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Aug. 8 1789: Deed from John Howard to Edwd. Yarborough for 175 acres July 30 1789 proved by Jacob Utzman.

Book 11 page 735: on July 30 1789, John Howard & wife Binah, let Edward Yarborough have 175 acres on Hillises corner next Samuel Wilson, Lowrance Thompson, Alexander Ferguson, Second Creek, & --- Hunt, for 200 pounds witnessed by Jacob Utzman & Bazel Holland in Aug. 1789.

Aug. 9 1788: "Ordered that Joseph Hughes, Edward Yarborough & Conrad Bream be appointed Assessors of Town-Property for the Year 1788".

Nov. 6 1789: "On Petition of Edward Yarborough Ordered that he have Leave to stop the road thro' the Island immediately above the old Trading Foard and that the said road & foard thro' said Island be discontinued".

Aug. 10 1787: "Ordered that £8. be paid out of the County tax for the Year 1787, to Edwd Yarborough for the Use of the Yellow House to hold Court in".

Aug. 5 1794: Alexander Long & Edward Yarborough are securities for Hudson Hughes (when he qualifies as Admr. of Mary Hughes) on 2000 pound bond. (also on bond of Harry Jones as guardian of Bird Hughes, son of Joseph ac.) Feb. 11 1792: "Andw. Brown from George Smiths to the Middle of Yarborough's Island" is appointed overseer? Nov. 9 1792: "John Bruner from the Forks of Bruners and Yarborough's roads to Chambers ferry" is overseer of the road. Buried in the Lutheran Cemetery of Salisbury, N.C.: William C. Love who died Jan. 9 1846 in his 27th year.

Aug. 7 1790: "Notice Edward Yarbrough, to shew cause why the Foard thro' the Island above the old trading foard, should not be opened".

Aug. 5 1790: "Inspectors of the ensuing Election appointed, towit, John Grove, Edward V. Harbin, Henry Young, Edward Yarborough & John Branton (Colo.)

Aug. 5 1790: Richmond Peirson vs Edwd Yarborough #51. verdict 42 pounds & 6d. (Jacob Hanline was on the jury instead of Humphrey Marshall)

Nov. 3 1795: Edward Yarborough vs Exrs. of Thos. Frohock. £39. £27-17-0 & 6d.

Book 17 page 560: Deed from Humphrey Marshall to Ed Yarborough (a merchant of Salisbury) for 297 acres in the Forks of the Yadkin River next John Marshall, John Thompson, Moses Linster & ---- Pearson, for 50 pounds proclamation money on Dec. 28 1791, witnessed by Wyth Marshall & John Marshall & acknowledged by Humphrey Marshall in Nov. 1801, before Ad. Osborn, C.C. (This is part of a grant of 623 acres (#67) from The State to Jesse Nighton by sale on March 28 1780). (followed by Joseph Pearson)

Deed from Jesse Knighting to Humphrey Marshall for 623 acres Aug. 3 1785. Accts.

Book 11 page 400: On Nov. 5 1787 Edward Yarbrough gets (#279) 69 acres on Brushey Fork of Abbots Creek next other tract of Sappinfield. (This is some confiscated property of Mathias Sappenfield sold by public vendue). Also (#278) 216 acres next Felix Clodfilters sold as confiscated property.

Nov. 9 1787: "Harmon Butner from Yarborough's Ferry to Frailey's Mill" overseer

Aug. 6 1789: "Inspectors of the ensuing Election appointed by Order of Court viz: John Johnston, Ebenezer Frost, Jacob Wiseman, John Willson (Cooper), William Alexander Henry Young, Edwd Yarborough and Robert Linn".

May 14 1814: Willie Yarborough, the Administrator of Francis Marshall, resigns so John Chambers & William C. Love qualify, giving bond of 1000 pounds with Horace B. Satterwhite & George Mumford as securities.

Feb. 12 1791: Deed from Edward Yarborough & wife to William P. Turner for 175 acres Feb. 9 1791 proved by Matthew Howard. Book 12 page 241: On Feb. 9 1791, Edward Yarbrough & wife Sarah, let Wm. P. Turner have 175 acres next ---Hillis, Samuel Wilson, Lowrance Thompson, ---Ferguson on bank of Second Creek to ---Hunters, for 185 pounds, witnessed & proved by Mathew Howard

Feb. 12 1791: Deed from William Moore to Alexander Yarborough for 100 acres Dec. 1 1788 proved by Joseph Hannah.

Marriage Bonds: Nancy Yarbrough to Wm. C. Beatty Nov. 1 1825. W.L. Nucholds.

Serena Yarbrough to Asberry Spry Nov. 4 1851 signed Micajah Griffin.

Eetsy ' ' William Freedle Fe. 6 1819 ' Green Magee

Henry " Bridgett Davis Aug. 29 1785 " Joseph Hanna. (over).

The will of Myrick Davis (Book G page 105) made while very sick & weak on March 23 1808 & probated. Wife Marget. Grandchildren: Sarah (daughter of son William), Susannah (daughter of son Hugh), Henry Yarborough Jr. (son of my daughter). Others: Thomas Coyal, Gabriel Davis, Abner Davis, Hugh Silvers & Henry Yarborough Sr. Exr: son Gabriel. Witnesses: Henry Boy, S. Davis & Samuel Owen. The property is to be sold and proceeds divided.

May 10 1794: Deed from Henry Yarborough to John Owen for 40 acres May 30 1793 proved by Thomas Carson.

Dr. Jethro Rumble's History of Rowan Co. tells of Capt. Edward Yarbore, of Salisbury, whose ~~mill~~ was down on the Yadkin River just back of where St. John's mill formerly stood. He lived in Salisbury & had 3 daughters & 2 sons: Sally (2d wife of William C. Love) mother of William & Julius Love--she & her husband were buried in rear of the Meroney Hall; Nancy (married Col. Beatty of Yorkville, S.C.); Mary (married Richard Long); Edward Jr. (married) & owned the Yarbore Hotel in Raleigh;

Capt. Edward Yarbore married Rebecca (daughter of Dr. Alexander Long of Salisbury, N.C.)

The house in which Capt. Edward Yarbore entertained Gen. George Washington stood almost opposite Meroney's Opera House. This was in 1791 when Gen'l. Washington made his tour of the South.

Dr. Rumble's sketch of Hon. William C. Love, who represented Salisbury District in Congress of 1815, says he was a Virginian by birth, studied at Va. University, became a lawyer, moved to Salisbury, married 1st Hon. Spruce Macay's daughter Elizabeth, (by whom he had one child, Esq. Robert E. Love), married 2d, Sally Yarbore (daughter of Capt. Edward Yarbore & granddaughter of Esq. Alexander Long of Yadkin Ferry) by whom he had two children: William & Julius Love.

Book 16 page 92: On Aug. 12 1797, Esq. Nathan Chaffin as "high Sheriff of the County of Rowan" lets Peter Brown & Henry Giles have lot # 2 in the great north square of Salisbury next Edward Yarbrough on Main St. witnessed by J.H. Petchey & Jacob Brown in Feb. 1798. (This was on an execution against John Henry Petchey for £12-19-7 recovered by Esq. John Steel. (It was advertised on Aug. 8 1797 and included a house, store & other buildings which during Margret Peetchey's lifetime &c.)

Nov. 9 1792: The prison bounds in Salisbury, passed by Yarbrough's store & dwelling house which were probably near the S.W. end of these bounds.

The will of Robert Torrence (Book G page 454) made March 9 1814 probated Nov. 1816. Wife Goodwin. Polly (daughter of Ed. Yarbrough deceased). Exrs: wife & friends: John McClelland & Joseph Chambers. Witnesses: James Fitzsimmons & Wm. Mollan. Robert is very averse to being buried in the Dutch Meeting Churchyard of Salisbury.

May 10 1788: Deed from the Exrs. of Gasper Kinder to Edwd. Yarbrough for 333 acres April 4 1788, is acknowledged.

Nov. 7 1785: The will of Gasper Kinder proved by Jacob Utzman & Peter Faust. Lewis Beard & Thomas Frohock qualify as Exrs. A codicil to the will.

Aug. 6 1795 Deed from Adlai Osborn (Commissioner of old Trustees &c) to Edward Yarbrough for 253 acres on Aug. 7 1795, Another of \$75 on same date

Book 23 page 236: The division of the deceased Joseph Cunningham's land according to his will, (surveyed on March 10 1805 by W. Moore & divided by Peter Smith, Joseph Haden, Geo. Smith, Theo & Robt. McKee) 150 acres go to Mansa Yarbrough, 157 each to Rachel & Griffith Cunningham--land on Swearing Cr. The will of Joseph Cunningham (Book E page 212) made Jan. 20 1801 & probated . Wife Ann. Sons: William & John, Joseph, Robert, George & Griffith Daughters: Elizabeth Dial, Martha ~~Series~~, Mary Yarbrough & Anna. First wife & son Joseph. Test: Samuel Dusenberry & Hugh Cunningham.

May 4? 1801: Samuel Dusenberry proved the will of Joseph Cunningham. Ann & Joseph Cunningham qualify as Exrs.

May 10 1788: Deed from Edward Yarbrough to John Lopp for 216 acres March 21 1788 proved by Lewis Beard. Also another for 69 acres on same date proved by same.

Aug. 6 1791: "Ordered that the following persons be a Jury to set off the Dower of Jeane Troy Widow of Matthew Troy deceased viz: William Nesbett, Montford Stokes, Richmond Pierson, Lewis Beard, Conrod Bream, Peter Brown, Charles Hunt, Henry Young, Charles Harris, Edward Yarbrough, John Beard & David Cowan."

Feb. 9 1788: John Brevard Jr., Edward Yarbrough, Joseph Cunningham & John Lopp are bondsmen on Sheriff Lewis Beard,

May 7 1806: John Fulton & Robert Torrens swear that Edward Yarbrough on his death bed said he wanted his mother properly supported, which is admitted as a proper nuncupative will. Book 27 page 387: On Feb. 19 1823, Edward Yarborough lets Ezra Allerton have tract of 220 acres on Middle Fork of Crane Creek for \$10.00, which had been conveyed to Henry Carson to the deceased Edward Yarborough & was next land of Jacob Fisher & Thomas Mull, also tract in Georgia (not described here but was owned by "My father" and was divided among his heirs); for \$40.00 he also sells 5 negroes, &c. It seems that William C. Love & James Huie had been securities on a note of \$100.00 made to Alfred Macay on Feb. 10 1823 and is making it good. He also lets him have the dwelling house "in the Town of Salisbury in which my father last lived preceas in his death and in and upon which my Mother Sarah Yarbrough at present resides", wagon & team, 5 horses, household & kitchen furniture, horses, cattle, hogs &c. in trust. This is acknowledged by Edward Yarbrough.

The will of Edward Yarbrough of Salisbury N.C. made while "weak of body" on Dec. 19 1805 (book D page 267). Wife Sarah. Sons: Wiley, Edward. Daughters: Sarah Ann & Patty or Polly?. Some children under age. Had house & lot in Salisbury beside much other land. His co-partnerships with W. Hugh Campbell & Thomas Carson may complete a year. Exrs: wife, John Fulton & David Foster. Witnesses: Evan Alexander & William Moore.

Book 18 page 1: On Oct. 18 18--, John Marshall of Montgomery Co. Kentucky--no wife signs--lets Edward Yarbrough of Rowan, have 407 acres in Forks of Yadkin River next Moses Linster, for 200 pounds, witnessed by Jno. Ellis & Ls. Beard who proved Nov. 1800. (Part of tract #67 being 623 acres from)

Book 25 page 453: On Aug. 22 1818, Sarah Yarbrough & John Fulton (as Exrs. of the deceased Edward Yarbrough) let "Major Gen. Jesse A Pearson" have two tracts in the forks of the Yadkin for \$1500.00, witnessed by George Miller & Wm. A. Slaughter & proved by Wm. A. Slaughter Aug. term of 1819. One of these being 207 acres next Moses Linster & the other being 207 acres next John Marshall,--Pearson, John Thompson & Moses Linster--each being part of tracts from the State (#64) to Jesse Nighten in 1780, he let Humphrey Marshall have.

Aug. 1819: Deed from Sarah Yarbrough & John Fulton (as Exrs. of Edward Yarbrough) let have 614 acres Aug. 22 1818 proved by William H. Slaughter.

Book 18 page 289: On May 6 1802, John Eccles (no wife signs) lets Captain Edward Yarbrough have 145 acres next Yarbrough's land, for \$200.00, witnessed by Jan? Caler & Vincent Tabb & acknowledged in May 1802.

Book 17 page 37: On Feb. 6 1806, John Eckles
Feb. 6 1806: The will of Edward Yarborough is proven by Esq. Evan Alexander. Letters issued to the widow of said deceased, Sarah, & John Fulton (the other David Foster? relinquished).

Book 31 page 59: On Aug. 14 1830, Richard W. Long--no wife signs--lets James Martin Jr. (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on the south side of Long's mill-pond on Grants Creek where a small branch empties, next Michael Brown & Thomas Chambers, for \$250.00, acknowledged in Aug. 1830.

Court Minutes of Feb. 1833: Lewis G. Slaughter is appointed guardian of the orphans of Wm. C. Love (William & Julius) giving bond of \$2500. with Robert H. Alexander, Samuel Reeves & Chas. Verble.

Book 28 page 601: On April 25 1826, "Whereas a marriage is about to be celebrated between William Long and Sarah M. Love, both of Rowan County and State of North Carolina, And whereas it is the wish and intent of the said Sarah M. Love to provide for her Minor Children William Calhoun and Julius Marshall Love", she gives them, for \$1.00, her homeplace of 195 acres next Robert Love & Nancy Beattie, which had been seized & possessed by the deceased Edward Yarbro, but reserves her life-time interest in it. This is witnessed by W.C. Beatty & E. Yarbrough & proved by Edward Yarbrough in May 1826.

Marriage bond: William Long to Sarah Love April 22 1826 signed Leonard A. & Rebecca H. Long to Ed. Yarbrough Jan. 7 1823 signed Henry Chambers.
Richard J. " Mary Nov. 30 1826 signed by George W. Brown.

The will of Alexander Long (book H page 274) made Oct. 23 1824 & probated in Nov. 1824. Sister, Mary Brim. Sons: William (land on Salem road north side of Yadkin River next my son James & the ferry), Alexander, John, James & Richard Walton Long (land bought of deceased Alexr. Frohock--last son is said to have been adopted). Son-in-law Michael Brown. Daughters: Maria Brown, Rebecca H. Yarbrough, Harriett Brown, Caroline Braughton & deceased Betsy Frohock (her children Susan, ? Betsy & Polly). Exrs: son James. Witnesses Wm. Chapman, A.D. Murphey, Elizabeth Torrence & Thomas Frohock.

Feb. 1835: Edward Yarbrough (guardian of the heirs of Michael Brown \$80 or \$90 in discharge of a note given by Jas. I & Richard W. Long for necessaries furnished his wards.)

Book 27 page 871: On Oct. 17 1822, William Cunningham in his own right (and as attorney for his sister Anna Davis of Lincoln Co. Tenn.) lets Jesse Hargrave of Rowan Co. N.C. have all the tract in Rowan Co. on Tate's Creek of Swearing Creek (excepting the parcel which said William Cunningham let Major Henry Yarbrough have also the tract which was devised by Joseph Cunningham Sr. to Griffish Cunningham) or 104 acres for \$500.00, witnessed by B.D. Rounseville & W.A. Carrigan & acknowledged by William Cunningham in Nov. term of 1822--no wife signs the deed. (This is part of 310 acres sold by Henry Eustace McCulloch to Joseph Cunningham & he devised it to Joseph Cunningham Jr. & Griffish Cunningham).


Lexington, Davidson Co. N.C., book 5 page 503: On Dec. 20 1834, William Stout gives to his daughter, Hannah Yarbrough, out of affection for her, some land on Toms Creek on the county line.

Book 23 page 295: On Jan. 25 1814, Thomas Yarbrough & wife Jemima, let Peter Owen Jr. (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 10 acres on the east side of the Yadkin River on both sides of a branch called Muddy Run near its head, next John Claver, Henry Kepley, John Berkart & Azariah Merrell, for \$80.00, witnessed & proved by John Goss. (This fell to said Thomas Yarbrough from the will of deceased Samuel Merrel).
(See Samuel Merrell's will below)

Mrs. Ruth Irish Preston (wife of Dr. Charles Preston), born in Toledo, Iowa, joined the D.A.R. as #82188, as a descendant of Capt. Benjamin Merrill (1740-1771) who was born in New Jersey, captured by the Tories at battle of Alamance while Capt. of N.C. Militia & hanged at Hillsboro, N.C. (see also #67828). She is the daughter of Charles Irish Wood Irish (1834-1904) & wife, Susannah Abigail Yarborough (born in 1837) whom he married in 1855; granddaughter of Zachariah Yarborough (1801-44) & wife Hannah Stout (1806-77) whom he married in 1826; great-granddaughter of Thomas Yarborough (died in 1837) & wife Jemima Merrill (1782-1827); great-great-granddaughter of Azariah Merrell & wife Jemima Blalock; & great-great-granddaughter of Benjamin Merrell & wife Jemima Stout.

Book 18 page 201: On Nov. 18 1801, Edward Yarbrough--no wife signs--lets Francis Coupee (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 1/3 of lot #2 in great east square of Salisbury (four poles fronting Main St.) & other lands which the Trustees of the Town, Esqrs. Hugh Foster & James Carter, let Peter Arrand & wife Catharine have, they let Conrd. Michael have by power of attorney let his heir-at-law, Conrad Carne have, who let Hugh Montgomery have, who let Anthony Newman have & he let Edward Yarbrough have), for \$350.00, witnessed by - 3 - & Henry Giles & proved by the latter in Feb. 1802.

The will of Zachariah Yarbrough (Lexington, Davidson Co. N.C. book 1 page 434) made while in a "very low State of health" on Feb. 29 1844. Wife Hannah. Exrs: wife & son William T. Witnesses: J. Spence & Charles Yarbrough.



N.C. Biography (Lewis) Vol. IV. page 203-4: William E. Hege of Lexington, N.C. married Sallie Lee Nooe, a daughter of Bennett who married Mary Ann Watson a daughter of Alanson Lee Watson & wife Elizabeth who was born in Davidson Co. N.C. on May 5 1809 & was daughter of Thomas Yarborough & wife Jemima who was a daughter of Capt. Benjamin Merrill, the Regulator who was captured & executed in 1771.

The will of Samuel Merrell (book G page 5) made while of strong constitution on Wife Susannah (where I live while a widow). Sons: Smith (where he lives being 117 acres also 110 acres adjoining which I bought of Lewis Beard) & Azariah (312 acres where I live but I reserve 20 acres of it for my two daughters). Daughters: Jemimah (10 acres on north east corner of 312 acres where I live) & Sarah (10 acres on Muddy Run). The will of John Burkhardt Sr. (in Lexington, Davidson Co. N.C. book 1 page 365) made April 25 1841 & probated in Aug. 1841. Wife Catharine (1/2 of home tract) Daughters: Elizabeth (wife of Benjamin Younts), Barbara (wife of John Frank), Margaret (living with Thos. Yarbrough), Sarah (wife of Thomas Yarbrough) & Nancy (wife of Jesse Goss). Sons: Solomon (& his 4 children) & John. Granddaughter Elizabeth (daughter of Andrew). Exrs: John Frank, & A.F. Smith. Witnesses: Peter Owen & James Wiseman.

Thomas Harvey, (1730-1799), died in Hancock Co., Georgia, served in South Carolina & the Georgia line under Col. Elijah Clarke. He had four sons in the army his son James served with his father;

John Clarke, (1728-1794), born in Virginia, served in the Revolution in South Carolina where he died. (See #19103).

William Yarborough, (1763-1831), born in Virginia, died in Fairfield Co., South Carolina served as a private in the South Carolina line for which he received a land bounty.

QUERY 1,418

YARBROUGH—I would like to know who the parents of my great-grandfather, William S. Yarbrough, were and whether they had any other children. I know that his father, James A. Yarbrough, was a soldier in the Revolutionary War and was killed in action in 1777. William S. Yarbrough was born in Montgomery County, North Carolina, in 1797. He married Lydia Morris (born in North Carolina in 1792) in 1809. They moved to Henry County, Tennessee, and stayed there until 1849 when they moved to Ouachita County, Arkansas. They had nine children, although I know the names of only four: Martha, Elbert S. (my grandfather), Nathan (a minister of the Primitive Baptist Church) and Ann (married her third cousin, Thomas A. Yarbrough). Did John Yarbrough and his wife have any other children than William? If so, what were their names and the dates of their birth and death? I would like to know who the mother of Lydia Morris Yarbrough was. Her father was Jeph Morris, a Revolutionary soldier. Division of Estates, book A page 136: by order of Reb. court, the commissioners, (Lewis Beard, Joseph Chambers, John Beard, William Pinkston & John Smith), divide the real estate of deceased Edward Yarborough among his heirs & legatees according to his will.

Tract #1 goes to his son Wiley. It comprises as follows: 108 1/2 acres on the south side of Grants Creek next William Pinkston, Lewis Beard and a corner of the original grant from Earl Granville to George Bruner on April 2 1761; also 241 acres, called "West's place" on Royals & Reedy branches next ---Leopard & Neels(?) or west(?), Craigie, Putner & Island Ford branch being 1/2 of 482 acres which had belonged to Lewis Beard but was sold by his executors() to West & Bevin, however this excludes any claim in the Island Ford tract. (see *below).

Tract #2 goes to son Edward & comprises: 229 acres near the town of Salisbury between the north & middle forks of Crane Creek next ---Utzman, Jacob Fisher, ---Mull & ---Lock (being land which Henry Carson let deceased have on May 4 1803 by deed). Edward gets nothing of the Island Ford tract.

Tracts #3, 4, & 5 go to daughters, Sarah, Nancy & Polly (who have Montfort Stokes as their guardian & who is to be paid by the two boys the differences in money their tracts being more valuable, I assume). Page 281: By order of Aug. 1823 court, William Moore divides the land of deceased Edward Yarborough, for William C. Love & wife Sarah, Nancy & Polly Yarborough, with the commissioners (Jesse Haden, R. Macnamara, Jasper Smith, Christian Lepp, & Peter Kern). The platts are also given.

Book page 938: Feb. 19 1830, William C. Beatty & wife Nancy of York District S.C. let Peter Kern of Rowan Co. N.C., have 199.10 acres (being lot #2 in the estate of deceased Edward Yarborough) for \$1000.00





A History of Liberty Baptist Association (Rev. Henry Sheets) page 69: "AARON YARBROUGH. The subject of this sketch was born and reared in what is now Davidson County, North Carolina. His birth occurred October 5, 1813. He was married to Miss Elizabeth Wommack, February 4, 1834. There were born to them thirteen children.

At just what age he made a profession of religion and joined the church could not be ascertained, but probably about majority.

He was chosen a deacon of Reed's X Roads church March, 1843, and was licensed to preach in July, 1853. A presbytery consisting of Elders Azariah Williams and S.W. Howerton was called, who examined and ordained him to the full work of the ministry June, 1862.

During his ministerial life he was pastor of four churches, as follows: Pine Meeting House, 1862-63-64; Holloways, 1863-64; Reed's X Roads 1866-67 and '69; Marion 1868. He lived to a good old age, departing this life December 30, 1897, in the 85th year of his life."
