

Book 32 page 8: Nov. 26 1832, John Tomlinson Sr.--no wife signs--lets David McMahan (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 228 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek, beginning on its edge & going south 86 degrees west 45 chains to a hickery, north 35 chains to a stake, north 45 degrees east 21 chains & 50 links to an ash on the creek bank, north 10 chains & 75 links to an ironwood, east to a stake, then to the beginning, for \$920.00, witnessed by Zadeck Griffin Tomlinson & William Tomlinson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1833. Deed from John Tomlinson to David McMahan for 228 acres Nov. 36 1832 proved by William Tomlinson.

Book 19 page 790: Dec. 30 1805, Shadrack Bail & wife Susanna of Rowan Co.N.C., let John Tomlinson late of Guilford Co.N.C., have 133 acres on Dutchmans Creek on the original line next John Dwiggins, for 391 pounds, witnessed by William Lane Sr. & Joseph Bail, & proved by the latter in Aug. 1806.

Book 22 page 492 or 592: March 7 1812, John Tomlinson--no wife signs--lets James Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 133 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek, beginning on the original corner at a pine, going north 27 chains & 4 links to a stone, west 48 chs. & 54 links to a black oak saplin, south 27 chains & 4 links to a black oak on the south east corner of the land of John Dwiggins, then east with the original line 48 chains & 54 links to the beginning, for 400 pounds current money, witnessed by John Powell & R. Powell & proved by the latter in Aug. 1812.

Book 16 page 87: Nov. 7 1797, Isaac Johnson & wife Elizabeth of Fitte Co., Kentucky, let Shadrack Dial of Rowan Co.N.C., have 133 acres on the waters of Dutchmans Creek beginning on the beginning corner of the original tract of the said Isaac Johnson at a pine & going north 27 chains & 4 links to a stake, west 48 chains & 54 links to a white oak, south 27 chains & 4 links to a stone on the original line of the said Isaac Johnson, then east 48 chains & 50 links to the beginning, for 29 pounds & 2 shillings & 6 pence, witnessed by Martha Whitehead & James Bryan & proved by the latter in Feb. court of 1798.

Book 13 page 235: July 14 1814, Phillip Swartzlander (Barbara also) let John W. Bush--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 132 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres on Dutchmans Creek next Scarlet Glasscock, for \$190.00 witnessed by Nathan Lyon & Moses Hall & proven by the latter in Nov. 1814.

Book 25 page 698: Nov. 13 1817, John W. Bush--no wife signs--lets Joel Kinyoun (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 132 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres on Dutchmans Creek next Scarlet Glasscock, for \$300.00, witnessed by Cornelius Smith & John Pierce & proven by the latter in Feb. 1820.

Marriage bonds: Joel Kinyoun to Margaret Bush Dec. 10 1817 signed by Cornelius Smith.

Book 31 page 362: Sept. 23 1823, Henry Jones (as the executor of deceased Joel Kinyoun) lets William Tomlinson of--all of Rowan--have 132 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres on Dutchmans Creek next Scarlet Glasscock, for \$250.00, witnessed by LittelBerry Austin & proven by him in Aug. 1831.

Book 11 page 159: Oct. 25 1787, The State grants (#1129 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Richardson Owen 400 acres on Little Creek of Abbotts Creek next Richard Hanks & Samuel Parks.

Book 11 page 653-4: Feb. 17 1789, Richardson Owen of Caswell Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets William Tomlinson of Randolph Co.N.C., have 400 acres on Little Creek of Abbotts Creek next Richard Hanks & Samuel Park, for 210 pounds, witnessed & proved by Josiah Tomlinson in May 1789.

May 9 1789: Deed from Richardson Owen to William Tomlinson for 400 acres Feb. 17 1789 proved by Josiah Tomlinson.

Book 11 page 654: Sept. 8 1788, James Hilton--no wife signs--lets Josiah Tomlinson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 246 or 146 acres on Hunts Fork for 156 pounds, witnessed by John Viech, Jonathan Hilton & Moses Mendenhall & proved by the last named in May 1789.

May 9 1789: Deed from James Melton to Josiah Tomlinson for 146 acres Sept. 8 1788 proved by Moses Mendenhall. This is 146 acres beginning on the original corner at a stake & going west 18 chains to a pine, south 28 degrees west 28 chains to a stake, west 5.65 to a pine, south 23 chains to a post oak on the old line, east with said line 36.65 to a post oak then north to the beginning & is a part of 246 acres.

N.C., have 400 acres on James Creek of Abbotts Creek near the ford, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Josiah Tomlinson & Joseph Sutlive & proved in May 9 1789; Deed from Richardson Owin to Benjamin Ward for 400 acres Feb. 17 1789 proved by Joseph Sutlive.

Book 16 page 175: Nov. 17 1797, Benjamin Ward of Randolph Co. N.C. lets Robert Moffitt of Chatham Co. N.C., have 400 acres on Jameys Creek of Abbotts Creek, for 200 pounds, witnessed by Samuel Tomlinson, David Vestal & L. Ward & proved in Feb. 1798. (The State granted this to Richardson Owen Oct. 25 1786 & he let Benjamin Ward have it

D.A.R. Records Vol. XXXII. page 80; Miss Dolly Williams Kirk, born in Tuscaloosa, Ala. joined as #31212 from Richardson Owen (1744-1821) born in Henrico Co. Va., went to North Carolina in 1762, died in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. He was a zealous whig, firm friend to liberty, a commissioner of Guilford Co. N.C. during the Revolution. See also #9440. She is the daughter of George Hamilton Kirk married Julia Ann Owen; granddaughter of Thomas Owen married Dolly Payne Williams; great-granddaughter of Richard Owen married Sarah Duty.

Book 11 page 119: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1084 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Richardson Owens 640 acres on Hunts Fork of Abbotts Creek.

Book 11 page 656: Feb. 7 1789, Richardson Owen of Caswell Co. N.C.--no wife signs--let Samuel Tomlinson of Guilford Co. N.C., have 640 acres on Hunts Fork of Abbotts Creek, beginning in a field, for 500 pounds, witnessed by Joseph Sutlive Josiah Tomlinson proved by the latter in May 1789.

Book 18 page 439: May 24 1800, The State grants (#2658 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Josiah Tomblinson 221 acres on Rich Fork of Abbotts Creek next Stephen Viteeto, Elias Pope, Nathan Pope, the Randolph line, the Guilford line & Christian Wilson. (Supposedly being tract #2971 entered on Jan. 9 1786; #3813 entered March 26 1790 & #412 entered Sept. 20 1797).

Book 22 page 403 or 503 (numbered twice): March 1812, Isaac Burton of Guilford Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Thomas Elliott of Rowan Co. N.C. have 41 acres on Abbots Creek next --- Collet George Ewin & George Pope, for 40 pounds, witnessed by William Pope & Jesse Burton & proved by the latter in May 1812. (This is part of a State Grant made to Josiah Tomlinson).

Book 22 page 398 or 498 (numbered twice): Oct. 10 1802, Josiah Tomlinson--no wife signs--lets Isaac Burton (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 193 acres on Rich Fork of Abbots Creek on the county-line, crossing Vitatoes mill-branch, next --- Collet, crossing the mill-pond, next --- Glandon, for 100 pounds, witnessed by John Kannadey & Jesse Burton & proved by the latter in May 1812.

Book 23 page 697: Feb. 13 1816, Isaac Burton--no wife signs--lets Emsly Burton (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 113 acres & 156 poles on Rich Fork of Abbots Creek on the County-line next Thomas Elliott, Jesse Burton & William Canady, for \$500.00, witnessed by Elis. Tharps & Joshua Burton & proved by the latter in Feb. 1816.

Book 27 page 531: Dec. 22 1818, William White--no wife signs--lets James Tomlinson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 78 $\frac{3}{4}$ acres on Cedar Creek next Asa Cox, southeast side of the Georgia road, next --- Dagley & Joseph Howell, for \$150.00, witnessed by Nancy Brown, & John Pierce & proved by the latter in Feb. 1823.

Book 25 page 160: Jan.3 1818, Hardy Jones of Surry Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Dabney P.Jones of Madison Co.Georgia, have 213 acres on the Yadkin River next Mr. Beryman on the south side of the road leading to Jones' Ferry of the Yadkin next Widow Beaton, Peter Dowel, Samuel Jones, Edmund Holding & --- Mattox, for \$500.00, witnessed by John Tomlinson & Samuel Edwards & proved by the latter in Feb. 1819.

Book 25? page 418: Jan.8 1818, Dabney P.Jones of Madison Co.Georgia--no wife signs--lets John Tomlinson of Rowan Co.N.C., have 213 acres on the Yadkin River next Mrs. Berryman on the south side of the road leading to a Ferry on the Yadkin formerly call,d Jones Ferry" next Widow Beaton, Peter Dowell, Samuel Jones, Edmond Holden & --- Mattox, for \$500.00, witnessed by Robert Jones & Daniel Hunt & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818.

Book 25 page 160: Dec. 22 1818, William White--no wife signs--lets James Tomlinson (son of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 213 acres on Cedar Creek next Mrs. Cox, southeast side of the Georgia road, next --- Dabney & Joseph Howell, for \$125.00, witnessed by Henry Brown & John Pierce & proved by the latter in Feb. 1819.

Book 15 page 42: Aug. 15 1786, Hardy Jones & wife Sarah of Mecklinburg Co. Va., let Edmund Holding of Rowan Co. N.C., have 147 acres in Rowan Co. N.C. next Matthew Jones, for 60 pounds, witnessed by Isaac Enochs, Roland Jones & John Seegar & proved in May 1797.

Book 21 page 19: Aug. 22 1805, Hardy Jones of Notley Maddon (both of Rowan Co) have 212 acres on the Yadkin River next John Wilkerson (but excepts the land drowned by Roland Jones' mill-pond when it is as high as it now is) for 1000 pounds, witnessed by Robert Harris & Dudley Ballard & proved in Aug. 1807.

Aug. 8 1786: The will of Hugh Tomlinson is proved by John Reed. The executors, Samuel Ellis & Humphrey Bucket Tomlinson returned an inventory of the estate.

The will of Hugh Tomlin, a farmer (Book C page 143) made while 'very sick and weak' on June 23 1786. Wife Mary (deceased). Daughter Sany or Sarah. Sons: Archibald, Perry, Hugh & Samuel. Exrs: friend & father Samuel Ellis Sr. & friend & brother Bucket Tomlin. Witnesses: Joshua Ellis, Isaac Green & John Reid.

On May 7 1787, Capt. Joseph Nichols returns Becket Tomlinson as having 1 white male between 21 & 60 years of age, 5 white males under 21 or over 60 years, 5 white females, & 5 blacks (He is listed next Joshua Ellice & John Green & not very far from Samuel Elless who had 3 white males under 21 or over 60 years & 5 white females)

Book 9 page 390; March 21 1780, The State grants (#147 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to William McCrary 250 acres on Rockey Creek next David Logan & Thomas Bones.

Book 9 page 519: Oct. 3 1783, William McCreery of Wilkes Co. N.C. --no wife signs lets Hugh Tomlinson of Rowan Co. N.C. --both yeomen--have 250 acres on Rockey Creek next David Logan & Thomas Jones, for 100 pounds, witnessed by John Chambers, & Joshua Ellis & proved by Joshua Ellis Jr. in Aug. 1784. (This had been granted to Wm. McCreery on March 21 1780 by deed).
Aug. 4 1784: Deed from Wm. McCreery to Hu. Tomlinson for 250 acres Oct. 3 1783 proved by Joshua Ellis. (This is on the waters of Rockey Creek, beginning at a post oak, going south 42 chains & 50 links to a stake, east 59 chains to a stake on the line of David Logan, north 42 chains & 50 links to a stake of the line of Thomas Bones, then west with his line to the beginning.)

May 7 1787, Capt. Joseph Nichols returns Marthew Tomson as having 1 white male under 21 or over 60 years & 2 white females (listed next Becket Nichols Elizabeth Dunkin & some Holms)

Nov. 7 1788: Becket (?) Thomison is made overseer of the road from Richland Cove to Haiden's Ferry in Capt. Nichol's Company.

Nov. 9 1787: A road is ordered to be laid off from Flat Shoals via Wm. Summers Sr. to intersect another road from Richland Cove & those appointed to attend it: Jacob Nichols

Esq. Thomas Praither, Wm. Howard, Wm. Summers Jr., Barton Dyson, Samuel Ellis Jr., Thomas Belt, Burgess Gaither, Wm. Summers Sr., Becket Tomlason, Joshua Ellis & John Brandon.

Joseph Tomlinson (Elishas Creek of Dutchmans Creek)

Book 15 page 281: Oct. 10 1797, Zachariah Allen--no wife signs--lets John Fox (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 300 acres on Elishas Creek next Thomas Allen, Joseph Allen, Joseph Dial & Thomas Brewer, for 300 pounds, witnessed by Rebeckah Hughes & Joseph Dial & proved by the latter in Nov. 1797.

Book 21 page 520: April 19 1804, John Fox--no wife signs--lets Joseph Allen (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 30 acres next Joseph Allen, for 30 pounds, witnessed by W. Moore & William Moore & proved by the latter in May 1809. (This is part of the 300 acres which Zachariah Allen let said Fox have). It begins at a dead pine, goes north 70 degrees east 29 chains to a small black Jack, south 16 chains to a small hickory, south 87 degrees west 22 chains to a post oak, north 38 degrees west 8 chains & 50 links to the beginning.

Book 23 page 430: April 8 1811, John Fox--no wife signs--lets Joseph Dial have 270 acres on Elishas Creek of Dutchmans Creek next Joseph Allen the said Dial, Thomas Allen, John Cheshier, Brumley Coker & Nicholas W. Gaither, for 350 pounds, witnessed by Peter Eaton & John Dial & proved by the latter on Oct. 11 1814.

Book 23 page 373: Sept. 28 1814, Joseph Dial--no wife signs--lets Joseph Tomlinson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 263 acres on Elishas Creek of Dutchmans Creek next Joseph Allen, Joseph Dial, Brumley Coker, John Cheshier & Nicholas W. Gaither, for \$900.00, witnessed by Samuel Smith & John Tomlinson & proved by the latter in May 1815. It begins on the corner of Joseph Allen & the line of Joseph Dial, goes south 87 degrees west 22 chains & 50 links to a post oak on the corner of said Allen, north 38 degrees west 8 chains & 50 links to an old pine, west 11 chains & 25 links to a hickory on the corner of Brumley Coker, south 42 chains to a pine on the corner of said Brumley Coker, west 8 chains & 40 links to a stone on the corner of John Cheshier & the line of said Coker, south 17 chains & 35 links to a black oak grub & a stone on the line of John Cheshier, east 42 chains to a black gum, north 11 chains to a hickory saplin on the corner of Nicholas Watkins Gaither, east 20 chains to a white oak on the corner of said Gaither, north passing a pine on the corner of said Gaither & Joseph Dial (on his north line), 22 chains to a black oak, west 14 chains & 15 links to a hickory grub, then north 22 chains & 62 1/2 links to the beginning.

Book 31 page 327; July 2 1831, Joseph Tomlinson--no wife signs--lets William Mock (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 148 acres & 20 poles on the waters of Elisha Creek on the original line, for \$440.71, witnessed by J.Tomlinson & Tho. Ratledge & proved by the latter in Aug. 1831.

Book 33 page 96; March 25 1836, William Mock--no wife signs--lets Fielding Slater (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 148 acres & 20 poles on Elishas Creek by the original line, for \$475.00, witnessed by C.Harbin & T.Cheshire & proved by the latter in May 1836. (The said Mock bought this of --- Tomlinson).

Book 33 page 85; April 15 1836, Fielding Slater--no wife signs--lets Tennessee Cheshire (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 148 acres & 70 poles on Alishas Creek on the original line, by a little branch, for \$475.00, witnessed by J.W.Etchison & Wm. Hawkins & proved by the latter in May 1836. (This is part of the tract which Joseph Tomlinson sold William Mock, who sold it to the said Slater).

Book 14 page 94; May 29 1795, William Raper (Keziah also) let John King (both of Guilford Co.N.C.) have 40 chains partly in Rowan & partly in Guilford Co. next Alexander Thomas & James Garrison, for ---- pounds, witnessed by James Caldwell & Henry Davis & proved by the latter in Aug. 1795. (This was northeastern part of land bought of Richard Glover).

Book 13 page 786; Dec. 12 1794, Jacob Raper (Elizabeth makes her mark) let Alexander Thomas--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 220 acres on both sides of Hunts Fork next William Raper, for 189 pounds, witnessed by Joseph David, William Davis Jr. & James Clift & proved by the last named in Feb. 1795. (Said Jacob Raper's father, William Raper, gave this to him).

Book 13 page 787; Dec. 14 1792, William Raper out of love for his son Jacob, gives him 220 acres next my son William, witnessed by William Raper, Henry Davis & James Clift & proved by the last named in Feb. 1795. (This is the west part of my home-plantation which I bought of William Churton).

Book 18 page 849; June 11 1803, Joseph Rich--no wife signs--lets Mary Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres on A Lots Creek next the old line, for 80 pounds, witnessed by Emmanuel Glyple(?) & Jonathan Manlove & acknowledged in Feb. 1804. (Alexander Thomas sold this to said Rich).

Book 18 page 854; Jan. 8 1802, Alexander Thomas of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Joseph Rich of Stokes Co.N.C., have 100 acres on Abbotts Creek on the southeast corner of the old tract, for 100 pounds, witnessed & proved by John Rich in Feb. 1804. (James Smith sold this to the said Thomas).

Book 18 page 852; Sept. 30 1801, James Smith--no wife signs--lets Alexander Thomas (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres on the south east corner of the old lot, for \$236.00, witnessed by William Wilborn Jr., Seth Jones & proved by James Wilborn in Feb. 1804. (This was willed to the said James Smith by his father William Smith) The will of William Smith (book D page 69) made Nov. 10 1795. Wife: Mary (the home & 100 acres where I live). Sons: William, John, Benjamin, James (100 acres south of my homestead) Jesse (100 acres north of my homestead) & Jeremiah (100 acres on north end of my homestead). Daughters: Sarah (wife of Joseph Moore); Keziah (wife of Stephen Orsburn); Elizabeth (wife of Paul Daniel) & four youngest: Hannah, Martha, Patience & Ruth. Exrs: wife & son Benjamin. Witnesses: James Welborn, Bartholomeus Williams & Henry Davis.

Book 2 page 7: Oct. 3 1754, Sarah Pincher (makes her mark, O), lets John Pelham--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 333 acres on bank of Yadkin River next Edwd. Hughes, for 5 shillings--the release price being 50 pounds on the next day--witnessed by Edwd. Hughes & John Thomas. (Earl Granville let said Sarah have this on Dec. 17 1753).

Oct. 10 1754: Lease & release from Sarah Pincher to John Pellom is proved by Esq. Edwd. Hughes.

Sept. 18 1753: The will of Francis Pincher is proved. Sarah Pincher qualified as Exx.

Book 6 page 486: July 8 1767, Marmaduke Kimbrough & wife Mary, let James Glen, have 333 acres on south side of Yadkin River next Edwd. Hughes, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Tyree Glenn, Abraham Creson & Robert Turner. (Earl Granville granted this to Sarah Pincher on Dec. 7 1753, she conveyed it to John Pelham, he let Nathaniel Weltshire have it, who let Marmaduke Kimbrough have it).

Book 3 page 209: March 19 1756, John Pelham & wife Dorcas --both make their marks--let Nathaniel Wiltshire (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 333 acres on the bank of Wadkin River next Edward Hughes, for 5 shillings--the release price being 50 pounds on next day--witnessed by Samuel Ratcliff & Edward Hughes & proved by the latter on April 24 1756. (Earl Granville let Sarah Pincher have this Dec. 17 1753, she let said Pelham have it Oct. 4 1754--see book B page 78).

D.A.R.Lineage vol.6. page 322: Mrs. George Custis Waters (Bettie Stokes) born in Lebanon Tenn. joined as #66883 from Major Green Hill (1741-1825) born in Butte Co.N.C., died in Williamson Co.Tenn. was a Member of Provincial Congress 1774-76: made second Major in regiment of Bute County where there wasn't a single tory.

She is the daughter of Jordan Stokes & second wife Martha Frazer; granddaughter of James Frazer & wife Hannah Brown; great-granddaughter of Jeremiah Brown & wife Martha Hill; great-great-granddaughter of Green Hill & wife Nancy Thomas.

Miss Bertha Jane Smiley of 349 Yards St., Franklin, Indiana, wrote me Oct. 15 1928 for information of her ancestors who lived about 6 miles east of Salisbury near Crane Creek & were of English descent. Jacob Thomas, fought in the Revolutionary War, had a sister Margaret who married Henry Bower (the son of a Revolutionary soldier Henry Bower of Pennsylvania) & had a son Jacob Bower? (born in Rowan Co.N.C. Jan. 10 1809, Catherine & Phoebe--all baptized by a Lutheran minister of Rowan) but moved to Clark Co. Indiana in wagons with the Bowers, Fishers & Lawrences. Jacob married a Smiley of Irish descent of Kentucky & were grandparents of Miss Bertha Smiley (who writes that her grandmother Smiley was a Deraney? of N.C.)--somewhat ambiguous.
