Lieut. David Meriwether (1755-1822) born in Va. died in Clark Co. Ga., was lieutenant of Va. Continental Line in 1776 & continued in active service, except while in captivity, until the close of the war. He was in the battles of Monmouth, Trenton, Brandywine, Germantown, Siege of Savannah & Charleston. See also #60439.

John Johnston (1734-1816) born in Ireland, died in Nashville Tenn., was a member of the Rowan County N.C. Committee of Safety.

Major Philip Alston () living in Cumberland Co. N.C. during the Revolutionary War where he was appointed major of the Cumberland Co. Militia.

John Ramsey (died 1807) was drafted from Iredell Co. N.C. & served at Ramsour's Mill in 1780, under Gen. William Davidson, & was here shot in the knee. His widow was allowed a pension in 1844 in Monroe Co. Tenn., See also #36516.

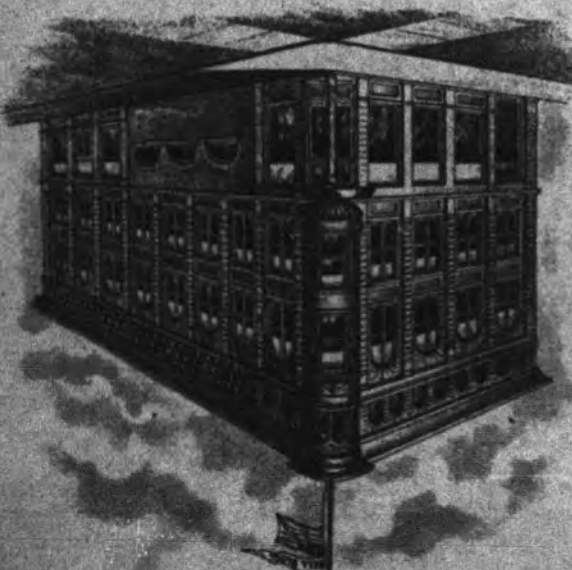

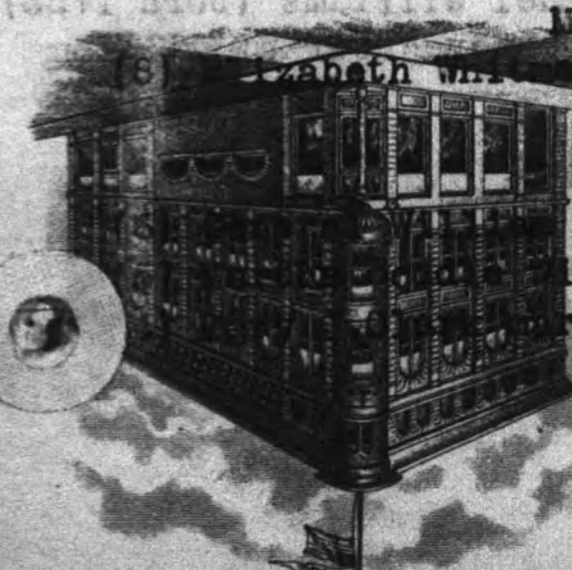
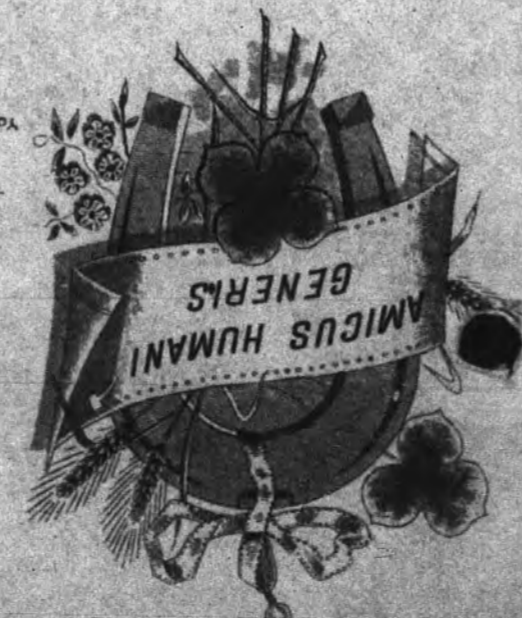

Joseph Montford 7, 1724-76, who came from England to N.C. in 1750 & was clerk of Halifax court in 1758; member of Colonial Assembly 1762-73; Colonel of Halifax militia; appointed Provincial Grand Master of Masons of & for North America, receiving the commission in 1772 from the Duke of Beaufort Grand Master of Masons of Great Britain; & married 1753, Priscilla, the daughter of Col. Benjamin Hill of Berke Co.)

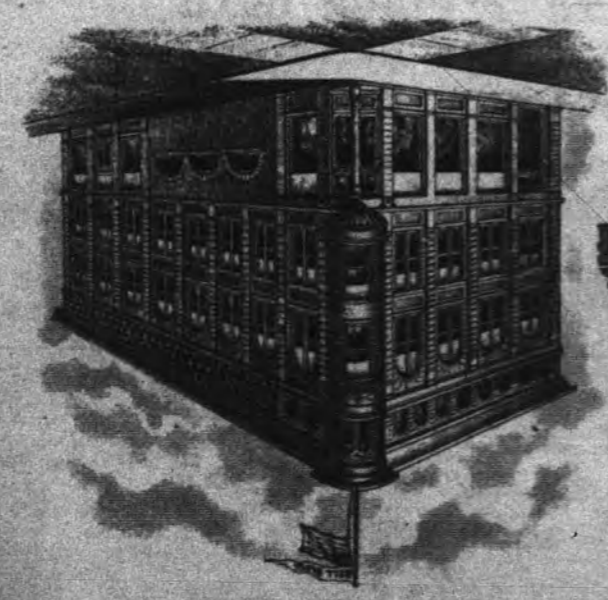
