: Deed from James Robison & wife to Joseph Locker for 347 acres on Feb. 1 1785 proved by Wm. McDaniel. Book 10 page 395: Feb. 1 1785, James Robinson & wife Lucy let Joseph Locker of Rowan Co. N.C. have 347 acres on Bryans Mill Creek next Isaac Enochs, Gabriel Enochs & Jeremiah Melong for 116 pounds, witnessed by Gabriel Enochs & William McDaniel & proved by the latter in Feb. 1786.

Book 9 page 575: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#5615 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to James Robinson 347 acres on Bryants Mill Creek next Isaac Enochs, Gabriel Enochs & Jeremiah Melon.

The will of Joseph Locker (book G page 130) made Dec. 24 1808 & probated. Wife. Daughter Lenny Potts. Granddaughters: Elizabeth & Mary McDaniel. Others: Josiah L. McDaniel (under age, is to have 50 acres in Rowan Co. where John Johnson lives next Daniel Orrell & Benjamin Berryman), also plantation where I live is to be leased out--it adjoins Philip Snyder & Thomas, Lizzy & Joseph Gentle. Exrs: Daniel Orrell & Jelson Berryman. Witnesses: Benjamin Berryman & John Johnson.

Minute Book page 28: The estate of Joseph Locker by the Exrs., Daniel Orrell & Jilson Berryman, May 15 1813.

Nov. 11 1786: Joseph Locker proves deeds from William Arnold to John Hurley for 200 acres Aug. 14 1786 & another to George Gentle for 138 acres on same date

Deed from Gabriel Enochs & wife to Joseph Locker for 118 acres, 2 rods & 28 perches on Dec. 31 1790 proved by Jno. Dowell.

Book 13 page 4: On Dec. 31 1791, Gabriel Enochs & wife Mary, let Joseph Locker (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 118 acres 2 roods & 28 perches on Bryans Mill Creek next James Robison, for 50 pounds, witnessed by William Harper & John Dowell & proved by the latter in Nov. 1792.

Book 23 page 241: Nov. 23 1810, Elizabeth Johnston lets Haly Tatom (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have lot #10 or 25 1/2 acres next the old survey on Samuel Bryans Mill creek, (which was formerly occupied by deceased Joel Johnston & divided into 10 equal parts), for \$50.00, witnessed by Lewis

Book 14 page 399: On Sept. 17 1793, Rachel Johnston & wife Lydia, let Joel Johnston of Rowan Co. N.C., have 272 perches of land on Samuel Bryan's Mill Creek next Joseph Locker, for 372 pounds, witnessed by Stephen Glascock & Joseph Locker & proved in Nov. 1796. (This is part of a tract of 500 acres--refers to page 579 where Isaac Melon let Thomas Melon have land).

Nov. 4 1800: Joel Johnston is made a minor of the estate of John Johnston deceased, giving bond of 2000 pounds, with Isaac Enochs & John Siddin as securities. There seems to have been trouble about the estate--on May 3 1800, the commissioners appointed to divide it are: William White, Jonas Leatherman, John Miles, Esq. John Morrell & T. Joseph Clarke; on May 10 1800 the legal proceedings between Joel & Rachel Johnston are pronounced void while the marriage of John Johnston to Keriah Crowder is pronounced legal. The administration is granted to Joel Johnston on Aug. 9 1800 but no bond then given.

Book 12 page 427: On ----- 1789, George Gentle & wife Mary let Joseph Locker all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 100 acres on waters of Yadkin River next John Johnson, for 35 pounds, witnessed by David Evans & Jones Sparks & proved by latter in Aug. 179-

Aug. 6 1791: Deed from George Gentle & wife to George Locker for 100 acres on --- 1789 proved by Jonas Sparks.

Aug. 6 1791: Deed from William McClure & wife to George Locker for 60 acres on --- 1790 proved by Enoch Enochs.

Book 12 page 24: On ----- 1789, William McClure & wife Rachel, let Joseph Locker have 50<sup>90</sup> acres next John Adams, Jeremiah Melone & George Gentle, for 10 pounds, witnessed by Enoch Enochs, Joseph Turner & Leda Linell? & proved by Enoch Enochs in Aug. 1791. This begins next John Adams at a white oak saplin & goes east 22 chains & 30 links to a black oak saplin on the line of Jeremiah Melone, west with his line 20 degrees east 24 chains to a stake, west 31 chains to a post oak saplin on the line of George Gentle, then south with his line to the beginning.

Nov. 11 1786: Joseph Locker proves deeds: William Arnold to John Hurley for 200 acres Aug. 14 1786 & another from Wm. Arnold to George Gentle for 138 acres on same date.

Book 13 page 654: On Aug. 15 1793, Jerry Malone & wife Bridget let James Adams have 120 acres on Samuel Bryan's Mill Creek next Michael Shaw, Isaac Adams, Daniel Adams, Benjn. Williams & Jesse Noland, for 80 pounds, witnessed by Edward Adams & Benjn. Gay. Proved by the latter in Aug. 1794.

Book 13 page 654: On Aug. 15 1793, Jerry Malone & wife Bridget let James Adams have 120 acres on Samuel Bryan's Mill Creek next Michael Shaw, Isaac Adams, Daniel Adams, Benjn. Williams & Jesse Noland, for 80 pounds, witnessed by Edward Adams & Benjn. Gay. Proved by the latter in Aug. 1794.

Book 22 page 628: On Aug. 3 1812, Daniel Orrell lets the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal "Pleasant Grove Chappel" have 1 1/2 acres on Haines Mill Creek next Joseph Locker, for 20 shillings, witnessed by Benjamin Berryman & Jilson Berryman & proved by the latter in Nov. 1812. (These trustees are Hardy Jones, Charles Caton, Joshua Caton & Daniel Orrell).

Book 22 page 8: Aug. 5 1805, Joseph Locker--no wife signs--lets Benjamin Berryman (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres on the south side of a branch of Bryans Mill Creek next Daniel Orrell, said Berryman, Isaac Knochs & on up the said branch, for \$150.00, witnessed by John Berryman, Jilson Berryman & Richard Johnson & proved by the last named in Aug. 1807.

Book 13 page 170: May 15 1789, The State grants (#270) at 50 shillings the 100 acres to George Gentle 268 acres on Sugar tree Creek next William Allen, John Johnston, William McClure, Jeremiah Malone & Sherick Williams.

Book 10 page 523: Nov. 4 1784, The State grants (#692) at 50 shillings the 100 acres to Jeremiah Malone 300 acres on a small branch of the Yadkin River next Jesse Roland, Stephen Green & Thomas Harmon.

Book 11 page 21: Feb. 5 1787, Jerry Malone--no wife signs--lets Ezekiel Phillips (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 300 acres on a small branch of Yadkin River next Stephen Green, Thomas Harmon & Jesse Roland, for 150 pounds, witnessed by John McCarty, Elijah Phillips & Edward Grimes & registered on July 24 1787.

Book 27 page 657: On Oct. 17 1817, Ezekiel, James & Mary Philips, let Samuel Smith (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 195 1/2 acres on waters of Jacob Black's Mill-creek between James & Malon Philips next Samuel Smith, James Etcheson & Edward Sylva, for \$130.00, witnessed by Federick Miller, William & James Etcheson & proved by the last named in Aug. 1813. (This is part of a State Grant of 300 acres to Jeremiah Malone on Nov. 4 1784--see book 10 page 523--which he let Ezekiel Philips have on Feb. 5 1787, who died & it fell to his only heir-at-law, Elijah Philips).

Book 30 page 600: Feb. 28 1829, Samuel Luckey, 's.' (which probably means blacksmith)--no wife signs--lets John Turner (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 162 acres on waters of Beaver Dam Creek next William Renshaw & William Smith, for \$500.00, witnessed by Wilson Turner & Thomas Innes & proved in May 1829. (This is parts of two tracts both of which had belonged to William Cook, who got one from William Smith & the other from Samuel Smith & wife, then let Daniel Wood have them, who let Thomas Meck have them, who let said Samuel Luckey have them)

Book 34 page 186: April 18 1839, Anna Lewis, Wilson Turner, Samuel Turner, Joseph Turner, Joseph Leppard, Drusilla Leppard, Zachariah Tomason, Aitty Tomason, Jesse Marlin, Mary Marlin, Hezekiah Turner, Eleanor Turner, Zephaniah Turner & Nancy Turner--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--and Wilson Heleman & Elizabeth Heleman of David Co. N.C., let John Turner Jr. of Rowan Co. N.C., have 162 acres on the south side of the dam of Beaver Dam Creek next William Renshaw & William Smith going up Beaver Dam Branch, for \$648.00, acknowledged before sq. Rebt. N. Fleming in May 1839. (This was in two tracts formerly conveyed to William Cook--one by William & Samuel Smith & the other by Samuel Smith & wife--said Cook let Daniel Wood have them who let Thomas Meck have them & he let Samuel Luckey have them).

Book 20 page 469: Aug. 28 1812, William Cook--no wife signs--lets Daniel Wood (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 162 acres on Beaver Dam Creek next the original grant, for \$400.00, witnessed by William Renshaw & John Andrews & proved by the latter in Feb. 1815. (This is the tract which Samuel Smith & William Smith let William Cooke have--see Book 17 page 720 for deed from William Smith & Book 16 page 623 for deed from Samuel Smith & wife).

Book 17 page 720: June -- 1801, Samuel Smith & William Smith--no wives sign--let William Cook have 68 acres on north side of Beaverdam Branch next the original corner & William Renshaw, for 132 pounds, witnessed by Samuel Hall & William Renshaw & proved by the latter in Aug. 1801. (This is part of 100 acres surveyed for Samuel & William Smith)

Book 16 page 623: March 15 1799, Samuel Smith & wife Dorothy let William Cook--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 106 acres on south bank of Beaver Dam Branch going down it to William Smith's for 100 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Prather & Francis Neely & proved by the latter in May 1799. (This is part of the land which Earl Granville granted to James Martin who let David Caldwell have, who let James Smith have & he & son James Smith willed to said Samuel Smith)

Book 17 page 113: Nov. 4 1801, James Cook--no wife signs--lets Daniel Luckie (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 106 acres on Beaver Dam Creek next the original (which is the two tracts: one from Samuel & William Smith to William Cooke & the other from Samuel Smith & wife to said William Cooke) for \$300.00,

Book 25 page 119: July 15 1817, Daniel Wood--no wife signs--lets James Lock (both of Rowan) have 106 acres on south bank of Beaver Dam Branch next the original grant on the north corner which connects the two grants next William Renshaw & W. Smith, for \$300.00, witnessed & proved by Phillip Phillips in May 1819. (William Cook got these of Samuel & Wm Smith & of Samuel Smith & wife).

Book 8 page 196: Dec. 23 1773, David Caldwell & wife Rebecca let James Smith have 226 acres on Beaver Dam Branch waters of South fork of Yadin (where said Smith now lives) for 5 shillings--the release price being --witnessed by James Debbins & William Debbins & proved in Aug. 1774. (This is part of the 480 acres which Earl Granville sold to James Martin on Aug. 6 1762 & he with wife Jane let David Caldwell have on Feb. 16 1769).

Aug. 5 1774: Lease & release from David Caldwell & wife Rebecca to James Smith for 226 acres Dec. 23 1773 proved by James Debbins.

: Deed from James Martin & wife to David Caldwell for 480 acres Feb. 1769 is acknowledged.

Book 7 page 74: Feb. 16 1769, James Martin, a planter, & wife Jane let David Caldwell--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 480 acres on Beaver Dam Branch of the South Yadin River next James Debbin on the lower side, for 100 pounds, witnessed by John Carruth & John Braly & proved in Feb. 1769. (Earl Granville sold this to James Martin on Aug. 10? 1762)

Book 11 page 106: Oct. 25 1765, The State grants (#1108 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to George Brandon 120 acres on the South Yadin River, beginning on the bank of said river at a sycamore tree, going north 57 chains to a black gum on the bank of Hunting Creek on the line of John Van Etton, west 22 chains to a pine on the corner of Joshua Nelson, south 22 chains to a Spanish oak on the river bank, then with its various courses to the beginning.

Book 20 page 480: May 25 1815, John Little & wife of Iredell Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets John Luckey of Rowan Co. N.C., have 173 acres on waters of Little Beaver Dam, a branch of South Yadkin River next William Renshaw on north end of Beaver Dam, for -----, witnessed by William Luckie & John Andrews & proved by the latter in Aug. 1 17.

Book 10 page 289: Nov. 1 1781. The State grants (#745 21) the 100 acres to John Graham 718 acres on both sides Hunting Creek next James Andrews, John McGuire, George Brandon & Brice Gaither.

Book 11 page 496: Oct. 12 1785, John Graham, a wheelwright, & wife Margaret let George Brandon, a farmer--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 718 acres on both sides Hunting Creek next James Andrews, John McGuire, George Brandon & Brice Gaither, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Benjamin Graham, James Davis, Abraham Brandon & John Brandon & proved by the last named in Aug. 1788. (The State granted this to John Graham on Nov. 4 1781).

Book 18 page 274: Dec. 11 1801. John Little Sr. gives the above to his son, Samuel, & says John Little bought it of Basil Gaither, the trustee of deceased Mary Brandon & of her executor).

The will of John Little (book H page 49) made while in a "state of infirmity" on Feb. 26 1819 & probated in May 1820. Sons: Samuel (younger age) & John Jr. Daughters: Sally Deposter Elizabeth Iiams, Agnes Luckey & Mary Beore. Exrs: Samuel Little & Beal Iiams. Witness: Robt Penry.

The will of Mary Brandon (book D page 161) made while 'very weak of body' on May 8 1797. Daughters: Jinnet Lukey, Isael Hendrix & Mary Glascock. Sons: Robert Luckey (5 pounds), James Luckey & George Luckey. Two years side rental is due by John Johnson on a plantation, which must be sold. The other plantation on east side Hunting Creek. Exr: son Henry Hendrix. Witnesses: Margaret Hendrix & Basil Gaither Jr.

Nov. 7 1798: The will of Mary Brandon is proved by Basil Gaither. The executor, Henry Hendrix, qualified.

Book 11 page 239: Aug. 9 1787, The State grants (#1532 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Benjamin Gaither 303 acres on Hunting Creek & Bear Creek next Robert Luckey, John Bryan Sr William Williams, Daniel Sutherland, Thomas Penery, Ralph Vanleave, Valentine Huff & Benjamin Gaither.

Book 11 page 258: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1188 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Robert Luckey 640 acres on Hunting Creek & Bear Creek next John Bryan, Thomas Penry & Samuel Reed.

Book 15 page 196: Aug. 5 1797, Esq. John Little & wife Belleney let Beal Iiams--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 200 acres on Bear Creek & a branch, for 100 pounds, witnessed by William Howard & Basil Gaither & proved by the latter in Aug. 1797. (This is part of the grant to deceased Robert Luckey).

Marriage bond: John Little to Bellany Erwin Oct. 1 1768 William Erwin writes his consent.

Book 13 page 351: Dec. 9 1793, Isaac Jones & Thomas Penery (as executors of the will of deceased John Luckey) let John Little--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 640 acres on Hunting Creek & Bear Creek next John Bryan, Thomas Penery & Samuel Reed, for 297 pounds, 1 shilling & 11 pence, witnessed by Jeremiah Jacob, Richard Leach & James Leach & acknowledged in Feb. 1795.

The will of John Little (book H page 49) made while "in a state of infirmity" on Feb. 26 1819 & probated in May 1820. Sons: Samuel (to have the negro named Elisha who must be freed when of age on Aug. 30 1834) & John Jr. (\$5.00) Daughters: Sally Deposter (to have a negro named Charlotte who must be freed in Oct. 1833 when 18 yrs. old), Elizabeth Iiams, Agnes Luckey & Mary Beore (?). The negro, Lydy & her child must be freed. Exrs: Samuel Little & Beal Iiams. Witness Robert Penry.

Book A page 249 of Division of Estates: April 17 1822, the estate of deceased John Little is surveyed by John Little (D.S.) & divided by the commissioners (Chs. Anderson Sr., Benjamin Bean, James Glascock, D. McGuire & Jacob Nichols) & returned to May court 1822. Lot #1 (38 3/4 acres next William Iiams & Stevenson Nicholas & Beal Iiams) goes to Nancy Luckey; lot #2 (30 acres next Stevenson Nicholas) goes to Elizabeth Iiams;

Book 18 page 77: Nov. 3 1801, Thomas Cooper--no wife signs--lets Alexander Lowrance (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 62 1/2 acres on north side of Jack Creek next John Haggins, David Cooper, said Cooper & Alexander Long, for \$172.00, witnessed by Richard Locke & James Locke & acknowledged in Nov. 1801. (This is part of the 686 acres granted James Haggins who transferred it to William McKnight, who let Robert Luckey have it, who let Samuel Miller Sr. have it, his heir & executor, Samuel Miller Jr., let Samuel Cooper have it, he devised it to William Cooper, he exchanged for other land & devised it to Thomas Cooper).

July 20 1768: Lease & release from William McNight to Robert Luckey for 680? acres Fe. 5-6 1760 proved by Esq. John Karr.  
Jan. 13 1768: Lease & release from Robert Luckey & wife to Samuel Miller for 686 acres Jan. 7-8 1768 proved by Thomas Miller.  
Book 6 page 528: Jan. 7 1768, Robert Luckie & wife Mary let Samuel Miller (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 686 acres on north fork of Grants Creek next John Long, Daniel McFeeter, Fergus Graham & crossing the creek, next Archibald Wason & John Hagan, for 5 shillings--the release price being 105 pounds on the next day--witnessed by William Luckie & Thomas Miller & proved in Jan. 1768. (Earl Granville sold this to William McKnight on Fe. 22 1759 he afterwards confirmed it by lease & release to said Robert Luckie)

: Deed from Samuel Miller to Samuel Cooper for 686 acres Aug. 1 1777 is acknowledged.  
The will of Samuel Miller (Book A page 91) made while in good health on Sept. 1770 & probated in 1772. Wife Jane. Sons: Samuel (the homeplace of 322 1/2 acres & the 686 acres bought of Robert Luckie) & Thomas (both are executors of will). Daughter Agnes Cooper. Son-in-law Samuel Cooper (the land bought of Robert Luckie). Grandsons: Samuel Miller, Samuel & Thomas Cooper. Witnesses: James Carruth, James McGown & John Draly.

Book 25 page 402: Aug. 22 1816, Samuel Anderson--no wife signs--lets Samuel Vaneter (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 144 acres on north bank of fourth creek on corner of John Hall's original tract, spring-branch of Isaac Anderson Sr. & Daniel Wood, for \$1800.00, witnessed by Jeremiah Roan, son & Wm.F. Anderson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1819. (part land which was granted Robert Tate Jan. 29 1755 &

John Luckie let Isaac Anderson Sr. have it).

AUG. 10 1782: "Cap. Will. Bell for his Company in the Room of James McPheeters" is to collect the taxes.

May 7 1785: Colonel James Brandon is the Justice in Capt. W. Bell's company.

May 7 1785: "Willis Bell Esq. qualified as a Justice of the peace agreeable to his Commission, by taking the several Oaths prescribed by Law for the qualification of public Officers and the oath of Office"

May 7 1785: "Wm. William Bell is the Justice in the companies of Captains: Boon, Howard & Hunt.

buried in first Presbyterian Churchyard of Statesville: Patrick Hughy who died Aug. 19 1794 age 52 years;

Book 11 page 748: On July 31 1789, Patrick Hughy & wife Ann, let John McGuire have 216 acres on little Creek next John Brandon's line, for 50 pounds witnessed by John Brevard & Francis Neely in Aug. term of 1789 & proved by John Brevard. (This is part of a tract granted by The State to Patrick Hughy and refers to page 722 where Jacob Nichols lets Lydia Gaither have land).

Book 15 page 44: On April 7 1797, Dr. John Hall & wife Sarah, give to Joseph Hall, a planter, (for 5 pounds on Nov. 22 1793) 51 acres on Beaverdam Branch of South Yadkin next Robert Tate's old corner & Samuel Luckey, witnessed by William Lowry & Daniel Jackson & proved in May 1797. (This is part of a large tract granted to John on Nov. 12 1795)

Book 14 page 643 or 743 (numbered twice): Nov. 12 1795, The State grants #2449 to John Hall 580 acres on north bank Fourth Creek next John Luckie, Robert Johnston & the old line of Robert Tate.

The will of Samuel Luckie (Book E page 132) made May 31 1797 probated Wife Anne. Sons: Robert & Samuel (the youngest). Granddaughter Peggy. Dars: sons Robert & Samuel. Witnesses: John Hall, William Luckie Jr. & Robert Luckie.

The will of Samuel Luckey (Book F page 136) made Jan. 2 1801 probated Sons: John (land west of Hunting Creek). Daughters: Eleonor McGuire, Ann & Mary Luckey. Grand daughter: Anne Renshaw. Exec: son Samuel & son-in-law James McGuire. Witnesses: John Evans, Thomas Boone(?) & Samuel McNeely.

Book 16 page 236: On Feb. 19 1798, Benjamin Boon & wife Mary of Iredell Co. N.C., let James Johnseay have 300 acres in Rowan Co. on Hunting Creek next Thomas Penry & Jane Black, for 62 pounds, witnessed by Francis Neely & James Cook & proved in May 1798. (This is part of two tracts granted to John Slaven by The State on Nov. 4 1784).

Marriage bond: Samuel Luckey to Rebecca Neely Nov. 12 1822 signed Enoch Leach.

The will of Samuel Luckey (Book K page 374) made Feb. 28 1866 probated in May 1866. Present wife Rebecca (the home & outhouses on the north side of Nail's branch including 2 acres exchanged with William A. Luckey Jr.). Her children are the following legatees. Son James (now under age, to let his sister Catharine live with him if needful). Two children of dead daughter Rebecca Camaline. (This is part of a larger tract granted said Samuel Luckie on July 19 1758).

Book 22 page 767 or 867 (numbered twice): May 24 1808, Richard Luckey of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets James Morrow of Iredell Co. N.C., have 152 acres on both sides Fourth Creek next Henry Guffy & Thomas Dickey, for 450 pounds, witnessed by David Caldwell, John Caldwell, John Brian, William Risher & James Orten & proved by the last named in Aug. 1813. (This had been granted by The State to Joseph Luckey who willed it to his son, Richard Luckey who let John Guffy have it & he let the said Luckey have it).

Book 27 page 203: March 30 1821, James Morrow--no wife signs--lets James Luckie (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 152 acres on both banks of Fourth Creek next Henry Guffy & Thomas Dickey, for \$550.00, witnessed by Samuel Luckey Sr. & Samuel Luckey J.S. & proved by one of them in Aug. 1822. (This is part of a State Grant made to the now deceased Joseph Luckie who willed it to his son Richard Luckie, who let John Guffy have it & he let said Richard Luckie have it back again).





Mary Luckie of Rowan Co N.C. & Georgia.

"KNOX, SAMUEL (Dad). 1780. At Battle of Ramsour's Mill, under Capt. Dickson and Colonel Francis Locke, below Charlotte three months after Camden (Aug. 1780). Scouted British movements in Charlotte two weeks. At Colson's engagement.

Served under Capt. Thomas Cowan and Colonel Davie five months.

Was engaged in attempting to prevent Cornwallis from crossing Catawba when Gen. Davidson was killed. From Hawfield sent with message to General Greene and met the army at a suitable distance on east side of Dan River. Then returned to Hawfield with message from General Greene to Captain Dickson, which express the General had placed in the saddle pad. Furnished own horse.

Saw service as militia militiaman, held commission as Lt. 2d Batt. under Capt. Thomas Cowan, given at Belmont, May 15, 1782, and signed by Pleasant Henderson.

Born Hanover County, Pennsylvania, 1747. Married Mary Luckie, in Rowan County in 1774. Died Mar. 10, 1833 in Jackson County, Georgia, having moved there from Wilkes County, where he had, in his early years, erected a fort for protection against the Indians, known as Knox Fort. He removed from Rowan County to Wilkes County, Georgia, in 1786, after disposing of his land in Rowan County. He was a son of John and Jean (Gracy) Knox." (Page 59 of "Catawba Frontier 1775-1781" Memories of Pensioners, copyrighted & published in 1950 by the compiler, Mary Elinor Layenby of 2333 Nebraska Ave., Washington, D.C.)

Hugh Lucky of Pennsylvania North Carolina & Georgia

"LUCKY, HUGH 1776. In company of Captain Baldridge of Lincoln County. He went on tour as ranger under Captain Lofton and General Rutherford.

1780. He went from Lincoln County to Ramsour's Mill but the battle was over when he arrived. To South Carolina under General Graham.

1781. He went with General Rutherford to Wilmington.

Hugh Lucky was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, in 1763, and was living in Lafayette County, Tenn., in 1832 when he applied for his pension. Isaac Lucky was the administrator of his estate, 1845." (Page 71 of "Catawba Frontier 1775-1781" Memories of Pensioners" by Mary Elinor Layenby, printed & copyrighted in 1950 at 2333 Nebraska Ave., Washington, D.C.)

William Lucket of North Carolina.

"LUCKEY, WILLIAM 1780. Drafted in Capt. John Sloan's company. In Charleston three months immediately preceding its capture (May 12, 1780).

"Volunteered in rifle company of Capt. Thomas Cowan, Col. William R. Davie, and served three months as minute man. at Battle of Ramscur's Mill.

"1781. Immediately before Battle of Guilford Court House (Mar. 15, 1781) he had smallpox and was removed from camp. James Graham and Benjamin Knox testified that they served with him part of this time mentioned.

"Born in Rowan County about 1757." (Page 72, of "Catawba Frontier 1775-1781 memoirs of Pensioners" printed, compiled & copyrighted in 1957, by Dr. Elinor Lazenby)

N.C.--have 33 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres next Ephraim Overcash, Stanhope Shul- enberger, ---Menius & south bank of the creek; also 4 acres & 25 poles next ---Overcash, & F.N. Luckey, for \$338.00, acknowledged on the same day.
