Book 26 page 236: On Sept. 16 1819, Samuel Steele & Isiah Reed of Maury Co. Tenn., & James Steele of Burk Co. N.C.--no wives sign--as heirs of the deceased Robert Luckie, let Josiah Owens of Rowan Co. N.C., have 30 acres on Sills Creek next the southwest corner of Robert Luckie & between him & ---Trott, for \$50.00, witnessed by John S. Carson & Thomas Gillespie & proved by the latter in Feb. 1821.

Marriage bond Mary Luckey to James Reed Nov. 5 1774 signed by John Hagin.

Book 10 page 336: On Sept. 3 1785, Mary Reed, alias Mary Luckie & John Luckie (as executors of the deceased Robert Luckie) let Hugh Jenkins, a planter & all of Rowan Co. N.C., have 337 acres on the north side of Sills Creek next ---Foster, on south side of creek & William Cowan, for 225 pounds & 10 shillings, as highest bidder, (in accordance with the will which left it to her until death or ~~re~~marriage & she has ~~re~~married,) witnessed by Samuel Lowry & James McFeeters & proved by the latter in Nov. 1785. (This is part of a tract of 624 acres on both sides of Sills Creek which Earl Granville let have on Jan. 30 1761).

Nov. 12 1785: "Mary Reed, Alias Luckie, and John Luckie Ex: of Robert Luckie, to Hugh Jenkins 624 Acres, September 3d-- 1785, proved by James McFeeters".

Jan. 20 1762: Deed from Earl Granville to Robert Luckie for 624 acres Jan. 30 1761 is proved.

The will of Robert Luckie (book A page 77) made while "very weak in Body" on Oct. 6 1772 & probated in Nov. 1772. Wife Mary (to have 1/3 of the movables & use the land on north side of the creek for herself & the children while she remains a widow but then to be sold & proceeds given to Nancy & the other children--the land on the south side of the creek next William Cowan is to be sold & on up to the old bridge). Daughters: Margaret 10 pounds), Mary (10 pounds) & Rachel (5 pounds) while the others (Ancey, Jannet, Hannah, Martha & Lydia) are to have equal shares in the estate. Exrs: wife & brother John Luckie. Witnesses: William Luckie, James & George Gillespie.

Book 6 page 324: On Oct. 23 1765, Joseph Erwin & wife Agness let Samuel Miller--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 322 1/2 acres on a branch next John Little & James Cathey, for 5 shillings--the release price on same day being 230 pounds, witnessed by James Graham & John Hagin & proved in Oct. 1766. (This is part of a tract upon which Robert Reed formerly lived).

Oct. 16 1766: Lease & release from Joseph Erwin & wife to Samuel Miller for 322 1/2 acres on Oct. 23 1765 proved by John Haggins.

Book 22 page 156: On March 1 1811, Samuel Miller gives to ~~father~~, James B. Miller (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) 172 acres on Second Creek next John Brandon, William Miller, John Reed & Samuel Miller Jr., witnessed by Will Barber & Richard Miller & proved by the latter in May 1811. (This had been granted to Robert Reed on March 25 1752).

Book 6 page 403: On Feb. 26 1767, John Little & wife Lettice ^{or Lillice} (he is a farmer) let Thomas Miller, a gentleman & all of Rowan Co. N.C., have 322 acres next James Cathey, for 100 pounds, witnessed by William & Samuel Luckie & proved in April 1767. (This is 1/2 of a tract granted Robert Reed on March 25 1752 & he & wife Agness let John Little have this by lease & release on April 28-29 1755).

July 16 1755: Lease & release from Robert Reed & wife Agness to John Little for 322 1/2 acres is acknowledged.

Book 2 pages 107-8: On April 28 1755, Robert Reed & wife Nancy (the wife makes her mark at the end as Agness) let John Little--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 322 1/2 acres next James Cathey, for 5 shillings--the release price being 20 pounds--witnessed by John Kerr & Henry Hendry & acknowledged on July 15 1755. (This is 1/2 of a tract which Earl Granville let Robert Reed have by indenture on March 25 1752).

(Rowan Co. was formed of Anson Co. in 1753,

Book 5 pages 202-3: On Feb. 1 1761, Robert Reed & wife Agness of Orange Co. N.C. let Joseph Erwin of Rowan Co. N.C., have 322 1/2 acres next James Cathey & John Little, for 5 shillings--the release price being 50 pounds--witnessed by Thomas Gillespie, James Erwin & "Henry Barkely". (This is where Robert Reed formerly lived & includes a tub or reed mill.)

April 12 1763: Deed from Earl Granville to Clement Reed for 540 acres May 10 1762 is proved by John Frohock, a witness. Also another for 390 acres on same date proved as above.

Book 5 page 127: May 10 1762, Earl Granville lets Clement Reed of Rowan Co. N.C., have 390 acres on Snow Creek waters of Dann River including Francis's Caⁿ in, for 10 shillings, witnessed by John Agar & John Frohock & proved in April 1763.

Book 5 page 128: May 10 1762, Earl Granville lets Clement Reed of Rowan Co. N.C., have 540 acres on both sides Crooked Creek waters of Maho for 10 shillings, witnessed by John Agar & John Frohock & proved in April 1763. (1-yearly rental of 21 shillings, 7 pence halfpenny included of course).

Book 6 page 172: On Sept. 15 1762, Charles Cupples bound himself to Esq. Clement Reed of Lunenburg Co. Va., to pay 47 pounds & 8 shillings Va. currency with 5 pounds per cent yearly (for which refer to Lunenburg Co. Va. records), which was to be paid to Jean & Sarah Cupples. Esq. Clement Reed has died since then without paying them, so he is letting them have many things, such as cattle, hroses, household furniture &c. on May 6 1765, witnessed by John Braly & Robt. Gordon & proved in July 1765.

Page 137: Mrs. H. Lee Edwards (Caro Fries Buxton) % Esq. Cameron Buxton of Winston-Salem, N.C. joined as seventh in descent from Thomas Bonner. Supplementary claims: John & Thomas Nash, Clement Read, James Bonner & Edmund Jennings.

A query in the American Monthly Magazine of Feb. 1913: "2763. BUCKNER-JONES. Ancestry desired of Buckner Jones, of Pittsylvania Co., Va., and official proof of Rev. servica, if any. Was his mother's name Buckner before her marriage with Mosias Jones of Pittsylvania Co.? His sister, Martha, called "Patty," m. Nov. 14, 1779, Augustus Machin and another sister, Mary, m. Rev. Clement Nance, who was supposed to have been named after a cousin, Rev. Clement Read, of the well-known family of Lunenburg Co., Va. Still another sister of Buckner Jones m. Senator John Tipton, of Washington Co., Tenn. He had three other sisters named in his father's will in 1770: Nancy, who m. a Lee; Elizabeth, who m. a James, and Wilmette, who m. a Massey.--- H.H.S."

Book 17 page 14: On Oct. 9 1799, Robert Ginnings of Metteson Co. Kentucky--no wife signs--lets George Reed of Rowan Co. N.C., have 38 acres next said Ginnings old line & George Reed, for 25 pounds, witnessed by John Booth & Michael Sappenfield & proved by the latter in Nov. 1799. (This is a part of 320 acres granted by sale to John Reess on Nov. 4 1784 & he let Robert Ginnings have 38 acres of it on July 13 1797). Also another on page 16: 100 acres on Dykers Creek in same section for 25 pounds, witnessed as above. (This is part of 300 acres from the State to Robert Ginnings on Oct. 10 1783 though).

Book B page 154: The will of George Reed, a planter, made while very sick & weak on Nov. 17 1781. Wife Abigail. Sons: Aventon (his homeplace next George Yearnest, 300 acres on River Dam or Beaver Dam next John Hollis), Felps (200 acres next Aventon Reed & Hugh Cunningham), Thomas (land next Robert Ginnings, John Ris & John Hollis), William (100 acres on north side where I live), Amos (100 acres where I live next William) & Jonathan. Daughters: Edatha & Eliza. Exrs: Richard Wilson & Esq. Robert McKee. Witnesses: John Hollis Jr. & John Book(?).

Book 17 page 57: On Nov. 7 1799, George Reed--no wife signs--lets Nicholas Simson, a planter & both of Rowan Co. N.C., have 100 acres on Potts Creek next Henry Sloan, James Wiseman & Thomas Willis, for 8 pounds, witnessed by Richard Wilson, Daniel Sharp & Daniel Sharp Jr. & acknowledged in Nov. 1799. (This is part of 200 acres originally granted by The State by sale to James Wiseman).

Book 9 page 477: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants #536 (at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to George Reed 300 acres on Beaverdam Branch next John Hollis.

Book 9 page 442: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#499? at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to George Reed 640 acres on Dickers' Creek.

Book 9 page 447: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#485 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to George Reed 400 acres on Dickers Creek next said Reed.

(This sold by The State to the now deceased George Reid on Nov. 4 1784 & he willed it to the said Thomas Read).

Book 18 page 646: Feb. 12 1803, Amos Reed--no wife signs--lets George Reed (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on Dicoses Mill Creek, for \$250.00, witnessed by Elijah Sibly & Isaac Johnson & proved by the latter in May 1803. (This is part of 400 acres sold by The State to the now deceased George Reed Sr. on Oct. 10 1783).

Book 10 page 156: Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (#751 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to John Reess acres on Indian Grave Branch next Robert Jennings, George Reed & John Hollis.

Book 15 page 79: Dec. 21 1796, The State grants (#2464) to John Hollis 59 1/2 acres on waters of Beaver Dam of Swearing Creek next John Green, said Hollis, Adam Helmstuder, John Ford & George Reid.

N.C.) have 200 acres on Potts Creek on the east side of Reeds Branch & crossing it, for 200 pounds, witnessed by Garshon Hunt & Thomas Carson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1793. (Esq. Henry Eustace McCulloh let George Reed have this on May 1 1785 & he let Zebulon Baird have it Oct. 21 1776 who let said Rattz have it Nov. 22 1785).

Aug. 11 1793: Deed from Godfrey Rattz to Francis Winkler for 200 acres May 18 1793 proved by Thomas Carson.

Jan. 23 1756: Lease & release from Robert Jenings to John Bravard Esqr. for 100 acres proved by Esq. Alexr. Osborn. (J.B. to pay).
 Book 3 page 160: On Nov. 22. 1755, Robert Jenings--no wife signs--lets John Bravard have 100 acres on old Beaver Dam on the north side of the Cataba River, for 13 pounds, witnessed by John Anderson, George Germand or Geramand & Esq. Alexander Osburn & proved by the last named on Jan. 20 1756. (This is the plantation upon which the said Jenings formerly lived in Anson Co.N.C.)

Book 15 page 454: Oct. 14 1797, Robert Jennings, a planter--no wife signs--lets Michael Sapenfield & David Mier (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 200 acres next the original survey of 300 acres, for 150 pounds, witnessed by Landon Smith & Thomas Carson & proved by the latter in Nov. 1797. (This is part of the 300 acres granted by The State on Oct. 18 1783).

Book 23 page 413: April 1 1807, John Booth--no wife signs--lets David Miers (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 300 acres on Dycas Creek next George Reed & Robert Grinnings (but excepts the 100 acres on the east, out of the 400 acres), for \$900.00, witnessed by ? , George Snider & William Wood & proved by the last named in May 1815.

Book 14 page 226: Dec. 29 1795, John Reess--no wife signs--lets Vincent Wood (both of Rowan Co.N.C.,) have 100 acres on Indian Grave ranch next next the old survey & John Hollis, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Robert Ginnings & Henry Cooper & proved by the latter in Feb. 1796. (This is part of 320 acres sold to said Reess on Nov. 4 1784).

Book 13 page 583: March 28 1792, Esq. Valentine Beard--no wife signs--lets Vinson Wood (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 190 acres for ? witnessed by Charles Dunn & George Dunn & proved in May 1794. (The State granted this to said Beard).

Book 13 page 582: April 31 1794, Vinson Wood--no wife signs--lets Emos Reed, a minor, both of Rowan Co.N.C., have 190 acres for 200 pounds, witnessed by Richard Leach & acknowledged in May 1794. (This is part of a State Grant made to Esq. Valentine Beard who let said Wood have it on March 28 1792).

Book 21 page 656: Nov. 7 1809, Esq. Edward Chambers as high-sheriff of Rowan Co. (on an execution in Rowan against John Buis Jr. Charles Caton Jr. & Vinson Wood, for 104 pounds 3 shillings & 4 pence recovered by Joseph Clark with orders to sell, which was done March 22 1808) lets Charles Caton Jr. have 443 acres next George Reed, John Buis, John Miller, Valentine Beard, Jacob Wiseman & Felpe Reed, for 612 pounds & 10 shillings, witnessed by F. Coupee & acknowledged. (This had been granted Avington Reed on May 18 1789).

Dear Mrs. McCubbins:

I am writing you upon the recommendation of Mr. Lee Overman Gregory.

As Mr. Gregory may have told you, one of my ancestors was named Thomas Jefferson Reed, who was born in Rowan County, North Carolina, on September 18, 1808. On December 11, 1828, he married Polly A. Miller, who was born in Rowan County, North Carolina, on October 4, 1808.

Polly A. Miller was the daughter of Jacob and Catharine Miller. Thomas Jefferson Reed was the son of Mose Reed. I am sure that is the correct name, but one of my relatives thought that Thomas Jefferson Reed's father was named Thomas.

What I want is to ascertain the names and as much history as possible of the ancestors of Thomas Jefferson Reed, and also of Jacob and Catharine Miller. I don't know how much is available in records there. It may be that what was Rowan County in 1808 and 1828 has since been divided into other counties, and some of the records may now be in the county seats of the new counties.

Neither do I know how long these families had been in North Carolina, or in that section of North Carolina. I understand that the Millers or their ancestors went there from Pennsylvania, and that their family name in Pennsylvania was spelled Mueller. That may be incorrect, however.

Will you please be kind enough to give me an idea of what will probably be available there, based upon your experience in searching records as to other early settlers.

I will also appreciate your advising me as to the charges for the investigation.
