Joseph Albertson (Hunts Fork)

The will of Stephen Glandon (book G page 45) a yeoman in a low state of health on April 25 1795;

Wife; Mary. Children; Ann, Elizabeth, Sarah, Rachel, Martha & Susannah Hardridge (who gets 1 shilling), James, Jeremiah, George, Isaac & Jacob. Exrs; wife, Stephen Vedito & Josiah Tomlinson, Witnesses; Josiah Glandon, Ole Videto & William Bettis (test).

Book 26 page 783; Feb.8 1822, Mary (the widow of Stephen Glandon), Isaac & Martha Glandon let Joseph Albertson--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have their undivided shares of the 150 acres on next Benjamin Kendall, John King & Nathan Hardridge for \$15.00, witnessed by John Hiatt & Zebulon Hunt & proved by the latter in Feb. 1822.

Nov. 1819; Deed from Benjamin Albertson & wife Ann to Joseph Albertson for their undivided share of the 150 acres left to the heirs of Stephen Glandon, on Nov. 18 1819 is acknowledged.

Book 25 page 509; Nov.8 1819, Benjamin Albertson & wife Anne let Joseph Albertson--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 150 acres on Hunts Fork next Benjamin Kendall, Nathaniel Hardridge, John King & others, for \$15.00, witnessed by Ezekiel Brown & Solomon Farrington & acknowledged in Nov. 1819. (This is their undivided part of the land of deceased Stephen Glandon)

Book 25 page 768; Jan. 18 1817, Bethany Haynre (Sarah Haynes also signs) let Isaac Glandon --all of --- have the tract of land which had been willed them by Stephen Glandon,

Book 25 page 778; May 12 1820, Isaac Glandon--no sige signs--lets Joseph Albertson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have the undivided tenth of 150 acres on Hunts Fork next Nathan Pope & ---Williams, for \$19.00, witnessed by W.Bodenham & acknowledged in May 1820. (This is what Bethley Haynes & wife Sarah let him have)



### Albertson

Colonial Families of the United States (Geo. Norbury Mackenzie), Vol. II page 758; Hannah Albertson (daughter of Jacob Albertson of Plymouth, Pa.,) married Nov. 12 1807, Jesse Williams of New Garden, N.C., a member of the Society of Friends who removed to Plymouth, Mont. Co., Pa.; in 1805. He was born Feb. 20 1780 & died Sept. 7 1814, the son of Richard Williams (born Sept. 29, 1755, died July 1852) of New Garden, N.C., by his first wife, whom he married June 17 1778, Sarah Baldwin (daughter of William Baldwin).

The children of Hannah Albertson & Jesse Williams were: I. Sarah (b. Aug. 31st 1808, d. July 1st 1884), II Phoebe (b. Aug. 27 1810, d. Aug. 17 1893), III Abigail (b. 26 Feb. 1812 d. Dec. 29 1883) & IV. Jesse (May 7 1814 d. June 30 1874).

Of the above children, Jesse Williams (May 7, 1814--d June 30, 1874) married Oct. 7 1842, Frances Charlotte Stokes (daughter of Dr. Samuel Stokes of Stroudsburg, Pa.) He was a merchant of Philadelphia, Pa. They had I. Hannah (March 14 1849-March 20 1849), II Samuel S. (b. Oct. 12 1850), III Henry S. (b. Jan. 28, 1853), Edward B. (b. Jan. 18, 1856) & Jesse (b. April 5 1860) of 4309 Walnut St. Philadelphia, Pa., a member of the Pennsylvania Historical Society, whose lineage on the Williams side is given.

Book 23 page 864: Jan. 24 1809, Josiah Albertson--no wife signs--lets Benjamin Albertson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 84 acres on Rich Fork of Abbotts Creek next Joseph Albertson, --- Kenady. in a bottom, & Benjamin Albertson, for \$250.00. witnessed by Noah Kellum & John Kenady & proved by the latter in Aug. 1816.

Nov. 1819: Deed from Benjamin Albertson & wife Ann to Joseph Albertson for their undivided share of 150 acres left to the heirs of Stephen Gannon, Nov. 18 1819 is acknowledged.

Book 26 page 81: July 29 1819, Benjamin Albertson & Elizabeth Albertson Sr. let Aaron Morras--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 84 acres on Abbotts Creek bank next Joseph Albertson, --- Kenneday & Benjamin Albertson in a bottom, for \$300.00, witnessed by Sherwood Kenneday & Joseph Albertson & proved by the latter in Feb. 1821

Feb. 1821: Deed from Benjamin Albertson to Aaron Morras for 84 acres 29 day of 7th month 1819 proved by Joseph Albertson.

May 1821: Deed from Noah Kellum to Benjamin Albertson for 100 acres July 29 1819 proved by Zebulon Hunt.

Book 26 page 330: Aug. 29 1819, Noah Kellum--no wife signs--lets Benjamin Albertson (bot of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres for \$300.00

Book 25 page 53: Jan. 21 1809, Benjamin Albertson--no wife signs--lets William Kenneday (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 84 acres on Rich Fork & the old line, next --- Harlin, for \$200.00, witnessed by Noah Kellum, Isaac Pope & Zebulen Hunt & proved by the last named in Feb. 1819.

Book 22 page 276: Jan. 1 1811, John English of Randolph Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Noah Kellum of Rowan Co.N.C., have 100 acres on Abbotts Creek next the estate of Samuel Tomlinson, Robert Moffit, John English & Noah Kellum, for \$300.00, witnessed by William Pierson & Charles Pidgeon & proved by the latter in F

eb. 1812.

The will of Josiah Albertson (book C page 267) made Feb. 29 1805

& Josiah. Daughters & grandchildren: Sarah. Jane. Mary, Elizabeth, Lydia, Millicent,  
Anna & William. Exrs: Josiah Tomlinson & Noah Kellum. Witnesses: Moses Tomlinson & Mark  
Tomlinson.

May 5 1807: The will of Joshua Albertson is proved by Noah Kellum (who is not a witness  
but saw the will executed) Moses Tomlinson & Mark Tomlinson. Letters granted to Noah  
Kellum.

May 5 1807: William Albertson, aged 9 years & --- months is bound to Joseph Albertson  
to learn the trade of a cooper &

Aug. 3 1807: Inventory of estate of Joshua Albertson's estate 54.17.2.

Aug. 9 1811: Joshua Albertson's estate filed by Noah Kellum

Book 16 page 695: On the 30th day of the 9th month of 1797, Jacob Wilson--no wife signs--lets Joshua Albertson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 254 acres (it being the west end of a tract of 640 acres), beginning on the southwest corner of said lot at a hickory, going north with the line of ---Harlan partly, 68 chains to a hickory on the northwest corner of said lot, east with the old line 38 chains & 25 links to a hickory, south 66 chains & 50 links to a post oak in the old line, then west with the old line to the beginning, for 250 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Merret & James Hopkins & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1799

Book 14 page 386 or 486: April 29 1796, Jacob Wilson--no wife signs--lets Joseph Wilson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have his half part of the 640 acre State Grant on the Third Fork of Rich Fork of Abbets Creek, which was dated Dec. 28 179 , being 254 acres beginning on the southeast corner of the said lot at a heap of stones, going with the old line north 68 chains to a black oak, west with the old line 38 chains & 25 links to the corner of Jacob Wilson, south with the line of Jacob Wilson 60 chains & 50 links to a post oak on the old line, east with the said line to the beginning, for 5 pounds N.C. money, witnessed by Micajah Haworth & John Beavert & proved by the latter in May court of 1796.

(Rich Fork of Abbots Creek)

Book 16 page 678: Sept. 24 1798, James Hopkins--no wife signs--lets Joseph Albertson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 50 acres on Rich Fork of Abbots Creek, beginning on the old line of ---Wilson at a post oak, going north 7 chains to a black oak, east 12 chains to a hickory, north 7 chains to a black oak in the old line, east 26 chains to a post oak, south 31 degrees east 9 chains & 30 links to a stake, south 5 chains & 60 links to a black oak in the line of Wilson, then west to the beginning, for 100 pounds N.C. money, witnessed by Josiah Smith & acknowledged in Aug. court of 1799.
