Oct. 20 1768: Deed from Hugh Foster to John Howard for lot #8 in north square of Salisbury, April 23 1768 proved by Wm. Temple Cole.

Book 9 page 537: On March 23 1784, Mary Howard, John Johnston & David Craige as executors of the will of deceased John Howard, let Lewis Beard of Salisbury, have part of lot #4 or 96 sq. poles in north square of Salisbury (which the Justices of Salisbury let John Howard have) next lot #3 on Corbin St. & lot #12, for 100 pounds, witnessed by James Craige & John Steele & proved by latter in Aug. 1784.

Book 9 page 538: They also let Leonard Crauser of Salisbury have lot #8 north square fronting on Corbin St. & containing 1747 sq. poles, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Robert Foster, Val Beard & John Steele & proved by named in Aug. 1784.

The will of John Howard (book C page 114) made while sick & weak on Feb. 23 1781 & probated in 1781. Wife Mary (to have everything but 5 shillings till death when things are to be sold & divided among her four sons & the two children of her son David Craige--the five shillings are for Gideon Howard the son of brother Matthew Howard. Exrs: William Nesbet & Col. James Brandon. Attests: Ant: Newnan, Thomas Biles & Joseph Biles.

May 9 1781: The will of John Howard was proved by Anthony Newnan & Joseph Boyles. William Nesbett & James Brandon relinquished the executorship to the widow, Mary Howard, John Johnston & David Craige who qualified under bond of 2000 pounds specie with James Craige & Robert Foster as security.

April 15 1763: Deed from James Carter & Hugh Foster to John Howard for "One Lot of Land for 144 Square" on April 25 1762 acknowledged by James Carter. Also another as above.

Oct. 18 1758: Ben: Miller & John Howard being Appointed Under Sheriffs took the Oaths by Law appointed". (Edward Hughs produced his commission as High Sheriff in preceding July).

July 25 1761: John Howard is again appointed D. Sheriff (Benjamin Miller is High Sheriff, Wm. Nassery & John McGuire are also deputy sheriffs).

Book 4 page 673: On April 3 1761, John Dunn & wife Mary let John Howard have lot #5 in east square of Salisbury fronting on Corbin St. for 5 shillings witnessed by Alexander Martin. Release price is

Book 7 page 19: On July 9 1768, John Howard--no wife signs--lets Catharine Howard Sr., Gideon, John & Benjamin Howard have 160 acres on the west side of the Yadkin River & both sides of Dales Creek on main river bank over to the South Yadkin, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Jason Frisell & William Pinkston & proved in Oct. 1768.

Oct. 21 1768: "A Bill of Sale from John Howard To David Craige for a Certain Negroe Boy Named Stbbio Dated the 3d Day of October 1768, -proved in Open Court by Jason Frizell".

Jan. 20 1762: Lease & release from John Howard & wife Mary to Daniel Little John Lewis Beard & Conrod Michel for 397 acres & 80 poles Dec. 29-30 1761 proved by William Reed.

Book 9 page 67: On Nov. 8 1779, Henry & John Fullwidner of Rowan Co. N.C. (as heirs of the deceased Jacob Fullwidner) let Peter Brown, a "Yeoman", have 397 1/2 acres on Grants Creek next John Howard & on north side of said tract for 190 pounds "Currant money of Virginia", witnessed by Michael Brown & John Dunn & proved by Esq. Michael Brown in Feb. 1780. (This land had been conveyed by John Howard & wife Mary to Daniel Little, John Lewis Beard & Conrod Michael by lease & release on Dec. 29-30 1761, who conveyed it to George Christopher Knertzner on July 10-11 1764 by lease & release, George Knertzner & wife Eve then deeded it to Jacob Fullwidner on May 6 1772).

April 23 1761: Deeds from Jas. Carter & Hugh Foster to John Howard for lots #29 & 30 in north square of Salisbury Aug. 22 1760 proved by Wm. Harrison.

May 10 1769: Deed from John Howard to Frances Reynold for 40 acres dated 1769 proved by John Lewis Beard.

Jan. 12 1764: Deed of sale from Edward Hughs to John Howard for 314 acres July 20 1763 is proved by William Nassery.

Book 5 page 418: On July 20 1763, Edward Hughes of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets John Howard, "Ordinary Keeper" of Salisbury Township N.C., for 80 pistoles, have 314 acres on north bank of the Yadkin River at the upper end "being Called & known by the Name of Fairfield" witnessed by William Nassery & George Magoune & proved in Jan. 1764 by Wm. Nassery. (This had been granted Edwd. Hughes on Oct. 27 1752). Since Rowan was made from Anson in 1753 this was granted before Rowan was formed. (See Book 6 page 384)

April 17 1767: Deed from Earl Granville to Edward Hughs for 314 acres Oct. 27 1752 proved by parrity of Hands & the oath of John Dunn Esq.

April 22 1761: Lease & release from Peter Dills to John Howard for 222 acres march 20-21 1758 proved by Edward Hughes.

Book 4 page 403: On March 20 1758, Peter Dilts--no wife signs--lets John Howard have the plantation of 222 acres on the west side of the Yadkin River for 5 shillings (release price on next day = 50 pounds) witnessed by Edward Hughes & Roger Turner Jr. & proved in April 1761. (This is part of a tract which Earl Granville let John Thomas have on Nov. 27 1753).

March 19 1754: Peter Dills Apointed Constable in the Room of William Fisher" Oct. 12 1754: Abraham Creson is appointed Constable instead of Peter Dills.

Jan. 10 1765: Lease & release from John Howard & wife to Nathan Maynard(?) for 500 acres Oct. 31 & Nov. 1 1764 proved by William Nassery.

Book 6 page 93: On Oct. 31 1764, John Howard & wife Mary, let Nathan Maynard? of Frederick Co. Maryland, have 500 acres on the east side of the Yadkin River on south fork of Reedy Creek down to where this creek runs into the Yadkin, for 5 shillings, witnessed by William Temple Coles & William Nassery & proved in Jan. 1765. The release price on next day was 100 pounds proclama-tion money--this is part of a 700 acre tract granted by Earl Granville on Dec. 21 1761).

July 14 1764: "On Motion of John Dunn, Esqr. Orderd. that a Road be Laid Out the Neares & Best Way from John Howards Ferey to the Road from Bethabra to Salisbury Near Reedy Creek, runing up from sd Fery in the Fork to Boons Road, and the Persons following to Appointed to Lay of sd. Road (to wit) John Roberts, Edward Turner, Nicholas White, Edward Williams, Isaac Holdman, Capt Aving. Fealps, Mathew Sparks, Will' Sparks, Francis Taylor, Thomas Jones, David Baley & James Whitaker"

Nov. 16-1769: Deed from John Howard to Elijah Skedmor for 250 acres Nov. 17 1769 proved by Charles Burton.

Book 7 page 169: On Nov. 17 1769, John Howard of Rowan--no wife signs--lets Elijah Skidmore have 250 acres at mouth of Reedy Creek on east side Yadkin for 30 pounds, proved in Nov. 1769.

Book 7 page 169: On day, Elijah Skidmore lets John Hedgepath (both Rowan) have 250 acres at mouth of Reedy Creek (part of 700 acres next Jas. Butler which Earl Granville let John Howard have & he let Elijah Skidmore have)

May 12 1787: Deed from James Craige to John Howard for 1/2 lot #6 in north square of Salisbury Jan. 17 1772 is acknowledged.

Book 11 page 37: May 18 1787, James Brandon, as the executor of deceased John Howard, lets John Little of ---- have four lots in the north square of Salisbury (31, 32, 23 & 24) for 100 pounds, witnessed by J. McEwen & James Cragg & proved by the latter in Aug. 1787.

Aug. 11 1787: Deed from James Brandon (Exr. of John Howard) to John Little for 4 lots in north square of Salisbury (# 31-32-23-24) on may 18 1787 proved by James Craige.

April 22 1757: Lease & release from James Jones to Edmund Johnston for 360 acres, is acknowledged.

Book 29 page 278: On March 28 1825, Joseph Howard of Oldham Co. Ky. (as attorney of his father, Cornelius Howard) lets Jacob Cornatzer of Rowan Co. N.C., have 112 acres on Buffalo Creek next Adam Sheek, Abraham Welty, George March, ---Ruepart & said Howard, for \$166.00, witnessed by Howard Walker & John Ruepard & proved by the latter in Feb. 1827. (This had been surveyed first for Cornelius Howard).

Book 13 page 679: Dec. 16 1793, The State grants (#2258 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Cornelius Howard 112 acres on Buffelow Creek next Abraham Sheek, Abraham Welty, George March & --- Rafort (?).

Book 11 page 63: On Sept. 14 1786, John Brunts & wife Elizabeth let Abraham Welty--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have acres on east side of Dutchmans Creek & both sides of Seder & Cubb Creeks next the west end of Wiltey's mill-dam, for 735 pounds, witnessed by Marget Brunts & John Hendricks & proved by the latter in Aug. 1787. (This had originally been granted to Peter Beam, who let Joseph Bryanyho let Richard Jacks, who let John Brunts have it).

Book 28 page 133: Nov. 3 1824, John Harwood & Squire Harwood of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wives sign--let Ishmael Caudell of Rowan Co. N.C., have 32 acres on Booths Mill-Creek (next land which Squire Harwood let Ishmael Caudell have,) for \$64.00, witnessed by H.C. Tatum, Samuel S. Tatum & H.S. Tatum & proved by last named in Feb. 1825.

Book 17 page 335: On Feb. 22 1800, George March--no wife signs--lets John Howard have 100 acres on Dutchmans Creek next Joseph Bryan, Christopher Howard, said Howard & Cornelius Howard, for 130 pounds, witnessed by Edmond Howard & John Stinchcomb & proved by the latter in Aug. 1800.

Book 13 page 595: Dec. 20 1791, The State grants (#1791 at 10 pounds the 100 acres) to John Stinchcombe 86 acres next John March, Edmond Howard & Peter Dowell.

Book 22 page 77: On Sept. 7 1809, John Stinchcomb--no wife signs--lets John Dowell have 40 acres on Yadkin River next -- Caton, for 30 pounds, witnessed by John Williams & Joseph Peck & proved by the latter in Feb. 1811.

Book 22 page 682: Aug. 24 1808, James Harwood & wife Margaret let William Rowsee (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 73 acres on Johns Branch next Aaron Weyatt, George Taylor & ---March, for 70 pounds, witnessed by Zachariah Johnson & John Stinchcomb & proved by the latter in Nov. 1812.

Nov. 10 1787: deed from John March & wife to Edmond Howard for 40 acres Sept. 4 1787 proved by Wm. Roberts.

Nov. 10 1794: Deed from Edmond Howard & wife to John Stinchcomb for 50 acres on March 1 1794 proved by John March.

Book 20 page 6: The land of deceased William Wyatt of Rowan Co. N.C. is divided among the legatees: Cornelius & William Wyatt. To Cornelius goes 107.5 acres next George Taylor, Elijah Veach, Joshua Whitehead & --- Arrwood; to his brother, William Wyatt the same amount or 107 1/2 acres next Cornelius Wyatt, Richard Dowell & Obediah Smith. Surveyed by Britain J. Heymore D.S., witnessed by Moses Burke & George Taylor as S.C.B.

The will of William Weyatt (book D page 268) probated in 1806.

The will of Zachariah Harwood (book E page 117) made June 22 1805. Daughter Mary Harwood who is Exx. Witnesses: John Stinchcomb & Rachael Bave?

Feb. 5 1806: The will of Jack? Arrwood is proven by John Stinchcombe. Letters issued to John Dunningham "for his wife", who qualified &c.

Nov. 3 1794: "Zachariah Arrwood gave bond & qualified as a Constable".

Book 47 page 364: On Oct. 15 1763, Samuel Bryan--no wife signs--lets Philip Howard, both of Rowan Co. N.C., have 137 acres on the head drafts of Elsworth Creek, (being 1/2 of the plantation which Earl Granville let said Samuel Bryan have on May 10 1762), for 25 pounds, witnessed by John & Thomas Frohock & proved in Oct. 1763.

Book 26 page 324: On Jan. 3 1821, William Haworth & wife Elizabeth Haworth Standley & heir of deceased Reuben Standley of Rowan) let Absalom Williams (all Rowan) have 20 acres on Brushy Fork of Abbots Creek in middle of road from Martinville to Salisbury next E. Brown, Samuel Spurgeon & Isaac Teague, for

witnessed by Howard. E. Brown & acknowledged in May 1821 in Book 11 page 324: William Howard has a State Grant (#1303) for 166 acres on the west side of Hunting Creek near Holemans Ford next Thomas Praeter & said Howard, on Oct. 25 1786.

A letter from Mrs. Edward S. Erickson of Linden farm, Hoopston, Ill. on June 5 1927, wanting information of the Haworth, Heyworth, nowarth families. These served in revolution of 1776, possibly in Continental line of Va. & she wants only their military proof. She was Hallie Bell. Route #5.

Book 26 page 58: On March 2 1819, John Harwood of Buncombe Co. N.C., through his attorney F. Atmon(?), lets John Thompson of Rowan Co. N.C., have 76 1/2 acres on south side of North Yadkin River, for \$268.00, witnessed by Haley Tatum & Jesse Buckner & proved by the latter in Nov. 1820. (This is part of the land on Jiles Mill Creek owned and willed by the deceased John Harwood who willed it to his sons John & Squire--being lot #1 next John & Peter Hastim & Ishmael Caudell).

Book 26 page 70: On Sept. 7 1819, Richard Smith & wife Elizabeth, John Sparks & wife Kitty & William Harwood make Richard Smith of Lincoln Co., Tenn. to let mack Crump of Rowan Co. N.C., have their 3/4 of 2/7 of the land on the northeast side of the Yadkin River which they received from their deceased Father, Henry Harwood (which had belonged formerly to the deceased Martin Walser but had been bought by the deceased Harrawood), for \$140.00, witnessed by .H. Buis & W. Douglas & proved by the latter in Feb. 1821. (See next page where John Walser lets Crump have his portion of it).

Book 24 page 366: Samuel Haworth & wife Elizabeth let Robert Craver, have 62 acres on Rich Fork of Abbots Creek next Eli Moore & Stephen Pain, for \$160.00, witnessed by Pharahab Haworth & John Oein(?) & acknowledged before Esq. William Piggott of Rowan Co. N.C.

The will of John Harwood (book G page 249) made April 19 1811 & probated in Nov. 1812. Son William to have 1/3 of Bells place after \$144.00 are paid my grandson Henry (son of Henry Harwood) which must be about the time of my death. Witness: J.A. Pearson.

Book 17 page 259: On Dec. 15 1798, Henry Harewood & wife Martha, let Joseph Chaffin--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 146 acres on south side of Yadkin River next Bush Sidden, for 150 pounds, witnessed by Jesse Adams, Phillip Harewood & Standley Chaffin & proved in May 1800. (This is part of 250 acres patented to Peter Hammond on Nov. 4 1784).

Marriage bonds: Henry Harwood to Martha Brian (Gov. Spaight's term) signed Charles F. Mabins.

Book 17 page 408: On Jan. 10 1800, John Johnston of Davidson Co. Tenn.--no wife signs--lets William Howard of Rowan Co. N.C., have 200 acres in the forks of the Yadkin River on Carter's Creek next Daniel Orret, Adam Brinegar & Richard Peck, for 200 pounds, witnessed by J. Johnston & Christopher Howard & proved by the latter in Nov. 1800.

Book 24 page 359: On Sept. 30 1817, William Howard of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Henry Faw of Stokes Co. N.C., have 301 acres on Carters Creek next Daniel Orrel, Adam Brinegar & Henry Howard in the forks of the Yadkin River, for \$1500.00, witnessed by Jilson Berryman, Joseph Howard & Joseph Cheffin & proved by the last named in Nov. 1817.

May 7 1785: Deed from John Johnston & ux to Adam Brinegar for 440 acres Jan. 7 1785 proved by Joseph Edwards.

Book 10 page 175: On Jan. 17 1785, John Johnston & wife Elizabeth let Adam Brinigar (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 440 acres on Carters Creek, for 11 pounds witnessed by Christopher Howard & Joseph Edward & proved by the latter in May 1785.

Book 19 page 171: Adam Brinegar--no wife signs--lets Henry Howard (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 220 acres on Carters Creek for 200 pounds, witnessed By John Hinkle & Benjamin Hinkle & proved by the latter in Feb. 1805.

Book 25 page 105: Oct. 20 1818, Joseph Howard--no wife signs--lets John Phillips (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 89 1/8 acres on Carters Creek next said Phillips, Philip Howard, Henry Howard & Ar Hendrix, for \$267.25, witnessed by Anderson Hendrix & Benjamin Hinkle & proved by the latter in Feb. 1819.

Book 13 page 628: Nov. 27 1793, The State grants (#2198 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to William Pinkston 348 acres on Deals Creek next John Howard on west side of a branch, next Gideon Howard, said Pinkston, Mesheck Pinkston & Braham Jacobs & Thomas Biles, crossing a branch.

Aug. 8 1795 : Deed from John Howard to Peter Pinxton for 100 acres March 22 1795 is proved by Henry Giles.

May 8 1795: Deed from John Howard to Mesheck Pinston for 132 acres May 9 1794 is acknowledged.

Book 13 page 941: May 9 1795, John Howard & wife Lubina let Mesheck Pinkston--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 132 acres on Deals Creek next Benjamin Turner & Gideon Howard, for 100 pounds, witnessed by I. Troy & acknowledged in May 1795.

Book 10 page 358: On Aug. 20 1785, William Pinkston Turner (Action Turner makes her mark), lets Mashack Pinkston have 107 acres on Dales Creek next Benjamin Howard, John Howard Jr. & William Pinkston, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Peter & William Pinkston & acknowledged in Nov. 1785.

Nov. 12 1785: Deed from William Pinston Turner & wife to Mesheck Pinston for 107 acres Aug. 20 1785 is acknowledged.

Book 24 page 369: On May 10 1817, Esq. Alexander Frohock, Sheriff of Rowan Co. N.C., lets John Howard Sr., have 150 acres next William Pinkston & John Howard, for \$155.00 (whereas an execution from Surry Co. N.C. court issued against Richard Messeeks for \$301.87 1/2 recovered by said John Howard & no goods or chattels to be found &c), witnessed & proved by Henry Allemong. (This is part of a State Grant to the said John Howard).

Book 4 page 430: April 4 1761, Earl Granville lets John Howard, the Innholder of Rowan Co. N.C., have 530 acres vacant land next George Bruner, for 10 shillings, witnessed by W. Lucas & John Frohock & proved by the latter in July 1761. (Delivered by Mr. John Frohock)

Book 6 page 380: On April 15 1767, John Howard & wife Mary let John Mitchell, a merchant & all of Rowan Co. N.C., have 103 acres on both sides of Grants Creek next George Bruner, for 5 shillings--the release price being 40 pounds on the next day--witnessed by Solomon Sparks & Michael Miller & proved in April 1767. (This is part of a tract which Earl Granville let him have on April 4 1761).

Book 6 page 382: On Oct. 27 1752, Earl Granville lets Edward Hughes, a plant of Anson Co. N.C., have 314 acres at upper end of Fairfield on north bank of Yadkin River, for 3 shillings, witnessed by Jas. Conner & Henry Johnston

Book 6 page 384: On April 15 1767, John Howard & wife Mary let John Mitchell have 314 acres on the upper end of Fairfield on the north bank of the Yadkin River, for the release price being 80 pounds on the next day--witnessed by James Conner & Henry Johnston & proved in April 1767. (Edward Hughes sold this to John Howard on July 20 1763).

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War records of ----- and Benjamin Howard-S. 31138.

The record of Benjamin Howard has been found and his history is furnished herein as found in the papers on file in pension claim, S. 31138, based upon his service in the Revolutionary War.

Benjamin Howard was born September 6, 1755, in Frederick County, Maryland, and when a small boy moved with his father to Rowan County, North Carolina. The names of his parents are not shown.

While residing in said Rowan County, Benjamin Howard volunteered and served with the North Carolina Troops, as follows: from the fall of 1775, three months as a private in Captain Montgomery's Company, Colonel Brannon's Regiment: from the summer of 1776 to November, 1776, as private in Captain James Craig's Company: soon after the termination of this service, he joined Captain Craig's Company of Horse and served about two years as cornet: from the spring of 1780, about four months as 2nd lieutenant in Captain James Craig's Company, Colonel Davie's Regiment and was in the battles of Ramsour's Mills and Catawba Ford: in February, 1781, he was in a skirmish at the "Shoals" under Captain James Craig: after this, Benjamin Howard was transferred to Captain Richard Simmins' Company of Light Dragoons, was in the siege of Ninety-Six and continued to serve in said company until October 11, 1781. He was also out many times against the Indians and Tories: no dates given for these short tours. He stated that he served four years and four months in all.

He was allowed pension on his application executed January 4, 1833, while a resident of Madison County, Kentucky.

There are no data as to wife and children. In 1833, Joseph Howard, a brother of the soldier, lived in Madison County, Kentucky, aged sixty-eight years.-----

HOWARD DATA

Kentucky was originally part of Fincastle County, Virginia. It was afterward made an individual county of the Old Dominion. IN 1780, by an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, it was divided into three districts- Fayette, Lincoln, and Jefferson. Fayette included more than one third of the present state.

Notes on Howards, from D.A.R. Magazine, February 1921, p.84.

Burke states that Howard, or Hereward, was living in the reign of King Edward, 957-973, and that he was a kinsman of the Duke Oslac. The very ancient book of the Church of Ely, "Historia Ecclesia Eliensis", confirms this statement.

Sir John Howard married Alice de Boys, and their grandson Sir Robert, married Lady Margaret Mowbray, She was the daughter of Thomas de Mowbray, a direct descendant of Robert De Vere, who signed the Magna Charta as surety for King John, and his wife Elizabeth, daughter of Richard Fitz Allen, Earl of Arundel, and grand-daughter of Lord John Mowbray and Elizabeth Segrave, who on her mother's side, was a grand-daughter of King Edward I. and his wife Margaret, daughter of Philip Le Hardi, King of France.

On her father's side, Elizabeth Segrave was descended from Charlemagne, King Alfred, William the Conqueror, Rollo, and all the early French kings and heroes.

Sir John, son of Sir William Howard, and Margaret Mowbray, 1st Duke of Norfolk, married Katherine, daughter of Lord Moleyna.

Their son, Lord Edmund, married Joyce, daughter of Sir Richard Culpepper, and their daughter, Margaret, married Sir Thomas Arundel. Their son Matthew took his mother's name of Howard and married Margaret Wiloughby.

They were the parents of Matthew Howard, who settled near Annapolis, Maryland, 1649, and of Ann Howard, wife of Cecil Calvert, Lord Baltimore..

The Howards came to Maryland from England
