## Rev. John Angel

"ANGEL, JOHN 1779. In November or December, 1779, he was a  
substitute for Charles Angel under Captain Samuel Martin,  
in Colonel Hampton's regiment of North Carolina militia. Served  
eight or ten days.

"1780. A volunteer at The Battle of Camden. Wounded in the  
left arm.

"Started to King's Mountain and got as far as Old Richmond  
Court House, now in Stokes County. Met General Armstrong, who  
sent him on a dispatch to General Davidson. He remained  
with General Davidson during the battle and continued with  
him to Salisbury.

"1781. Was called out several times to fight Tories. Went to  
Wilmington.

"John Angel was born 1762 or 1763. Lived near Upper Sarantown.  
In 1802 he moved to Surry County, to the place where he was  
living in 1892. Married Mary Brunson. Minister at Flat Rock  
Baptist Church fifty years. References as to service were  
Thomas Wright, Sr., John Wright, Josiah Combs and Major  
Joseph Williams. John Wright testified that he was about the  
same age as Matthias Angel, oldest son of John, and that he  
attended Flat Rock Church and lived within three miles of  
The Angel home." (Page 12 of "Catawba Frontier 1775-1781 Memories  
of Pensioners" published in 1950 at 2333 Nebraska Ave., Washing-  
ton, D.C. by the compiler, Mary Elmer Sargent.)

Among the Revolutionary War Pensioners of Surry Co. North  
Carolina, was John Angel, age 71 years, who received \$126.99  
beginning March 4, 1831, as a Private in the Infantry & Cavalry  
& Sergeant in the North Carolina militia.
