Book 19 page 790: Dec. 30 1805, Shadrack Dail & wife Susanna of Rowan Co. N.C., let John Tomlinson late of Guilford Co. N.C., have 133 acres on Dutchmans Creek on the original line next John Dwiggins, for 391 pounds, witnessed by William Lane Sr. & Joseph Dail, & proved by the latter in Aug. 1806.

Book 22 page 492 or 592: March 7 1812, John Tomlinson--no wife signs--lets James Smith (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 133 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek, beginning on the original corner at a pine, going north 27 chains & 4 links to a stone, west 48 chs. & 54 links to a black oak sapling, south 27 chains & 4 links to a black oak on the south east corner of the land of John Dwiggins, then east with the original line 48 chains & 54 links to the beginning, for 400 pounds current money, witnessed by John Powell & R. Powell & proved by the latter in Aug. 1812.

Book 16 page 87: Nov. 7 1797, Isaac Johnson & wife Elizabeth of Fittle Co., Kentucky, let Shadrack Dial of Rowan Co. N.C., have 133 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek beginning on the beginning corner of the original tract of the said Isaac Johnson at a pine & going north 27 chains & 4 links to a stake, west 48 chains & 54 links to a white oak, south 27 chains & 4 links to a stone on the original line of the said Isaac Johnson, then east 48 chains & 50<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> links to the beginning, for 29 pounds & 2 shillings & 6 pence, witnessed by Martha Whitehead & James Bryan & proved by the latter in Feb. court of 1798.

Book 13 page 235: July 14 1814, Phillip Swartzlander (Barbara also) let John W. Bush--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 132 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on Dutchmans Creek next Scarlet Glasscock, for \$190.00 witnessed by Nathan Lyon & Moses Hall & proven by the latter in Nov. 1814.

Book 25 page 698: Nov. 13 1817, John W. Bush--no wife signs--lets Joel Kinyoun (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 132 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on Dutchmans Creek next Scarlet Glasscock, for \$300.00, witnessed by Cornelius Smith & John Pierce & proven by the latter in Feb. 1820.

Marriage bonds: Joel Kinyoun to Margaret Bush Dec. 10 1817 signed by Cornelius Smith.

Book 31 page 362: Sept. 23 1823, Henry Jones (as the executor of deceased Joel Kinyoun) lets William Tomlinson of--all of Rowan--have 132 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on Dutchmans Creek next Scarlet Glasscock, for \$250.00, witnessed by LittelBerry Austin & proven by him in Aug. 1831.

Book 32 page 8; Nov. 26 1832, John Tomlinson Sr.--no wife signs--lets David Mc-  
Mahan (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 228 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek,  
beginning on its edge & going south 86 degrees west 45 chains to a hickery,  
north 35 chains to a stake, north 45 degrees east 21 chains & 50 links to an  
ash on the creek bank, north 10 chains & 75 links to an ironwood, east to a  
stake, then to the beginning, for \$920.00, witnessed by Zadeck Griffin Tomlin-  
son & William Tomlinson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1833.  
Aug. 1833; Deed from John Tomlinson to David McMahan for 228 acres Nov. 26 1832  
proved by William Tomlinson.

William Tomlinson (waters of Dutchmans Creek)

- Beck 32 page 27: May 25 1833, Thomas Smoot--no wife signs--lets Elkanah D. Austin (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have  $47\frac{1}{2}$  acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek, being part of the tract which the said Smoot bought of William Tomlinson & "known as the D McHahan tract", next the said Austin & others, beginning on the line of the said Austin at a stone, going east 17 chains & 75 links to a stone on the
- east side of the Salisbury road, south 40 chains & 64 links to a stone, west 5 chains to a stone near the branch, north 18 degrees west 4 chains & 90 links to the beginning, for \$130.00, witnessed by J. Holman & William Tomlinson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1833.

Book 32 page 8: Nov. 26 1832, John Tomlinson Sr.--no wife signs--lets David McMahan (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 228 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek, beginning on its edge & going south 86 degrees west 45 chains to a hickery, north 35 chains to a stake, north 45 degrees east 21 chains & 50 links to an ash on the creek bank, north 10 chains & 75 links to an ironwood, east to a stake, then to the beginning, for \$920.00, witnessed by Zadeck Griffin Tomlinson & William Tomlinson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1833.  
Aug. 1833: Deed from John Tomlinson to David McMahan for 228 acres Nov. 26 1832 proved by William Tomlinson.

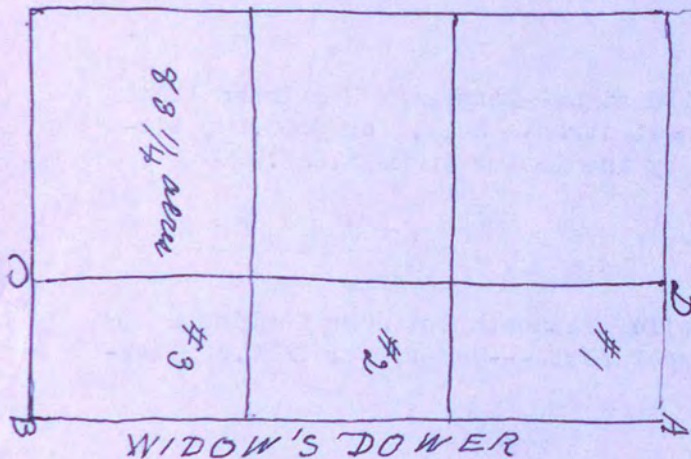
Book 30 page 150; Aug.6 1825, James Tomlinson--no wife signs--lets John Tomlinson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 50 acres on Dutchmans Creek next Abraham Hall, for \$300.00, witnessed by Philip Baker & William Tomlinson & proved by the latter in May 1828.

Book 30 page 152; May 17 1828, William Tomlinson & wife Elizabeth let John Tomlinson (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 83 acres on Dutchmans Creek next ---Baker, for \$330.00, acknowledged in May 1828.

Marriage bonds:

William Tomlinson to Elizabeth Eaton Dec.12 1816-7 signed by Zachariah Jones.

Daniel Eaton--Tomlinson (Eaton's Meeting House).  
 page 318: Nov. 15 1825, as the widow & heirs of deceased Daniel Eaton chose John Ellis to survey the widow's dower, it was done & returned to Nov. Court of 1825. It lies between the letters A, B, C, D.



Lot #1 is  $83\frac{1}{4}$  acres next Abraham Hall, Philip Baker on the bank of Dutchmans Creek, valued at \$6.00 the acre, goes to Margaret Tomlinson.

Lot #2 of 83 acres next #1 & ---Baker, goes to Elizabeth Tomlinson & is valued at \$61.87 $\frac{1}{2}$

Lot #3 of  $83\frac{3}{4}$  acres next #2 is valued at \$5.75 the acre & goes to Mary Horn, but the land laid off in it for Eaton's Meeting House is excepted.

Book 30 page 883: Oct. 26 1829, Stephen Horn & wife Mary let Lemuel Kenyon--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have on Dutchmans Creek next George Moore, John Jones, Philip Baker, John Jones & George Moore Jr., for \$250.00, witnessed by Peter Eaton & Michael Clifford & acknowledged in Feb. 1830. (This excepts the dower of Elizabeth, the widow of deceased Daniel Eaton, while she lives, but it then goes to the said Kenyon also the acre upon which the Meeting House stands).

Book 17 page 354: March 26 1800, William Tomlinson of Randolph Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Nathan Hunt of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 50 acres on Hunts Fork of Abbots Creek next Josiah Tomlinson, Hanks Creek, ---Vethes, ---Hunts & ---Tomlinson lines, for \_\_\_\_\_ witnessed by Jacob Rogers, Joseph Hunt & Zebulon Hunt & proved by the last named in Aug. 1800.

Book 19 page 774: Mesheck Plummer--no wife signs--on the 16th day of 9th month of 1805 lets Thomas Tomlinson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have  $47\frac{1}{2}$  acres on Hunts Fork of Abbots Creek on its bank next a sloping beach, for \$200.00, witnessed by Moses Tomlinson & Josiah Tomlinson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1806.

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Marriage bonds: Nancy Tomlinson to David Howard Nov.30 1823 signed by George Haward  
James Tomlinson to Anna Jones Dec.25 1815 signed by John Smith.

Book 11 page 641: May 5 1789, Josiah Tomlinson--no wife signs--of Rowan Co.N.C., lets Stephen Mendenhall of Guilford Co.N.C., have 100 acres on Little Creek next said Tomlinson, Samuel Park & William Tomlinson, for 10 pounds, witnessed by William Tharpe & Samuel Tomlinson & acknowledged in May 1789.

May 9 1789: Deed from Josiah Tomlinson to Stephen Mendenhall for 100 acres May 5 1789 is acknowledged.

Tomlinson. (Rich Fork of Abbotts Creek)

Book 19 page 78; Feb. 17 1804, Josiah Tomlinson of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets John Meradeth of Randolph Co.N.C., have 37 acres & 8 poles on Rich Fork of Abbotts Creek on the county line next --- Teague & --- Burton, for 15 pounds, witnessed & proved by John Veach in Nov. 1804.

Book 26 page 701: Nov.5 1814, John Meredith of Randolph Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets James Meredith of Rowan Co.N.C., have 37 acres & 48 poles on Rich Fork of Abbotts Creek on the County line next ---Teague & ---Burton, for \$200.00, witnessed & proved by Sherwood Kenne-day in Feb. 1822. (This is part of the land granted as 221 acres).

John Tomlinson (Henlies Creek in Fork of Yadkin River)

Book 24 page 319; Sept. 12 1817, Peter Rupard--no wife signs--lets John Tomlinson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 107 acres on Henlies Creek in the Fork of Yadkin, on the original corner, for \$500. 0, witnessed by William Tomlinson & John Tomlinson Jr., & proved by the latter in Nov. 1817. (This is part of a State Grant to Elizabeth Admire)

Book 20 page 373; Jan. 14 1814, Mary E.Admire of Rowan Co.N.C., lets Peter Rupard of N.C. have 107 acres on Henlines Creek in the forks of the Yadkin River, for 200 pounds, witnessed by Cornelius Howard & Jesse Walker & proved by the latter in Feb. 1814. (This is part of a State Grant to Elizabeth Admier).

The will of Elizabeth Admier (book H page 475) made June 4 1823. Sons: John Rupard & Peter Rupard (5 shillings each). Daughter: Mary (deceased & her daughter Esther Hilton 5 shillings) & her son John Rupard; Elizabeth, Margaret & Rachel. Exr; grandson John Rupard. Witnesses; Will S.Jones & Ann K.Jones.

Book 32 page 365; July 18 1833, John Tomlinson Sr.,--no wife signs--lets Abraham Allen (both of Rowan Co.) have 157 acres (which had been granted to the State to Elizabeth Admira & her) belonged to Benjamin Howard beginning on the original corner & going west 42 chains & 40 links to a pine, north 9 chains & 85 links to a pine, west 32 chains & 35 links to a pine, north 25 chains to a post oak bush, east 20 chains to a post oak, south 8 chains to a stone, east 54 chains 95 links to a pine, south 17 chains & 13 links to the beginning, for \$562.40, witnessed by William Allen William Sheek & proved by the latter in Feb. 1835.

John Tomlinson (Jones Ferry of Yadkin River)

Book 25 page 160: Jan.3 1818, Hardy Jones of Surry Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Dabney P.Jones of Madison Co.Georgia, have 213 acres on the Yadkin River next Mr . Beryman on the south side of the road leading to Jones<sup>n</sup> Ferry of the Yadkin next Widow Beaton, Peter Dowel, Samuel Jones, Edmund Holding & --- Mattox, for \$500.00, witnessed by John Tomlinson & Samuel Edwards & proved by the latter in Feb. 1819.

Book 25? page 418: Jan.8 1818, Dabney P.Jones of Madison Co.Georgia--no wife signs--lets John Tomlinson of Rowan Co.N.C. have 213 acres on the Yadkin River next Mrs. Berryman on the south side of the road leading to a Ferry on the Yadkin formerly call,d Jones, s Ferry" next Widow Beaton, Peter Dowell, Samuel Jones, Edmond Holden & --- Mattox, for \$500.00, witnessed by Robert Jones & Daniel Hunt & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818.



Book 15 page 42; Aug.15 1786, Hardy Jones & wife Sarah of Mecklinburg Co.Va., let Edmund Holding of Rowan Co.N.C., have 147' acres in Rowan Co.N.C. next Matthew Jones, for 60 pounds, witnessed by Isaac Enochs, Roland Jones & John Seegar & proved in May 1797.

Book 21 page 19; Aug.22 1805, Hardy Jones of \_\_\_\_\_ lets Notley Maddon (both of Rowan Co)have 212 acres on the Yadkin River next John Wilkerson (but excepts the land drowned by Roland Jones' mill-pond when it is as high as it now is) for 1000 pounds, witnessed by Robert Harris & Dudley Ballard & proved in Aug. 1807.
