that society as #2126, son of Isaac Winston by Olivia Bland (Michie); grandson  
of Isaac Winston by Catharine Baker (Jones); great-great-grandson of Anthony  
Winston, Captain of the Virginia Militia.

Sons of American Revolution, page 958: Lucian Minor of Galveston, Texas, joined that society as #12829, son of Lucian Minor by Lavinia C. (Price); grandson of Joseph Farrell Price by Eliza (Winston); great-grandson of Thomas Randolph Price, a private in the Virginia Continental Line.

July-20 1768: "On Motion of Alex. Martin, Esquire It is Ordered by the Court that Martin Armstrong Jacob Lash James Brown William Robins James Felkerson Will; Price William Dalton John Dunagan, William Porter, Hugh Porter William Hall and James Sheppard be Appointed as a Jury to Lay out a Road the Nearest and Best Way from the Morav. Town, Thru the Hollow to the Virginia Line where the road Crosses the Mountains to Cheppells Mines".

Book 5 page 137: Aug. 27 1762, Earl Granville lets William Preece of ----, have 300 acres on both sides Renfroes Creek (being the east fork of Tararat River) including his own improvements, beginning on the east side of said creek, for 10 shillings, witnessed by Jno. Agar & Jno. Frohock & proved in April 1763.

April 12 1763: Deed from Earl Granville to William Puise? for 300 acres Aug. 27 1762 proved by John Frohock (a witness).

Book 6 page 414: April 11 1762? William Preece & wife Mary let Martin Armstrong--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 120 acres on both sides Rentfros Creek on east fork of Tararat River, at an island on the east side of the creek, for 10 pounds, witnessed by John Griffith & James Dorchester & proved in April 1767. (This is part of a tract which Earl Granville let William & Mary Preece have Aug. 27 1762--the above date must be wrong as he couldn't sell land before he got it).

April 16 1767: Deed from William Preece & wife to Martin Armstrong for 120 acres April 11 1762? proved by James Dorchester.

Book 6 page 603: May 11 1757, Martin Armstrong--no wife signs--lets William Dolton (bot of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 120 acres on both sides of Rentfros's Creek of the east fork of Tararat River near an island, for 10 pounds, witnessed by James Dorchester & James Fulkerson & acknowledged on Sept. 7 1768 before Chief Justice M.Howard. (This is part of a larger tract granted by Earl Granville to William Preece on Aug. 27 1762 & he & wife Mary sold it on April? or Feb. 11 1767

Surry Co.N.C. book A page 156: Jan.24 1775, William Dolton--no wife signs--lets Martin Armstrong (both of Surry Co.N.C.) have 120 acres on both sides of Renfroes Creek of the east fork of Tarrat River, in Surry County, for 10 pounds, witnessed & proved by Elijah Smallwood in Feb. 1775. (Earl Granville indentured this to William Preece on Aug. 27 1762 in Rowan County before the late division of the counties, he & wife Charity? let Martin Armstrong have it in Rowan County on April 11 1767 & he let William Dolton have it May 11 1767).

July-20 1766: "On Motion of Alex. Martin, Esquire It is Orderd by the Court that Martin Armstrong Jacob Lash James Brown William Robins James Felkerson Will; Price William Dalton John Dunagan, William Porter, Hugh Porter William Hall and James Sheppart be Appointed as a Jury to Lay out a Road the Nearest and Best Way from the Morav. Town, Threw the Hollow-to the Virginia Line where the road Crosses the Mountains to Cheppells Mines".

Book 55 page 91: Sept. 21 1878, William Jones & wife Sally, Henry Price & wife Phyllis (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) have  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an acre in the north ward of Salisbury next O.W. Atwell, Crissy Owens, Mary E. & Edwin Shaver on the road from the depot to the Mocksville road, for \$100.00, witnessed by T.G. Haughton & acknowledged on the same day.

Book 76 page 148: Feb. 7 1893, Thomas Vinson & wife Laura let William Lee Sloan--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have next the heirs of M.L. Holmes, Edwin Shaver, H.N. Woodson, n north ward of Salisbury, fronting on Church St. & on Kerr St., between Church & Jackson streets, for \$25.00  
(Henry Price & wife Let ---Woodson have this on Dec. 30 1879--see book 57 page 167).

Book 57 page 167: Dec. 30 1879, Henry Price & wife Phyllis let Horatio N. Woodson--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an acre in the north ward of Salisbury, fronting on Kerr street 497 feet (between Church & Jackson Streets) next O.W. Atwell, John H. Heilig & Edwin Shaver, beginning next Shaver on Kerr St., going back 197 feet to O.W. Atwell, for \$85.00, witnessed & proved by T.J. Haughton on the same day.

Book 5 of Mortgages page 308; March 16 1889, Joel L.Swink--no wife signs--lets William A Woodson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 60 acres in Unity Township next John Morrison, Daniel Penninger & Joseph A.Mingus, for \$350.00, acknowledged on the same day.

Book 81 page 593; Dec. 4 1895, W.R.Woodson (as the trustee of Joel L.Swink who made the trust--see book 5 page 308), lets A.H.Price of Rowan Co.N.C., have 60 acres in Unity Township next John Morrison, Daniel Penninger & Joseph H.Mingus, for \$225.00

Book 66 page 575: Nov.28 1872, R.H.M.Price & wife E.P. or "Lizzie" of Iredell Co.N.C., let John W.Potter of Rowan Co.N.C., have 148 acres on Back Creek next S.C.Rankin, the road, Dr. Hall,---Goodman, a field, ---Upright & ---Rodgers, for \$1000.00, witnessed by J.N.Moore & A.M.Hudson & acknowledged by the Prices in Mecklenburg Co.N.C. on April 21 1885.

Prominent Living North Carolinians (by Jerome Dowd in 1888) page 210: "REV. J.C. PRICE OF SALISBURY. The subject of this sketch is, perhaps, the most distinguished negro in America. He is certainly equal to any as an orator. He has lectured in England and America before the best audiences. He has preached in the pulpit of Henry Ward Beecher." He remained in England & on the Continent one year lecturing in behalf of his race & collected \$10,000.00 which established Livingston College, at Salisbury, N.C. "He was born in Elizabeth City, N.C., February 10th, 1854, and is therefore as yet a young man. He is a genuine negro. His father was a slave, his mother a free but unlettered woman. At the age of nine he went with his mother to New Berne. She did her part to give him an education. Some time after he had learned to read, he attended the Lowell Normal School of New Berne. For four years he taught in a public school at Wilson, then entered Shaw University of Raleigh in 1873, remaining five months. Returning to New Berne, he connected himself with the A.M.E. Zion Church, and began to preach in less than two years after. Desiring to better qualify himself, he entered the Lincoln University of Pennsylvania, and took a four years' course. He won the Freshman and Junior prizes as an orator. In 1879, he graduated with the valedictory. After graduation he remained three years in the Theological Seminary, completing the course at that place."\*\*\*Appointed by Book 67 page 302; Sept. 20 1886, William McClay & wife Rena of Iredell Co. Book 66 page 575; Nov.28 1872, R.H.M.Price & wife E.P. or "Lizzie" of Iredell Co.N.C., let John W.Poteet of Rowan Co.N.C., have 148 acres on Back Creek next S.C.Rankin, the road, Dr. Hall,---Goodman, a field, ---Upright & ---Rodgers, for \$1000.00, witnessed by J.N.Moore & A.M.Hudson & acknowledged by the Prices in Mecklenburg Co.N.C. on April 21 1865.

Charles Price (Yadkin River)

Book 71 page 590; Feb. 5 1890, D.M. Brown & wife E.R. let Lydia L. Earnhart--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 116 acres on the Yadkin River, for \$632.00, acknowledged on the same day. (This is what Silas Earnhart bought from George Cauble on Nov. 29 1856, & was deeded by Julius Earnhart, as the trustee of Silas Earnhart & wife Lou E., to D.M. Brown on Jan. 18 1890.)

Book 75 page 448; Nov. 29 1856, George A. Cauble--no wife signs--lets Silas Earnhart (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 116½ acres on the south side of the Yadkin River, about 5 miles north of Salisbury, next Milas Cauble, Jo. Swink & John Cauble, for \$550.00, witnessed by J.S. Johnston & acknowledged on Sept. 25 1891. (This is what Martin & Polly Cauble let John A. Weirman have who sold it to the said George A. Cauble).

Book 74 page 2; Aug. 20 1891, Julius Earnhart & wife Lydia L. let W.C. Ridenhour--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 106½ acres on the south bank of the Yadkin River next ---Swink, for \$1050.00, witnessed by J.W. Hamney & acknowledged on the same day. (Refer to book 75? page 25, 71 page 590, mortgage in book 4 page 58, & deed from George Cauble to Silas Earnhart on Nov. 29 1856).

Book 94 page 168; Oct. 27 1902, Allen A. Weant & wife Mary A. let Mary R. Price & A.H. Price (the wife & son of Charles Price)--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 116½ acres on the south bank of the Yadkin River next ---Swink, for \$345.15, witnessed by Thomas H. Vanderford & acknowledged on the same day. (Refer to books 93 page 25 & 91 page 590, also to the mortgage from George Cauble to Silas Earnhart on Nov. 29 1856 in book 74 page 2).

Book 86 page 132: April 8 1899, George W. Brown & wife Nannie E. of Cabarrus Co. N.C., let Julia M. Shaping of Rowan Co. N.C., have the house & lot (in the shape of a parallelogram) in the great west square of Salisbury on the east corner of the intersection of Fisher & Ellis Streets, fronting 100 feet on Fisher St. & going back 121 feet on Ellis Street, next John Allen Brown & T.C. Linn, for \$1000.00, witnessed by John M. Cook & acknowledged in Cabarrus County April 10 1899. (This formerly belonged to the heirs of John M. Coffin & was sold John H. Verble, who willed it to the said Nannie E. as the niece of his wife.)

Married April 17 1886: Mrs. Nannie Bencini of Salisbury, N.C. age 34 years, to George W. Brown of Concord N.C., age 42 years. (Mr. Cal Fauser says her prior husband, Moses Bencini, son of Lorenzo Bencini, was a handsome but desperate man--fatal shots)

Buried in Old English Graveyard, Salisbury, N.C.; Charles N. Price born Feb. 13 1811 died July 6 1869 aged 58 yrs. 4 mos. & 23 days; Jane E. Price born April 9 1817 died Dec. 20 1890; Thomas J. Price born Oct. 22 1849 died Nov. 10 1876

Mary C. wife of T.M. Crawford, died Dec. 21 1863 aged 24 yrs. 9 mos. & 4 days; Thomas Crawford born June 9 1831 died Oct. 8 1895; Bettie Crawford Murphy, born Sept. 1857 died Sept. 7 1884

Book 55 page 272: Nov. 3 1866, Thomas M. Crawford--no wife signs--lets Jane E. Price (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have a lot on Water Street next John A. Weisman, John Shuman & T.J. Meroney, for \$441.00, witnessed & proved by W.L. Klutz on Nov. 20 1878.

% Marriage license Aug. 26 1878: Nancy Eleanora Price age 23 yrs. to Moses Anthony Bencini, age 32 yrs--they were married in Salisbury on the next day by David L. Lingle, J.P.

Book 31 page 113: Nov. 26 1828, William S. Macay--no wife signs--lets Isaac Knight (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have the land in Salisbury where Mrs. Eliza Balfour formerly lived (& which my brother, Alfred Macay bought at a sheriff's sale as the property of Ralph Kesler,) for \$125.00, witnessed by G.D. Smith & Peter Heldebrand & proved by the latter in Nov. 1830.

John Wansley (1798-1833), born in Louisa Co. Virginia, died in Elbert Co., Georgia, who enlisted in Albemarle Co. Va., in 1776 & in 1833 was allowed a Pension as a Private in the Virginia line;  
Elisha Martin (1751-1819), died in Jones Co., Georgia, settled in South Carolina in 1774 when he served as a Private in the S.C. militia - see also #41757;

Richard Harris (1730-1790), born in Pennsylvania, died in Union District, South Carolina, who signed the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence;  
Thomas Harris (1762-1800), born in Union District South Carolina, enlisted when 19 years of age in the S.C. militia, was taken prisoner on board the "Voyager" in the Charleston harbor in 1781;

William Pierce (1730-1779), died in Martin Co. N.C., who enlisted as a Private in the North Carolina line in 1778 & was soon taken to a hospital.
