

Book 21 page 513: Oct. 1 1807, Edward Buckner--no wife signs--lets John Stinchcomb (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 67½ acres next said Stinchcomb & John Buckner, for 60 pounds, witnessed by Buckner Candell, Ishmael & Haley Tatum & proved by the latter in May 1809.

Weed (Creek No Creek waters)

Book 19 page 471; Thomas Wood--no wife signs--lets Edward Buckner (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 67½ acres next John Stinchcomb & John Buckner, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Moses Burk & John Stinchcomb & proved by the latter in Feb. 1806.

Book 14 page 897: Oct. 8 1805, Thomas Weed--no wife signs--lets John Weed Sr. have 41½ ac & 15 peles next John Stinchcomb & Edward Buckner, for 20 pounds, witnessed by William Heward & Jehn Stinchcomb & proved by the latter in Feb. 1807.

Book 22 page 819 or 919 (numbered twice): Sept. 27 1813, John Wood Sr. & wife Anna let John Stinchcombe--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 41½ acres & 15 poles on the east side of Creek No Creek next said Stinchcombe & John Buckner, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Isaac Parker & John March Jr. & proved by the latter in Nov. 1813. This begins on the line of said Stinchcombe at a hickory bush, goes east 90 poles to the corner of said Stinchcombe, south with the line of said Stinchcombe 73½ poles to a best oak on the line of John Buckner, west with the line of said Buckner to a stake on the line of the said Stinchcombe, then north 90 poles to the beginning.

Book 22 page 816 or 916 (numbered twice): Nov. 8 1813, John March Sr.--no wife signs--lets John March Jr. (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres next John Stinchcombe & Jacob March, for 10 pounds, witnessed by John Stinchcombe & Jesse Walker & acknowledged in Nov. 1813.

Book 25 page 291: Feb. 10 1819, John March Jr.--no wife signs--lets Benjamin March (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres next John Stinchcomb & Jacob March, for \$700.00 witnessed by John March Sr. & John Phillips & proved by the latter in May 1819.

Daniel Wood (south Bank of Third Creek)

Book 21 page 226: Feb. 3 1808, Daniel Wood--no wife signs--lets Samuel Trott (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 55 acres on the south side of Third Creek, beginning on the creek bank on the corner of Stephen Kerr at a post oak saplin, going south 51 poles to a pile of stones on the corner of said Kerr, east 69 poles & 5 links to a black oak on the corner of James Gragy's original tract, north 180 poles to a pine at the head of said creek & on the original line of the old tract of James Gray, then up the meanders of said creek; also one eighth of an acre which William Gray let Daniel Wood have to put up a dam & a head for his saw-mill, for \$1000.00, witnessed by William Wood, Philip Rice & William Gray & proved by the last named in Feb. 1808.

Book 41 page : Dec. 28 1852, Esq. Luke Blackmer (as C.M.E. on a petition in the spring of 1852 from Thomas T. Locke, Daniel Wood & wife Jane, Richard H. Cowan & wife Margaret, Mathew Lock & William F. Cowan as tenants-in-common of a tan-yard, wishing to discontinue the business, with orders to sell & did so on July 3 1852), lets John Barger have 101½ acres on Poplar Draft next Mathew Plummer, heirs of Samuel Sloan, John Cress & Alexander Buis?, for \$350.00, acknowledged in May 1856. *It begins on the corner of Mathew Plummer & the line of the heirs of the deceased Samuel Sloan at a persimmon & goes south 1 degree east 17 chains to a stone on the corner of the said heirs, south 63 degrees west 5 chains to a stone on the corner of the said heirs, south 7 degrees east 6.50 chains to a stone on the corner of the said heirs, south 31 degrees east 8.60 chains to a stake*

on the corner of the said heirs, south 1 degree east 52 chains to a hickory.
on the corner of the said heirs, south 89 degrees west 21.32 chains to a
stake on the corner of John Cress & Alexander Bean, north $\frac{1}{2}$ degree west
22.50 chains to a stake on the corner of John Cress, north 89 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees

John Luckey, east 37 chains to a white oak on the corner of John Lowrey, south
9 chains & 50 links to a hickory on the corner of said Lowrey, south 51 degrees
west 7 chains & 50 links to a post oak on the corner of said Lowrey, south 44
chains to a post oak on the creek bank & corner of said Lowrey, then with the
meanders of the creek to the beginning.

Book 16 page 641; Oct. 31 1798, Joseph Shields--no wife signs--lets William Bra-
sel (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 160 acres beginning on the north bank of Fourth
Creek at a gum & going north 33 chains to a white oak on the line of John Luckey,
east 37 chains to a white oak on the corner of John Lowry, south 9 chains & 50
links to a hickory on the corner of the said Lowry, south 51 degrees west 7
chains & 50 links to a post oak on the corner of the said Lowry, south 44 chains
to a post oak on the corner of the said Lowry & the creek bank, then with the
meanders of the creek to the beginning, for \$410.00, witnessed by Robert Love,
William Lowry & William Gray & proved by the last named in May court of 1799. (The
State granted this to Andrew Shields, who devised it to the said Joseph Shields).

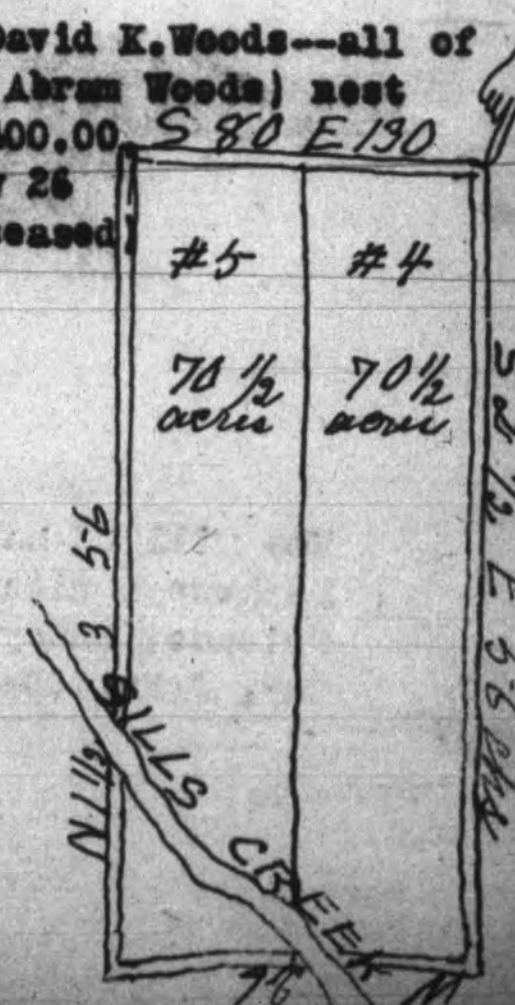
Lot #3 of 55 1/2 acres next lot #2 & T. Woods valued at \$275.00 is allotted to Trissa Woods;

Feb. 11: that part on Sills Creek next Samuel Hart, John Hart & George Duff being 141 acres, is divided by John Leazer Jr., T.S. Arwell, Daniel Leazar, Christian Seckler & Alexander Sloop & returned in May 1830 as follows among the children of said Abram Woods (who are David, Joshua, Jane, Trissa & Elizabeth)

Lot #4 of 70 1/2 acres valued at \$365.00 is allotted to Elizabeth Woods;

Lot #5 of 70 1/2 acres valued at \$375.00 is allotted to Joshua Woods.

Book 40 page 617: May 3 1856, Daniel Leazar & wife Elizabeth let David K. Woods--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 70 1/2 acres (being lot #4 in estate of deceased Abram Woods) next Samuel Hart, John Hart, south side of Sills Creek & lot #5, for \$400.00 witnessed by Christian Seckler & John Leazar & acknowledged on May 26 1856. (This had been allotted said Elizabeth as an heir of said deceased)

Elizabeth Garret to Benjamin Merrill March 3 1795. John Wiseman (J. Troy).

John Garret (Book G page 81) May 18 1793. Wife Mary. Children: Elizabeth, Mary, John, Daniel, William, Wiley and James. Ex: wife Mary and Daniel Wood. Test: John Baily Jr. John Wood and Moses Daty.

Daniel Wood to Abigail Reid Dec. 1 1813. Obadian Biles. (Marriage bonds)

Margret Wood to John Beard Dec 4 1780. James McEwen (Ad Osborn).

Rebecah Woods to Arron Varas (He signs voss?) Agu 7 1788. William Donaldson (Wm Alexander).

Book 6 page 315: On Oct. 29 1765, Henry McHenry & wife Elenor let Archibald McHenry have 256 acres (or 1/2 of 512 acres which Robert Woods & wife let him have) next John Hagin & Thomas Bell, for 5 shillings (release price on next day was 40 pounds) witnessed by John Culbertson & John Braly & proved in Oct. 1766.

Book 8 page 340: On July 11 1775, Archibald McHenry & wife Agness, let Michael Albright (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 256 acres next John Hagin, Thomas Bell & the line of Henry McHenry, for 5 shillings--the release price being 200 pounds on the next day--witnessed by John Campbell & Matthew Lock & proved by the latter in Aug. 1775. (This is 1/2 of 512 acres which Robert Woods & wife let Henry McHenry have by lease & release, & he & wife Elenor let Archibald McHenry have on Oct. 29-30 1765).

Book 6 page 198: On Dec. 8 1764, Robert Woods (Margaret Woods makes her mark) let Henry McHenry, a "Taylor", have 512 acres next Samuel Burnet, for 5 shillings--the release price being 32 pounds on the next day--witnessed by Matthew, Samuel & Joseph Woods & acknowledged in Oct. 1765.

Book 13 page 388: March 22 1792, Richmond Pearson--no wife signs--lets Vinson Wood. (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 200 acres on Swaring Creek next John Reess, for 90 pounds, witnessed by James Macay & Avention Reed, & acknowledged in Nov. 1793. (This was granted by The State to Hugh Cunningham who let said Pearson have it). *See elsewhere*

Book 94 page 15: Oct. 12 1901, Dr. L. White & wife Katie & Gertrude Wood of Iredell Co. N.C., James H. Wood & wife Blanch of Buncombe Co. N.C., Frank L. Page & wife Belle of Vance Co. N.C., Frank L. Fithian & wife Marianna of Camden Co. New Jersey, let Daniel A. Miller & M. Costin Wood of Iredell Co. N.C., have 411 acres on Fourth Creek next Walter Wood, --- Harris, --- Hobson, --- Krider (now --- Miller's) & up said creek; also 80 acres next Neal Wood (which was owned by deceased Rev. W.A. Wood when he died), for \$3571.43.

Book 30 page 532: Dec. 30 1828, Samuel Sloan--no wife signs--lets John F. Cowan (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ acres on Poplar Draft next the old field & tract which Benjamin Cowan Sr. bought of Aaron Pinkston & wife, for \$100.00, witnessed by Will Barber & John Locke & acknowledged in Feb. 1829.

Book 8 page 538; Jan. 5 1774, James Woods--no wife signs--lets Alexander Osborn (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 302 acres on west side of Catabaw River on south side of Gillshoe? Thomas Creek (a branch of south fork of Broad River) "nigh the Chirakee path", for 30 pounds, witnessed by Hugh Lawson, Nathaniel Ewing & Griffith Rutherford * acknowledged in Nov. 1778. (This was granted to said Woods on March 31 1755)

Nov. 1846: The will of Elizabeth B. Woods is proved by James Jemison (who is acquainted with the writing of the witness of deceased John Barkley). Truth Woods is the executor.

Book 40 page 336: Oct. 21 1851, Edom Wood of Davidson Co. N.C. --no wife signs-- lets Alexander Shoaf of Rowan Co. N.C., have the above for \$800.00, proved by Francis Clarke on March 26 1856.

Book 11 page 155: Aug. 9 1787, The State grants (#1451 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to

Daniel Wood 150 acres on the bank of Yadkin River next Richmond Pearson & Margaret Goss
*It begins on the river bank & corner of Richmond Pearson & goes south 12 chains
& 50 links to a black oak, west 20 chains to a dead hickory, south 34 chains & 50 links
to a hickory on the line of Margaret Goss, south with lot 45 degrees east 10 chains
& 70 links, east 25 links to a black oak, north 40 chains to a mulberry on the river
bank, then down it to the beginning.*

Book 24 page 1: Feb. 20 1817, Daniel Wood--no wife signs--lets Daniel Warner (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 160 acres on the north side of the Yadkin River, beginning on what had been the corner of Joshua Wood (now William Wood's), at a black gum, going out from the river with the line of William Wood 190 poles to the corner of William Wood, south 65 degrees east, a straight line to a black oak on the line of --McCrump; east 70 degrees 36 poles to a dogwood on said line & the corner of James Kent, ---- 130 poles to a walnut on the river bank, then up its various courses to the beginning, for \$600.00, witnessed by William F. Anderson & William B. Wood & proved by the latter in Feb. court of 1817.

Joshua Wood

Book 11 page 216; Nov. 5 1787, John Garret & wife Mary let John Johhua Woods--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 105 acres on the North bank of the Yadkin River for 150 pounds, witnessed by James Wood, William Woods & Daniel Wood & proved by the last named in Nov. court of 1787. This may be 115 acres & begins on the river bank at a black gum & goes up the river 172 poles to a sugar tree, with the old line 195 poles & then with the short line to the beginning. (Joshua Woods paid for it.)

Book 27 page 53: May 13 1822, William Wood mortgages to Esq. Mack Crump (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 115 acres on the north bank of Yadkin River, for \$511.92 $\frac{1}{2}$ witnessed by Daniel Warner & W.Hertel & acknowledged in May 1822. (This is the land which my deceased father, Joshua Wood bequeathed to me being the land which John Garret & wife deeded him Nov.5 1787--see book 11 page 216--see Jan.16 1788).

Book 11 page 163: Oct.25 1786, The State grants (#1108 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to William Wood two acres on the Yadkin River opposite the field of John Garrett on the south side of an island.

May 7 1806: The will of Joshua Wood is proven by Dr. Robert Moore

Book D page 6: The will of Joskuah Wood made June 2 1805 & probated
Wife: Rachel (the dwelling house, the river-bottom field, the negro, Judge, & some other negroes until the youngest child is of age) Sons: James, (200 acres on the end of my lower tract, but he must take good care of his grandmother, Donnahoo), William (150 acres where I live, & the negro, Judge, after his mother's death), & Daniel, (the negroes, Primus, Thomas & Jerry). Daughter: Nolley Wood, (the negro, Feat). Witnesses: Stephen Neal, James Wood & Robert Moore

Book 20 page 112: Jan.7 1809, Rachel Wood lets Daniel Wood Sr.-- have 29 acres on the north bank of the Yadkin River next Daniel Wood & Mack Crump, for 30 pounds, witnessed by Mack Crump & John Donoway & proved by the latter in Feb. 1809. (This is part of the old tract of Jacob Likens)

Rachael (Lykens) Wood

The will of Jacob Licens (book A page 85), made Feb. 23 1767, while in a "lode state of Health", a planter. Wife Ann. Daughters: Rachel, Elenor, Rebeckah & Drewzillah. Exr: wife. Witnesses: John Hunt Prater & Edward Turner.

Book 9 page 425: May 9 1782, Thomas Criswell a "Labourer" - no wife signed - let Degr. Richmond Pearson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on the east side of the Yadkin River (which had been divided by Jacob Licens & wife Anne to James Criswell Nov 29 1766 - see book 1 page 366 in the Registrars office & in Jan Court of 1767) beginning on the upper corner of John Cronche at a red oak & going east 30 chains to a pine, north 30 chains to a white oak, east 20 chains to a black oak, north 15 chains to a black oak on the river bank, then down its various courses to the beginning, for 200 pounds in gold & silver, witnessed by William Armstrong & William Butler & proved by the latter in Aug court of 1784.

Book 11 page 162: July 20 1787, Ann Dunnikin let Rachael Likens--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 229 acres on the Yadkin River, beginning at a dogwood, hickory & mulberry, going north 13 degrees east 32 chains to a black oak, --- 70 degrees east 66 chains to a black oak, south 37 degrees west 37 chains to a white oak on the bank of the said river, then up it to the beginning, for 5 shillings specie, witnessed by Joshua Wood & Daniel Wood & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1787.

Marriage bond: Rachael Lykens to Joshua Wood March 16 1790 signed by Daniel Wood

Book 19 page 438: Dec. 25 1805, Rachel Wood, alias Rachel Likens, lets James Wood (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 200 acres on the north bank of the Yadkin River, next Daniel Wood, for 10 pounds, acknowledged in Feb. court of 1806. (This is part of the 229 acres which Anne Donahoo let her have).

D.A.R. Lineage Vol. 123 page 279: Mrs. Cassandra Woods Webb Burton (wife of C.W. Burton) born in Green Co. Ark., joined as #122917 from Captain Samuel Woods (1740-1825) born in N.C., died in Carroll Co. Tenn., commanded a company at the battle of King's Mountain. See also #99594
She is the daughter of John B. Boykins (1853-90) married 1883 Lizzie Jones (born 1859); granddaughter of LeGrand M. Jones (1817-96) married 1850 Cassandra Woods (1830-79); great-granddaughter of Levi S. Woods (1801-57) married Aranthia J. Dinwiddie (1811-53); great-great-granddaughter of John Woods (1774-1846) " 1799 Charity Dyzart (1778-1814); great-great-great-granddaughter of Samuel Woods married 1760 ----Holmes.

Kriminger; also 47 acres on Little Cold Water next W.C. Beaty & William A. McDonald in Cabarrus County; also 75 acres in Rowan County (being the western part off where said Woods now lives) next John Leazar, George Corrier & others, for \$10.00, witnessed & proved by Rufus Barringer

Richard L. Woods (Thompson's or Correll's Mill-pond)

Book 52 page 541; Oct. 13 1857, Sidney H. Hart--no wife signs--lets Richard L. Woods (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 345 acres on the south side of Thomson's or Correll's mill Creek, next---Shulliberger, ---Seckler & Henry Carriker, for \$500.00, witnessed by Jacob Sloop Jr. & John I. Patterson & acknowledged on Sept. 2 1876.
Marriage bond; R.L. Woods to Jane M. Corrier June 23 1859 signed by S.J. Brown

Book 52 page 74; Oct. 28 1876, Richard L. Woods & wife Jane H. let John S. Henderson--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 197 acres where said Woods lives, next George Corriher, Jacob Shula-barrier, Franklin Waggoner & others, for \$1.00 acknowledged on April 8 1876. (This is land which Sidney H. Hart deeded said Woods on Oct. 13 1857 but there is a mortgage of \$150.00 on 75 acres made to William B. Atwell, & this done to secure debts of \$325.00 owing Elizabeth B. Henderson & \$200.00 owing Horatio K. Woodson).

Daniel Wood----- Margaret Goss or Goss? (Sandy Creek) South side of Yadkin River)

(This had been granted Matthew Woods Sr., who let Matthew Woods Jr. have, who let Joseph Woods have, who let William Barr have, who willed it to Hugh Barr).
