Laid out a large farm in Squantum and built a home. Freeman, September 3, 1634. Selectman; member of the Church; Deputy to the General Court at Newtowne. Prepared to move to Windsor, Connecticut, but death in 1636, prevented. His family, however, moved to Windsor. Will made December 12, 1635; proven January 28, 1636. Colonial Records Vol. 22 page 97: Extracts from the pension of Col. Richard Allen, a resident of Wilkes Co. N.C. shows that he was born in Baltimore Co. Maryland in 1741 where he remained until 21 years of age when he moved to Va. & lived 7 years then moved to Rowan Co. N.C. in 1770 (cut off into Wilkes county where he was living on Sept. 4 1834). He volunteered in Oct. or Nov. 1775 for 6 mos. service in the first company raised in that county, under Capt Jesse Walton & was made a sergeant & marched into Salisbury, N.C. where they received 16 days training, then returned home for Christmas.

Revolutionary War Pensioners of Wilkes Co. N.C.: Richard Allen, aged 92 (died Oct. 10 1832 certificate issued in favor of the heirs) got ----- beginning March 4 1831 as a private & capt. in the N.C. Continental line.

King's Mountain and It's Heroes (Draper) page 462: "Richard Allen was born in Baltimore County, Maryland, November twenty-sixth, 1741; settled in what was subsequently Wilkes County in 1770; became a Sergeant in 1775; served on the Cross Creek expedition in February, 1776; early in 1780 he commanded a company for the relief of Charleston; then went in pursuit of Bryan's Tories; and led his company on the King's Mountain campaign, but was prevailed on to remain with the footmen in the rear. He served a tour of duty early in 1781 under General Greene. He was the first Sheriff of Wilkes County, and a member of the House of Commons in 1793. He attained to the rank of Colonel in the militia, and died in Wilkes County, October tenth, 1832, in his ninety-first year."
