Book 17 page 685: Oct. 22 1800, Joseph & Esther Gates (as executors of the deceased Edward Gates) let Samuel Smith--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 100 acres next Buckworth Nichols, Esther Gates & Joseph Hall, for 12 shillings, witnessed by  
(This is 2/3 of the land willed by the said deceased, originally granted to Charles Bailey who let Nicholas Gaither have & he let said deceased have).

Book 10 page 219: Nov. 4 1784. The State grants (#715 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Charles Bealey 250 acres on South Yadkin next his other tract & John Dobbins. It begins on the corner of said Bealey's other tract at a post oak, goes north 25 chains to a persimmon saplin, east 35 chains to a hickory, north 9 chains to a post oak, east 48 chains to a pine on the line of John Dobbins, north with his line 9 chains to a post oak, south with his line 34 chains to a pine on the corner of said Bealey, then west with his line 83 chains to the beginning.

Book 10 page 254: Nov. 4 1784. The State grants (#835 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Charles Bealy 317 acres on Beaver Dam Branch waters of South Yadkin, beginning on the line of John Dohin near along his line north 28 chains to a pine, west 83 chains to a post oak, south 35 chains to a post oak, east 15 chains & 50 links to a black oak, south 15 chains to a post oak on the line of James Dickey, then with a conditional line (between said Bealey & James Dickey), to the beginning.

Book 18 page 415 April 27 1802, Joseph Gates--no wife signs--lets Abram Trott (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have two adjoining tracts (one of 193 acres on Bever Dam Branch of South Yadkin River next John Dobbins, James Bailey, John McGinnis, said Bailey's spring branch & James Dickey & the other 250 acres next & above John Dobbins & said Bailey) for \$110.00, witnessed by William Davinport & William Inness & proved by the latter in Nov. 1802. (This is part of 317 acres & all of the 250 acres granted to Charles Bailie in two grants Nov. 4 1784)

Aug. 9 1793: "Ordered that the road called Bate's road from Cyder-creek-bridge in the Forks of Yadkin be discontinued. And Ordered that the following Jury, Ephraim Hampton, Jacob Stallings, Jonas Leatherman, Francis Williams, Fredrick Miller, Jacob White, Isaac Enochs, Isaac Smith William Linville, Michael Smith, William Atcheson and Gabriel Enochs lay off & describe a road the nearest nearest and best way from Cyder-creek-bridge by Hardy Jones, to Fredrick Millers Mill, thence the nighest & best way to the old Moravian road leading by Randolph old court House".

Book 13 page 749: On April 16 1791, Joseph Higdon & wife Margaret, let Nathan Lapp or Sapp (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on Carters Creek at the mouth of a little branch, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Cornelious Weyatt & William Harper & proved by the latter in Nov. 1794. Aug. 9 1777: "Captain William Ransom Davis came into Court and made Oath, that a Certain John Bates committed to the Goal of this County, from the County of Anson on a Charge of petty Larceny, is a Soldier in the Artillery Company in the State Commanded by Col: Roberts, Ordered that sd. Bates be delivered to sd. Davis to be Transmitted to his Regiment"

May 20 1817 (Tuesday): Administration on the estate of deceased John Armsworthy is granted to Samuel Jones, who gave bond of 500 pounds with Benjamin Hinkle & Michael Haines as security. Ordered that Esq. Jilson Berryman, Benjamin Hinkle, James Pelly & George Haines lay off one years provision for the widow & family.

May 12 1787: Deed from James Bates & wife to Michael Smith for 200 acres on Nov. 15 1786 is proved. Bates.

Book 11 page 16: On Nov. 15 1787, James Bates & wife Susannah, let Michael Smith have 200 acres on the waters of Samuel Bryan's mill creek, for 160 pounds, witnessed by Charles Caton, John Dowell & Richard Dowell in May 1787. (This is the same land conveyed to James Bates by George Halbrooks & wife Hannah on Dec. 15 1785).

Feb. 11 1786: Deed from George Holbrook & wife to James Bates for 200 acres Dec. 15 1785 proved by William Bates.

Book 10 page 385: Dec. 15 1785, George Halbrooks & wife Hannah of South Carolina let James Bates of Rowan Co. N.C., have 200 acres on Samuel Bryans Mill Creek for 100 pounds, witnessed by Josiah Wilson & William Bates & proved by the latter in Feb. 1786. (Richard Jacks & wife Mary let said Halbrooks have this on March 14 1785).

Feb. 8 1786: The State vs Geo. Holbrook. Recog in 200 pounds to appear at next court & anser respecting a charge of Bastardy. James Bates & Jno Jacks each 100 pounds. Fine 50/.

Feb. 10 1787: Deed from George Holbrook to Charles Caton for 500 acres Dec. 20 1786 proved by Jesse Caton. Book 10 page 93: Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (#819 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to George Holbrook 500 acres in fork of Yadkin River on the east side of Aquilla Phelps Mill Branch next Philip Dowel & Obadiah Baker.

Aug. 3 1790: "Charles Caton in the room of James Bates" is appointed overseer of the road.

The will of Charles Caton Sr. (Book G page 389) made while in good health on Nov. 2 1814 & probated Nov. term of 1815. Sons: John, Charles, Jesse, George Dent Caton, Benjamin & William. Daughters: Mary Felps, Jemima Hill, Rebecca Ridgeway, Elizabeth Ridgeway & Ann Orrel. Exr: James Orrel. Witnesses: Nathl Peebles, James Douthet, N. Peebles & Alpha Peebles. The will was probably finished on Nov. 4 1814.

Feb. 9 1793: "James Higden from Bates' foard on Yadkin to Cubb Creek James Pelly from Bates' foard to Avington Reeds Vincent Wood from Avington Reeds to Shoaffs" are appointed overseers of the road.

Book 65 page 296: Dec. 16 1881, James C. Yates & wife Lendie E. let Jacob Barger--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 25 acres next Jacob Misenheimer, ---Brown, near the road & ---Deal, for \$130.00, acknowledged on the same day.

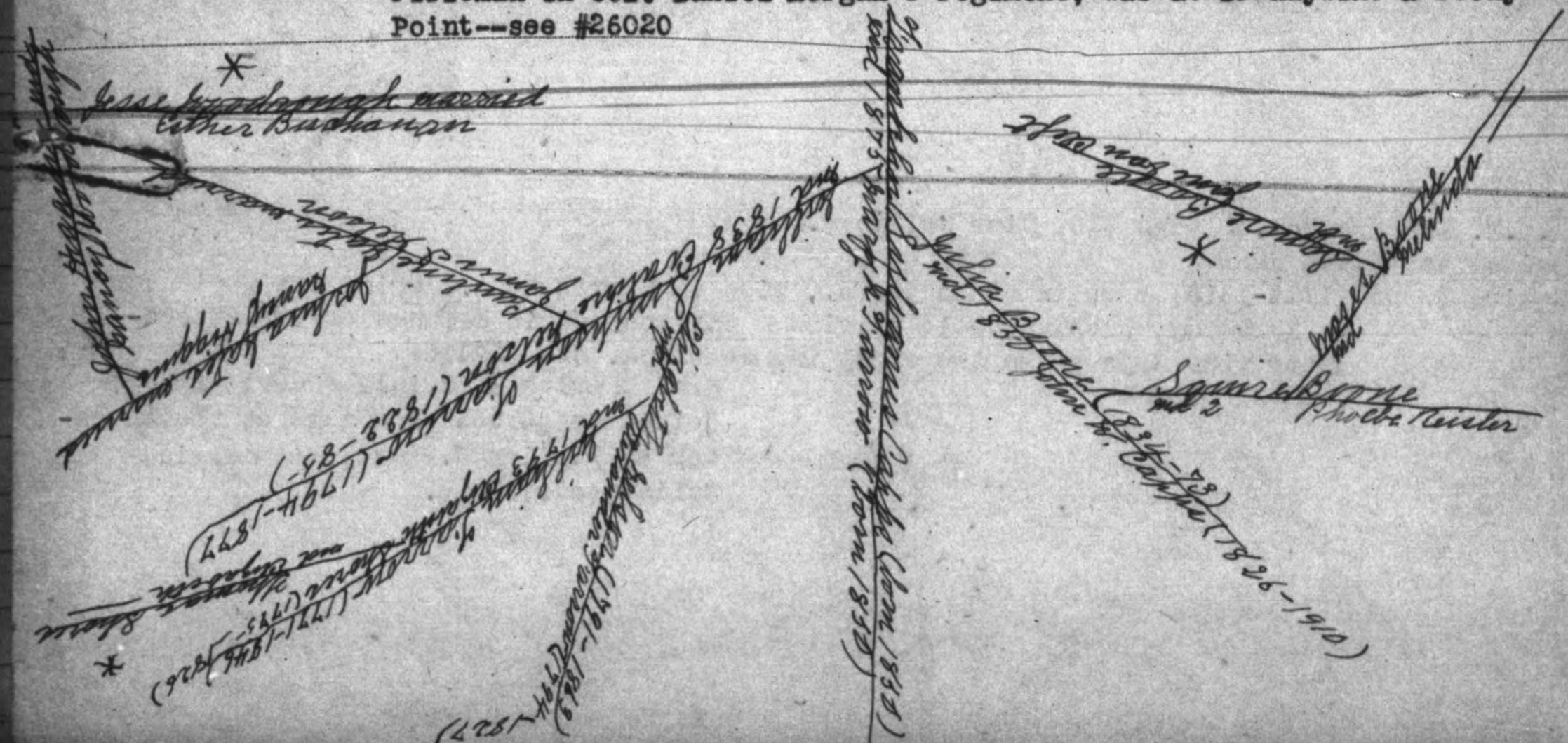
