A letter to Mrs. Mamie Linton of Salisbury, N.C. from Mrs. H.C. Shower, (Eliza Crosby Bibber), of 14 Ridgeland Way, Route 70, Atlanta, Ga., wanting information of her Rowan & Sredell Counties ancestry, written Feb. 9, 1927, & passed on to me, (Mr. & Mrs. C.) Book 22 page 90: Nov. 6 1810, John Hill formerly of Rowan lets William Hampton, a silversmith of Rowan Co. N.C., have 253 acres on Grants Creek next Cale Phifer, Wm. Pinkston, small glade, Jno. Smith, Paul Roadsmith & Jacob Switzer, crossing north branch of Jumping Run next said Hampton, for \$900.00, witnessed by Daniel Cress & William H. Hampton & proved in May 1811.

Book 28 page 246: Sept. 3 1825, the high-sheriff of Rowan Co. N.C., Esq. Charles Fisher (on an execution against James Hampton for \$49.76 recovered by Christian Pringle, Randolph & Young--no goods or chattels, with orders to sell & does sell Aug. 19 1825) lets Philo White of Rowan Co. N.C., 1/4 of the tract of 253 acres deeded by John Hill to William Hampton (& which came to said James Hampton from his said father, William Hampton) next --- Phifer, William Pinkston, John Smith, Paul Roadsmith, Jacob Swisher crossing north branch of Jumping Run next said Hampton's other tract, for \$60.00, witnessed by Samuel Jones & acknowledged in Nov. 1825.

Book 5 page 352: On Oct. 8 1763, John Witherspoon, a weaver (Elizabeth also signs), lets Thomas Johnson--all of Rowan Co. N.C.-- have 320 acres "on Gillespies Creek it being a part of Henry White's place where he did Live on the Lower end", for 65 pounds, witnessed by William Luckie & Thomas Braly & proved in Oct. 1763. (This had originally been granted by Earl Granville to Henry White on May 26 1761).

N.C.--have 217 acres on the west side of Davidson's Creek next Samuel Baker, for 40 pounds, witnessed by James White, James Davidson & Hugh Lawson Jr. & proved in Feb. 1773. (This is part of a tract granted Moses White by deed on Dec. 21 1761).

May 8 1790: "Thomas Anderson appointed Constable gave bond with Richd Trotter & qualified".

Book 13 page 633: On Aug. 19 1793, Francis Lock Sr.--no wife signs--lets Martin Steele, a weaver, have 200 acres on Second & Grants Creeks next John Skiles, Col. Francis Lock & Elizabeth Gibson, for 120 pounds, witnessed by William Robison & Francis Locke Jr. & proved by the latter in Aug. 1794. (This is part of some land which Matthew Long let Francis Lock have & some granted Francis Lock by The State).

May 10 1794: Deed from Martin Steele to Thomas Anderson for 200 acres Feb. 27 1794 proved by Henry Giles.

Book 13 page 600: On Feb. 27 1794, Martin Steele--no wife signs--lets Thomas Anderson have 200 acres on Second Creek & Grants Creek next John Skiles & Elizabeth Gibson, for 140 pounds, witnessed by M. Stokes & Henry Giles & proved by the latter in May 1794.

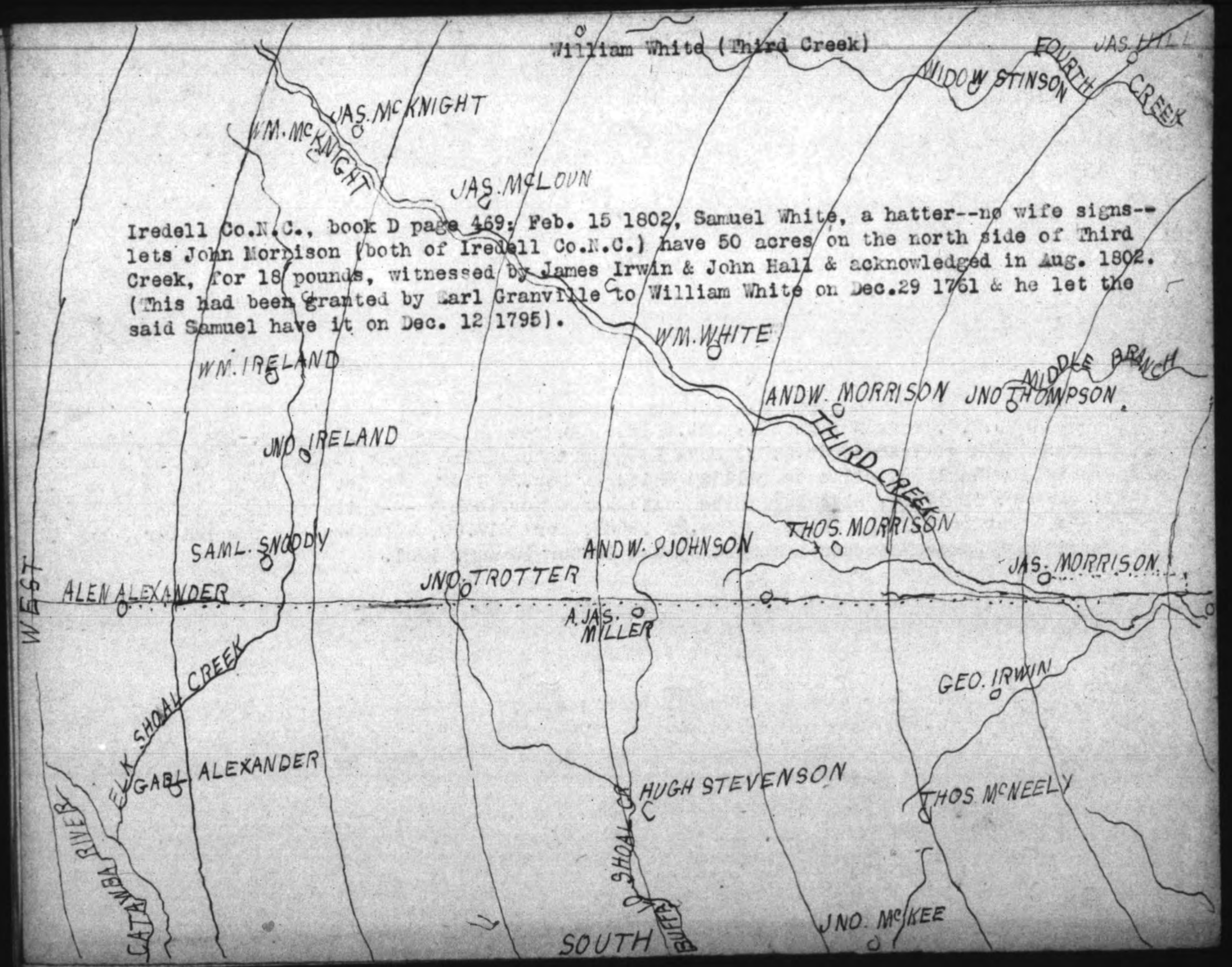

Book 7 pages 95-6: Moses White, out of love and affection for his son James deeds him 200 acres of land (now occupied by James) next that of John Work & Moses White on Feb. 18 1769 witnessed by John & Moses White in May 1769. (The deed is signed by Moses & Elenor White & is for part of a tract of 650 -- acres granted to Moses by Earl Granville on May 25 1752). Moses also gives to his son John White, 100 acres next John Miller & "my own" at the same time and part of the 650 tract from Earl Granville to him on March 25 1752, witnessed by James & Moses White in May 1769. This is also signed by Elenor & Moses White. (See deeds below)

The History of Rowan Co. N.C., says the first Moses White came from Ireland about 1742, married the daughter of Hugh Lawson, and their son, James White, (the eldest of six children,) was a soldier in the Revolution and moved to East Tenn. in 1786 where he was one of the original founders of Knoxville. "He was distinguished for his bravery, energy, and talents, and was a brigadier general in the Creek War. His illustrious son, Hugh Lawson White, was a Judge of the Supreme Court of Tennessee, a Senator of the United States, president of the senate, and in 1836 a candidate for President of the United States. His remains sleep peacefully under the vines and grass of the churchyard of the First Presbyterian Church of Knoxville." Feb. 13 1771: Hugh Lawson Sr. lets James White have a negro, "Salley" on Jan. 10 1771 proved by Moses White Jr. Feb. 5 1773: Decd from Moses & Elenor White to Nathl. Ewing for --- 1770 proved by Hugh Lawson Jr. Book 8 page 81: On --- 1770, Moses White & wife Elenor, let Nathaniel Ewing--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 217 acres on the west side of Davidsons Creek next Samuel Baker, for 40 pounds, witnessed by James White, James Davidson & Hugh Lawson Jr. & proved in Feb. 1773. (This is part of a tract granted Moses White by deed on Dec. 21 1761).

Book 7 page 95: On Feb. 18 1769, Moses White Sr. (Elenor makes her mark) lets his son Moses White Jr. have 200 acres on west side of Davidsons Creek next both father & son's (now occupied by son Moses) witnessed by William Robert & proved May 1769. (This is part of 650 acres granted to Moses White on March 25 1752 by Earl Granville). Book 7 page 97: On Feb. 18 1769, Moses White (Elenor makes her mark) lets his son John White have 100 acres (which he now occupies) next Moses White & John Miller, witnessed by James & Moses White & proved May 1769. (This is part of 650 acres granted Moses White by Earl Granville on March 25 1752). (Refer to Francis Look Sr. Martin Steele, weaver, & other for this)

N.C.) have 50 acres on the north side of Third Creek, for 18 pounds, witnessed by James Irwin & John Hall & acknowledged in Aug. 1802. (This had been granted by Earl Granville to William White on Dec. 29 1761 & he let the said Samuel have it on Dec. 12 1795).

Iredell Co.N.C. book K page 201: Oct.9 1816, Andrew White--no wife signs--lets Thomas Lawson (both of Iredell Co.N.C.) have 134 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on Third Creek (being part of the land granted by Earl Granville to William White on Dec.29 1760, who let the said Andrew have it on Dec. 11 1795); also 52 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres next Andrew Morrison & ---White (being part of a State Grant to William White on Nov.29 1803), for \$617.00, witnessed by the latter, John Morrison & James Thompson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1821.

Book 63 page 456: Nov.1 1878, J.A.White & wife Margaret A. of Iredell Co.N.C., let Sarah J. the wife of S.A.Sharpe, also of Iredell Co.N.C., have this for \$800.00, acknowledged in Iredell on July 19 1883.
