Book 4 page 825: Dec. 21 1761, Earl Granville lets Samuel Reed of Rowan Co. N.C.,
have 640 acres of vacant land on the north side of the South Yadkin & both sides of
Little Dutchmans Creek, beginning at a hickory on the bank of the river, going north
75 chains to a black oak, east 80 chains to a black oak, south 85 chains to a white
oak on the river bank, then up the river, for 10 shillings, with the yearly rent of
25 shillings 7 pence half penny (at the rate of three shillings sterling the 100
acres)

Iredell Co. N.C. book D page 520; Sept. 27 1800, George Seal--no wife signs--lets Benjamin

It begins on the line of Caleb Todd at a pine, goes west 55 degrees west 26 chains & 50 links to a red oak on his corner & the line of Benjamin Todd, south with the line of Todd 31 degrees west 18 chains & 50 links to a white oak on the corner of Todd, south with his line again 31 chains & 90 links to a pine on the corner of Joshua Pain & line of Todd, south with the line of Pain 49 chains to a stake on the line of John Sloan, east with the line of Sloan 44 chains to a stake on the corner of Caleb Todd, north with the line of Todd 20 chains to a pine on his other corner, then with his line again to the beginning.

N.C.--have 133 acres on the waters of Crows Creek, beginning on the corner of Dilly Williams at a forked elm, going south with the line of the original survey 18 chains & 60 links to a stake on the line of John Sloan, east with his line 44 chains to a stake on the line of Caleb Todd, north with the line of Todd 20 chains to a pine on his other corner, north with the line of Todd again 39 degrees east 25 chains & 40 links to the corner of Dilly Williams on Crows Creek, then south with his line 75 degrees west 55 chains to the beginning, for 65 pounds & 5 shillings N.C. money, witnessed

The will of Alexander Reed (book A page 243), made Jan. 11 1775 & probated . Wife: Margrat (use of the home). Sons: Alexander (the home place); Samuel (the big Bible & 1/7 of); Andrew (1/7 of), John (1/7 of) & George (1/7 of). Daughters: Frances Hall (1/7 of), Hannah Knox (1/7 of) & Mary Wilson (5 shillings--her 1/7 going to her two children Alexander & Margrat Wilson). Executors: sons Alexander & Andrew. Attests: Samuel Young, John Armstrong & George Kerr.

John L. Reid (Yadkin River)

Married Oct. 26 1873 by D. Barringer, a J.P.; John S. Leonard age 18 years (son of George & Susan Leonard) to Margaret Reid, age 17 years (daughter of John L. & Louisa Reid).

Book 40 page 170; April 8 1874, John C. Connor & wife Sally J. let Luke Blackmer--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have their undivided fifth of 400 acres next Alick Miller & Jesse Klutts (this being what was formerly owned by Henry W. Connor); also their sixth interest in the estate of deceased John L. Reid next Peter W. Hairston, Burton Craige & others, for \$1.00, as they owe Tobias Kesler \$239.40 & Luke Blackmer \$53.75 & c.

Book 56 page 87; Oct. 9 1875, Louisa Reid as administrator of deceased John L. Reid (on the petition in 1873 showing that he died leaving heirs John F., Sarah Jane wife of John C. Connor, Maggie E. wife of John Leonard, Alice, William W. & Lula who want the land sold, which was granted & sold at the home on May 4 1874 & confirmed) lets William W. Stoner have 111 acres & 3 rods (111 1/2 acres) on the Yadkin River, crossing two branches next ---Kern, for \$450.00.

Book 56 page 55; April 12 1879, William W. Stoner--no wife signs--lets Mrs. Dora M. Kerns (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 111 acres & 3 R., on the Miller's Ferry road next Peter Hairston & crossing two branches, (but excepts 28 acres sold off of it), for \$320.00, witnessed by James E. Kerr & acknowledged on the same day.

Thomas Reed (North Bank of Yadkin River)

Book 16 page 240: Oct. 6 1794, Walter Belah, a blacksmith--no wife signs--lets Thomas Reed, a sadler (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 9 acres on the north bank of Yadkin River next Lewis McCartney & Alexander Long, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Carson & James Macay & proven by the latter in Feb. 1796. (This is part of the grant of 30 acres from The State to said Belah on Oct.30 1784) It begins on the corner of Lewis McCartney at a heap of Stones, goes with his line east to the river bank, south, up the river, 67 degrees west to the line of Alexander Long, then north to the beginning.

Book 17 page 664: March 29 1801, Dilly Williams--no wife signs--lets Peter Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 133 acres on the waters of Crows Creek, beginning on the line of Caleb Todd at a pine on the beginning corner of the original survey, going with his line north 55 degrees west 6 chains & 50 links to a red oak on the line of Benjamin Todd, south 31 degrees west 18 chains & 50 links to a white oak on the corner of Todd, west with his line 31 chains & 90 links to a pine on the corner of Joshua Pain & line of Todd, south with the line of Pain 30 chains & 40 links to an elm, north 72 degrees east, crossing Crows Creek several times, 55 chains & 50 links to a stake on Crows Creek, to the line of the original survey, north with the original line 39 degrees west 12 chains & 80 links to the beginning, for \$150.00, witnessed by John Parsons & Philip Smith & proved by the latter in May court of 1801. (This is a part of a State Grant to Thomas Reed who indentured it to the said Dilly Williams in 1797).

John L. Reid ("White House" on west bank of Yadkin River)

Book 42 page 562: Aug. 20 1858, John L. Reid--no wife signs--lets C.F. Fisher & Daniel Kern--all of Rowan Co.N.C., have 2 acres beginning on the south bank of the Yadkin River eight feet below the Trading Ford, going with a line made by the said Reid in 1846 to G.L. Torrance (now D.F. Caldwell's) to a stone corner, west parallel with D.F. Caldwell's line to the line of John B. Kerns, then west with his line up the river to the beginning, for \$60.00, witnessed by William R. Russell & Step Roberts & acknowledged June 9 1863.

Book 42 page 536: Oct. 17 1846, John L. Reid--no wife signs--lets Charles L. Torrance (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have "the Dwelling House Known as the White House" & other buildings on the west bank of the Yadkin River at entrance of Trading Ford, on the upper line of --- Torrance & up the river, being ----- acres, for \$500.00, witnessed & proved by James I. Long on April 14 1863. Beginning on the west bank of the River at an oak "at the entrance to the Trading Ford", going south 65 degrees west 28 1/2 poles to a stake, south 14 1/2 degrees east 52 poles to a stake, east 65 degrees west 28 1/2 poles to the upper line of Torrance, north with the line of said Torrance to a stake on the bank of said river, then up its meanders to the beginning, "including the Dwelling House Known as the White House, and the other buildings".

Book 23 page 377: Oct. 8 1814, James Burckhead--no wife signs--lets John Tiller Reed (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 210 acres on Gar Creek next James Daniels & Lewis Lawflin, for \$230.00, witnessed by Abram Johnston & Clement Reed & proved by the latter in Feb. 1815.

Book 16 page 187: Feb. 22 1797, The State grants, (#2469 at 50 shillings the 100 acres), to Thomas Reed 266 acres on the waters of Crows Creek, beginning on the line of Caleb Todd at a pine & going north 55 degrees west 26 chains & 50 links to a red oak on his corner & the line of Benjamin Todd, south with the line of --- Todd 31 degrees west 18 chains & 50 links to a white oak on the corner of --- Todd, west with the line of --- Todd again 31 chains & 90 links to a pine on the corner of Joshua Pain & the line of --- Todd, south with the line of Pain 49 chains to a stake on the line of John Sloan, east with the line of Sloan 44 chains to a stake on the corner of Caleb Todd, north with the line of --- Todd 20 chains to a pine on his other corner, then with his line again to the beginning.

Book 16 page 240: Oct. 6 1794, Walter Belah, a blacksmith--no wife signs--lets Thomas Reed, a sadler (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 9 acres on the north bank of Yadkin River next Lewis McCartney & Alexander Long, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Carson & James Macay & proven by the latter in Feb. 1796. (This is part of the grant of 30 acres from The State to said Belah on Oct.30 1784) It begins on the corner of Lewis McCartney at a heap of Stones, goes with his line east to the river bank, south, up the river, 67 degrees west to the line of Alexander Long, then north to the beginning.

Williams & Leonard Smith & proved by the latter in May court of 1801. (This is part of a State grant to the said Thomas Read.)

Book 17 page 657: Oct. 13 1797, Thomas Read (Franke also) let Benjamin Gilstrap (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 133 acres on Grows Creek next Dilly Williams, John Sloan & Caleb Todd, for 65 pounds & 5 shillings, witnessed by Reave Williams & Leonard Smith & proved by the latter in May 1801. (This is part of a State Grant to said Read.)

Book 18 page 862; Sept. 16 1803, Lewis Gilstrap--no wife signs--lets Thomas Smith Hill (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have acres on Crows Creek next Caleb Todd, Benjamin Todd, & Joshua Payne, crossing said creek several times next the original survey, for 100 pounds witnessed by Daniel ? & Morris Davis & proven by the latter in Feb. 1804. (This is part of the State Grant sold to Thomas Read who let Peter Smith have Oct. 23 1797).

Book 17 page 611; April 27 1801, Peter Smith--no wife signs--lets Lewis Gilstrap (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 133 acres on Crows Creek next Caleb Todd, Benjamin Todd & Joshua Pain, crossing said creek several times, for 100 pounds, witnessed by George Smith & Bright Gilstrap & proved by the latter in May 1801. (This is part of a State Grant to Thos. Wread who certified it to the said Smith on Oct. 23 1797)

Book 17 page 664; March 29 1799, Dilly Williams--no wife signs--lets Peter Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 133 acres on Crows Creek next Caleb Todd, Benjamin Todd & Joshua Pain, crossing said creek several times, for 100 pounds, witnessed by John Carson & Philip Smith & proved by the latter in May 1801. (The State granted this to Thomas Reade who let the said Williams have it on Oct. 23 1797).

Book 46 page 69; Jan. 28 1871, J.A.Reid & wife Martha E. let D.C.Reid--all of Rowan Co.N.C. have 68 1/2 acres next Michael Miller, the river, J.A.Reid & public road; also 49 1/2 acres on the south side of the public road next Alexander Shemwell, ---Miller & J.A.Reid, for \$655.00, acknowledged on July 6 1871.

Book 26 page 179; Dec. 1 1887, J.A.Owens, James A.Reid & wife M.E., Michael Miller & wife Manda J., M.M.Owens, C.A.Owens, B.H.Owens & wife L.S., let Eliza T.Owens--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 41 acres next lot #4, (being lot #5 in the estate of deceased Philip Owens) for \$415.00, witnessed by B.C.Arey & acknowledged on the same day.

Special Proceedings page 18; May 6 1874, J.E.Harris & wife Caroline M., J.H.Thayer & wife Jane, Holmes W.Reid, William A.Reid, N.C.Wyatt & wife Nancy E. & Lafayette Reid (an infant by his guardian, D.C.Reid) for partition

Miss Ada Holmes said her mother Jane Harris (wife of Judge Reuben Lindon Holmes, son of Jesse, son of Reuben the 1st here from Massachusetts) has a brother, James Edney Harris who married Caroline, (daughter of Richmond Reid by wife Eliza) She thought this Eliza was a daughter of Jesse Holmes & sister of Reuben & Moses Holmes of Salisbury, N.C.-- while James Edney Harris was a son of William, son of Jesse Harris.

Book 33 page 145; Jan. 14 1836, Thomas J? Reed, Jacob Morgan & wife Ally (an infant heir of the deceased Noah Reed Sr.) of Calaway Co. Canetucky, let Aaron Miller of Rowan Co. N.C., have their one quarter of the land of said deceased or 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres out of 233 acres on Flat Creek on the west side of the Yadkin River, next Moses Reed, ---Lamberts & John Reed, for \$125.00, witnessed by Jacob Miller Sr. & Abraham Miller & proved by the latter in Aug. 1836.

Richmond Reed (Yadkin River bank).

April 6 1874, Otha V. Poel petitions the Board of County Commissioners to view his 105 acres on the Yadkin River next Nathan Morgan & wife Lavina, Boyden Trexler & wife F.S.A.C. of which 30 acres needs to be drained about 450 yards across Boyden Trexlers land to connect with that of the heirs of Richmond Reid, & although it can be of little damage to Trexler he objects. The board appointed Alexander Shemwell, Henry Barringer & A.M. Peeler to investigate & after Poole gave both couples a copy of the notice about half of a mile from their homes on the Bringle's Ferry read on April 13 1874, they too agreed but the Trexlers do not.

Book 42 page 484; Dec. 5 1862, John I. Shaver (as Receiver of Rowan County N.C. in the Confederate States) on a petition from Mary Ann, wife of Charles Hartman (an enemy & alien now in the state of Illinois) against John L. Hill who is now in possession of the land, having sent notices, lets Richmond Reed of Davidson Co. N.C., have 50 acres on the bank of the Yadkin River near the old Casper corner, lot #5, H.W. Hill & up the river, for \$1210.00, witnessed & proved by Thomas McNeely on Dec. 5 1862.

Book 15 page 9; April 8 1797, Henry Frick (a German & no wife signs) lets David Reed-- both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 100 acres on the south side of Cedar Creek next the old tract of said Frick & crossing a branch, for 25 pounds, witnessed by David Cox & acknowledged in May 1797. (~~This deed was later in possession of Ephraim Mauney & the dimensions~~ are; beginning on said Frick's corner of the old tract at a black oak saplin, going north 25 chains with his old line to a small red oak, west, a new line, 40 chains crossing a branch to a lightwood stake, south with the open line 25 chains to a stake in the old line of the whole tract, then east with the old line 40 chains to the beginning.

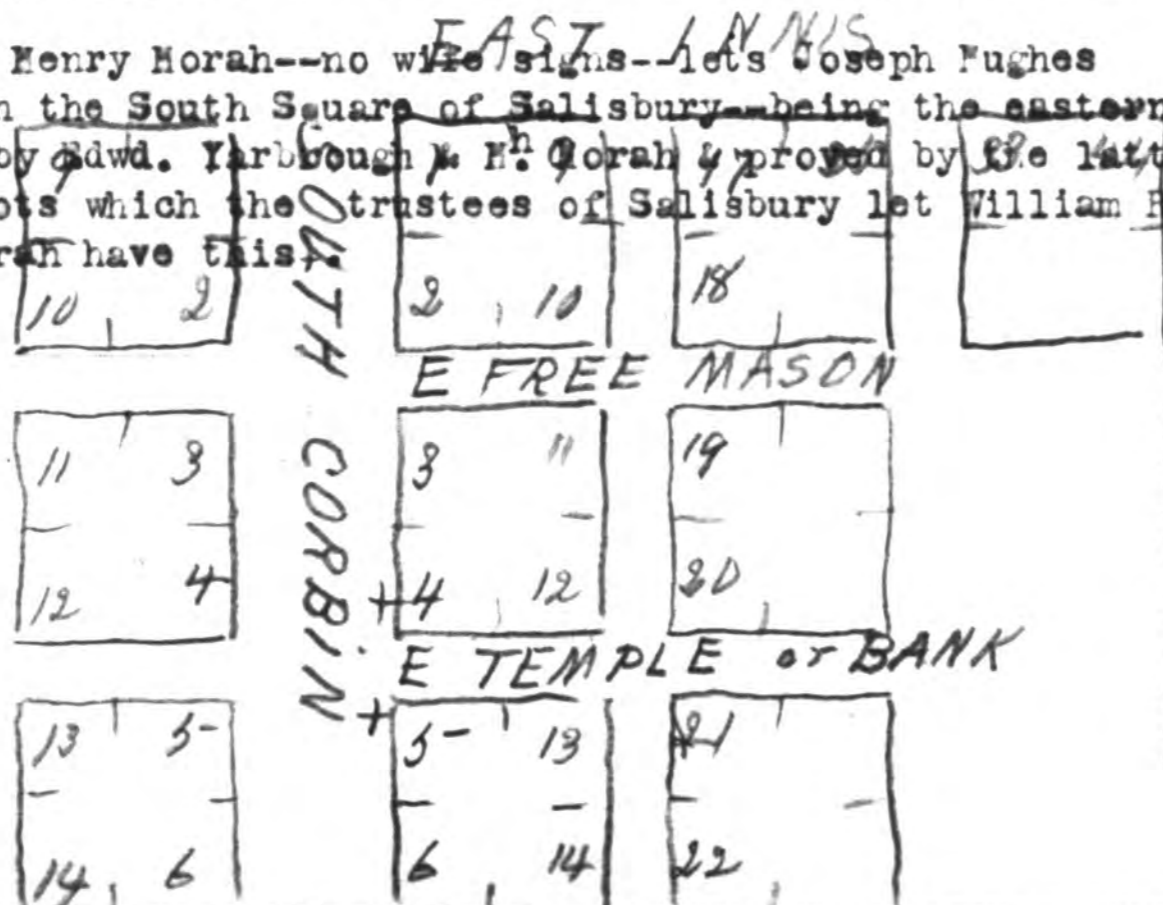

Their ancestor, John Willson, said to have been a tory, had died by 1785, at which time, his widow, Esther Willson was a widow with at least two daughters; Elizabeth (who had married John Reed (born about 1760) by 1781 as their first son, George Washington Reed, was born in 1782), & Sarah Willson, (who married David Hampton). They went to Clarke Co. Kentucky, about 1784 or 85, from Rowan Co. N.C.

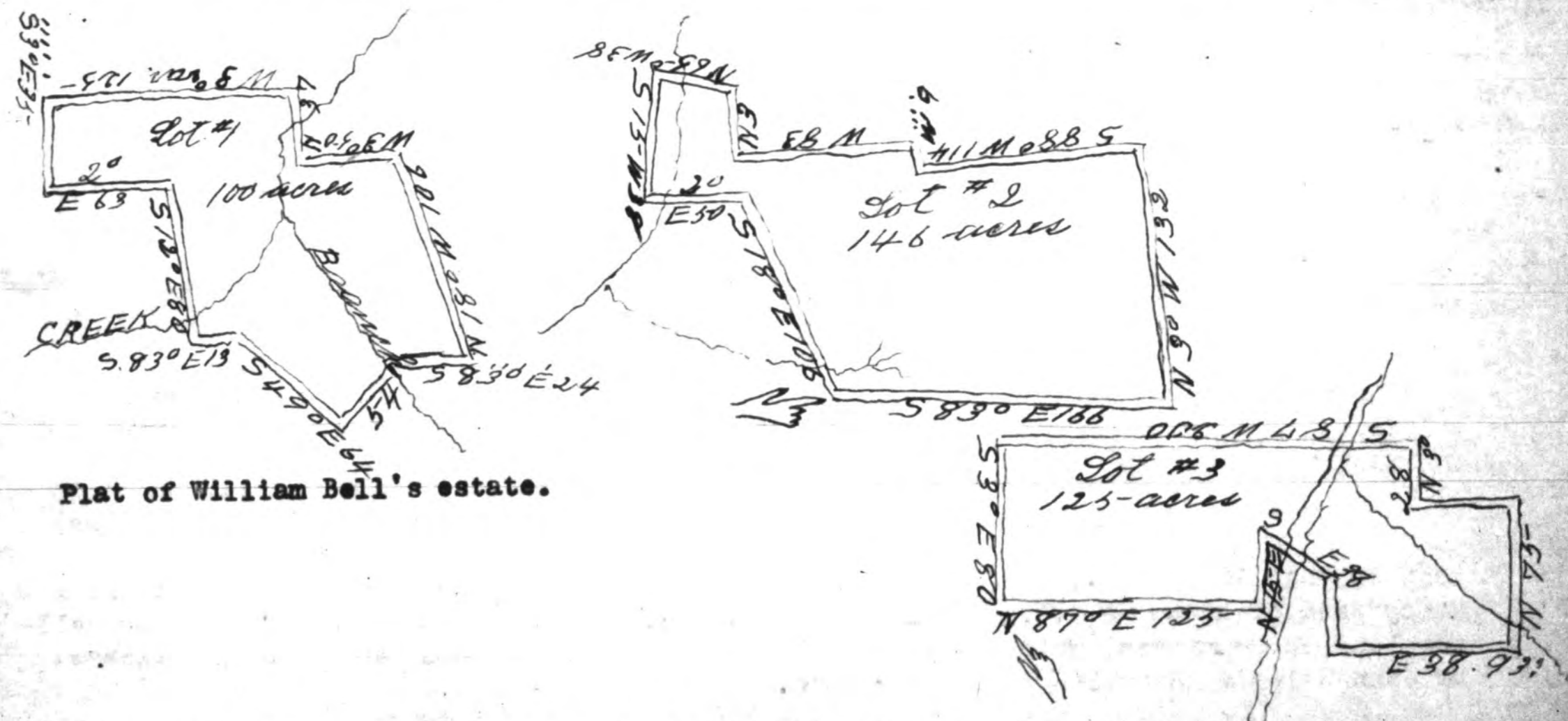
