Copy of a letter owned by Mrs. Q.J. Scott of Cleveland, N.C., who says it was written to her grandmother, Sara W. Young, at Salem College, where she was attending school, whose sister, Elizabeth, married Thomas Cowan Graham (father of the millionaire, Edward Graham, who died at Montreat, N.C., a few years ago).

"Branchville N C 10th Apr 1840
My Dear Sister

Your Verry welcome and Kind Letter bearing date 11th March was anxiously Received, which give us great pleasure to hear from you. I antisipated on writing to you sooner but in Consequence of having so much writing of a Different Nature it has been put off untill Now. I also have been quite unwell for three weeks with the Dispepsay, a part of the time not able for business, Elizabeth had the Mumps Remarkably bad, but is now enjoying good health. She is at Mr. Rufacis this Week quilting and will be there untill sunday.

Margaret also had the Mumps, but verry slightly. I am happy to inform you that my friend Tom Cowans Health is greatly improved, he stayed 2 Days with us week before last and was at Church last Sunday. Mary is in fine spirits and mischevious as usual. There is a fine wedding pending in the neighbourhood for which Elizabeth is making large Calculations on attending. The parties are Doct. A. Torrence to Miss Laura T. Chambers, it will take place this Day 2 Weeks, I presume we aill be all invited & Mug & Eliza

Elizabeth received a Letter by yesterdays mail from Mr Matthews & Nancy, there was Nothing of any importance in it more than they were all well and in good spirits Sister Nancy appears to be highly pleased with her New Situation which I was glad to hear. They wrote that Jane would Come home the first opportunity, and they knew no Chance of her having a favourable opportunity Except it would be with a young Merchant who Spoke of Going to N.York, and that was entirely uncertain. They Stated that they felt it their Duty to let Jane Come and was willing to give her up under the Circumstances which she was Coming--Mr Rufus stands greatly in Need of her or Some other person to take charge of his household affairs, and if I was in his Situation I would think nothing of the trouble of Going after Jane Rather than live as he is doing, he Certainly would be Richly Rewarded for his trouble.

I have not heard from T Woods for Near 2 Weeks they were all well the last time I herd. We expect to go down Last next week to attend the Meeting at Unity--

I am getting my house finished off now, the workman will be through next week all that I intend having done at present, when Elizabeth (will move?) soon after.

I expect to go to Fayetteville before long to purchas Groceries, I have ordered my Goods on this spring in place of Going myself. Times has been so distressingly hard that I Could not make Collections to Justafy me in going Myself.

Elizabeth is not (missing) part of my Letter, it will (missing) us attending your Examn (missing) will let you Know (in?) our next. You (must?) not forget to let us hear from you soon & often

In taking copy of the Will of James Graham of Rowan County as found in Will Book K page 228 of the Rowan County Probate Court there appears to be an omission of an entire paragraph, therefore would you please refer to the original and advise me what the paragraph #4 should be.

The record at Salisbury reads as follows:

~~3rd. I will and devise unto my nephews Fergus M.Graham, my two negroes children Alfred and Mary subject however to a money charge if in the valuation hereinafter provided for this lot should exceed in value the other lots of negroes.~~

~~4th. missing~~

5th. I will and bequeath unto Joseph A. Graham my negro girl Carolina subject a money charge as mentioned in the 4th clause of this my last will and testament.

My Dear Mr. McCubbin:

I do appreciate your courtesy in writing me so promptly concerning
the items contained in my letter to the State Historical Commission at Raleigh
dated July 15th.

It was necessary for me to go to Raleigh in person to clear up a number
of matters in this chain of titles and I therefore went over the matter in person
with Mrs. West who is the person in charge of that particular set of records.

The Will of the elder Fergus Graham mentioned in the Hinson book of
your County is not among those in the files at Raleigh.

The error in the will of June 1st when a descendant of this elder Fergus
received in Will Book E page 228 indicates a clerical error at the time of recording.
The paragraph in your records numbered 3 appears as paragraph 4 in the original and
paragraph 5 in your records is correct. Paragraph 3 therefore has been omitted
and reads in the original at Raleigh as follows:

"3rd. I will and bequeath unto my nephews Fergus M. Graham, James S.
Graham, Joseph A. Graham, John C. Graham and Richard F. Graham my threshing machine with
the apparatus attached thereto."

I will greatly appreciate any suggestion you can make for me to make
further search in an effort to find the original or a copy of the Will of the
elder Fergus Graham by an examination of papers, books or other documents there
in your records.

Book 11 page 112: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1423 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to James Harris 160 acres on south bank of Yadkin next John Johnston, Joseph Campbell & John Bryan.

The will of James Harris (book G page 177) made Dec. 3 1810 & probated in Wife Hannah. Sons: John (the blacksmith tools), James & Nicholas (the homeplace after death of his mother). Son-in-law Abraham Trott. Daughters: Polly Harris & Peggy Graham. Grandson James Harris Graham. Exrs: wife & son Nicholas. Witnesses: Jeremiah Robinson & Thomas Anderson.

Feb. 5 1811: The will of James Harris is proved by Thomas Anderson. Hannah Harris qualified as executrix but Nicholas Harris resigned.

Elizabeth Harris to Abraham Trott Feb. 11 1803 signed by Daniel Clary

Mrs. J.A. Proctor of Scottsboro, Ala. writes that the above James Harris married Hannah Stapleton in Pennsylvania, although she hasn't a copy of the marriage bond, but the old Graham Bible in Tenn. gives the record of their daughter, Margaret or "Peggy" & says they were of Harrisburgh Pa. & that their second son, James Jr. was born there in 1777 (he was Mrs. Proctor's great-great-grandfather & saw Gen. Washington when he passed through Salisbury). Peggy married James Graham & moved to Tenn. as did John several of the other children.

Book 22 page 650: Sept. 17 1812, Nicholas Harris--no wife signs--lets John Harris (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 280 acres on south side Yadkin River next Robert Johnston, Mrs. Campbell & John Bryan on the river bank, for \$350.00, witnessed by John Graham & William B. Graham & proved by the latter in Feb. 1813.

Book 31 page 223: Oct. 3 1817, John Harris--no wife signs--lets Francis Neely (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 280 acres on south bank of South Yadkin River next the old line of Robert Johnston (which the deceased James Harris & Robert Johnston mutually agreed upon) next --- Campbell (now Robert Johnston's) & John Bryan, for \$1000.00, witnessed by John Caton & Nathan Neely (& the handwriting of Nathan Neely is proved by William B. Wilson in Feb. 1831).

A letter from Mrs. Hilda Graham Pickens of 926 South 14th St., Lincoln, Nebraska, on May 1 1941, to our Historical Society, wanting information of her great grandfather, James Graham, who married Margaret or "Peggy" Harris (born Dec. 2 1781 died in 1868, daughter of James & Hannah Sheperton Harris), by whom had seven children. According to her record, there was a son Henry Freland Graham, born March 22 1805, James Harris born Feb. 17 1807 & Nicholas Harris, born July 12 1809--"All three born on Yadkin River, Rowan Co.N.C." James Graham & wife Margaret (Harris) Graham, with their children, moved to Shelbyville, Bedford Co.Tenn., where Nicholas Graham (their son & the grandfather of Mrs. Pickens), married Eleanor Dixon, by whom had seven children, one of whom was James William Graham (the father of Mrs. Pickens) who moved from Tenn. to Texas about 1850. There was a brother, John (whether a Graham or Harris, she didn't know), whose wife was named Martha, by whom she had a son, Samuel.

Book 1 page 154: On March 25 1752, Earl Granville (through his agents James Innes & Francis Corbin Esqrs.) lets Fergus Graham (planter, of Anson Co.N.C.) have 620 shillings 10 pence release North fork of Grants Creek, (for 3 shillings 100 pence) witnessed by James Campbell & John Dunn & proved by the latter in Rowan Co. County Court on April 24 1756 (Rowan was formed from Anson Co. in 1753--).
Book 18 page 210: On March 1 1798, James McLaughlin--no wife signs--lets Daniel Crisman have 200 acres on both sides of Back Creek (a branch of Grants Creek) next the original corner of Fergus Graham's, for 250 pounds, witnessed by Matt & Matt Brandon & proved by latter in May 1798. (This is part of 620 acres which Earl Granville let Fergus Graham have & he devised to Fergus Graham Jr. who let James McLaughlin have it by indenture).

Book 10 page 546: On Feb. 7 1787, Esq. Matthew Lock lets Richard Lock have much land on both sides of Grants Creek next --- Allison (now Stewart's), crossing Fergus Graham's Creek next Esq. John Brandon, & in a meadow. One tract Thomas Brandon let him have--see book 7 page 204) & the adjoining 29 acres (was a State Grant)--in all 354 acres.

Book 7 page 204: On March 24 1770, Thomas Brandon--no wife signs--lets Esq.

Matthew Locke (both of Rowan) have 325 acres on both sides Grants Creek, next

Jan. 20 1762: John Cathey in the room of Samuel Woods" is appointed Constable.

July 22 1762: John Brandon Esqr. for Capn. Kerrs and Capn. Rutherford's District Constables John Patterson & John Cathey".

Jan. 13 1763: Order P Cur that Richard Brandon be Appoind Cur: on the So: Wist Side of Malcolm Blew Mathew Loch Aandrew Allison Achad: Cathey & Lock Will Luckey". (This will have to be untangled).

July 23 1761: Ordered Pr. Cur that Samuel Woods on Gnants Creek be Appointed Constable in Cap. Griffith Rutherford's District and to Qualifie before Alexander Cathey Esqr"

July 24 1761: Alexander Cathey is the Justice in the companies of Captains Rutherford & Michael. Michael Broal? (Brown) & Samuel Woods are the Constables

April 11 1764: Orderd that Samuel Cochrane be appointed A Constable in the Room of Samuel Woods". On Jan. 12 1764: Samuel Woods Senr. in the room of Richd Brandon" is appointed Constable--do not which Samuel Woods is Capt. or

Constable of this line.

July 14 1764: Samuel Cochrane is the Constable in John Brandon's District in which John Brandon is the Justice.

Book 24 page 578: Dec. 3 1817, John Harris--no wife signs--lets Solomon Hall (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 180 acres on the north side of Beaver Dam Branch (a branch of the South Yadkin) next William Hall. John Graham, William Law & Robert Johnson on the south side of Beaver Dam, for \$600.00, witnessed by Robert Johnson & James McGowen & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818.

Book 16 page 270: Nov. 27 1797, Richard Graham (a stiller & no wife signs) lets John Harris, a blacksmith--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 180 acres on Beaver Dam Branch of South Yadkin next William Law, for 181 pounds, witnessed by William Law & Thomas Pra & acknowledged in May 1798. (Earl Granville patented this to Robert Tate on Dec. 10 1753).

Thomas Harris (Iredell Co.N.C.)

D.A.R. Records of Pensioners in Iredell Co.N.C.: Major Thomas Harris of the Revolutionary Army, died Aug. 31 1826, received a pension of \$2,627.82 beginning Oct. 3 1806 & one of \$1,185.51 beginning May 25 1821.

The will of Thomas Harris (Iredell Co.N.C., book 2 page 38) made while "Sick and in a Low State" on May 23 1826.

Wife Nancy (proceeds from where I live and the mills)
Daughters: Jane Chisholm (land next the mouth of Sound Branch next the mill & mill-dam)
Matilda Moore (the remainder of where I live and the mills) & Rachael Neely.

July 13 1765: Alexr. Cathey Esq. is Justice in Catheys Settlement in which
John Scott is the Constable. (Dont confuse.) Fredk. Fisher succeeds John Scott
& for his District &c"

Jan. 13 1767: The Grand Jury: Mathew Lock (foreman), Saml Woods, Jas McCullough
Jas Graham, Danl McFeeter, Wm Luckey, Archaball Morrison, Jno Haggins, Jno
Todd, Jno Willson, Archabald McHinery, Alexr Dobbins, Francis Mabery, Joseph
Tate & Robert Rankin & "Fergus Graham Constable" for it. (Each Jury seems to
have had a constable appointed for it).

Jan. 15 1767: " Alexr. Pihey in the room of Fergus Graham" is appointed
Constable.

(The will of Alexr. Cathey is proved by John Frocock & John Brandon on July
12 1766--the Exrs are Francis Lock & John Cathey--so a new Justice will
have to be appointed).

July 16 1767: Alexander Piney is the Constable in Capt. Rutherford's district
in which Esq. John Brandon is the Justice.

Book 18 page 953: On Oct. 4 1804; Daniel Christman, late of Rowan Co.N.C.--no
wife signs--(by his attorney, Matt Brandon) lets Henry Pence of Rowan Co.N.C.,
have 200 acres on both sides of Back Creek, a branch of Grants Creek, next
Andrew Boston, for \$900.00, witnessed by Moses G. Bellah, Eliza & Polly
Brandon & proved by Moses Bellah in Feb. 1808. (This is part of the 620 acres
originally granted by Earl Granville to Fergus Graham Sr. who devised it
to Fergus Graham Jr., who let James McLaughlin have it & he let said Daniel
Christman have it).

John Campbell sold this to John Brandon April 23 1816--see Book 20 page 526.

In working out the Graham Family History I have met with several items which by reference to your files may help me to clear up.

In the Deed Books at Salisbury, Book 1 page 154 Fergus Graham purchased 620 acres of land from Lord Granville Mar 25 1752.

In Deed Book 14 page 210 dated March 1, 1798 indicated that Fergus Graham Jr who had inherited 200 acres from his father out of 620 acre tract sold this 200 acres to James McLaughlin. The deed states that this land was devised to Fergus Graham Jr by his father Fergus Graham deceased.

Minute Book of Circuit Court for Rowan Co dated Feb 9, 1798 reads as follows:

The last will and testament of Fergus Graham proved by Wm. Gathay.
Letters of administration issued to Fergus Graham Jr who qualified.

From this reference I sought to find in the records at Rowan Co. the above mentioned will but failed to find it and it occurred to me that the original may be among those at Raleigh as I did not list the men of this name when I was at Raleigh.

May I ask you to look at your file and give me the names and dates of the will by men named Fergus Graham which you have.




My Dear Mr Baty:

I regret that it has taken so long to get the bare foundation upon which to erect a proper proven history of your Graham family but the traditions and similarity of names have been so interwoven that it has been almost impossible to get anything like a rational statement from the present living persons.

Through the kindness of co-operation of the five children named in the will of Betty Green Brown and especially the help of Miss Bessie Green Brown of this place I enclose a complete proven set of records beginning with Miss Brown and her family back to George Gillispie who married Mary Graham.

In the will of George Gillispie you will note that he names Nelly Graham as his niece. His son Jacob Gillispie married Nelly Graham. You will note that Nancy Graham made her will in Mercer County, Ky but that it was probated here in Sumner Co.

In his will of George Gillispie you will note that he refers to the land of John Graham adjoining the tract he wills to his son Jacob. It is this same bible we have found and it was he who married Nelly a niece of his father and sister to Nancy. Whether this John Graham was a son or the father of the two girls or a brother is yet a question.

From the date of the birth of Mary Graham Gillispie in 1751 she could be a granddaughter of the John Graham who died in Rowan County leaving a nuncupative will in 1773, yet she may have been the daughter of this John of Rowan Co.

The tombstone gives Nelly Graham as born 1789. No other facts of her birth. The family bible may supply this deficiency.

I mailed you the records of the several cemeteries in my preliminary report last Monday.

John Gillispie son of George was born March 11, 1773.

George Gillispie after the death of Mary Graham in 1815 married a second wife who was a widow in 1818 as clearly set forth in his will.

I shall try to get these reports out promptly during the first few days of each month and make them regular so that you may have a connected record rather than the many disjointed letters which you have been getting.

Please note however in the numerous notes sent you the presence in all of the records of the four men Richard, John, James and Samuel Graham. John of Rowan Co. was the only one of the four brothers who had a Samuel and his children carried the same names into their families. This is true down to this present generation.

Note that George Gillispie gave two of his sons land on the Duck River. The names of the Graham men sent heretofore have all been on or near the Duck River.

Hope to have the marriages of all of your John Grahams children by the next report and if possible fix the parentage of his wife.

It is now my belief that the John Graham and his wife Margaret who sold their land on Hunting Creek in Rowan Co. in 1785 were your John and his wife. See my N.C. Reports.

Will you please send to me the date when the suit was instituted against John by the Tory. Also the date of the judgement in that suit. These dates may have had some influence on his movements.

1st It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid by my Executor herein after named as soon as convenient after my death which I hope will not be very much.

2nd I give and bequeath to my loving wife Ann a dowry on my place that I now live on while she may remain my widow. I also allow my wife to have negro woman Bly to her own use while she may remain my widow. I also give my wife one house built of her own choice. I also give her three milk cows and slaves her own choice together with four more cow beasts of her own choice for the use of my family the three just named to be her own and at her disposal, I also give her twenty head hogs her choice and all my sheep on hand.

3rd I give and bequeath to my son Richard Mitchell my plantation that I now live on my Grahams old tract, but I do not intend this to interfere with my wifes dowry as above named, I also give to my son Richard Mitchell my boy Burton, Alfred, Caesar and Ritty and I also give my son Mitchell my new waggon and harness but I allow it to be on the place for the use of my wife and family, I also give to my son Richard Mitchell my bay colt named Doctor. I also allow my son Richard Mitchell my blacksmith tools but my will is that they be for the use of my family as long as they may stay together on my place, I also give my son Mitchell my rifle gun all the above named property named to my son Mitchell I give to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

4th I also give and bequeath to my daughter Sam. A. Gillispie my boy Fard, Margaret, Drusilla and Mingo, I also allow him three hundred dollars to be given to him as my Executor may think best for his education

5th I also give to my daughter Elisabeth my negro man Hector my negro girls Cety and Mary together with three hundred dollars in money. It is also my will that at the death or marriage of my wife that my negro woman Bly shall go to my daughter Elisabeth all the above named property to my daughter. I allow to them and theirs heirs and assigns forever. But if either of my daughters should die in a minor state, then and in that case I allow the property to go to her ² sister it is my will that if my negro woman Bly has any more increase from this time that she shall be valued and equally divided amongst all my children share and share alike at the death or marriage of my wife.

6th I give and bequeath to my son Richard Mitchell all my landed estate to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

7th I also allow all my household and kitchen furniture to the use of my wife and family during her widowhood and then to be equally divided amongst her and my children.

8th I also give to my son Mitchell all my leather books and the balance of my books to remain in the family for their use. I also allow 3 more of my horn beasts to the use of my wife and family as long as they may stay together

and at the death or marriage of my wife I allow them to be sold and the sum to be equally divided amongst all my children share and share alike.

It is my will that my friend E. D. Austin and Joseph E. Robbins and Abel Green be commissioners to lay off one years provisions for my wife and family.

I also allow all my negroes to remain on my place and work as they have been doing in my life time and the proceeds over and above what will support them to be equally divided amongst my wife and children. But if my negroes does not do so I will then and in that case I allow my Executor to hire them out or do as he may think best for the interest of my family. All the residue of my property not here named I allow to be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided amongst my wife and children share and share alike after the above specific bequests are paid.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my loving brother Sam. A. Gillispie Executor of this my last will and testament revoking all other wills by me made or done antedating this and his alone to be my last will and testament signed sealed and published and acknowledged in the presence of us this 20th day of January 1840

Item 1st. 4thly I give and bequeath to my son James A. Gillispie my negro boy Sam Parker my negro boy Andy and my negro girl Esther and also my two old negroes Ben and Parker and my Tilly mare called Lepard to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

5thly I give and bequeath to my son Thomas G. Gillispie one negro boy Hardy, one negro boy Peter and one negro girl Delsey and two hundred dollars in money to him, his heirs and assigns forever.

6thly I give and bequeath to my daughter Flossie Penilla Gillispie one negro girl Caroline and six hundred dollars in money to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

and ordain this my last Will and Testament That is to say principally and first of all
I give and recommend my灵魂的恩典 of Almighty God that gave it and my body I
recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the Discretion of my
Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God. and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it
has pleased God to bless me with in this life. I give demise and dispose of the same
in the following Manner and Form:

First: I give and bequeath to Mary my dearly beloved wife my own bed and bedstead
and clothes thereunto belonging and all the household goods and my black mare and
two cows and her own maintenance and the mare and two cows to be raised off the planta-
tion during her life.

Secondly. I give and bequeath to Jane my beloved daughter a bed and furniture
and the Bald Colt and Saddle and the Flecked cow that now carries the Bell and her
chife and a year old heifer and three sheep and the largest peat but one that is in the
house.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to Elizabeth my other beloved daughter a bed and
furniture and a cow and a year old heifer and the black colt and saddle.

Fourthly I likewise give and bequeath unto William my beloved son the halfe my
land including my dwelling house and the Barn, the dividing line on George Wallis's
line about halfe way at Amvers and to run and East course and two horses and a mare
when he comes to the age of twenty one.

Fifthly I also give and bequeath unto John my other beloved son the other halfe
of my land horse to worth Fifteen or Sixteen pounds price in former times, and a saddle
and bridle when he comes to the age of twenty one.

Sixthly I also allow all my children to be maintained on the Plantation unto such
times they come of Age or capable to do for themselves and the expense of this school-
ing to be raised on my place.

Seventhly I also allow my beloved daughter Mary to have an horse and saddle and
a bed and furniture and also to my beloved daughter Gisel I allow a horse and saddle
and a bed and furniture and to my Daughter Mary I also allow to receive a horse and
saddle and a bed and furniture and also to Sarah my beloved daughter I allow a horse
and saddle and bed and furniture when they go to do for themselves.

Eighthly I likewise when my youngest child Sarah comes of age. I allow the effects
that's then remaining to be equally divided among all my children and also I leave my
Blue coat and jacket unto my brother John Graham and all the utensils belonging to
farming of mine. I allow to be divided between my two sons William and John.

Ninthly. Likewise I also constitute make and ordain my Dearly beloved wife Mary
and my Brother John John Graham my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and
Testament and I choose my Brother Richard Graham as a Guardian over my children. And
I do hereby utterly disannul revoke and disallow all and every other former testaments,
Wills Legacies, Grants and Executors by me in any ways before named, willed and rat-
ifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In witness

Item 1st. I will and desire to my nephew James S. Graham the north part of the tract of land wherein I now live the tract to be divided in the following manner. beginning at a point on the dividing line fence between my tract of land and the land of my deceased brother Fergus Graham, near a small hickory tree, thence a straight line south of east passing through the old field and through a grove of pine trees in the pasture to the dividing line between my lands and the lands of Sally H. 8th I will and bequeath unto my niece Sarah H. Houston my negro girl Sabah subject to a money charge as mentioned in the 4th clause of this my will.

10th I will and bequeath unto my nieces Polly Wilberson widow of Alexander Wilhelm my negro woman Eliza, subject to a money charge as provided for in the 4th clause of this my will.

In making the foregoing bequest of my negro slaves it is my wish and purpose to make perfect equality among my nephews and nieces, so far as my negro property is concerned and knowing that this could not be without a sale of my negroes, which I am unwilling in any contingency to permit, therefore direct that after my death three good men wholly disinterested be selected by the parties, to value the several lots of negroes, and that the more valuable the lot or lots pay to those of inferior value such sum or sums as may be necessary to equalize the several lots in value,

11th I will and bequeath unto my nieces Sarah H. Houston and Polly Wilhelm One hundred dollars each, this money legacy is given to them in lieu of land.

12th I will and bequeath unto James S. Graham and Richard T. Graham Fifty dollars each this small pecuniary legacy is given to sustain and support my nephews until such time as they may be able to procure humor after my death.

13th I will and direct that after my decease my property be kept together

In the name of God Amen. The twelfth day of December in the year of Our Lord 1787 I. William Graham of Rowan County and State of North Carolina, Farmer, being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say. principally, and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave all: and for my body I recommend it to the earth, to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and: as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in manner and form following that is to say.

In the first place. I give and bequeath to Jeanny dearly beloved wife one negro wench named Flora to her during her own life and said wenches children to my Heirs and I also allow her a good horse with her saddle and bridle and also her choice of the beds with the furniture with the dresser and the furniture and as many of the pots as may be thought sufficient to keep house with.

Also I give to my well beloved Son John Graham this plantation I now live on with all the improvements and benefits belonging therunto and also one black mare named Smith and a saddle and a bridle.

Also I give my well beloved son James Graham one negro boy named Sambo and also one mare and colt and saddle and bridle.

And to my youngest son William Graham I give and bequeath to him the sum of Fifty pounds Lawfull and current money to be levied out of my Estate as soon as may be convenient and put to the best use till he comes to Maturity and also when he comes of age I allow him one horse and saddle and bridle.

And concerning the offspring of the above named wench if any, it is my desire to give my son William the first child that she has and the rest of her children I allow to be divided amongst my aforesaid sons and I also allow four milk cows of the best on the place to be for the use of the family with plow and tacklings with horses sufficient to carry on the farm. And the remainder of my Estate I allow to be sold and to school my childderent of it, with all necessary expenses at the discretion of the Executors and if any thing remain when my children is raised let it be equally divided amongst my three children.

And I do likewise constitute make and ordain John Hall and Richard Graham my only sole executors of this my last will and testament. And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disann all and every other former testaments, wills and legacies, bequests and executions by me in and ways, before this time named willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this, and no other, to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand seal, the year and day above written.
