The will of Benjamin Abbott (book G page 439) made while "strong in body" April 7 1813 & probated in Aug. 1816. Wife Mary (where I live then to sons: Joseph & Starling). Children: William (where he lives on the main road), Joseph, Starling, Lucy, Sarah & Mary. Wife is Exr. Witnesses: George Swink & John Jacobs.

Aug. 20 1816: The will of Benjamin Abbott is proven by John Jacobs & George Swink. Administration on the estate is granted to Joseph Abbott who gave bond of 2000 pounds (with Michael Holdouser & Theodore McKee) & qualified March 16 1781 signed Ad. Osborn. A note from the bride's father, William Hudgens, giving consent?

The will of William Hudgins (Book D page 172) made June 28 1795. Wife Elizabeth. Daughter Mary Abbott. Sons: little William & the youngest Pleasant. Exrs: friends John Sloan, Alexander Long & Thomas Carson. Witnesses: O'diah Tuqua Jr., Agnes Sloan, Jane Fisher & John Sloan.

28. Br. Johann George Ebert, of Friedberg, his wife, and four children, have  
moved to the plantation near Salem, on the other side of the Wach, and will be  
"answartzige" members of Salem congregation."

Page 2130 under caption of Minutes of Salem Boards, 1786. "Feb. 1. (Auf. Col.)  
Johann Georg Ebert draws attention to the fact that most of the wood suitable  
for building has been cut from the 280 acres of Salem land which he has taken,  
in addition to his 340 acres of Unity land. He asks that in consideration of  
this he may have the land for two years without paying interest. As all inter-  
est is due at Michaelmas we think that if his interest is remitted until Mich-  
aelman, 1787, that will be quite enough." Page 2131 of same: "Feb. 2. \*\*\*Johann  
George Ebert, of Friedberg, has bought a piece of land on our creek, near Phil-  
ip Vogler. It includes the southeast corner of the Salem Lot, beyond the Wach.  
He will also rent from the Congregation Diaconie for several years the planta-  
tion now occupied by Philip Vogler."\*\*\*\* Page 2137: "April 26. The girls' school  
has been increased by a number of small children, since Johann George Ebert's  
daughters have entered"\*\*\*\* Page 2146: "Dec. 22. (Auf. Col.) J. George Ebert is  
bringing much fire-wood into town to sell to the Brethren. Br. Tycho Nissen shall  
ask him where he cuts it. Dec. 27, Wednesday. (Auf. Col.) J. George Ebert has  
been asked about the fire-wood. He cut it on his own land." Page 2161: "Fried-  
berg diary, 1786; March 26: "In the place of Johann George Ebert, who is moving to  
Salem neighborhood, Johann Hohns was elected steward." Page 2171, of Salem Dia-  
ry in 1787: "June 18. This evening a little son was born to Br. and Sr. Johann  
George Ebert, living near Salem." Page 2242, Salem Board Minutes of 1788: "Dec. 2  
(Auf. Col.) George Ebert has returned the 280 acres which he took from the Salem  
land." Page 2369, Salem Board Minutes of 1792: "May 17. (Auf. Col.) Br. Johann  
George Ebert has decided to take the corner lot next Br. Kuschke."

thought, though we have no other to suggest. They did not wish to leave the  
matter to the lot, and we did not think it would be wise to insist, nor to in-

Book 25 page 510: Sept. 30 1819, Lewis Beard--no wife signs--lets Sarah Abbott (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have  $\frac{3}{4}$  of lots 73 & 74 in the east square of Salisbury (in all  $1\frac{1}{2}$  poles<sup>2</sup> of the said lots, beginning at the northwest corner of 73 on Corbin St. going 24 past Cross St. & part of 74 to Wake St., then southwest on Wake St. 9 poles with lots 74 & 75, then 24 poles to Corbin St. then northeast to the beginning, for \$300.00, witnessed by Am. Jacobs & Charles Biles & acknowledged in Nov. 1819. (John Beard conveyed this to the said Lewis Beard).

(This refers to page 666--deed to Adam Desh).

May 9 1789: Deed from Martin Ebert & wife to Martin Ebert Jr. for 339 acres April 24 1789 proved by Peter Seaner. (Minutes of Rowan Co.N.C.)

May 9 1789: Deed from Martin Ebert & wife to Adam Desh for 345 acres April 4 1789 proved by Peter Seaner.

Book 11 page 666: On April 24 1789, Martin Ebert Sr. & wife Eva Barbara, Surry Co.N.C., let Adam Tesh of Rowan Co.N.C., a planter, have 345 acres (part of State Grant #1062 of 640 acres in Rowan next Surry line on Sept. 28 1785 see book X page 361 on south fork of Muddy Creek) & 69 acres next this (see book 10 page 632 tract #10) or 94 acres in Surry on Wachovia line & ridge next Martin Ebert Jr., for 10 shillings, witnessed by John Rights, Lewis Meinung & Peter Seaner & proved by last in May 1789.

Book 23 page 11: On Feb. 4 1814, Adam Tesh (signs like a foreigner & no wife signs) lets Jacob Tesh, both of Rowan Co.N.C., have 170 acres on Muddy Creek next Daniel Delap Sr. & crossing the creek to John Teshes, for \$340.00, witnessed by John Monroe Jr. & John Monroe & proved by the latter in Feb. 1814. (This is part of the tract of 345 acres which Martin Ebert Sr. let Adam Tesh have--see book 11 page 666).

Book 23 page 7: On Feb. 4 1814, Adam Tesh--no wife signs--lets George Tesh, both of Rowan Co.N.C., have 50 acres next ---Eberts, & John Tesh, in Wachovia, for \$50.00, witnessed by John Monroe Jr. & John Monroe & proved by the latter in Feb. 1814. (This is 1/2 part of the 345 acres which Martin Ebert Sr. let Adam Tesh have--see book 11 page 666).

Book 24 page 462: Aug. 30 1817, Joseph Abbott & wife Lucy, Massa Thomas & wife Elizabeth let Joseph Haden--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 17 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on the east bank of Swearing Creek next ---Myers (which is the lot laid off to said Lucy in the estate of deceased Michael Myers) also the 10 acres laid off for Mary (who is now dead) also 10 acres laid off for the dower of the widow, Mary, to which Elizabeth Thomas is entitled, being part of the original tract from Henry McCullough to said deceased Michael Myers), for \$130.00, witnessed & proved by John Smith & Samuel Wilson in Feb. 1818.
