

Book 54 page 231: March 26 1875, Sarah Krider (widow of Jacob Krider who willed her the home & land on the south side of Fourth Creek while she lived, also the household & kitchen furniture &c) thinking that she is not entitled to all her husband had willed her, waives her claim in favor of T.A.Krider, Mrs. Julia E.Graham & Mrs. Margaret C.Fleming--the children of Mrs. Maria Krider--& authorizes the executor, J.G.Fleming, to make it over to them, witnessed & proved by D.F.Fleming on Feb. 11 1878.

Book 54 page 230: March 26 1865, C.C.Krider, waives his part of the land which Jacob Krider had willed him (being the mill tract which Mr. D.Wood had bought of J.Dickey, including the land on the south side of Fourth Creek, after the death of his mother, if he would pay \$1,000.00 to the heirs of said estate) as above

Vinson Wood

Book 21 page 207: Aug. 23 1806, Amos Reed--no wife signs--lets Vinson Wood (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 190 acres for \$100.00, witnessed by Henry Cooper & Joseph Clarke & proved by the latter in Feb. 1808. (The State granted this to Esq. Valentine Beard who conveyed it to Vinson Wood who let the said Amos Reed have it).

Book 21 page 201: May 6 1807, Vinson Wood & Absolom Gossett--no wives sign--let Peter Younts (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 80 acres on Reedy Creek, for \$245.00, witnessed by Henry Cooper & Wm. Painter & proved by the latter in Feb. 1808. (The State granted it to Valentine Beard who indentured 190 acres to Vinson Wood who indented it to Amos Reed who indented it to Hughs Brookshire who indented it to Absolom Gossett but the whole was indented by Amos Reed to Vinson Wood).

Book 25 page 182: On Feb. 9 1819, Vinson Wood--no wife signs--lets William Wiseman (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 9 1/4 acres on Indian Graveyard branch, next Richard Owins & Joseph Pearson, for \$150.00, witnessed by Daniel Wood & Daniel Wood & proved by the latter in May 1819.

Book 25 page 363: Feb. 10 1819, Vinson Wood--no wife signs--lets Daniel Wamock (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres on both sides Indian Grave Branch next ---Lanier, ---Foutz & Richard Owens, for \$300.00, witnessed by Daniel Wood & William W.Wiseman & proved by the latter in Aug. 1819.

(Waters of Woods Creek).

Book 11 page 456: Oct. 25, 1786, The State granted, (\$1113 at 50 shillings the 100 acres), to John Gebble 150 acres on the waters of Woods Creek, beginning on a corner of the doaded land of John Woods at a white oak & going east with the line of Jacob Gebble 50 chains to a small hickory, north 30 chains to a hickory, west 50 chains to a stake on the line of John Woods, then south to the beginning.



Daniel Wood. (Fourth Creek)

Book 18 page 162: Dec. 15 1801. The State grants (#2766 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to John Lowry 180 acres on the north bank of Fourth Creek & up it. (This had been entered on Jan. 27 1779).

Book 19 page 937; Sept. 23 1803. John Lowry--no wife signs--lets Henry Williams (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 180 acres on the north bank of Fourth Creek, beginning on the said bank at a white oak & going north 47 chains to a red oak, north 55 degrees east 8 chains to a hickory, north 10 chains to a black oak, east 31½ chains to a pine, south 64 chains to a hickory on the creek bank, then up the various courses of said creek, for 250 pounds, witnessed by Herod B. Pruitt, John Boyen & Obediah Smith & proved by the last named in Feb. 1807.

Book 21 page 648; Oct. 30 1806. Henry Williams "a Soldier in the army of the United States of Rowan County in the State of North Carolina" appoints George Williams, his attorney to sell 180 acres on Fourth Creek in Rowan Co. N.C., witnessed by Duke Hamilton & Walter Hamilton (who are Justices of the Peace in Hancock Co. Georgia, where the said Henry Williams is at this time).

Book 21 page 28; Nov. 15 1806. George Williams (as the attorney in fact of Henry Williams, which attorneyship is dated Oct. 30 1806) lets Daniel Wood--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 180 acres on the north bank of Fourth Creek, for \_\_\_\_\_ witnessed by James Brooks & William Moore & proved by the latter in Aug. 1807. (This is the land which John Lowry let said Henry Williams have).

James Woods

The will of Andrew McCollum (book 6 page 35) made while "sick & low" on March 16 1807. Wife Jane (the plantation where I live while a widow). Daughters: Betsy (the eldest), Jane (wife of James Wood), Nancy & Anna. Exrs: friends: John Locke Sr., Esq. Francis Lock & Hugh Braly. Witnesses: Samuel McLaughlin, Jacob Addams & James Stuart.

Book 33 page 429 or 431 (numbered twice): Dec. 23 1837. Elizabeth, Nancy & Ann McCollum let Phillip Cope--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 42 acres on Thompsons Mill Creek next Daniel Leaser, for \$80.00, witnessed by Marcus E. Reese & William Dancy & proved by the latter in Feb. 1838.

Book 7 page 183; April 18 1769. David Mackey--no wife signs--lets George Cathey (both of Mecklenburg Co. N.C.) have 147 acres on Marlins Creek on the west side of James McManus, for 10 pounds, witnessed by Samuel Dingle, Abraham Pierce & John Cathey & proved by the last named on May 10 1770 before Richard Henderson. (This is part of 613 acres Earl Granville granted George Cathey on March 25 1752 & he conveyed to the now deceased William Mackey).

Book 7 page 457; Feb. 29 1772. George Cathey of Mecklenburg Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Robert Alexander of Rowan Co. N.C., have 147 acres on Marlins Creek on the west side of James McManus, for 25 pounds, witnessed by David Ramsay & John Braly & proved in May 1772. (David Mackey sold this to George Cathey on April 18 1769).

Book 9 page 17; July 16 1779. Robert Alexander of Lincoln Co. N.C. lets James McCollum of Rowan Co. N.C., have 147 acres on Marland Creek next John Thompson, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Polk & Joseph Dickson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1779. (George Cathey let Robert Alexander have this).

Book 25 page 744; Aug. 17 1808. John Wood of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Henry Wood have 50 acres next Jarratt Wood, for \$200.00, witnessed by Benjamin Sherwood & John Wood & proved by the latter in Feb. 1820. (This is part of 600 acres granted by The State to Jarratt Wood on Nov. 4 1784 who willed it to John).

Book 21 page 469; Aug. 17 1808? John Wood--no wife signs--lets David Lockinbill (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 50 acres on the original line, for \$200.00, witnessed by Bm. Sherwood & Adam Swisegood & proved by the latter in Feb. 1809. (This is part of the 600 acres sold by The State to Jarratt Wood on Nov. 4 1784 who willed it to the said John Wood).

Book 21 page 468; Aug. 17 1818. Henry Wood--no wife signs--lets David Lookingbill (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 50 acres on the old line next William Pinkerton, for \$200.00, witnessed by Bm. Sherwood & Adam Swisegood & proved by the latter in Feb. 1809. (This is part of the 600 acres sold by The State to Jarratt Wood on Nov. 4 1784 & he willed it to the said Henry Wood).



James Woods

Book 38 page 612: Jan.30.1818, James Woods & wife Jane of Cape Girardeau Co.Missouri as an heir-at-law of Ann McCollum who died intestate & whereas the said deceased & Nancy or Agnes McCollum owned considerable more than was necessary to pay their debts) appoint David R. Bradshaw of Rowan Co.N.C. their attorney to get what is due then, witnessed by John D.Cooke (Judge). Robert Brown (Clerk of Court in Missouri) & proved in Rowan Co.N.C. by James E.Kerr (Clerk of Court ) & J.S.Myers (as deputy Clerk).

Book 25 page 147: Dec. 25 1818, James McCollum of Iredell Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets James Woods of Rowan Co.N.C., have 159 acres on Thompsons Mill Creek next said Woods' house Mrs. McCollum, John Albright on the north side of the road, next --- Thompson, for \$1.75 the acre, witnessed by Samuel A.H.McCollum & John Andrews \* proved by the latter in Feb. 1819. (This is part of a grant to George Gathe who let said McCollum have this).

Book 30 page 518: Sept.20 1829, James Woods--no wife signs--lets Henry Seckler Sr. (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 160 acres on Corrells Mill Creek next Garrett Shulenburrier, Mrs. McCollum, --- Albright & Joseph Rodgers, for \$470.00, witnessed by Joseph Rodgers & John Andrews & proved by the latter in Feb. 1829. (This is part of the land which was owned by George Gathe who let Robert Alexander have, he let James McCollum have & he let said Woods have).

Book 30 page 521: Sept.20 1828, James Woods & wife Jane let Nancy & Ann McCollum--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have his 1/2 of 338 acres on Corrells Mill Creek next the old place of Henry Seckler, the tract James Woods bought of the heirs of Jacob Leizer, & Samuel Andrew, for \$100.00, witnessed by Archibald Morrison & William Gibson & acknowledged in Feb. 1829. (This is said Woods' wife's share as an heir of the deceased Andrew McCollum).

Book 38 page 239: Nov.23 1849, D.R. Bradshaw as the executor of Elizabeth McCollum, James Woods & wife Jane let Sidney H.Hart--all of ---, have 345 acres, 1 rod & 26 poles on both sides Thompsons or Corrells Mill-creek next ---Shulabarger, ---Sechler Henry Corriher for 605.00, witnessed by Marcus Rose & Joshua Miller & proved by the latter in May 1857

James Woods & wife of their mother's estate.)

Wood

Book 26 page 525: Oct.23 1817, Isaac Loveless--no wife signs--lets Frederick Thompson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 138 acres on Potts Creek next Richard Wilson & the land said Wilson surveyed to Thomas Reed, for \$500.00, witnessed by Jonathan Williams & John Semson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1821. (This is part of the State Grant made to the said Richard Wilson on Oct.24 1786).

Buried at Reed's Cross Roads not far from Tyro  
Jarret Wood born Dec.25 1793 died in March 1850;& his wife Mary, born Dec.12 1794 died in May 1866.

Jarret Wood

Aug.7 1795: The will of Jarret Wood is proved by William Hollys. One of the executors, George Reed, qualified.

The will of Garret Wood (book E page 10) made May 10 1795 & probated in Wife (no name given). Sons: William & Archibald (the two eldest), Isom, James, Henry, John, Joshua, Daniel & Garret. Brother Isom Wood. Daughters: Leah Cent, Ann Barber, Sarah, Elizabeth, Mary & Martha. Exrs: George Read & Thomas Wilson.

James Wood

Book 20 page 420: July 16 1812, John Wood--no wife signs--lets Jesse A.Pearson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 70 acres, it being lot #4 in the estate of deceased James Wood which was laid off on June 8 1808, on the river bank next William Wood's lot #5, for \$112.00, witnessed & proven by John Murphy in Nov. 1814.



Book 11 page 132: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1154 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Richard Wilson 300 acres on the head waters of Potts Creek next James Curry & Nathaniel Tenpenny.

Book 13 page 500; May 10 1793, Richard Wilson out of love--no wife signs--for Thomas Reed (both of ), 138 acres on the northwest side of said Richard Wilson, witnessed by Isaac Wiseman & Robert Wilson & acknowledged in Feb. 1794. (This is a part of the State Grant of 300 acres sold him Oct. 25 1786).

Book 17 page 74: Feb. 9 1796, Thomas Reed, a sadler--no wife signs--let George Reed (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 138 acres on the head waters of Potts Creek next the original line of Richard Wilson, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Zachariah Booth & Richard Wilson & proved by the latter in Nov. 1799. (The State granted this to Richard Wilson Oct. 21 1786).

Book 18 page 788: Aug. 22 1803, Daniel Wood--no wife signs--lets Isaac Loveless (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 138 acres on Potts Creek next Richard Wilson's land which was conveyed to him by Thomas Reed, for 150 pounds, witnessed by John Donoway & William Harwood & acknowledged in May 1804. (This is part of the 300 acres granted by The State to Richard Wilson on Oct. 24 1786).

Feb. 3 1806; The will of James Wood is proven by John Garret & Benjamin Merrell. Letters were issued to Daniel Wood who qualified &c.

Book 13 page 809: Oct. 11 1794, Henry Roberts, a blacksmith (Nesse Roberts makes her mark), lets the yeoman, William Wood (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 150 acres on the waters of Holmans Creek, beginning on the corner of Jacob Gobble at a stake, going south 57 chains & 5 links to a stake, east 11 chains & 5 links to a stake, north 63 chains to a post oak on the corner of Jared Woods, east with his line 20 chains to a stake on the corner of John Daney, north with his line 14 chains & 5 links to a post oak, west 47 chains & 50 links to a stake on the line of John Gobble, south 20 chains to a hickory grub, then east 16 chains to the beginning, for 50 pounds specie, witnessed by John Gobble & John Bailey & proved by the latter in Nov. court of 1794. (This is part of 350 acres sold by The State to ~~the said Henry Roberts on Dec. 20 1791~~); July 13 1796, Henry Roberts, a blacksmith--~~new wife 1796; sold to the Henry Roberts on Dec. 20 1791~~ 150 acres, on the waters of Holmans Creek, beginning on the corner of William Wood & the line of John Daney at a small post oak, going with said line north 19 chains & 50 links to a small black oak on the corner of the original survey, west with the old line of the original survey 26 chains to a post oak on the old line, south 19 chains & 50 links to a stake on the line of William Wood, then east with his line 26 chains to the beginning corner, for 25 pounds specie, witnessed by Jacob Gobble & John Gobble but proved by William Gobble in Nov. court of 1786. (This is part of the 350 acres sold by The State to the said Henry Roberts on Dec 1791.)

Book 13 page 90: Dec. 20 1791, The State grants (#2156 at 10 pounds the 100 acres) to Henry Roberts 350 acres on the waters of Dycas Creek, beginning on the line of John Booth at a stake, going with it south 4 chains to a white oak, east 30 chains to a black oak on the corner of Jarret Wood, with it west 20 chains to a post oak on his corner, south 63 chains to a stake, west 11 chains & 50 links to a stake, north 57 chains & 50 links to a stake on the corner of Jacob Gobble, west 16 chains to a stake, north 17 chains to a stake, then east to the beginning.

Book 32 page 303: Nov. 5, 1834, D.F. Caldwell--no wife signed--let William B. Wood, (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), have 759 acres beginning on the north side of Third Creek at the dividing corner (formerly John & Joseph Youngs), on the line of --- Armstrong--new the corner of M.D. & R.M. Kilpatrick's--16 chains & 25 links east of the line of --- Brandon, & going east with the line of --- Armstrong  $2\frac{1}{2}$  degrees south 16 chains & 25 links to the line of --- Brandon, (now W.B. Woods), south with his line  $4\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 40 chains to a black oak on the corner of Wood, west  $2\frac{1}{2}$  degrees south 26 chains & 50 links to the corner of Wood & --- Irvin, south  $4\frac{1}{2}$  degrees 49 chains & 87 links to the graveyard wall, south with the wall & the church--line 5 degrees east 2 chains & 75 links to the corner of the wall, south 61 degrees east 2 chains & 33 links to a hickory on the corner of the church yard, south 19 degrees east 7 chains & 6 links to a post oak on the corner of the church land, south with the line of Margaret Irvin 30 degrees east 6 chains & 10 links

Book 14 page 388; May 3 1802, Isom Wood--no wife signs--lets Bryant Twonsee? (both yeomen of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 50 acres on the waters of Dycas Creek, beginning on the corner of William Wood at a small post oak on the line of John Dancy, going with his line north 19 chains & 80 links to a small black oak on the corner of the original survey, west with the old line 25 chains to a post oak on his line, then 26 chains to the beginning, for 25 pounds, witnessed by Henry Roberts & John Harwood & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1805. (This is part of a tract of 350 acres which the State sold to Henry Roberts on Dec. 20 1791).

Feb. 1824; Mortgage from John Holmes to John McClelland for 265 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres & 3 chains on Jan.29 1824  
Book 27 page 693; Jan.29 1824, John Holmes of Rowan Co.N.C., mortgages to John McClelland of Salisbury N.C. for \$1600.00 215 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on Crane Creek next James Hughes, James McCulloch & John Clary; also 4 acres & 8 chains next John Clary, & ---McCulloch; also acres on Milky Branch of Grants Creek next James McCulloch, David Nesbit & Betsy Nesbit,--in all 265 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres-- --as he owes \$260.00 "c

Book 10 page 196; Nov. 4 1784, The State grants Adam Helmstutler 400 acres on Beverdam Branch next John Green & John Dancy, being #854.  
Book 12 page 323; Nov. 10 1790, John Green, a planter & wife Hannah, let John Hollis have 100 acres on Beaver Damm Fork of Swearing Creek next Joseph Laning, John Hollis & Adam Helmstetler, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Daniel Hunt & William Hollis & proved by the latter in May 1791. (This was granted by sale from The State to John Green Nov. 4 1780).

Book 22 page 266; On June 28 1811, Benjamin Heathman & wife Polly of Madison Co.Kentucky, let Frederic Waltzer of Rowan Co.N.C., have 258 1/2 acres on the Yadkin River bank next George Reed,---Gobble & said Waltzer on down the river, for \$730.00, witnessed by Elisha Roberts & Phillip Walser & proved by the latter in Aug. 1811.



Benjamin Woods (Both sides of Grants Creek)

Book 7 page 125; July 6 1769, Benjamin Woods--no wife signs--lets Richard Auten (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 201 acres on both sides of Grants Creek, beginning at a pine on the north side of said creek & going west 67 chains to a white oak, south 30 chains to a black oak, east 67 chains to a black oak, then to the beginning, for 40 pounds proclamation money, witnessed by Thomas Auten, Nathan Todd & Jacob Nichols & proved in Aug. court of 1769. (Samuel Woods & wife Sarah let Robert Woods have this by lease & release on Jan. 15-16 1762 & said Robert Woods was a brother of the said Benjamin Woods who got it by heirship).

Book 4 page 655; Jan. 15 1762, Samuel Woods & wife Sarah, let Robert Woods (all of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 201 acres on the head of Grants Creek, beginning on the north side of said creek at a pine, going west 67 chains to a white oak, south 30 chains to a black oak, east 67 chains to a black oak, then to the beginning, for 6 shillings sterling--the release price being 30 pounds on the next day, witnessed by James Dobbin & James McCulloch & recorded in Jan. court of 1762.  
Jan. 20 1762: Lease & release from Samuel Woods & wife Sarah to Robert Woods for --- Jan. 15-16 1762 is proved.

Laura B. Wood

Book 13 page 809; Oct. 11 1794, Henry Roberts, a blacksmith (Messee makes her mark) let William Wood, a yeoman--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 150 acres on Holmans Creek next Jacob Gobble & Jared Woods, for 50 pounds, witnessed by John Gobble & John Bailey & proved by the latter in Nov. 1794. (This is part of 350 acres sold said Roberts by The State on Dec. 20 1791).

Book 21 page 814; July 20 1816, William Wood--no wife signs--lets Enoch (the infant son of the widow, Polly Rice) have 28 1/2 acres on Holmans Creek next Jared Wood & John Davis, out of his love, witnessed by Philip Wolser & Jacob Gobble & proved by the latter in Aug. 1816. (This is part of the 350 acres granted by The State to Henry Roberts, who let the said Wood have this).

Book 23 page 266; Nov. 24 1813, Jacob Goible--no wife signs--lets Michael Swain (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 20 acres on Holemans Creek next Thomas Hartley, for 20 pounds, witnessed by John Cope & John Phillips & proved by the latter in Feb. 1815. (This is part of a State Grant to Daniel Sherwood in 1789).

Book 10 1/2 page 122; June 23 1905, Henderson A. Fisher & wife Annie B. let Laura M. Wood--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have \_\_\_\_\_ on the southeast side of Fulton Street, next C.P. Shuping & parallel with Franklin Street 200 ft for \$850.00.



Daniel Wood (Sandy Creek)

Book 9 page 605; Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#437 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Margaret Geoss or Gross? 420 acres on the bank of Sandy Creek next ---Hull, Joseph Gross, William Wood, lowgrounds of said creek next ---Hull's mill-pond.

Book 10 page 25; Aug. 12 1784, Margaret Goss lets Daniel Wood (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 420 acres on Sandy Creek bank next Joseph Goss, William Wood, crossing said Creek & down the south side of the low-grounds of said creek, next --- Hull, at the head of said Hull's mill-pond & on down the creek, for 22 pounds & 8 shillings, witnessed by Robert Lodein hartly & James Wood & proved by the latter in Nov. 1784.

Book 14 page 42; Jan. 26 1793, Daniel Wood--no wife signs--lets Moses Doty (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on the bank of Sandy Creek, on Stony ridge, next David Lookable; edge of the swamp, for 73 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Oak & Zachariah Harwood, & acknowledged on Feb. 9 1793. (Margaret Goss let said Wood have this on Aug. 12 1784).

Book 14 page 391; Sept. 12 1793, Moses Doty--no wife signs--lets John Baxter (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on the bank of Sandy Creek, on Stony Ledge next David Lookable, edge of the swamp on the south side of the low-grounds of said creek, for 50 pounds, witnessed by John Doty & Baxton Deatherage & proved by the latter in May 1796. (Margaret Goss let Daniel Wood have this on Aug. 26 1784)  
Book 18 page 286; May 7 1798, John Baxter--no wife signs--lets Philip Harmon (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on Sandy Creek next David Luckabell, edge of the swamp & south side of the lowgrounds of said creek, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Charles Baxter & B. Deatherage & proved by the latter in May 1798. (Margaret Goss let Daniel Wood have this Aug. 12 1784, then to Moses Doty on Jan. 26 1793, & then to John Baxter on Sept. 12 1793).

Vinson Wood (Waters of Swearing Creek)

Book 11 page 336; Aug. 9 1787, The State grants (#1488 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Hugh Cunningham 200 acres on the waters of Swearing Creek, beginning on the line of John Rees at a red oak, going south with his line 48 chains to a post oak, east 41 chains & 70 links to a white oak, north 48 chains to a red oak, then west to the beginning.

J.W. Wood

Book 64 page 258; April 18 1884, J.W. Wood & wife Annie I? let John Mowery--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 50 sq. poles next Benjamin Caldwell, Martha Taylor, Joseph Horah & Julius Henderson, for \$250.00, acknowledged on the same day. (This is what George Dickson let the now deceased Alexander Henderson have on June 19 1867 & the said Annie is his only heir-at-law & daughter).



James Woods (Sandy Creek)

Book 10 page 303; June 15 1785, Margaret Goss, a widow, lets the planter, James Woods (both of Rowan Co., N.C.) have 176 acres on the edge of Hull's mill-pond on Sandy Creek, on the north side of the Yadkin River next ---Hull & down said creek, for 22 pounds, witnessed by Rachel Lee & Daniel Hull & proved by the latter in Aug. 1785.

Pain--Wood

Feb. 5 1808: John Pain must pay to Susan Wood for a bastard on her body, 100 pounds. He filed bond or fine of 50 pounds with John Frederick Morrison as security.

James Wood (Sandy Creek)

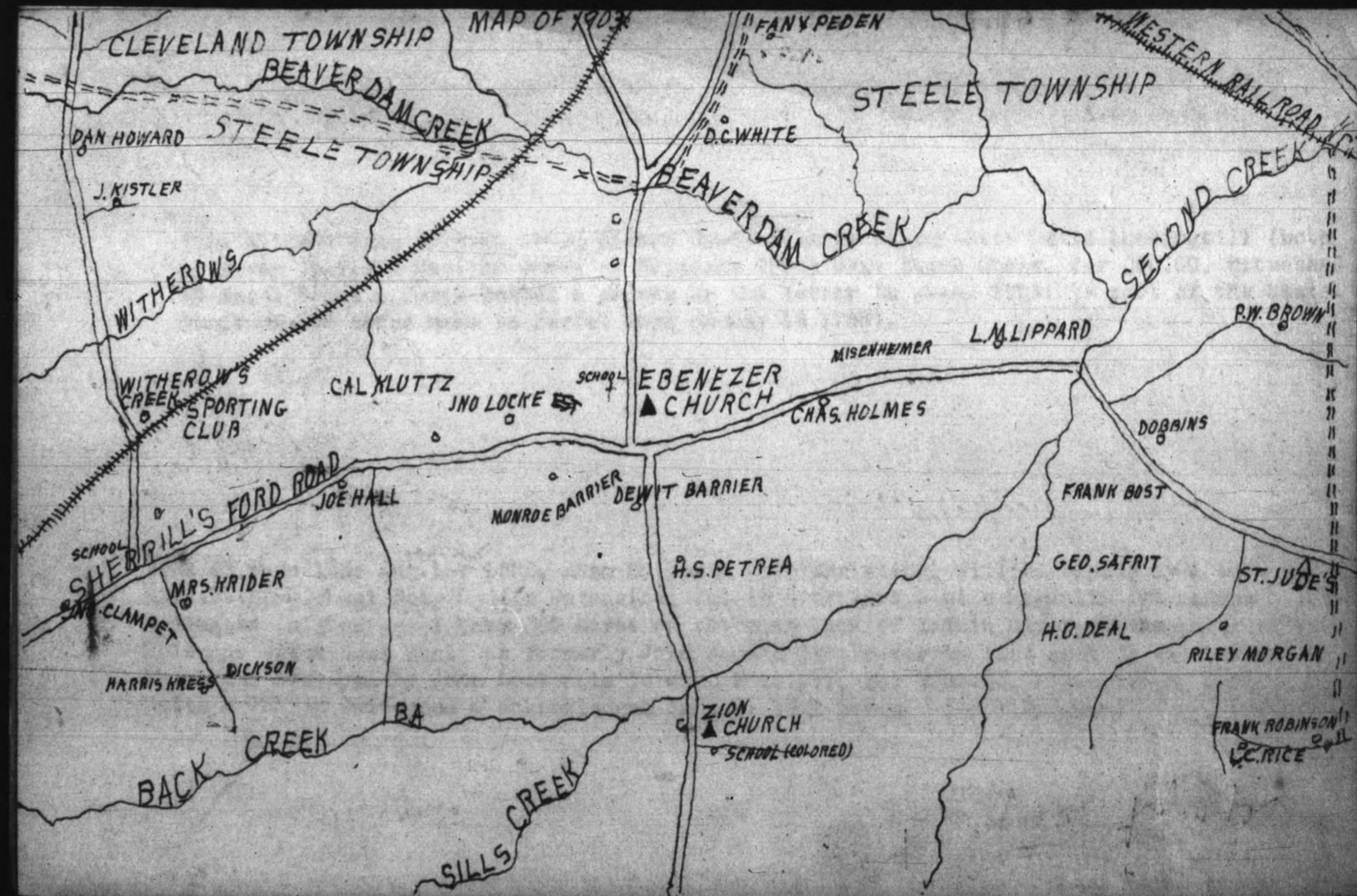
