


Barnett Wiatt. (North sides of the Yadkin River).

Book 22 page 85D: Nov. 27 1816, The State grants (#3995 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Barnett Wiatt 25 acres on the north side of the Yadkin River, beginning on the corner of Solomon Coater at a stake, going west with the line of Lewis Robland 21 chains to a stake, south 12 chains to a hickory on the corner of John Sloan, east with his line 21 chains to a black Jack on the corner of Coater, north with his line to the beginning. (This had been entered on Jan. 20 1815).

Book 43 page 182; May 1866, the land of deceased Edmund Briggs is divided among his heirs by the commissioners (W.R. Fraley, M. Plumer, T. Crawford, M.A. Bost & Jessie Lyerly) & reported as follows

- Lot #1 of 65 acres to John E. Briggs (a minor) next ---Robinson, the railroad, lot #4 & valued at \$650.00,

Book 54 page 351; March 27 1878, R.R. Wyatt & wife Martha let John S. Henderson--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 58 acres (which was allotted said Martha in the estate of her deceased father, Edmund Briggs when divided) next Annie Lord, John Barger, John E. Briggs & W.J. Wyatt for \$1.00 as they owe H.W. Woodson & others &c. (This mortgage is marked released).

N.C. have 320 acres on Lick Creek next Moses Parks. John Wyatt & William Daily. for 20 pounds, witnessed by William Cole & Michael Beck & proved by Jacob Beck in Nov. 1796. (This had been patented on May 18 1789)

Book 12 page 210; May 18 1789, The State grants (#1816 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to George Bonds 640 acres on Lick Creek next Moses Parks, John Wyatt & William Cole, in a field.

Book 14 page 646 Or 746 (numbered twice): Sept. 20 1796, Nathan Wyatt of Rowan Co. N.C. & wife signs-- lets Adam Smith of Orange Co. N.C., have 200 acres on waters of Lick Creek next Moses Parks, John Wyatt, William Dayley, William Sandey (between Nathan Wyatt & William Sandy & had been granted to said Wyatt on May 18 1789 ) witnessed by Lydia Ward & William Ward & proved by the latter in Feb. 1797.

*At begins on the line of Moses Park at a white oak, & goes north 16 chains & 70 links to a post oak on the line of John Wyatt, east 6 chains & 70 links to a pine on the corner of the said Wyatt, north with his line 22 to a small black oak on the corner of William Dayley, east with his line to a small pine in the said line, south on a conditional line of William Sandey 98 chains & 70 links with the original line of the said tract to a stake on a branch & a conditional line between Nathan Wyatt & William Sandey, then west to the beginning. (This is what George Bond got May 18 1789 & let the said Nathan Wyatt have, for 120 pounds N.C. money*


