Book 46 page 56: Sept. 18 1871, A.W. Miller & wife R.S. let Calvin R. Morgan--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 183 acres on Curltail Creek next Jacob Barnhardt, Fisher's bog road, James Troutman, A.W. Miller, ---Linn & the County-line, for \$400.00, witnessed by E. Mauney

Miller (Muddy Creek & Surry County line)

Book 10 page 362: Sept. 28 1785, The State grants (#1064 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Traugott Bagge 436 acres on both sides Muddy Creek below the three forks of said creek & crossing it, beginning at an elm tree in the Surry line & goes west crossing said creek 50 chains to a pine tree, south 44 chains to a stake, west 10 chains to a pine tree, south 36 chains to a pine tree, east crossing said creek 6 chains to the pointers in line of John Miller, north with said Miller 80 chains to the beginning.

Frederick Miller (Abbotts Creek)

Book 16 page 708: Feb. 12 1799, Jacob Huff & wife Lydia let Frederic Miller--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres on Abbotts Creek next Thomas Coyl, Joseph Park, bank of Spring branch & up it on the old line of ---McCrary next --- Lopp (formerly ---Yunker's) & --- Younkers, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Carson & James Carson & acknowledged in Aug. 1799. (This is part of 100 acres bequeathed by Hugh McCrary to his daughter, Lydia who is now the wife of Jacob Huff)

James and Anne Miller (Book 8 page 89) to David Miller Nov. 23 1764, 407 acre land on Buffelow Creek next to Abraham Miller. Witnessed by John Miller and Francis Johnston Jan. 1765.

Michael Miller (w^hoolwright) and wife Obedience (Book 8 page) let Adam Hedrick have 172⁹ acres on South Fork of Abbotts Creek @ April 13 1773, proved in Sept, court 1774.

George Miller (yeoman) in (Book 8 220) out of the love and affection he bears For sons John, Jacob, Frederick and David Miller gives them land on Abbotts Creek. Also gives Glory Lettler negro- & but cannot tell if she is his daughter. (Probably is).

John Miller and Mary his wife (Book 8 page 222) let Robert Lindsay have 326 acres 1774

Frederick Miller (makes his mark) to Inhabitants of Brushy Fork Society of Church and Presbyterians, 11 acres and 27 square feet for 1 pound and 30 shillings Aug. 1 1789. Land adjoins Windle Hinkle, Jacob Houk and Miller's Homestead and plantation. (Book 11 page 747).

Frederick Miller Feb. 1 1786 (Book 10 page 399) gets 400 acres from Henry Hooser for 225 pounds on Brushy Forks and Abbitts Creek. Witnessed by Traugott Bagge and Christian Lash in Feb Court 1786.

Frederick Miller # 809 (Book 10 page 273) (at 50 shillings per 100 acres) 130 acres on Cold Branch, from State

Frederick Miller # 787 (Book 10 page 273) granted by State land on Guilford Road of Brushy Fork and Abbotts Creek

Frederick Miller (Book 11 page 845) on Feb 4 1790 to Capt. Peter Eoks of Penn. for 50 pounds, 230 acres on both side of Brushy Fork of Abbotts Creek next Jacob Long, Matthias Sappingfield Hinkles (grant to Frederick Miller from Jacob Sr. and Jacob Jr. Wagoner).

Book 21 page 447: The land formerly possessed by Frederick Miller in tract #7 next William Stanley & William Delap on Brushey Fork of Abbots Creek & the Yadkin River, crossing Reedy Fork of Abbots Creek, is conveyed to Peter Daniel on Sept. 3 1808 by Christian Lewis Benzien (who was given authority & control of the lands got from William Churton & Charles Metcalf by Frederick Marshall of Stokes Co.N.C. who made his will on Dec. 16 1801 & it was proved in March term of 1802) &c.

Book 17 page 499: Sept. 6 1800, Elizabeth Warlow, a widow; lets Peter Warlow, a planter-- both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 200 acres on Reedy Creek next the old lot,--- Picket, John Wilson & crossing the said creek, for the rents & many other needful things (which I didn't copy), being a State Grant--see book 11 page 538.

Book 18 page 936: On Nov. 28 1803, Jehu Burkett--no wife signs--lets Isaac Hire--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 110 acres on Reedy Creek next Captain Francis Williams & ---Whirlow, for \$160.00, witnessed by William Kirth? & Jonas Leatherman & proved by the latter in Aug. 1804.

Book 22 page 643: On April 1 1811, William Wooseley of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Adam Ader of Franklin Co.Va., have 13 acres on Reedy Creek next Jehu Burkett & Francis Williams, for \$100.00, witnessed by Alexander & Francis Williams & proved by the latter in Feb. 1813. (This is a State Grant to William Wooseley).

(West Branch of Second Creek.

Book 12 page 264: Nov. 25 1790, John Hamton Sr. & wife Hannah, let Martin Miller-- all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 633 acres on the west branch of Second Creek, between Salisbury & Peedee, beginning at the line of Phillip Miller at the center of three black oaks, going west 31 chains & 25 links to a stake, south 12 poles to a post oak, west, crossing the branch, 33 chains & 25 links to a black oak, north, crossing said branch, 104 chains to a white oak, black oak & a hickory, east 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains to a hickory bush, south to the corner of Phillip Miller, then with his line to the beginning, for 7 pounds, witnessed by Frederick Miller & John Rintleman & proved by the latter in Feb. 1791.

Feb. 12 1791: Deed from John Hamton & wife to Martin Miller for 633 acres Nov. 5 1790, proved by Jno. Rintleman.

Book 11 page 258: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1371 at 50 shillings the 100 acres to Michael Miller 154 acres on the north side of Dutch Second Creek next Michael Peler, David Woodson, Michael Hardman Dillow, Jacob Cluts & Windle Miller.

Book 18 page 311: Oct. 24 1801, Esq. Fredrick Miller--no wife signs--lets Henry Miller (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have two contiguous surveys now sold as one, the first is _____ acres on the waters of Muddy Creek, beginning on the corner of Frederic Pacler & line of said Miller at a white oak, going west with said line 30 chains to a post oak, south 33 chains & 40 links to a post oak, east 30 chains to a stone, then north to the beginning (which was granted by The State to Henry Miller on May 18 1789), while the other is 140 acres on both sides of Sparkes Creek, beginning on the south west corner of Frederick Bakle at a post, going north with the line of said Bakle 182 perches, crossing Sparks Creek, to a post between a black haw & a persimmon tree, west 123 perches to a post between two oaks, south crossing said creek again 182 perches to a post on the ridge, then east 122 perches to the beginning, for \$1100.00, witnessed by Britain Jones Heymore & Jacob Clinard & proved by the latter in Feb. 1802. In all this is 240 acres.

Book 17 page 555: Sept. 2 1800, Henry Millar Sr.--no wife signs--lets Esq. Frederick Millar (both of Rowan Co.N.C.), have 140 acres on Sparks Creek next Frederick Bakle & crossing the creek--it being the land which the said Henry Millar Sr. bought of John Millar on Aug. 7 1779

Esq. Frederick Miller (Rich Fork of Abbotts Creek)

Feb. 9 1788: "Mathew Brandon and William Botenhammer Esqrs: qualified as Justices of said County.

May 10 1788: Among the Justices to take the Taxables for 1788: "24 William Botenhammer in Capt. Lopp's Co."

Nov. 10 1787: Among the Justices appointed to take the tax list for 1787: "20 John Monrow in Captain Lopps Co. 18(?)"

Feb. 8 1785: "John Grove in the Room of William Botenhammer" is appointed Constable.

Book 18 page 628: Dec. 27 1801, The State grants (# - William Bodenhamer 48 acres on Rich Fork of Abbotts Creek next Hugh Yokley, ---Ledford, Isaac Payne, John Riddle & James Gordon, (This had been entered on Feb. 10 1798).

Book 19 page 229: Oct. 24 1803, Esq. William Bodenhamer--no wife signs--lets Esq. Frederic Miller (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 48 acres on Ritch Fork of Abbotts Creek next Hugh Yokely. ---Ledford, Isaac Payne, John Riddle & James Gordon, for \$22.00, witnessed by Frederick Raker & Britain J. Haymoore & proved by the latter in May 1805. (The State granted this to the said Bodenhamer).

Esq. Frederick Miller (Abbotts Creek & Tinkers Creek waters)

Book 11 page 335: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1039 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Martin Shikle 614 acres at the head of Tinkers Creek of Abbotts Creek next John Coons, Ralph Picket & Valentine Leonard.

Book 15 page 156: Jan. 1 1790, Martin Shikle of Lincoln Co. N.C. (Christian makes her mark) lets Joseph Greenwood of Rowan Co. N.C., have 614 acres on Tinkers Creek waters of Abbotts Creek next John Coons, Ralph Picket, Valentine Leonard & --- Miller, for 150 pounds, witnessed by Michael Rees & Wheeler Chadwick & proved by the latter in Aug. 1797.

Book 17 page 22: Oct. 19 1797, Joseph Greenwood--no wife signs--lets Edward Parnell (but indexed to Joseph Parnell)--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 49 acres next Valentine Leonard, for 19 pounds, witnessed by John Perriman & Frederick Rake & proved by the latter in May. 1799. (Said Greenwood bought this of Martin Shikle).

Book 16 page 687: Oct. 21 1797, John Thomas of Rockingham Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets Edward Parnold of Rowan Co. N.C., have 51 acres on Abbotts Creek next Frederic Raker, Valentine Leonard & Joseph Greenwood, for 30 pounds, witnessed by John Periman & Joseph Periman & proved by the latter in Aug. 1799.

Book 17 page 50: Aug. 5 1799, Edward Parnell--no wife signs--lets Esq. Frederick Miller (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have two tracts: 49 acres next the old line of said Parnell & Valentine Leonard (which said Parnell bought of Joseph Greenwood) & the adjoining 51 acres (which said Parnell bought of John Thomas of Rockingham Co.) on Abbotts Creek next Frederic Raker & Valentine Leonard, for 50 pounds, witnessed by W. Clayton, Jacob Miller & Brit

Book 19 page 347: Aug. 6 1805, Esq. Frederick Miller of Rowan Co. N.C. lets Daniel Day have 49 acres next Val Leonard on Abbitts Creek (which Joseph Greenwood conveyed to Edward Parnell), also the adjoining 51 acres (which John Thomas of Rockingham Co. N.C. let Edward Parnell have), for \$150.00, witnessed by J.A. Clinard & Britain J. Heymore & proved in Aug. 1805.

Book 16 page 661: July 7 1794, the State grants (#2336 at 10 pounds the 100 acres) to John Thomas 51 acres on Abbotts Creek next Frederick Rake, Valentine Leonard & Joseph Greenwood.

Book 12 page 217: Nov. 27 1789, The State grants (#1657 or 1957 numbered twice at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Frederick Miller 230 acres on both sides side of Brushy Fork next Jacob Long, the land formerly owned by Matthias Sappenfield, --- Hinkle, said Miller & Jacob Long, the land formerly owned by Matthias Sappenfield & goes west 67 chains to a pine, south 11 chains to the line of --- Hinkle, west with said line 5 chains, north 16 chains to a post oak, east 9 chains to a pine, north 30 chains to a black oak on the line of the other lot of the said Miller, east with that line & crossing the said fork 63 chains to a pine, south crossing the said fork with the line of the said Long 35 chains to the beginning.

(This is the tract which was indentured by Frederick Miller of Rowan Co. N.C. to the said Captain Peter Ickes on Feb. 4 1790.)

Samuel Silliman (upon a decree of the Court of Equity to sell the land of deceased Samuel Creson who died intestate in 1819 owning 137 or 157 acres with seven children, &c. was granted in April 1832 & by order of court &c) let Daniel File of _____ have 137 acres on south side of the Yadkin River next John Harkey, Jacob Bruner, ---Rodgers, Michael File & ---Creson, below the mouth of Dutch Second Creek, for \$156.00,

Book 34 page 173: Sept. 24 1839, Daniel File--no wife signs--lets Daniel Miller (both of Rowan Co.
