Lexington, Davidson Co. N.C. (made from Rowan in 1822, but this portion was not cut off until 1836 Legislature & possibly not in force until later). Will of Alfred Smith, made July 25 1843 & probated in 1843, Book I page 408: Wife Susannah, the homelace, "which I bought of my brother George Smith whereon I now live", but after her death it is to descend to my sons, James & Alfred. Sons: James, Alfred, Burges L. & Casper G. The latter two are to have the 22 acres I bought of my deceased brother, Casper Smith. These four sons also get land on the east side of Abbotts Creek near the bridge of Leonard Smith, being 135 acres. Daughters: Ellen, Nancy, Mary Ann, Jane (all of these under age) & Rachel (who is the wife of Obadiah Goss--she may receive something from her grandfather, Leonard Goss). Some of the children may have gone off. Exrs: son Casper G. & brother, David Smith. Witnesses: B.L. Beall & James Wiseman. The clerk says he can find no division of the estate.

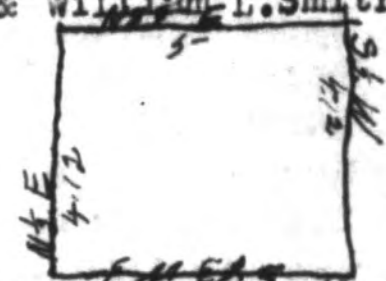

Book 10 page 231; Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (\$974 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Jacob Smith 263 acres on the south fork of Potts Creek, beginning on the corner of Maxwell Chambers at a stake, going with his line south 20 degrees east 33 chains & 50 links to a stake on the corner of said Chambers, west 89 chains & 50 links with a conditional line between the said Jacob Smith & Thomas White

(Waters of Dutch Buffalo Creek).

Book 16 page 159: April 25 1796, Everhart Smith--no wife signs--lets Jacob Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 280 acres on the waters of Dutch Buffalo Creek, beginning on the corner of the old tract of said Smith, at a large pine, going north 32 degrees east 10 chains & 50 links to a small pine on the line of George Ketner's part of said old tract, south 47 degrees east 35 chains & 25 links to a post, south 68 degrees & 30 minutes east 11 chains & 50 links to a pine, east 32 chains & 28 links to a stone heap in the branch & on the old line, south with the old line 2 degrees & 30 minutes east 30 chains & 50 links to a post oak saplin & a black oak on the old corner of the tract of the said Smith, south with the old line 7 1/2 degrees west 53 chains & 50 links to a post oak saplin on the old corner, then south with the old line 2 degrees 30 minutes west 53 chains to the beginning, for 150 pounds, witnessed by two Germans (?) & acknowledged in May court of 1796.

Book 16 page 141: April 25 1796, Everhart Smith--no wife signs--lets George Ketner (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 234 acres on the waters of Dutch Buffalo Creek, beginning on the corner of the old tract & the corner of the land of Joseph McPherson, at a large pine, going north 87 1/2 degrees east 32 chains to a large pine on the corner of the old tract, north with the line of Jacob & John Smith 32 degrees east 57 chains & 75 links to a heap of stones on the line of Frederick Stigerwalt, near the branch, north with the line of said Stigerwalt 23 degrees & 15 minutes west 66 links to a poplar bush at the branch on the corner of Stigerwalt, south with the old line 87 degrees west 40 chains & 78 ----- to a hickory saplin on the line of Joseph McPherson, then to the beginning, for 200 pounds, witnessed by ? & Robert Linn & acknowledged in May court of 1796.

Lewis Smith. (Third Creek)

Book 18 page 546: April 26 1800? Peter Lewis Sr.--no wife signs--lets Lewis Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 55 acres on Third Creek, beginning at a post oak & going south 45 degrees east 20 chains, as the line is marked, to a post oak on the corner of Richmond Pearson, south 55 degrees east 28 chains to a Spanish oak saplin on the bank of the said creek, south 15 degrees west with the meanders of the creek 25 chains & 50 links to a black oak, north 55 degrees west with the meanders of said creek to a post oak on its bank, north 40 degrees west 13 chains & 50 links to a pine under a stoney hill on the bank of said creek, then north to the beginning, for \$109.00, witnessed by Benjamin Hodgens, William Byrd & Peter Lewis & proved by the last named in May court of 1803. (This is part of a State Grant to the said Peter Lewis Sr.)

(Waters of Potts Creek)

Book 13 page 374: Nov. 27 1799, William Elliott--no wife signs-- let Jonathan Merrell (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 286 acres on the waters of Potts Creek, beginning on the corner of said Merrell & the line of Jacob Smith, at a stake, going with the line of the said Merrell south to a stake, south 16 degrees east 63 chains to a stone on the line of Andrew Merrell, west with the line of --- Merrell 28 chains to a post on the line of John Davis, north with his line 7 chains & 75 links to a Spanish oak on his corner, west with his line again 34 chains to a forked white oak, north 51 chains to a stake on the line of Jacob Smith, then with his line to the beginning, for 61 pounds N.C. money, witnessed by Frederic Clever & Elijah Merrell & proved by the latter in Nov. court of 1793.

Book 65 page 828; April 5 1882, John Smith & wife Susan let R.A. Smith--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 301 acres (which includes three different tracts bought by said John Smith, next Daniel Fink, Monroe Ritchie, Michael Bost(?) & heirs of Michael Bostian), beginning next ---Beaver (now ---Sloop's) on a wet-weather branch, for \$1000.00, witnessed by P.A. Sifford & acknowledged on Dec. 10 1883.

Book 82 page 80; Aug. 14 1897, R.A. Smith & wife Mollie let H.F. Rimer--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 301 acres next ---Beaver, near a branch, for \$1000.00, witnessed by C.M. Kimball a J.P. before whom it was acknowledged on the same day. (Refer to the deed from John Smith to him in book 65 page 828).

(N. CRANE CREEK)

Book 26 page 845; Jan. 21 1822, Jacob G. Smith (as executor of the will of deceased George Smith), lets William Smith--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have parts of three tracts: the first is acres & begins on the corner of Alexander Long & an original corner of the 313 acre tract, going with the line of Long, west 17.50 chains to a dead gum, south, partly with the line of Alexander Long & partly with that of Alexander Frocock, 83 chains & 50 links to the beginning corner of the 313 acre tract, east 14 chains to a stone on the corner of --- Chambers, north with his line degree west 5 chains & 20 links to a stone, south 55 degrees east 4 chains to a stone, east 18 chains to a stone, south 52 degrees east 4 chains to a stone, north 55 degrees east 320 chains to a stone, east 31 chains to a white oak on the line of John Adams, north with it, 29 chains to a heap of stones on his corner, north with the line of Lewis Beard 45 degrees west 32 chains & 75 links to an original corner, then north 42 degrees west 42.25 chains to the beginning--in all 447 acres-- for \$200.00, witnessed by V. Moore & John Cunningham & acknowledged in Feb. court of 1822. (This is part of the 313 acres which Matthew Troy let George Smith have March 28 1786 & part of 135 acres which Alexander Long let George Smith have Aug. 27 1784; & 96 poles & 6/10 which Peter Rice let George Smith have on Feb. 8 1796).

Book 21 page 70; Sept.-- 1806, Hardy Jones--no wife signs--lets Samuel Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 30 acres, beginning on the line of Benjamin Berriman at a post oak, going south 44 3/5 poles to a black oak saplin on the line of Peter Dowel, east 108 poles to a stone, north 44 3/5 poles to a hickory saplin, then 108 poles to the beginning, for \$100.00, witnessed by Thomas Watkins & Levi Smith & proved by the latter in May court of 1807. (This is part of the land upon which James Baxter now lives).

Book 65 page 828; April 5 1882, John Smith & wife Susan let R.A.Smith--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 301 acres (which includes three different tracts bought by said John Smith, next Daniel Fink, Monroe Ritchie, Michael Bost(?) & heirs of Michael Bostian), beginning next ---Beaver (now ---Sloop's) on a wet-weather branch, for \$1000.00, witnessed by P.A. Sifford & acknowledged on Dec. 10 1883.

Book 82 page 80; Aug. 14 1897, R.A.Smith & wife Mollie let H.F.Rimer--all of Rowan Co.N.C.-- have 301 acres next ---Beaver, near a branch, for \$1000.00, witnessed by C.M.Kimball a J.P. before whom it was acknowledged on the same day. (Refer to the deed from John Smith to him in book 65 page 828).

Obediah Smith (West of the Yadkin River)

Book 9 page 233; March 21 1780, The State grants (#54 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to James Andrews 300 acres on the west of the Yadkin River, beginning on its bank on the corner of David Bailey's deeded land, at a white oak, going north 31 chains to a black oak on the line of said Bailey, west 55 chains to a white oak, south 55 chains to a stake on the line of Humphrey Marshall, east 50 chains to a stake on the river bank, then up its meanders to the beginning.

Aug. 12 1786; Deed from James Andrews to Samuel Clerk for 100 acres April 15 1786 is acknowledged.

Book 10 page 482; April 15 1786, James Andrews--no wife signs--lets Samuel Clarke (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 100 acres next the said Andrews, for 75 pounds, witnessed by Joseph Williams & Moses Linster & acknowledged in Aug. court of 1786. (This is part of the 300 tract granted to the said Andrews by The State & begins on the northwest corner of said James Andrew at a black oak, goes east 23 chains & 30 links to a heap of stones, south 42 chains & 50 links to a pine, west 23 chains & 50 links to a black oak on the line of said tract, then to the beginning) (Over)

Book 11 page 525; April 25 1788, James Andrew, a planter, (Sarah Andrew also) let Obediah Smith--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 300 acres on the Yadkin River next the deeded land of David Bailey & land of Humphrey Marshal (but excluding the 100 acres sold Samuel Clarke), beginning on the river bank & corner of David Bailey's deeded land at a white oak, going north with his line 31 chains to a black oak on the line of said Bailey, west 55 chains to a black oak, south 55 chains to a stake on the line of Humphrey Marshal, east 55 chains to a stake on the river bank, then with its various courses to the beginning, for 50 pounds specie, witnessed by James Mcp Culloch & Elisabeth Freeland & proved by the latter in Nov. court of 1788.

Jacob Smith (North Side of Yadkin River)

Book 14 page 72 or 172 (numbered twice); July 16 1795, The State grants (#2401 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Alexander Long 900 acres on the North side of the Yadkin River, beginning on the corner of John Davis at a white oak & going north with his line 30 chains to two red oaks, west 5 chains to a black oak, north 10 chains, east 30 chains & 50 links to a small pine on the line of John Sloan, north with his line 17 chains to a sassafras on the line of Jacob Smith, west 1 chain to a pine on the corner of Smith, north 9 chains to a pine on the line of Walter Bellah, west 50 chains to a pine on his corner & the line of John Elliott, south with his line 17 chains to a pine on his corner, west 42 chains to a stake, west 36 chains to a post oak, west with the line of Elliot again 9 chains to a black oak grub, north 7 chains & 50 links to the line of George Peckry, west with his line 20 chains to a post oak on his corner, north 29 chains to a stake on the corner of John Cox, west with the line of Cox 14 chains & 50 links to a stake on the corner of Godfrey Ratts, south 14 chains to a stake, west 36 chains & 50 links to a stake on the line of Joseph E sien, south with his line 38 chains & 50 links to a Spanish oak on the line of John Mitseler, east 42 chains & 50 links to a stake, south 46 chains to a stake on the line of Maxwell Chambers, east with his line 28 chains & 40 links to a post oak on his corner, south with his line again 56 chains & 50 links to a stake on the line of said Long, east 19 chains & 25 links to a dogwood, north 31 chains to a stake, then east 34 chains to the beginning.
