N.C., have 100 acres on the bank of Fourth Creek next Robert Erwin & Richard Graham on the lowground, for \$150.00, witnessed by John Moore & William Graham & proved by the latter in Nov. 1804. (This is part of the land which James Chalhoon let John Moore have).

Book 19 page 146: Jan. 21 1805, Richard Graham lets his son, James Graham (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 183 acres on the south bank of Fourth Creek next Elisha Campbell and two other tracts of said Richard Graham, next Robert Erwin on the road between the field of --- Erwin & --- Graham on the west side of a small branch near a spring, for \$300.00, witnessed by Christopher Graham & William Graham & proved by the latter in Feb. 1805. (This is part of the land of James Hemphill)

May 1801: Deed from the Exrs. of John Hemphill to James Calhoun for 797 acres Dec. 15 1797 proved by Samuel Young.

Book 17 page 647: Dec. 15 1797, Susannah, Andrew & Samuel Hemphill of Elbert Co. Georgia (as legal heirs of deceased James Hemphill of Rowan Co. N.C.) let James Calhoun of Rowan Co. 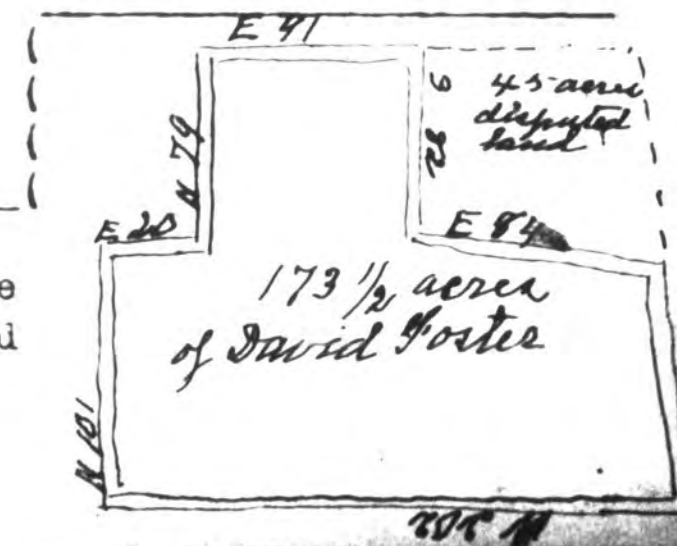

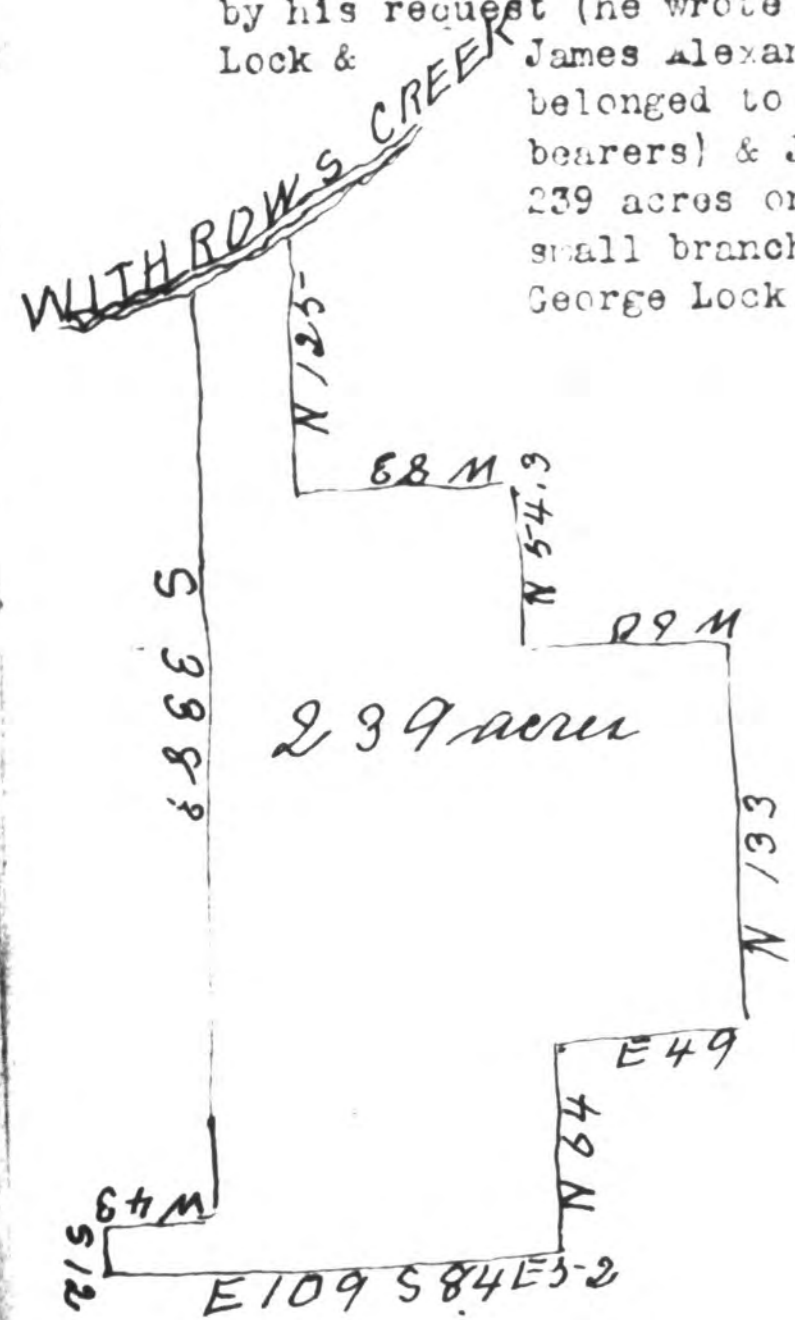

Land ProceSSIONS page 1: Aug. 16 1803, the land of Richard Gillispie was processioned by his request (he wrote a note on Aug. 5 1803 to Mrs. Joseph Graham, Henry Cowan, George Lock & James Alexander to attend to it, in which he states that the land formerly belonged to Richard Graham) by Henry Cowan, & Joseph Chambers (as chain-bearers) & J. Andrews as processioner, witnessed by Thomas Gillispie. It is 239 acres on the south bank of Withrows Creek on up it to the head of a small branch next Elze Graham, David Foster, Joseph Graham, Henry Cowan, George Lock & James Alexander. The lines bear three variations.

Book 3 page 248: March 25 1752, Earl Granville lets the planter, Richard Graham of Anson Co. N.C., have 640 acres in Anson, on the waters of Third Creek, beginning at a hickory & going south 340 poles to a red oak, east 300 poles to a poplar, north 220 poles to a hickory on the line of James Stewart, east 88 poles to north 100 poles to a hickory, then to the beginning, for 3 shillings wterling, with yearly rental of

Richard Graham (Head Branches Cold Water Creek)

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Book 6 page 249: Oct. 11 1765, James Graham Sr.--no wife signs--lets his son, Richard Graham--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 450 acres on the head branches of Cold Water Creek next John Campbell, beginning at a white oak on the east side of said creek & going south 260 poles to a hickory, east 260 poles to a red oak, north 260 poles to a red oak, then west to the beginning, for love & maintainance, witnessed by Griffith Rutherford & James McCulloch & recorded in Oct. 1765.

James Grayham (Head waters of Cold Water & Crane Creek)

Book 3 page 345: June 24 1751, Earl Granville let the planter, James Grayham of Anson Co.N.C., have 450 acres in Anson, on the head of Cold Water by a branch of Crane Creek, about two miles from his own house southeast & between him & the Trading Path, for 3 shillings, with yearly rental of 18 shillings proclamaion money (rate of 3 sterling 100) witnessed by Benjamin Wheatley, Richard Hellier, Thomas Child & Francis Corbin & proved July 23 1756. This begins at a white oak & goes south 260 poles to a hickory, east 280 poles to a red oak, north 260 poles to a red oak then west to the beginning.

* Book 10 page 274: Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (#778 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Richard Graham 151 acres next James Graham Sr., William Cathey, Mathias Boston & John Hickey, beginning on the north side of Grants Creek at a hickory on the corner of James Graham, going north 15 chains & 50 links to a black oak on the line of William Cathey, west with his line 15 chains & 50 links to a hickory on the corner of William Cathey, north with his line 8 chains to a black oak supposed to be on the corner of Mathias Boston, west 54 chains & 50 links to a hickory on line south 23 chains & 50 links to a hickory on said Graham's corner, east with his line to the beginning.

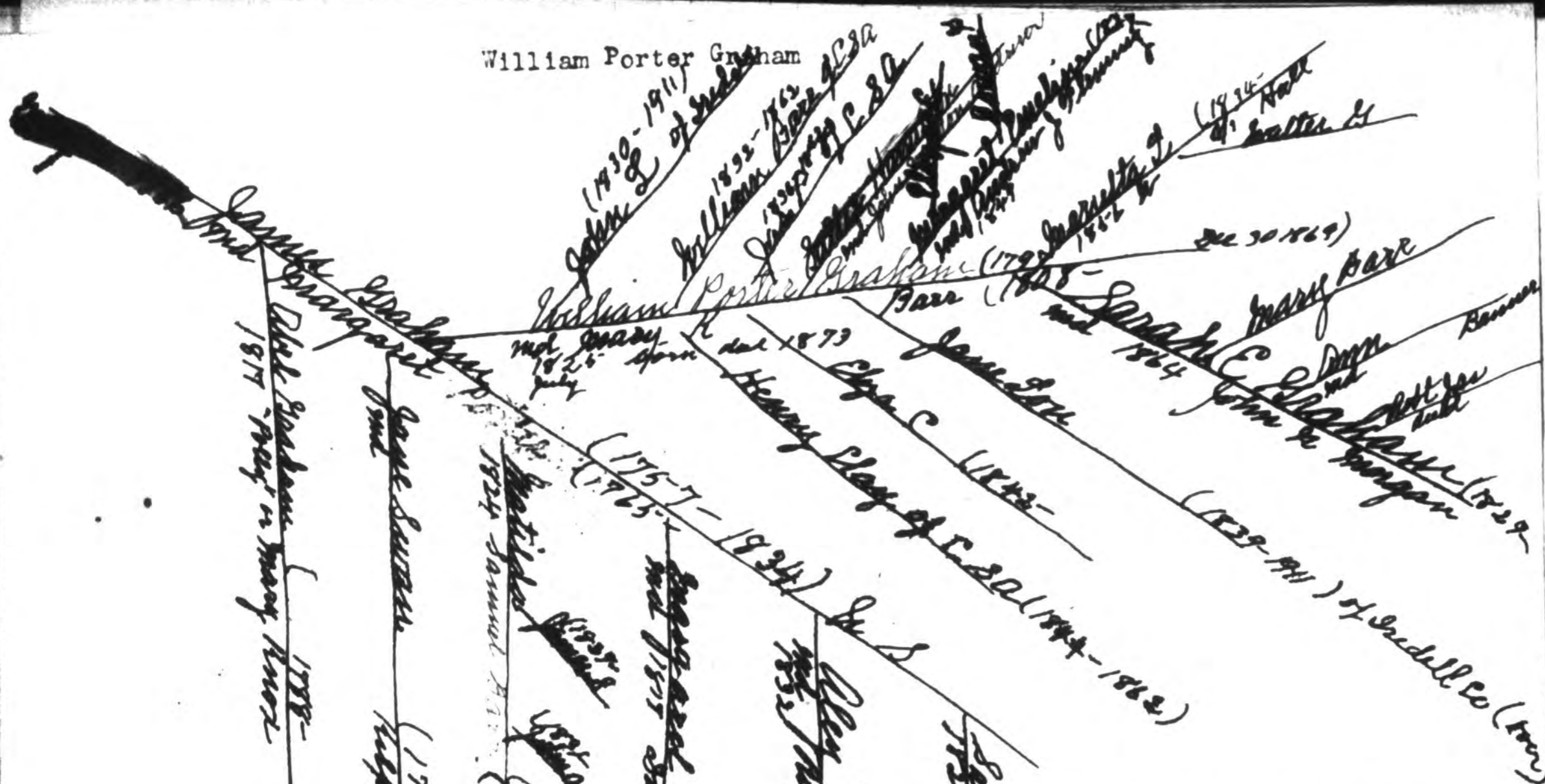

Division of Estates page 89: The land of deceased Hugh Dobbins Sr., is divided by the commissioners appointed in Nov. term (John Barger, Daniel Lyerly, Edmund Briggs & Thomas T. Locke) & returned to May term of 1852. The 483 $\frac{3}{4}$ acres are divided according to the will--the eastern third allotted to Joseph Dobbins; the middle third to John Dobbins & the western third to James Dobbins. This land is next the heirs of John Briggs, crossing a branch twice, down the channel of Second Creek, next ---McCoy, heirs of A. Henderson, on the east side of a branch next John S. Graham, William Pinkston, on the west side of Sherrell's Ford road, was surveyed Jan. 14 1852 by N.M. Dobbins as C.S. assisted by Thomas Pinkston & Joseph C. Graham as S.C.B.

The order includes the division of the lands of John & James Dobbins which is as follows: two thirds of lot #1 goes to the heirs of Joseph E. Dobbins; while lots 2, 3 & 4 go to Polly E. Dobbins. The lands of John & James Dobbins are divided among Hugh A., N.M., Emily G., Jamiea A. Dobbins, Joseph C. Graham & wife Grizzy (who are the children of Joseph E. Dobbins & of lawful age) also among his minor heirs who are Nancy E., Joseph E. & Naomi N. (children of deceased Joseph E. Dobbins) & Polly E. Dobbins (daughter of deceased Hugh Dobbins), George Rex & wife Mary E. (the daughter of Polly E. Dobbins)---more to it.

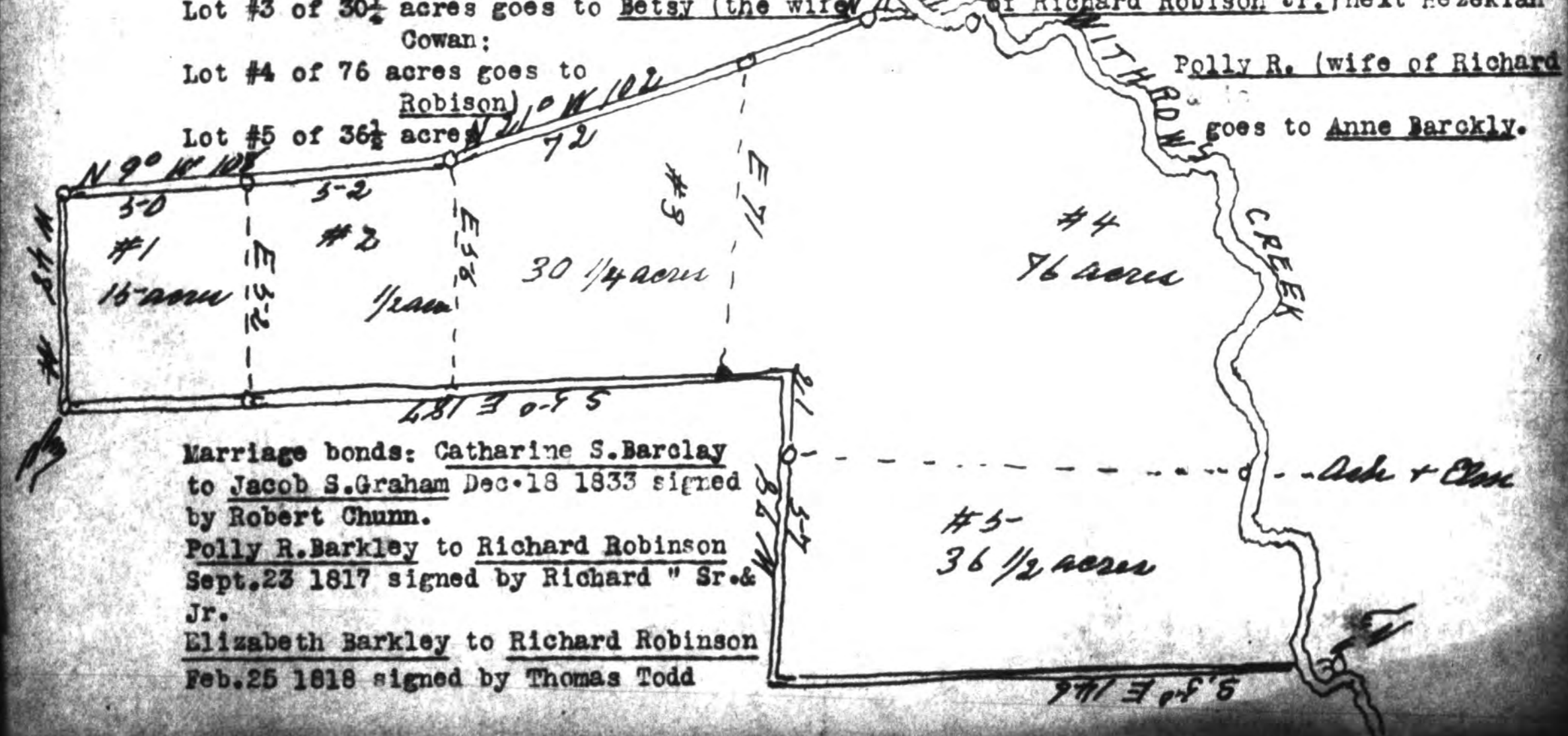

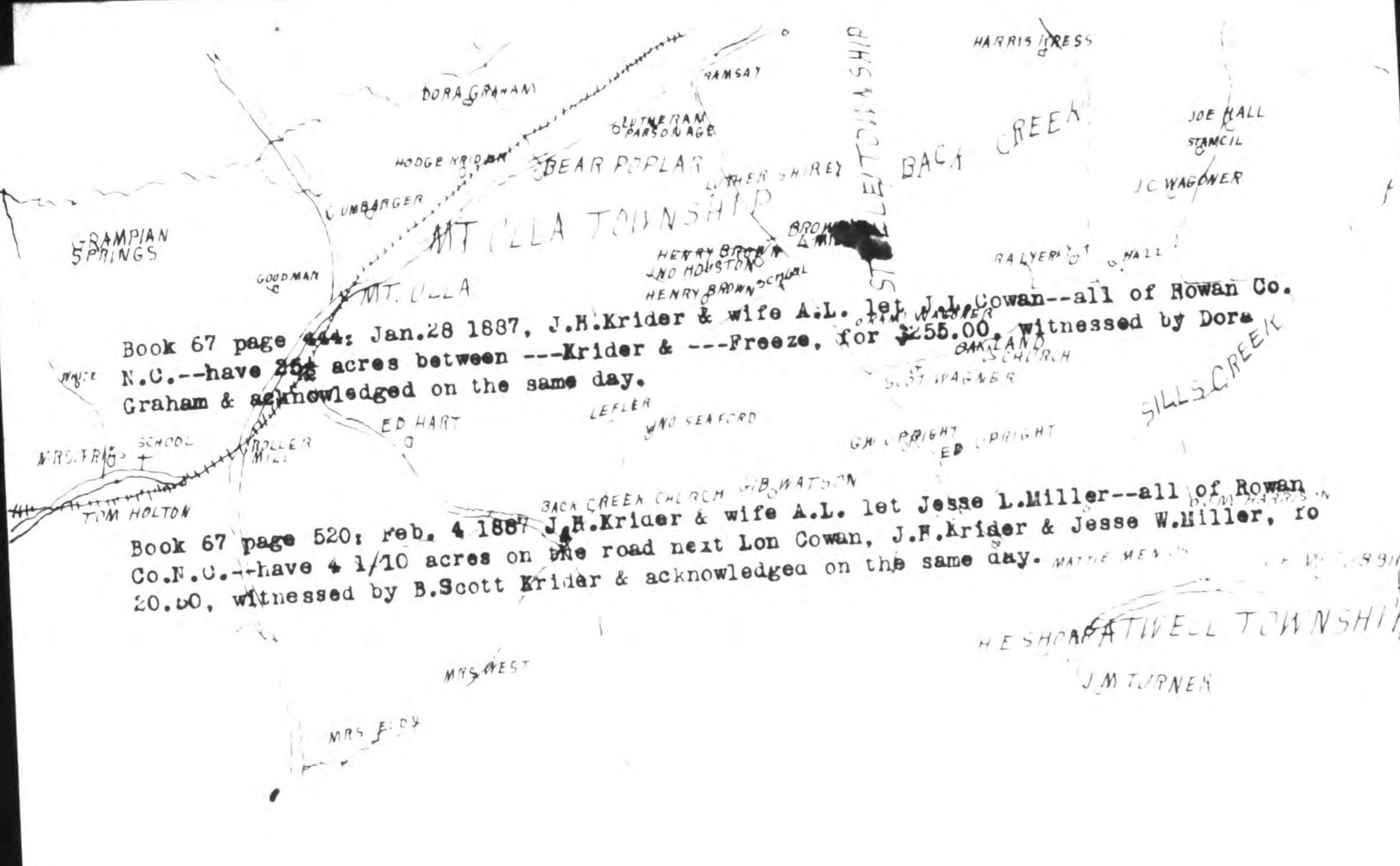

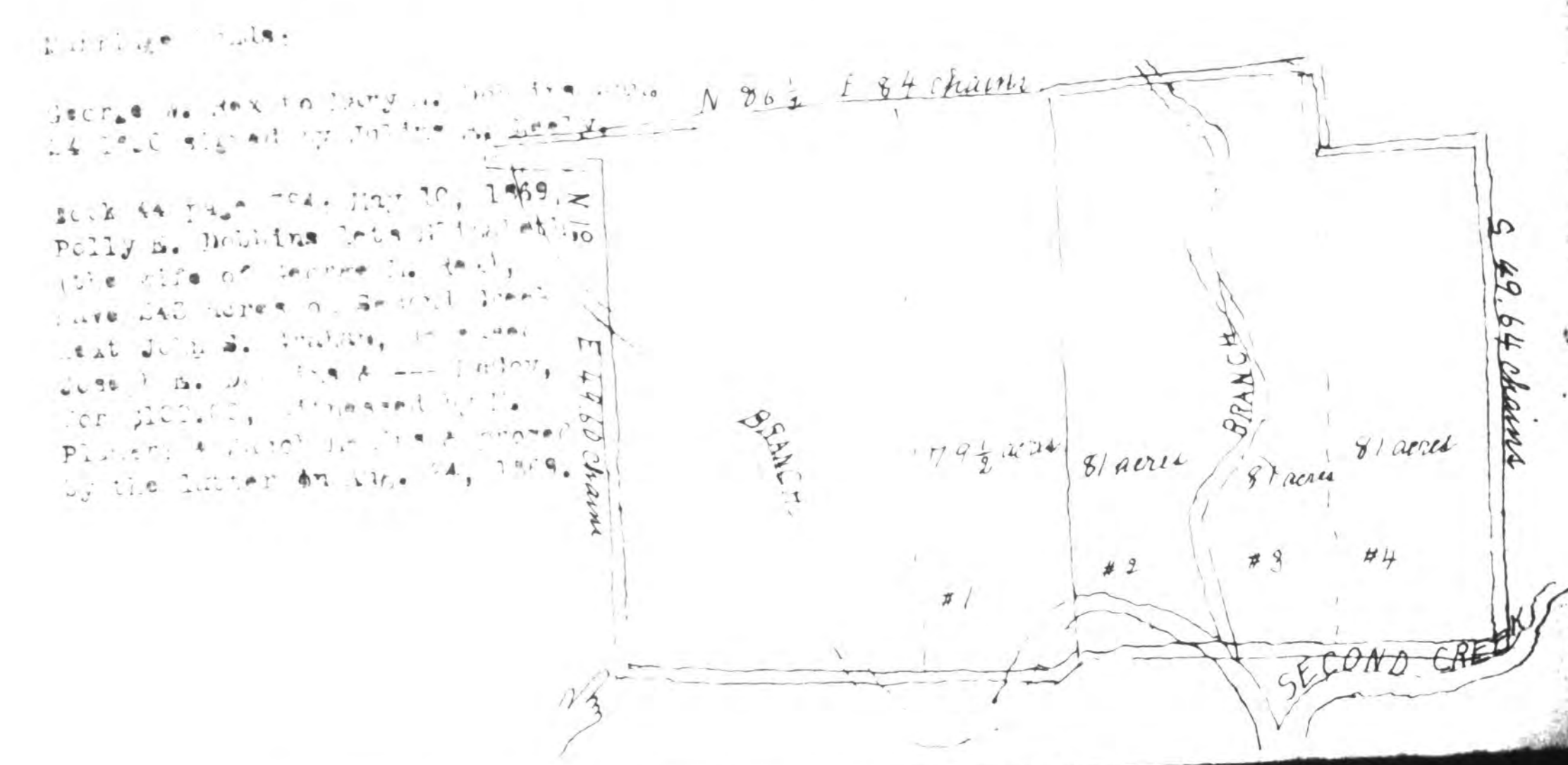
