Book 67 page 134: Feb. 25 1875, John S. Henderson & John G. Fleming (as executors of deceased Francis K. Luckey) lets James Cline--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 171 acres next ---Krider, on Schellhouse Branch, the creek, ---Harrison (formerly ---Owen's) & ---Cowan, for \$525.00, witnessed & proved by H.N. Woodson on March 13 1886. (over)

Book 65 page 62: Feb. 14 1885, James Cline of Cabarrus Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Margaret S. Suther of Rowan Co. N.C., have 171 acres on Schoolhouse Branch next ---Harrison (formerly ---Owens) for \$1500.00, witnessed by J.L. Sifferd & acknowledged on the same day.

Book 67 page 702: Sept. 3 1887, Margaret S. Suther lets D.A. Suther--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 100 acres on the north bank of the Back Creek on the School-house branch, for \$500.00, witnessed by & proved by J.W. Mauney on the same day. (This is part of the tract deeded her by James Cline--see book 65 page 62).

Book 74 page 84: Aug. 17 1891, David A. Suther of Memphis, Tenn.--no wife signs--lets J.M. Harrison of Rowan Co. N.C., have 100 acres on the bank of Back Creek next Schoolhouse Branch, for \$330.00, witnessed & proved by Robert E. League in Shelby Co. Tenn. on Aug. 27 1891. (This is part of the tract deeded by James Cline to M.S. Suther--see book 65 page 62).

Book 74 page 68: Sept. 14 1891, Margaret S. Suther lets Louisa Ilyerly--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 171 acres (but excepting the 100 acres conveyed to D.A. Suther leaving 71 acres on Schoolhouse Branch next ---Harrison (formerly ---Owens), for \$325.00, witnessed by J.W. Mauney & acknowledged on Sept. 18 1891. (See books 65 page 62, 64 page 286 & 67 page 134).

Book 63 page 378: Sept.4 1882, R.M.Suther & wife Sarah A. let David L.Mckeely & wife M.J.--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 72 acres next R.M.Suther, J.S.McLaughlin & E.C.McLaughlin, for \$400.00, witnessed by J.K.Graham & acknowledged on the same day.

both of Rowan Co.N.C.

Book of Mortgages #1 page 4: Aug.1 1883, Edward A.Suther & wife Eliza R. let J.Frank
