Book 19 page 160: Feb. 2 1805, Christian Lewis Benzean of Salem, "Clark"--no wife signs--lets Valentine Miller of Rowan Co. N.C., have 70 acres (of tract #1064 dated Sept. 28 1785 of 436 acres on Muddy Creek below the three forks--see book 10 page 362,--who let Frederick William Marshall have--see book 10 page 482) on the north fork of Gargals or Muddy Creek next the Wachovia tract & Michael Miller, for \$118.78, witnessed by Frederick Meinung & Lazarus Hage & proved by the latter in Feb. 1805. (\$180.78)

Book 10 page 482: March 25 1786, Esq. Traugott Bagge of Salem in Surry Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Esq. Frederic William Marshall of the same place, have 436 acres on both sides of Muddy Creek below the three forks & said creek, crossing said creek twice, next John Miller, for _____ witnessed by Christian Lop?, John Chitty & Peter Fry & proved by the last named in Aug. 1786. (This is tract #1064--see book 10 page 362).
Book 10 page 362: Sept. 28 1785, The State grants (#1064 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Traugott Bagge 436 acres on both sides Muddy Creek, below the three forks of said creek & crossing it next John Miller.

Joseph Miller (Dutch Second Creek)

Book 33 page 269: Dec. 5 1835, Joseph Miller--no wife signs--lets Paul Barringer (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 2 acres & 3 rods on the south side of Dutch Second Creek, beginning at a large hickory on the stony hill near said Barringer's mill-pond, going north 53 degrees 30 minutes east along the old line (crossing the mouth of a branch in the edge of the millpond) 18 to a small red oak, south 12 degrees east 16 poles to a post oak, south 17 degrees west (crossing a branch) 20 poles to a little hollow or drain, south 85 degrees west 10 poles to the beginning, for \$27.50, witnessed by John Seaford & John Barringer & acknowledged in May 1837. (This is part of the land which George M. Heilig sold the said Miller).

Book 34 page 70: Jan. 12 1839, Paul Barringer of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Moses Corl of Cabarrus Co. N.C., have 140 acres on both sides Dutch Second Creek next John Seaford, on & crossing Seaford's Branch, next Joseph Miller, Mr. Heilig, James Klutts, ---Cummins, the millpond & Nicholas Barringer, for \$2250.00, witnessed by Edmond M. Lester & Samuel Sefford & proved by the latter in Feb. 1839. (This is all that Nicholas Barringer, father of said Paul, let him have & from Joseph Miller, excepting two small tracts deeded John Seaford).

Book 40 page 107: Nov. 21 1850, Esq. J.L. Blackmer as C.M.E. (on a petition from the nine heirs of late deceased Moses Corl who died owning 150 acres, for a sale * it was sold on Jan. 30 1851) lets Jacob Corl have 150 acres on Dutch Second Creek next John Seaford, west side of Seaford's Branch & crossing it, next ---Miller, Col. Barnhardt, Moses Barringer & the millpond, for \$1000.00, acknowledged on Nov. 21 1853.

Book 33 page 254: Dec. 7 1833, George Michael Heilig--no wife signs--lets Joseph Miller (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 163 acres on both sides Dutch Second Creek next Nicholas Barringer & ---Caster, for \$925.00, witnessed by Edmund McLester, Jacob Miller & John Miller & proved by the last named in May 1837. (This is part of 320 acres which Jacob Brown, as the surviving executor of deceased Peter Barringer, sold said Heilig.)

Book 34 page 146: March 6 1839, Joseph Miller of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Moses Corl of Cabarrus Co.N.C., have 4 acres 1 rood & 10 perches on the south side of Dutch Second Creek near the mill-pond, Moses Corl & J.Miller, for \$43.1/8, witnessed by Paul Barringer & Philip File & acknowledged in May 1839. (This is part of where the said Miller now lives).

Charles R. Miller (Grants Creek)

Book 44 page 58: Dec. 12 1868, Charles R. Miller & wife S.E. let Henry C. Miller--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 36 acres next ---Gardner, ---Sumner & Bank of Grants Creek (but reserving the water rights), for \$100.00, witnessed by A. Judson Mason as Judge of Probate & acknowledged on the same day.

Marriage bonds: Charles R. Miller to Sarah E. Sifford Sept. 13 1858 signed by Jesse Miller

Book 46 page 147: Feb. 12 1872, Charles R. Miller & wife S.E. let Henry C. Miller--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have grants Creek bank, next a lot previously conveyed, heirs of Benjamin Sumner; also 51 acres, for \$300.00, acknowledged on Feb. 15 1872.

Book 48 page 161: March 19 1874, Henry C. Miller & wife Tabitha B. let Luke Blackmer--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 36 acres next Elizabeth Sumner & Richard Gardner (which Charles R. Miller & wife let him have--see book 44 page 58); also the adjoining 51 acres next Elizabeth Sumner & ---Miller's heirs (which had been deeded him by Charles C. Miller & wife on Feb. 12 1872--see book 46 page 147), for (a deed of trust) acknowledged

Book 46 page 146: Feb. 12 1872, Charles R. Miller & wife Sallie E. out of love for Londa A. & Lawrinda Miller--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--& \$1.00, lets them have 130 acres & 12 poles on Grants Creek next Henry J. B. Arringer, formerly Matthew Locke's, William Smith, T. Graham & Levi Lawrence, acknowledged on Feb. 15 1872.

Book 35 page 336: Sept. 14 1841, William G. Alexander of Mecklenburg Co. N.C. (as the attorney of Nathaniel W. Alexander) lets Abraham Miller of Rowan Co. N.C., have 300 acres on Little Creek next the heirs of Michael Miller, John Shaver, Joseph Hodges, Jesse Hodges, Willie Morgan & Thomas Wiatt, for \$150.00, witnessed & proved by H. C. Owens on Sept. 14 1841. (This was formerly owned by the late R. H. Alexander who devised it to the said Nathaniel W. Alexander).

The will of Samuel Miller (book I page 128) made Dec.27 1819 & probated in May 1842. Sisters: Jane & Agness. Exr; George McConnaughey. Witnesses: James McConnaughey & George Lingle.

Book 36 page : Sept.21 1842. Patsy Dobbins (formerly Patsy Miller of Rowan Co.N.C.) of Lawrence Co.Alabama, appoints Alexander Thomas Dobbins & Robert Armour of said county, her attorneys to get & sell what is due her in Rowan from the estates of her deceased brother Samuel Miller, Jane Miller & Agness Miller her sisters

Book 36 page 202; Jan. 1 1843, Martha Dobbins of Lawrence Co.Ala.(through her attorneys, Alexander T.Dobbins & Robert Armour,) lets Stephen Frontis of Rowan Co.N.C., have a negro named Lucinda aged 38 years, for \$250.00, witnessed & proved by J.C.McConnaughey in Feb. 1843.

Book 37 page 248; Dec.29 1842, Martha Dobbins of Lawrence Co.Ala. (through her attorneys, Alexander T.Dobbins & Robert Armour) let James Sloan of Rowan Co.N.C., have 291½ acres next John Lingle, --- Kerr, J.Baker, --- Cowan & John McConnaughey, for \$1.00, witnessed by J.C.McConnaughey & John M.McConnaughey & proved by the latter in Nov. 1844.

Robert J.Miller

History of Methodism in North Carolina (W.L.Grissom) page 256: "Robert J.Miller, who was one of the preachers on the Yadkin Circuit this year, was sent before the close of the year west of the Catawba, to form a circuit in Lincoln. However, he did not form a circuit or organize a church. He soon fell in with a large settlement of German Lutherans, who received him kindly, and he was soon induced to become their pastor at "Old White Haven." He became dissatisfied with that congregation, and joined the Protestant Episcopal Church. "He finally settled, lived, and died near the present town of Lenoir, N.C."¹ This note 1 "In the "History of the North Carolina Synod," page 19, we get the following facts, from which we conclude that he was at least very changeable. He was born in Scotland; came to America and located in Charleston, Mass., in 1774. At the close of the Revolutionary War we find him in Virginia, and in 1784 he joined the Methodist Church and was licensed to preach. While he was lay reader for the Episcopal congregation at White Haven in Lincoln county, they desired his ordination, and there being no Episcopal diocese in North Carolina at the time, petitioned the Lutheran pastors for his ordination. Five Lutheran pastors met and ordained him, and he was the second ~~pastor~~ ever ordained by the Lutheran ministry in North Carolina."

D.A.R.Lineage, Vol. LII page 210: Mrs. Maude Powell Carpenter (wife of David J.Carpenter), born _____ joined as #51485 from Robert Johnston Miller (1758-1834) born in Scotland died in Caldwell Co.N.C., enlisted as a private in Capt. Nathan Reed's company fourteenth Va. regiment in 1777. She is a daughter of Tate Powell & wife Lucy (Powell); granddaughter of Nelson Powell & wife Mary Sumter (parents of Lucy); great-granddaughter of John Sumpter & wife Amelia Miller; great-great-granddaughter of Robert Johnston Miller & wife Mary Perkins.

History of the Lutheran Evangelical Synod of N.C. (by Bernheim & Cox) page 164: #6 Robert J. Miller, (a Methodist licentiate was ordained by the Lutheran ministry of N.C. at St. John's in Cabarrus Co. N.C., on May 20 1794, was one of the organizers of N.C. Synod (he had returned to the Episcopal Church in June 1821), died at Lenoir, N.C. in 1834. (over)

Miller & acknowledged in May 1848. (This is part of the 800 acres granted Esq. Henry Miller).

Book 48 page 51: Feb. 28 18 4, Jacob Klutts & wife Mary L. let John R. Miller--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 45 acres (which is lot #1 in the estate of deceased Paul Miller allotted to the said Mary L.) next Jacob Lyerly, ---Brown, lot #2 (which is allotted to the said John R. Miller), south side of a branch & ---Holshouser, for \$315.00,

Book page 173: the estate of deceased Paul Miller is divided among his children by the commissioners (P.A. Sifferd, P.N. Heilig, G.M. Bernheart & M. Barringer) & reported in Nov. 1859 as follows

(This had been allotted Laura C. as an heir of deceased Paul Miller).

N.C.--have the eastern 11 acres of what had been allotted Laura C. as an heir of deceased Paul Miller, next Frederick Holshouser, Henry Peeler & George Barnheart, for \$132.00, acknowledged in Nov. 1860.

Miller) next Jacob Lyerly, ---Brown lot #2 on the south side of a branch next Holshouser for \$315.00.

Book 42 page 130: June 9 1860, Henry M. Miller lets his trustee, Loses Resperman--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 57 acres next Robison Kluttz, in a glade, Widow Josey, lot #6, ---Shuning, lot #4 & ---Peeler, for \$1.00.

Book 42 page 577: May 8 1861, Henry M. Miller--no wife signs--lets Eliza M. Eller (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 57 acres next Roberson Kluttz, in a glade, Widow Josey, lot #6, the old line, ---Shoopins, lot #4 & ---Peeler, for \$400.00, witnessed by David A. Bost but proved by Jesse Beaver, as said Bost is dead, on July 15 1863.

Michael Miller #892 (Book 10 page 54) State Grant of 300 acres on East side Muddy next John Miller Nov 9 1784.

Michael Miller, Sr. and wife Obedience (Book 8 page) Millwright, April 13 1775 to Adam Hedrick, 172¹/₂ acres on South Fork of Abbotts Creek. Sept. court 1774 signed by

Henry Miller and wife Mary, (Book 11 page 820) on June 19 1789 to Jacob Stallings for 250 pounds, 261 acres on mouth of branch in Muddy Creek to Moravian line, to head of sd branch. Witnessed at Nov 1789 Court by Thos, Cooper and Leonard Bumgarner. Henry signs his name like a Dutchman.

John Miller, planter, and wife Mary Magdalene, (Book 11 page 20) Aug 7 1779 to Henry Miller, shoemaker, for 84 pounds, 140 acres on both sides of Sparks Creek, next Frederick Bakle, Parks Crossing, (part of tract of 453 acres granted John Miller by Earl Granville. May 6 1762). Witnessed May 1787 by Benoni Banning? and Mary Pitts.

Frederick Miller gets State Grant # 1898 for 150 acres on Brushy Fork and Muddy Creek next his own and land of Henry Lowry 1789 (Book 11 page)
Frederick Miller gives to his grand children: George, Mary, Susannah, Catharine, Magdalene, and Eve Grimes-- children of Jacob and Catherine (Miller) Grimes) 300 acres on Farmers Creek Feb 16 1789 (Book 11 page 812).
One Henry Miller is of Grayson County Va. Oct 27 1810.

Phillip, Martin and Christian Miller on north side of Dutch Second Creek 1824

Leonard Miller of Germany, among many others, applies for naturalization papers in Sept 1763 Court, held for Rowan, Anson and Orange Cos. Salisbury.
Wendle Miller lets Nicholas Miller (Book 11 page 679) May 4 1788 have 249 acres on Dutch Second Creek for 150 pounds witnessed by Thomas Allon Jr. and Frederick Miller in May Court 1789.

Book 44 page 265; Jan.23 1869, Stephen J.Miller of Union Co.Ill., appoints Solomon Eagle of Rowan Co.N.C., to get from George Bane of Rowan Co.N.C., what he got as guardian of said Stephen from Jacob O.Miller (administrator of deceased Milus Miller)

Look 15 page 81: July 7 1794, The State grants (#2328) 100 acres to Frederick Miller on waters of Dry Fork of Lick Creek next John Miller.

Book 20 page 77: March 8 1808, Dr. William Moore of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets George Miller of Salisbury N.C., have the northern half or 72 sq. poles of lot #12 in the great west square of Salisbury (beginning at the west corner of lot #11 on Tryon St. & going with that street southwest 6 poles, then through the middle of lot #12 to Moore's corner of lot #4 & with it northeast 6 poles to lots #3 & 11, then northwest with lot #11 to the beginning) for \$200.00, witnessed & proved by E. Stokes in May 1808.

Book 18 page 532: Dec. 7 1801, William L. Alexander of Cabarrus Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets William Moore of Rowan Co. N.C., have the eastern half of lot #12 in the west square of Salisbury (beginning at the corner of lot #11 on Tryon St., going 12 poles along said street to the corner which was formerly Mr. Chamber's, then 6 poles along Cross St. towards Corbin St., then through the middle of lot #12 until it strikes the middle of lot #11, then 6 poles to the beginning), for 150 pounds, witnessed by Richard Trotter & acknowledged in Feb. 1803.

Book 18 page 531: Same day he also lets the same have 72 sq poles of lot #4 in the west square (6 poles from Corbin St. & 12 poles back), also the other half of lot #12 (being the southern half next William Casey on Cross St. going along Corbin St. 6 poles to Cross St., then between lots 4 & 12 to lot #11, then with it 6 poles & c), for 600 pounds, witnessed & acknowledged as above.

Book 13 page 3: March 19 1792, John Erwin (Kitty also signs) lets William L. Alexander--all of ?-- have 72 sq. poles or $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot #12 in the west square of Salisbury (beginning on the corner of lot #11, running 12 poles along Tryon St. to the corner of Cross St. next Mr. Chamber's, then 6 poles along Cross St. toward Corbin St., then through the middle of lot #11 6 poles to the beginning), for 22 pounds, witnessed by Abraham Hill & Richard Trotter & proved by the latter in Nov. 1792

Nov. 9 1792: Deed from Charles Harris & wife to William L. Alexander for $\frac{1}{2}$ lot #4 & $\frac{1}{2}$ lot #12 in the west square of Salisbury Oct. 1 1792 proved by A. Henderson.

Book 14 page 28: March 13 1794. John Moler of Wilks Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Vincen Gardner of Rowan Co. N.C., have 110 acres on Buffellow Creek next said Moler, for 30 pounds, witnessed by Adam Sheaks & John Ellis & proved by the latter in May 1795.

: Deed from Jacob Brubaker to John Kohlar for 110 acres Sept. 7 1789 proved by Adam Sheak.

Book 11 page 311: Dec. 16 1788, Valentine Moler (a German?) lets Evan Ellis have 118 acres on both sides Sugartree creek next Henry Rich & Jeremiah Clark, for _____ witnessed by Evan Ellis Jr. & Will Ellis & proved in Nov. 1789.

Book 9 page 334: Aug. 19 1783, William Dickins--no wife signs--lets Valentine Moulder (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 118 acres on both sides Sugar tree creek, next Henry Rich, Jeremiah Clark & Maurice Stockstill, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Evan Ellis Jr. & John Allen & proved by the latter in Nov. 1783.

Book 13 page 318: Jan. 12 1790, Joseph Moulder of Wilkes Co. Georgia--no wife signs--lets John Rowland of Rowan Co. N.C., have 236 acres on the waters of Bear Creek next ---McElhaney & Richard Bartleson, for 140 pounds, witnessed by Alexander Cairns & Joseph Roland & proved by the latter in Aug. 1793.

Book 12 page 620: April 15 1791, John Rowland (a German & no wife signs) lets James Tatom & both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 118 acres next John McElhaney, John Langford & John Hendrix for 60 pounds, witnessed by Alexander Cairns & Robert Dial & proved by the latter in May 1792. (The State granted this to Joseph Kohlar).

N.C., have 326 acres next John McConnell & Moses White, for 130 pounds, witnessed by Moses Winsley & Robert Lindsay & proved in Nov. 1774. (John & Mary Miller are still lying somewhere but where? This is the land granted to William Morrison on May 25 1752, made over to James Tennan by lease & release on Dec. 18 1754, leased & released to Thomas Grier on Jan. 4 1765 & leased & released to John Miller on Feb. 14 15 1768).

Iredell Co. N.C. book C page 221: March 15 1796, Robert Lindsay--no wife signs--lets John Lindsay (both of Guilford Co. N.C.) have 326 acres next John McConnell & Moses White, for \$500.00, witnessed by Robert Lindsay Jr., Henry Clift, James Freeland & Andrew Freeland & proved by the last named in Feb. 1798. (This had been granted William Morrison on March 25 1792, who let James Teanen have, who let Thomas Grear have, who met John Miller have, who let said Robert Lindsay have).
