Book 85 page 484; Sept. 6 1899, John S. Henderson & Lee S. Overman (as commissioners in the Special Proceedings of D.R. Julian & W.H. Miller vs John A. Boyden & others; let D.R. Julian have 200 acres in Unity Township "Known as the Jesse Thomason lands" which had been willed by J.H. Mingus to W.C. Mingus & c, for \$600.00,

Book 87 page 38; Sept. 15 1899, W.H. Miller & wife Mary R. let D.R. Julian--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have their half of the following lands, for \$300.00

Book 87 page 246; Dec. 15 1899, D.R. Julian & wife M.R.M. let George M. Kenerly--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 36 acres in Unity Township next Daniel Winecoff & others "Known as the Wilford Dent Tract" formerly owned by Joseph Mingus--see book 84 page 380 & 87 page 38--; also 200 acres next Daniel Winecoff & Daniel Penninger "Known as the Jesse Thomason lands--see book 84 page 378, 85 page 484 & 87 page 38--which had been willed by J.A. Mingus to W.C. Mingus, for \$1200.00, acknowledged on the same day. (over)

Book 84 page 378: March 14 1898, the sheriff, J.M.Monroe (in the suit vs W.Smithdeal see details, with orders to sell & did) let D.R.Julian & F.W.Miller--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have the undivided half interest of 200 acres in Unity Township next Daniel Winecodd, Daniel Penninger & others, for \$300.00, witnessed by Theo F.Kluttz & acknowledged on April 7 1898. (This is known as the Jesse Thomason land which J.H.Mingus willed to W.C.Mingus).

Same book page 380: Another on same day in same case to them of 36 acres next the above, known as the Wilfred Dent tract", for \$100.00 (This had been formerly owned by Joseph Mingus).

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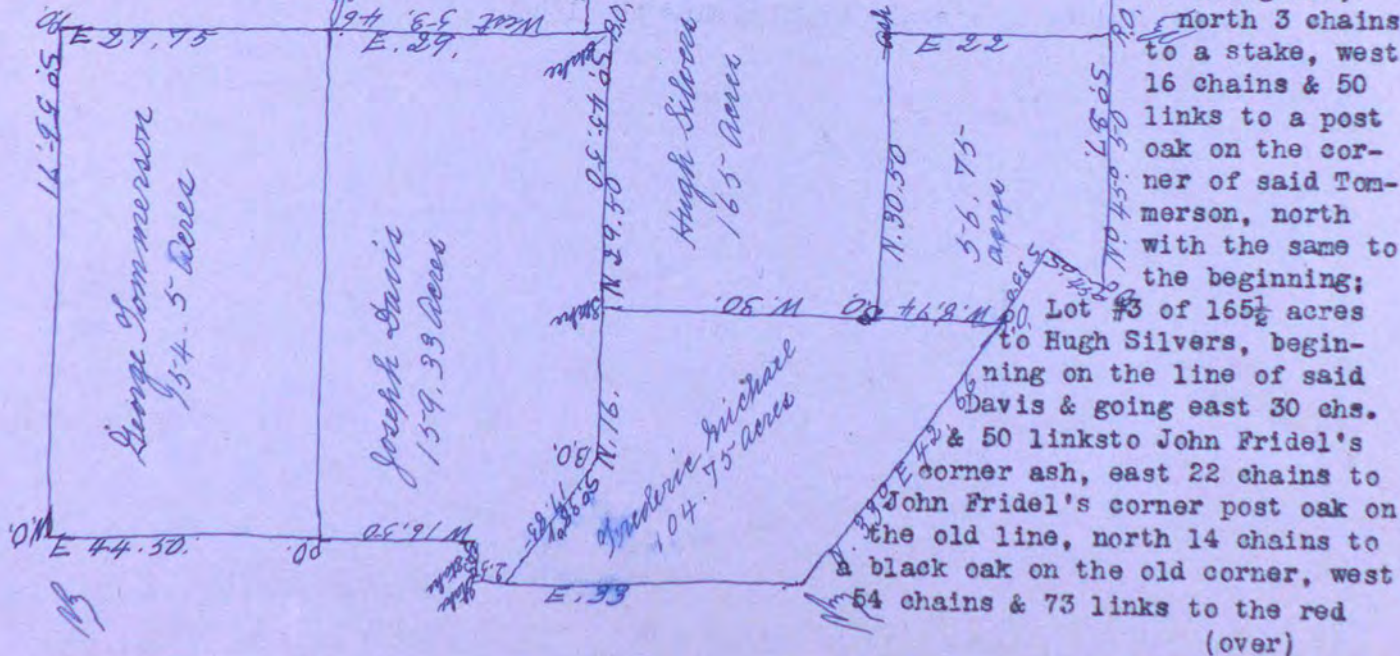


Division of the estate of deceased Hugh Mc.Crary

Book 21 page 105: Oct. 24 1806, Britain Js. Heymore as D.S., In obedience with the order of the County Court Sessions of May 1806, to divide the land of deceased Hugh McCrary, with the agreement & consent of the legatees (who sign), divided the land according to his will, assisted by the C.B., Barneby Bowers & Jos. Parkes, (who sign), as follows:

Lot #1 of 154 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres to George Tommerson, which begins at a white oak in the beginning corner of George Barrier, going east with the old line of McCrary 27 chains & 73 links to a post oak, north 55 chains & 71 links to a hickory sprout, west 27 chs. & 73 links to a post oak on the original corner, then south with the old line to the beginning.

Lot #2 of 159  $\frac{1}{3}$  acres to Joseph Davis, beginning on George Tommerson's corner at a hickory sprout, going east 29 chains to a red oak, south 45 chains & 50 links to a black Jack, south 38 degrees west 17 chains & 85 links to a stake near a Spanish to a dogwood, north 3 chains to a stake, west 16 chains & 50 links to a post oak on the corner of said Tommerson, north with the same to the beginning;





oak on the old corner, south 14 chains to a stake in the line of Davis, east 3 chains & 50 links to a red oak on the corner of Davis, then south with his line to the beginning.

Lot #4 of 56 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres to John Fridel, begins at a post oak in the old line on the corner of Hugh Silvers, south with the same 27 chains to a post oak, north 45 degrees west 8 chains to a post oak, south 35 degrees west 10 chains to a hickory, west 8 chains & 74 links to a black oak on the corner of Silvers, north 30 chains & 50 links to an ash on the corner of Silvers, then east to the beginning.

Lot #5 of 104 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres to Frederic Michael, begins on the beginning corner of the old tract, & goes north 35 degrees east with said line 32 chains & 72 links to a hickory corner of John Fridel, west with his line & the line of Silvers in all 38 chains & 76 links on line of Davis, south 16 chains to a black Jack, south 38 degrees west 17 chains & 85 links to a stake near a Spanish oak, east 33 chains to the beginning.

The tract is divided by a scale of 20 chains the inch.

William T.Thomason

Book 66 page 90: Sept.14 1867, William Swisher & wife Leah Ellen let William T.Thompson--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 2 tracts (one of  $24\frac{1}{2}$  acres next Richard Thomason,---Jacobs, the church lot & Ransom Jacobs, while other is 5 acres, 3 roods & 10 poles which was bought of John Beard on Jan.5 1861, but excepts the saw & grist mills with stable & ice house which will be moved), for \$350.00, witnessed by D.A.Davis & S.H.Wiley & acknowledged on the same day.

Book 66 page 92: Jan.22 1881, G.T.Thomason & wife J.A., J.A.Thomason & wife S.C., M.R. Thomason, R.B.Bailey & wife S.E. let W.T.Thomason--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have a quit-claim to 22 acres (in lot #2 appropriated to Mary B.Thomason in estate of deceased Richard Thomason), for \$420.00, witnessed by W.M.Kincaid & acknowledged on Jan. 24 1881.

Marriage license Oct.12 1876: George Taylor Thomason age 28 yrs. to Josephine Klutts age 20 yrs. they were married the same day in Franklin Township by Rev. A.L.Cranford.



Book 82 page 186: June 30 1896, J.Houston Gillean & wife Rachel E., H.B.Bailey & wife Lydia A., Martha J?Gillean, Sarah Jane Thomason & W.C.Gillean let John W.Powlas--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have their rights in 25 21/100 acres next Richard Graham, Joseph Dickson, old line & Moses Thompson; also in 37 $\frac{1}{4}$  acres on the original line next Aquilla Davinport; also in 22 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on the old line (now Richard Graham's), for \$200.00, witnessed by W.A. Thomason & acknowledged on July 21 1896.



George Thomason

The will of George Thomason (book C page 49) made June 22 1792 while "very sick & weak". Wife: Mary. Sons: Lande or Sande, Zachariah & William. Daughters: Elizabeth Pinxston & Mary. Exrs: friends Obadiah Smith & Moses Linster. Attests; Cha. Burrough, David Montgomery & John Hunter.

Aug. 11 1792; "Inventory of the Estate of George Thomason filed"

Aug. 11 1798: "Zachariah Thommeson orphan of George Thommeson being of lawful age came into court & elected John Howard his Guardian who gave bond with "William Thomison orphan of George being of lawful age Elected John Robley Guardian who gave bond with Charles Biles & Christian Cochenour Secu 400."

Marriage bonds: Landy Thompson to Elinor Clarke, March 20 1797 signed by David Montgomery.

Book of Mortgages 1 page 424; March 10 1888, William A.Sawyer & wife Mollie let Wilson Kesler--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 60 acres in Franklin Township next Ransom Jacobs, Burgess Elliott, Richard Walker & others "known as the home place of Wiley W.Swink", as they owe him \$275.00 with interest, acknowledged on the same day. (George T.Thomason let said Sawyer have this on March 8 1888).

Book 75 page 329; Wilson Kesler (as trustee of William A.Sawyers & wife Mollie who made it March 10 1888--see book 4 page 424 & it was sold May 9 1891) lets W.F.Thomason of ---- have 60 acres "Known as the home place of Wiley W.Swink" in Franklin Township next Ransom Jacobs, Burgess Elliott, Richard Walker, John Cauble & others, for \$312.00, witnessed & proved by J.W.Basinger on May 23 1891. (George T.Thomason let William A.Sawyer have this on March 8 1888).

Book 28 page 42: , John Williamson--no wife signs--lets William Thomason (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 121 acres on both sides Third Creek next Samuel Marlin (by purchase from John Williamson), near a branch, next John Rolley & corner of --- town, for \$327.30, witnessed by Daniel Lyerly & Samuel Marlin & proved by the latter in May 1825. (This is part of the land which Martin Randleman let John Williamson have on June 17 1823).

Book 66 page 489: April 23 1856, Jackson Thomason & Turner Thomason of Pontottee Co.Miss. (no wives sign) let Daniel Peninger of Rowan Co.N.C., have 326 acres on the south side of Third Creek next George Thomason, John Marlin, George O Tarr,----Brown, James Thomason, west bank of a branch & Jesse Thomason, for \$1200.00, acknowledged in Miss. before Judge Phineas T.Scruggs on the same day.

Book 28 page 472: Fe<sup>y</sup>. 24 1826, William Thomason out of love for his friend, Anna Catharine Trexler (daughter of Adam & Artemisa Trexler) gives her gives her a sorrel horse, 4 head of cattle, a sow & 6 pigs, 3 beds & furniture, a clock & case, a bureau, a cupboard & other things (now in the possession of Adam Trexler), witnessed by Peter Trexler & Moses Pinkston & acknowledged in Fe<sup>y</sup>. 1826.

Note (1) W. T. Thomason married first Fannie V. Shuman; born Mar. 23, 1848, died Jan. 17, 1882. He had Will, Kate, Annie and Mary, - all of whom are dead except Mary, Mrs. Add Swicegood, Spencer, N. C. He married Sarah J. Gillean in 1885, who is still living. They had Robert Lee and Charles G. Thomason, also Ruth, Lois and Ossie Thomason.

Note (2) Geo. T. Thomason married Josephine (Kluttz I think). They had Geo. Y. Thomason, Watson Thomason, Nettie and Frank. Geo. Y. married Pearl Bessent; Watson married a Kluttz, and they had one daughter - Nancy Watson Thomason; Nettie married Paul Cruse and they have a number of children; Frank married Adele Saeffer.

Note (3) Sarah Elizabeth married R. B. Bailey, Woodleaf. They have Elizabeth, Mary, Walter, Ira, Hugh and Helen, - all of whom are married.

Note (4) John Thomason married Harriet Ellen Fraley, June 30, 1848, lived in Franklin Township until 1849, when they moved to or near Little Rock, Ark. They remained there one year, then came back to Catawba County. Their children were: Geo. F. Thomason, Elmira, Robert H., Martha J., John J., Thomas J., Mary Lourena and Richard S.

Thomason & wife Susan C. have 5 acres & 3 rods (being a part of lot #2 in the estate of deceased Richard Thomason) next to the ridge road, for \$110.00, to be paid in installments, the first \$50.00 on the 1st day of May, 1869, and the balance of \$60.00 on the 1st day of May, 1870.

Book 43 page 410; Jan. 16 the land of deceased Richard Thomason was divided among his widow & children by the commissioners (John C. Miller, E.A. Propst, Jehu Foster, & Aron Raney with C.F. Waggoner as C.S. & B.W. Howard & Henry Shuping as C.B.S.) & reported to Feb. court of 1867 as follows

Thomason & wife Susan C. have 5 acres & 3 rods (being a part of lot #2 in the estate of deceased Richard Thomason) next to the ridge road, for \$110.00, to be paid in installments, the first \$50.00 on the 1st day of May, 1861, and the balance of \$60.00 on the 1st day of May, 1862.

 Robert E. Thomason & wife Susan C. let George T. third Monday Nov. 1824: The will of Richard Thomason is proved by Aquilla Thorn (a witness). The executors George Thomason & Benjamin Howard.

The will of Richard Thomason (Book H page 288) made while "very weak an low in body" on Sept. 4 1824 & probated in Nov. term of 1824. Son-in-law William Julian (whose wife is Fanny). Sons: George, Bias & William. Grandchildren: Hannah, Thomas, James & Ann Kincaid. Exrs: son George & friend Benjamin Howard. Witnesses: A.T. Horn & John Howard.

Mrs. Robert W. Price, says that William Julian was father of David, Lut. & Jess. He was very dissipated and often would run his wife and children out of the house for the night when drunk. David went to live with the Chunn family-- possibly for this reason, and thereby was made into a man. The Julians lived east of town, she thought.

Mr. William Murphy was a widower with at least two children when he married Susan C. Chunn. One child married Samuel Harrison and had at least three children: Robert, Samuel and a girl Sally? The boy may have died of tuberculosis as did some of his children by second wife. He kept a general mdse store at his home where the Graded School stands on east Innis St. Wealthy, they lived well and a crippled daughter had a negro to follow and carry her doll for her. His widow moved on corner of next block.

Sent the will of Richard Thomason & a few marriage bonds which I had in the house. Her want patch is very fertile.

(This is lot #1 in the division of the estate of deceased Francis Gibson & allotted to his daughter, Esther Wiseman).
