Walton in Feb. 1822.

(This is their 1/7 parts of the estate of Peter Riblin as heirs).

Mr. Mauney says James McMackin was probably of Pennsylvania and when the Cornish miners found they couldn't manipulate the machinery, he was sent for to show these workers at Gold Hill all about it. His son, David McMackin born Dec. 23 1787 died Dec. 26 1858 aged 71 yrs. & 3 days, with wife Susanna, who died April 25 1857 aged 69 yrs. 6 mos. & 9 days, and daughter, Rachel (wife of Ephraim Mauney) born Dec. 3 1824 died of a congestive chill on Jan. 19 1858 aged 33 yrs. 1 mo. & 16 days; Ephraim Mauney, born Dec. 15 1812 died May 24 1899 & wife Eliza Jane (daughter of J. & R. Davis) died Jan. 1 1880 aged 50 yrs. 5 mos. & 19 days, are buried in the Methodist graveyard on the line between Cabarrus & Rowan counties near Gold Hill.

Book 45 page 55; Feb.5 1839, Jacob Ribelin--no wife signs--lets Asa Ribelin (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 110 acres on the Middle Fork of Crain Creek; also 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres on Middle Fork of Crain Creek next David Brown & Thomas Mull, for \$770.00, witnessed by John Shuman Jr. Jacob Brown & Michael L.Brown & proved by the last named on Sept.30 1869.

Book 20 page 148: Nov.28 1808, George Fraley Sr. (a German & no wife signs) lets Jacob Ribelin--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 110 acres, for \$200.00, witnessed by John Fraley Sr. & Thomas Mull & proved by the latter in Feb. 1810. This begins at a maple & goes north 3 degrees west 38 chains to a hickory, north 87 degrees east 29 chains to a stone heap, south 3 degrees east 38 chains to a stone heap, south 87 degrees west 29 chains to a maple.

The will of George Fraley Sr. (book G page 472) made Feb.26 1817 & probated in May 1817. Sick & weak. Six children: Jacob, John. George, Barbara Fite, Rosannah Ribelin & Margaret Tredwell. Exrs: son George & friend Henry Fraley. The will of George Fraley is proved by Abragam Airey (one of the witnesses) & George Fraley qualified as Exr.
