Rev. And Mrs. Warlick Observe Golden Wedding Anniversary

The delightful affair honored the Rev. and Mrs. C. W. Warlick of Mt. Pleasant, who were observing their golden wedding anniversary.

Guests were greeted at the door by the Rev. and Mrs. Roy C. Whisenand and were introduced to the receiving line by Mrs. Maxwell Warlick. Receiving were Rev. and Mrs. Warlick, Mrs. Adrian Shuford of Conover, sister of Rev. Mr. Warlick, and the six sons of the couple, Maxwell W. Warlick, Frederick M. Warlick, Charles W. Warlick Jr., Joe R. Warlick, Hal G. Warlick, and Richard H. Warlick.

For the occasion, Mrs. Warlick was wearing a lovely dusty rose crepe dress designed with all lace bodice. Her corsage was a deep orchid with a yellow throat.

Mrs. Hal Warlick directed guests into the den, where gifts were displayed. Mrs. Joe Warlick received in the gift room, and Mrs. Charles Warlick Jr., presided at the register.

Mrs. Fred Warlick and Mrs. M. F. Carpenter were in the hall and directed visitors to the dining room, where they were received by Mrs. Richard Warlick.

Miss Mary Bright and Mrs. Tay Lowrance alternated at the punch bowl during the afternoon. Assisting in serving individual cakes inscribed with a gold "50" were Mrs. Fred Campbell, Miss Carolyn Warlick, and Miss Mary Warlick, granddaughters of the honored couple. Gold and white mints and mixed nuts were also served from the table.

The Warlick home was perfectly appointed for the golden anniversary occasion. In the living room, the mantel was arranged with yellow roses, yellow pom pom chrysanthemums, and gypsophyllia. A bowl of talisman roses was on a table near the door. Yellow and white gladioli and marigolds were used in the den, and yellow roses and pom poms graced the hall.

In the dining room, the table was overlaid with a lace cloth over gold damask. Centerpiece was a three-tiered gold-decorated wed-



ding cake inscribed with a gold "50." Flanking this central arrangement were three-branched silver candelabra holding white tapers. At one end of the table was the punch bowl and at the opposite end was a low arrangement of golden Daw roses, pom poms, and gypsophyllia. Yellow and white gladioli were used elsewhere throughout the dining room.
