 acres-- (Book 26 page 900).

Daniel Wood on Nov. 7 1815 sells a negro Tom to Martin Trantham a planter (Both Wood & Trantham of Rowan Co.) Witnessed by George Snider and Philip Walser. (Book 26 page 684). Tom is 14 or thereabout.

Jarratt W. Wood-- I think the initial is W-- on Aug. 3 1821 sells 50 acres of land on Holeman's Creek next David Lucabel, William Woods, (deceased), old line and the said Cook's, for \$125.00 at Court held in Lexington, Rowan Co. N.C. on Aug. 1821. Witnessed by Brittain J. Heymore & John Gobble. (Book 26 page 504).

Daniel Wood on Nov. 13 1820 gets (for \$3000.00) 47 acres of land from John Dickey. It is on both sides of Fourth Creek & includes the saw & grist mills. Is adjoining John Dickey, & James Luckey (formerly the owners of these (neighbors) were Thomas Dickey & Joseph Luckey who are now dead). The witnesses in May 1822 were John Campbell & Will Barber. (Book 26 page 908).

Daniel Wood has a grant from the State # 3129 (entered Oct. 13 1818) if registered 12 mos from date, at 50 shillings the 100 acres). Dated Nov. 25 1819 and recorded in Sec. of States Office by command of Wm Hill the Sec. The land is on Holdman's Creek next that of Reed, Jarrett Wood & Joseph Clark. (Book 26 page 588).

Daniel Wood enters 6 acres (#54) next that of Geo. Reed, deceased, and William Wood and it includes the vacant land between the line, on Oct. 13 1818.

Nov. 2 1807: Administration on the estate of Rachel Wood granted to Frederick Walser who gave bond of 100 pounds with Laban Hartley & William Wood. Estate of Rachel Wood, account filed May 3 1808, = 139 pounds & 7.

Daniel Wood is appointed Constable & gave bond of 500 pounds with William Wood & Thomas Reed in 1818.

On March 14 1799, Daniel Wood lets Henry Cowan have a negro woman named Crese, for 150 pounds. Book 16 page 662.

Nov. 3 1778" Ordered by the Court; That Letters of Administration issue to Margret Woods Widow of Samuel Woods deceased, on the Estate of said deceased; and said Margret qualified and gave Bond with Patrick Gracey and Mathew Woods Security in the Sum of 600. Ordered that Margret Woods Administratrix of the personal Estate of Samuel Woods keep in her Hands the Crop of Corn and Wheat and flax, for the Use of the Orphans, & that the same be not sold".

Deeds registered Friday Feb. 10 1775: Robert Woods to Matthew Woods 350 acres dated Nov. 7 1774; Matthew Woods to Joseph Woods 300 acres dated Feb. 2 1775. Both proved by Thos. McKnight. And on same day, Matthew Woods proves the deed of Jacob Nichols and wife, Agnes, to Saml. Bartley for 320 acres dated Feb. 8 1774.

May 9 1783: Deed from Joseph Woods to William Bar for 300 acres March 25 1783 proved by Patrick Barr.

Book 17 page 413: Nov. 1 1800, Hugh Barr of Sumner Co. Tenn. no wife signs-- lets John Barr of Rowan Co. N.C. have 300 acre or 1/2 of plantation on Jumping Run (which was granted Matthe Woods Sr., who let Matthe Woods Jr. have, who let Joseph Woods Sr. have & he let Wm. Barr have who willed it to said Hugh Barr) for \$250.00 witnessed & proved by Jas. Barkley.

Book 25 page 182: On Feb. 9 1819, Vinson Wood--no wife signs--lets William Wiseman (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 9 1/4 acres on Indian Graveyard Branch next Richard Owen & Joseph Pearson, for \$150.00, witnessed by Daniel Wood & Daniel Wood & proved by the latter in May 1819.

The will of Robert Woods (book D page 122) made while in perfect health on June 9 1784 & probated. Friend Robert Woods (son of William Woods & grandson of Oliver Woods--448 acres on Dutch Buflow Creek next David Miller & John Stigerwalt) & to his brother Oliver (a plantation of 300 acres on Warrior Creek in South Carolina). Friend James Woods Jr. & William Woods (son of James Woods Sr.) a shilling. The estate is to be divided among my relations after these bequeathals. Exrs: "good friend Andrew McClenaghan--blacksmith & James McCallaugh both of Rowan" Witnesses: James Nixon, Peter Grant & George Kothe'. (It would seem that he died in Madison Co. Kentucky, or that the will was there, for on Oct. 18 1803, Andrew McClannahan went before the Justices of the Peace in Madison County, Ky. and made oath that this will was witnessed by James Nixon, Peter Grant & George Kothe' and then delivered to him, Andrew McClannahan, to keep until called for, so he now delivers it to Oliver Woods on Oct. 18 1803. Green? Clay & Richard Callaway are the Majistrates in Madison County, Ky. & W.M. Irvine is Clerk of the Court at this time--they make affidavits. James Nixon, of Rowan Co. N.C., swears he saw Robert Woods sign & seal the will, & that "Peter Grant & Geo. Kothe lived at the house of Andrew McClanehem where the will was drawn & executed", on Feb. 9 1804 before Moses Billah a J.P.).

Aug. 6 1790: Deed from Absolam Baker to John Brown for 300 acres July 21 1790 proved by James Nixon.

Book 12 page 85: On July 21 1790, Absolam Baker--no wife signs--lets John Brown of the City of Philadelphia, Pa., have 300 acres on Back Branch of McCutchens Creek next the heirs of Samuel Sewell Sr. deceased, Dan Claory & Absolam Baker, for \$400.00 Spanish Milled, witnessed by Caleb Holbrook & James Nixon & proved by the latter in Aug. 1790.

Aug. 6 1790: Deed from John Brown to James Nixon for 300 acres July 21 1790 proved by John Bettz.

Book 12 page 91: On July 21 1790, John Brown of the city of Philadelphia,--no wife signs--lets James Nixon, a "School Keeper" of the county of Mecklenburg, N.C., have 300 acres in Rowan on Back Branch of McCutchens Creek next the heirs of the deceased Samuel Sewell Sr., Daniel Clairry & Absolom Baker, for 250 pounds, witnessed by John Betty & George Overcash & proved by John Betty in Aug. 1790. (Refer to page 85 for deed from Absolom Baker to John Brown).

Aug. 3 1790: "Ordered that James Nixon be committed to Jail on Suspeticion of having murdered one John Brown, circumstances supported by sundry Depositions."

Aug. 4 1790. The State vs James Nixon. Recog. 500 pounds, to appear at next Superior Court. Bondsmen: Richard Graham & Andw. McClenehan.

The will of Samuel Sewel, 'Planter, being very sick and weak' (book D page 73) made April 6 1789. Wife Elizabeth (1/3 of the land but she must support & educate my five younger children). Sons: Nicholas (his choice of the 4 divisions of land) & the other three divisions one to each of youngest sons: John Greenbury & Moses. Exrs: wife, son Nicholas & friend James Nixon of Mecklenburg County. Witnesses: Mary Pather, Joseph G'ison Jr. & John Betty Jr.

Feb. 3 1806 (page 333): Administration on the estate of James Nixon is granted John Patterson who gave bond of 300 pounds with Richard Barnes & John Adams as security. The year's provision is to be paid off by Moses Bella, Michael Albright, William Wood & Peter Mahon.

Feb. 1804: The will of James Woods is proved by the deposition of James Nixon. James McCulloch resigned, so Robert Woods qualified as administrator giving bond of 100 pounds with William Woods as security.

The will of James Stewart (Book C page 204) made while 'weak in body' on Oct. 2 1778. Wife Elizabeth, sons: Matthew (everything but he must provide for his aged mother). Sons-in-law John Woods & Thomas Thomson. Grandchildren Elenor Woods (when 18 years of age) & James Thomson (when 21 years of age). Exr: son Matthew. Witnesses: John Gray, James Hughes & John McNeely Jr.

Book 20 page 347: Jan. 17 1812, John McKnight as administrator of deceased Joshua Woods & in accordance with a bond made by said deceased to Locke Atwell while living, lets said Atwell have 80 acres next the land said Atwell bought of William Crosby, ---Thompson, ---Luck, ---Harris, ---Masters, & ---Woods, for \$80.00, witnessed by William G. Crosby & Hugh Gray & proved by the latter in Aug. 1813.

The will of Joskuah Wood (Book D page 6) made June 2 1805. Wife Rachel (the dwelling house & river-bottom field, the negro Judge & some other negroes until youngest child is of age).

Book 20 page 112: Jan. 7 1809, Rachel Wood lets Daniel Wood Sr. have 29 acres on the north bank of Yadkin River next Daniel Wood & Mack Crump, for 30 pounds, witnessed by Mack Crump & John Donoway & proved by latter in Feb. 1809. (Part of old tract of Jacob *Shivers*)

Book 22 page 205: or 305 (numbered twice): Nov. 10 1810, Joshua Woods--no wife signs--binds himself to let Locke Atwell have the eastern end of the tract where said Woods now lives, being 80 acres, for \$160.00,

Book 33 page 173: Sept. 27 1836, Oliver Woods--no wife signs--lets Joseph Atwell (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) & Daniel R. Bradford of Cabarrus Co. N.C., have 272 acres on south side of great John Walker, Hugh Parkes, Philip Careker, John Shives on the south side of the great road, for \$335.00, witnessed by James A. Atwell & Lock Atwell & proved by the latter in Nov. 1836.

May 1802 (page 168): "William Crosby appointed Guardian of Elizabeth Crosby, Alexander Crosby & Garner Crosby, his own children to account for their estate decending from their Grand father David Wood, gave bond with John & Samuel McGlaughlin each bond 100".

Book 32 page 444: March 16 1835, Alexander Crosby--no wife signs--lets James Jameson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 23 acres on Blythes Creek next James Jameson, Truth Woods & John Leazer, for \$30.00, witnessed by Jas. F. Jameson & Truth Woods & proved by the latter in Aug. 1835. (This is said Crosby's share of estate of deceased David Woods as an heir--being $\frac{1}{2}$ of the undivided tract).

Book 20 page 384: Sept. 22 1812, John McLean of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets William Woods, a hatter, have 153 acres on Coddle Creek next James McLean, ---Leatie, Samuel Young, William McKnight & the heirs of ? McLean, for \$703.80, witnessed by William Woods & Hugh Gray & proved by the latter in May 1814.

Rebeckah Woods, widow of Matthew Woods, and Abraham Woods & wife Peggy, Samuel Woods, Israel Woods & Rebeckah Woods, the heirs of Matthew Woods, deceased, sell for \$490.00 some land on Sills Creek, Rowan Co. (225 acres) next that of James McNeely Sr., George Duff and Emerson, to James McNeely on Oct. 4 1809. Witnessed by J. Ma Braley, John Barkely & John Graham on Feb. Term 1810. Registered by Hugh Braly. (Book 20 page 158).

Deed of sundries from Francis Holmes to Margret Roseborough April 30 1784

Daniel Wood sells a negro woman to Henry Cowan March 1799 Book 16 page 662 witnessed by Isaac Anderson.

Jared Wood & wife Rachel on Oct. 11 1794 sells for 10 pounds 30 acres of land on Molmans Creek next that of Isom Wood. (Part of a tract granted to Jared by deed of sale Nov. 4 1784). Witnessed Nov. 1794 by Isom Wood. Both Jared and William Wood are yeomen of Rowan Co. Another from Jared to Isom Wood for 20 pounds, 120 acres (next the above, I believe ?) and witnessed by William Wood & John Bailey Nov 1794. See pages 807-8 in Book 13. The latter deed is dated Oct. 18 1794. and

Robert Wood has been in jail in 1771 and still refuses to take oath of allegiance to the Crown so is returned. (Suppose that it is being a Regulator.)

According to a map of Statesville or Fourth Creek Congregation by William Sharpe Esq. in 1773, there was a Robert Woods living about 7 miles northwest on Snow Creek a branch of the South Yadkin River. His nearest neighbors at this time were; Widow Ormond, James Rodgers, John Smith, Patrick Morrison, & James Adams.

Abraham Woods is deaf and Samuel Woods is to be the administrator with Truth Woods & James Crosby on bond of \$1,000.00 Aug. 1837.

"A Lease and Release from Samuel Woods and his Wife to Alexander Morrison for 223 Acres of Land dated the 25th & 26th. Days of January, 1771 and Prooved by Archabld Morrison".

Samuel Woods gets deeds for 424 & 700 acres of land in April 1761 from John Frohock (who was attorney for the Earl of Granville).

I have heard that Archibald Dalrymple served in Revolutionary war but have failed to find his service. He was old enough, and if he was living here at the time, it was going on, does seem to me he would have been in the service. The records in Cumberland County N.C. should have something about him. Moore County was formed from Cumberland County 1784.

Have you any knowledge of who Archibald Dalrymple's daughter married, and where their descendants are located? Do you know who Archibald Dalrymple's parents were? I have right much data about Capt. Dalrymple second son of Sir John, Baronet of Courland (a Ditchy of Europe) who died in Fort Johnston Brunswick County. He gave his property to his sister and brother "Waters" He died July 13, 1766. His wife Martha died, and left will and Elizabeth Dalrymple otherwise Hamilton Macgill administered on her estate Dec. 12th 1787 in Brunswick County, N.C. Have you ever heard of this family and know who they are and do you think they are in our line?

John Band McGiver Sr married Ann McDonald near relative of Flora McDonald (My mother's sister told me this along with other data last time I saw her in 1900 at uncle John Dalrymple McGiver's few years before she died). I have eight children four boys and four girls all college and University except two youngest not quite through. Had three sons in World War, one in many big battles in France.
