Fisher & George Smith & proved by the latter in Nov. 1813. (This is the land of deceased Peter Lense where he lived & died).

Book 12 page 380: June 5 178 Christian Eller (as executor of deceased Jacob Eller) lets Adam Trees, a planter--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 160 acres on south bank of Yadkin River next George Lambley, for 145 pounds, witnessed by two foreigners, & acknowledged in Feb. 1791. (This is part of 320 acres which Esq. Henry McCollough let said deceased Jacob Eller have, who later let Michael Murr have, he let George Lambley have, & said Murr in two separate deeds, let said deceased Jacob Eller have June 2 1767).

Book 15 page 173: Aug. 8 1797, Esq. Nathan Chaffin, as high-sheriff of the county of Rowan, lets Jacob Eller have ^{of Rowan Co. N.C.} (on execution against Adam Tries for 45 pounds, 10 shillings & 11 pence recovered by Frederick Fisher, with orders for land to be sold, which was done Feb. 19 1796) 160 acres next George Lemly on the Yadkin River, for 55 pounds & 10 shillings, acknowledged in Aug. 1797. It begins on the bank of the said river at a black oak, goes south with the line of George Lemly 53 degrees west 268 poles to a black oak, north 233 poles to a stake, east to a locust on the river bank, then down its meanders to the beginning

German) in May 1790. (This is part of the State Grant of 262 acres to said John Lance on July 11 1788).

Book 11 page 853: July 11 1788, The State grants (#1695 at 10 pounds the 100 acres) to John Lence 262 acres in fork of Crane Creek near a swamp. next David Craige, Andrew Brown,---Montgomery, Lewis Kaler & George Frailey.

(This had belonged to Peter Lance when he died).

Feb. 8 1803: William Trees is appointed guardian of Phillip, Susan & Sophy Lentz & gave bond of 300 pounds with Jacob Lyarly.

Book 20 page 371: Oct. 26 1813, William Trees--no wife signs--lets Gasper Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 104 acres on both sides of South Fork of Crane Creek, beginning in the fork near a swamp, next David Craig Henry Fight, Peter Arey, Henry Moyer & George Frailey, for 250 pounds, witnessed by J.A. Fisher & George Smith & proved by (OVER)

N.C.), his attorney to sell 300 acres upon which John Shoeman now lives, next George Earnhard on the south side & of Jacob Lyerly on the north side, witnessed by Joseph McPherson & Robert Linn & proved by the latter in Feb. 1788.

Book 12 page 176: March 15 1790, Adam Fries or Tries (signed by two Germans) lets John Showman--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 299 acres on Dutch Second Creek, beginning next George Earnhart Sr. & Jacob Lyele, for 200 pounds, witnessed by ? & Peter Lyele & acknowledged in Nov. 1799. It begins on the corner of George Earnhart Sr. & the line of Jacob Lyerle, going north with his line 22 chains & 50 links to the corner of Lyerle, in all 57 chains & 30 links to a post oak east 52 chains & 32 links to a white oak, south 57 chains & 32 links to a stake on the old line of said Earnhart, then with the same to the beginning.

Book 14 page 470 or 570 (numbered twice): April 1 1796, Michael Treece--no wife signs-- lets John Yeost Ketts (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 103 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres on Dutch Second Creek next ---Sheoman, ---Brougher, John Kessler, said Ketts & ---Eller, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Elihu Van Pool & John Airy & proven by the latter in Aug. 1796. It begins at a stake on the corner of ---Sheoman & ---Brougher & goes west 20 chains & 50 links to a black Jack saplin on the corner of John Kessler, north with his line 36 chains & 66 links to a small post oak on the corner of said Ketts, north 10 chains & 75 links to a Spanish oak on the corner of ---Eller, east 36 chains & 50 links to a post oak, then south to the beginning.

Book 27 page 410: Sept. 4 1820, Elizabeth Treize? appoints John Klutz her attorney to collect what the last Aug. term of court allowed her for bastardy, being \$48.00, to be collected by Windle Klutz, witnessed by John Lentz & Jacob Lentz & proved by the latter in Feb. 1823.

May 12 1792: "A Paper purporting to be the last Will & Testament of Jacob Freez deceased was offered for probate, and on examination the Evidences refused to make Oath of the sanity of the Testators mind when the said paper was executed, the same was therefore rejected. On Motion Ordered that administration on the personal Estate of Jacob Freez deceased issue to Peter Freez jur & to Matthew Brandon, on the relinquishment of the Widow having been made appear who qualified & gave bond with Peter Freez Sr & John Lyteker Securities in 500".

Aug. 7 1792: "Samuel Freeze Orphan of Jacob Freeze deceased, being of lawful age, came into open Court and elected John Freeze his Guardian who gave bond with Peter Freeze Security in the Sum of 200" "Annalez Freeze, being of lawful age, came into court and chooses Rudolph Seekler her Guardian, who gave bond with Fredrick Seekler Security in 80..0"

Aug. 11 1792: "John Freeze Orphan of Jacob Freeze deceased being of lawful age, chose John Freeze senr his Guardian who gave bond with Peter Freeze Security in 100"

Book 24 page 568: April 2 1818, Benjamin Fry--no wife signs--lets Michael Hues (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 100 acres on the waters of Uary next James Hues, Bryant Fry & Jerry Pery, beginning at a post oak saplin on the north, south & east lines of a 155⁺ acre tract & going south 3 chains & 20 links to a black oak on the old corner of a 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre tract, east with the old line 17 chains & 50 links to a post oak, west to a dogwood in the original line, north 4 degrees west 15 chains & 80 links to a stone pile on the corner of Bryant Fry in the old field, south 40 degrees west 15 chains to a post oak, west to a black oak on Pery's corner, south 65 degrees west 21 chains with the line of Pery to a red oak bush on the corner of James Hues said line, then east with a new line of James Hues to the beginning, for \$200.00

Book 33 page 542: Aug. 20 1838, Aaron Freeze & wife Katharine of Cabarrus Co.N.C., let Henry Stirewalt of Rowan Co.N.C., have 103 acres on Grants Creek, beginning on the original corner, next Philip Litaker, crossing said creek, next Mrs. Trotter (now ---Polk's), Peter Peninger, edge of a swamp, for \$325.00

Book 41 page 588: Dec.16 1852, John Freeze--no wife signs--lets Daniel Lipe (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres next Caleb Smith, for \$227.25, witnessed by Alexander Lipe & Simon P.Lipe & acknowledged in May 1859.

Book 38 page 328: June 2 1840, John Freeze Sr.--no wife signs--lets John Freeze Jr. (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 60 acres on Grants Creek next Barbara Freeze & Abraham Seckler, for \$300.00, witnessed by W.Bostian & Henry Freeze & proved by the latter in Aug. 1848.

Book 38 page 283: June 2 1840, John Freeze Sr.--no wife signs--lets Henry Freeze (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 60 acres on Grants Creek next a field, John Freeze & a branch, for \$300.00, witnessed by Jacob W.Bostian & John Freeze & proved by the latter in May 1848.

Martin Sheets (Carters Creek in the forks of the Yadkin River)

Book 9 page 515: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#518 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Thomas Monrow 528 acres on Carters Creek, beginning at a hickory grub going south 45 chains to a black oak on the line of William Holebrook, east with his line 17 chains to a hickory saplin on the corner of said Holebrooks, south with his line 7 chains to a white oak grub on his corner, east with his line 62 chains to a persimmon on the corner of George Holebrook, north with his line 32 chains to a stake on his corner, east with his line 39 chains to a stake on his corner, south with his line 40 degrees east 15 chains to a black oak, north 54 chains to a post oak, west 37 chains to a black oak on the line of John Johnston, south with his line 23 chains to a black oak on his corner, then west with his line to the beginning.

Book 14 page 654 or 754: Jan.18 1797, Jacob Houck (a German " no wife signs) let Samuel Freeze--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 106 acres on Grants Creek next John Hileman, James McCulloh, George Savitz Jr., for 100 pounds, witnessed by Hu Braly & John Braly & proved by the latter in Feb. 1797. (This is part of 50 acres which Griffith Rutherford let the now deceased Jacob Freeze have & part of the 200 acres granted by The State to the said deceased).

Book 14 page 655 or 755: Jan. 18 1797, Jacob Houck (a German & no wife signs) let Samuel Freeze--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 96 acres including the improvements, next James McCulloh, Peter Freeze by the mill race, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Hu Braly & John Braly & proved by the latter in Feb. 1797. (This is part of the saw-mill tract which the heirs of deceased Jacob Freeze let said Houck have).

Book 14 page 653 or 753: Jan.18 1797, David Houck (a German & no wife signs) lets Peter Freeze--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 125 acres on Grants Creek next James McCulloh, George Savits & John Freeze for 100 pounds, witnessed by Hu Braly & John Braly & proved by the latter in Feb. 1797.

Book 14 page 651 or 751 (numbered twice): Jan.18 1797, David Houk (a German & no wife signs) lets John Freeze have 58 acres next Peter Freeze, in a swamp, James McCulloh, down the north side of the sam-mill dam, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Hu Braly & John Braly & proven by the latter in Feb. 1797. (This is part of the 305 acres which the heirs of deceased Jacob Freeze let the said Houk have).

Jacob Freeze (Grants Creek)

Book 11 page 147; Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1128 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Jacob Freeze 200 acres on the waters of Grants Creek, beginning at a black oak, going north 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains to a white oak on the corner of James McCulloch & Jacob Freeze, west with the line of Freeze 45 chains to a post oak, south 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains to a black ---, then east to the beginning.

Book 14 page 650 or 750 (numbered twice); Jan. 18 1797, David Houck (a German & no wife signs) lets John Freeze Sr.--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres on Grants Creek next James McCulloch, the old line & Peter Freeze, for 19 pounds, witnessed by Hu Braly & John Braly & proven by the latter in Feb. 1797. (This is part of the 200 acres granted by The State to Deceased Jacob Freeze, whose heirs let David Houck have this)

Book 77 page 28; Dec. 19 1892, Thomas P. Johnston as the trustee of Junius B. Sheets & wife L.M. let W.W. Reid--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 164 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres next George H. Gheen, ---Overman, crossing Dales Creek twice, Lewis Jacobs, Andrew Shuping & ---Kincaid; also 110 $\frac{1}{2}$ (being lot #1 in tract of Thomas Gheen) but does not include the acre conveyed to the school-house, on Deals Creek, for \$700.00, acknowledged on the next day. (This is part of the land which Obadiah Woodson let J.B. Sheets have--see book 48 page 630--& was mortgaged by said Sheets on Oct. 24 1885 to the said Johnston--see book 2 page 448).

Book 48 page 65; July 6 1872, William E. Dunham & wife Susan A., let Junius B. Sheets--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 164 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres next George H. Gheen, lot #1, ---Overman, Louis Jacobs, crossing Dales Creek & Andrew Shuping, for \$600.00, acknowledged on the same day.

Book 48 page 63; Nov. 8 1871, Obadiah Woodson & wife A. Maria let J.B. Sheets--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 110 acres (being lot #1) but subject to the dower of Margaret Gheen for life, on Deals Creek next D.J. Sheets, ---Kincaid, Joseph Gheen, George H. Gheen & lot #2 (also excepting the acre which Thomas Gheen let the school-house committee have on Oct. 20 1847), for \$350.00, acknowledged on the same day.

Book 71 page 118: June 7 1889, J.B.Sheets & wife L.M. let D.J.Sheets--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have a quit claim to 101 acres next George Dunn, Hillary Elliott, Wiley Kincaid, Joseph Gheen & Gheen's road, for \$1.00, acknowledged on the next day.

Book 72 page 76: May 10 1888, J.B.Sheets (as the trustee of H.A.Kanup & Crissy Canup who mortgaged this to him on Feb.2 1886 for \$320.37--see book 3 page 36--& failed to pay so he sold it on May 5 1888) lets D.M.Miller have 26 acres next ---Sheets & the dower-lot (but excepts 1 acre which Thomas Gheen let the school committee have) for \$130.00

Book 68 page 532: Dec. 5 1874. J.B.Sheets & wife Louisa let Henry Knup--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 26 acres beginning on the corner of --- Sheet & going south $87\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east 16.40 chains to a pine knot. south $1\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west 15.85 chains to a stake on the dower-lot, north $87\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west 14.40 chains to a stake on the line & corner of the dowerlot, north $1\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east 15.85 chains to the beginning (but excepts the acre which Thomas Gheen conveyed to the schoolhouse location in the School District #19 on Oct. 20 1847. acknowledged by them Dec. 5 1874.

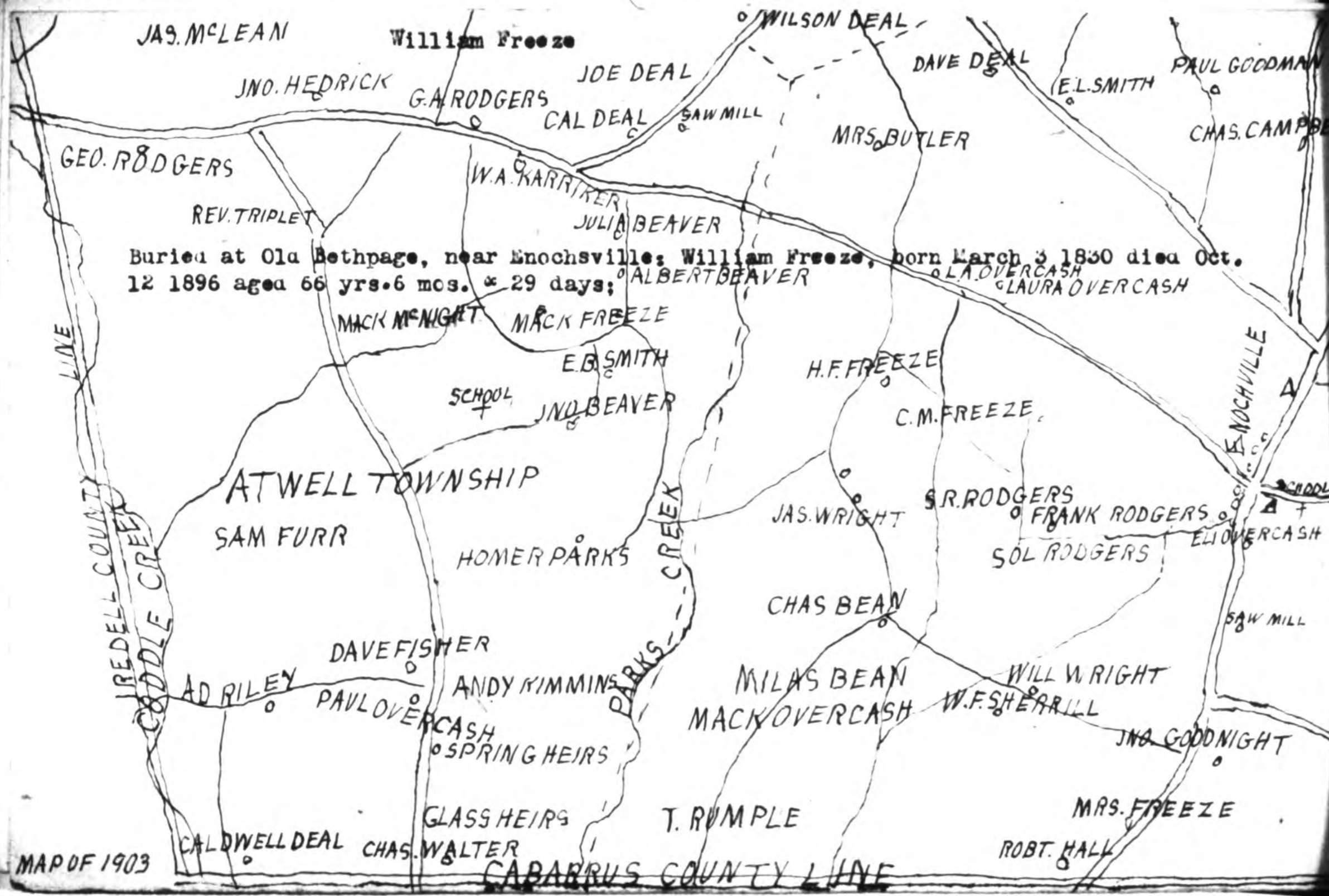

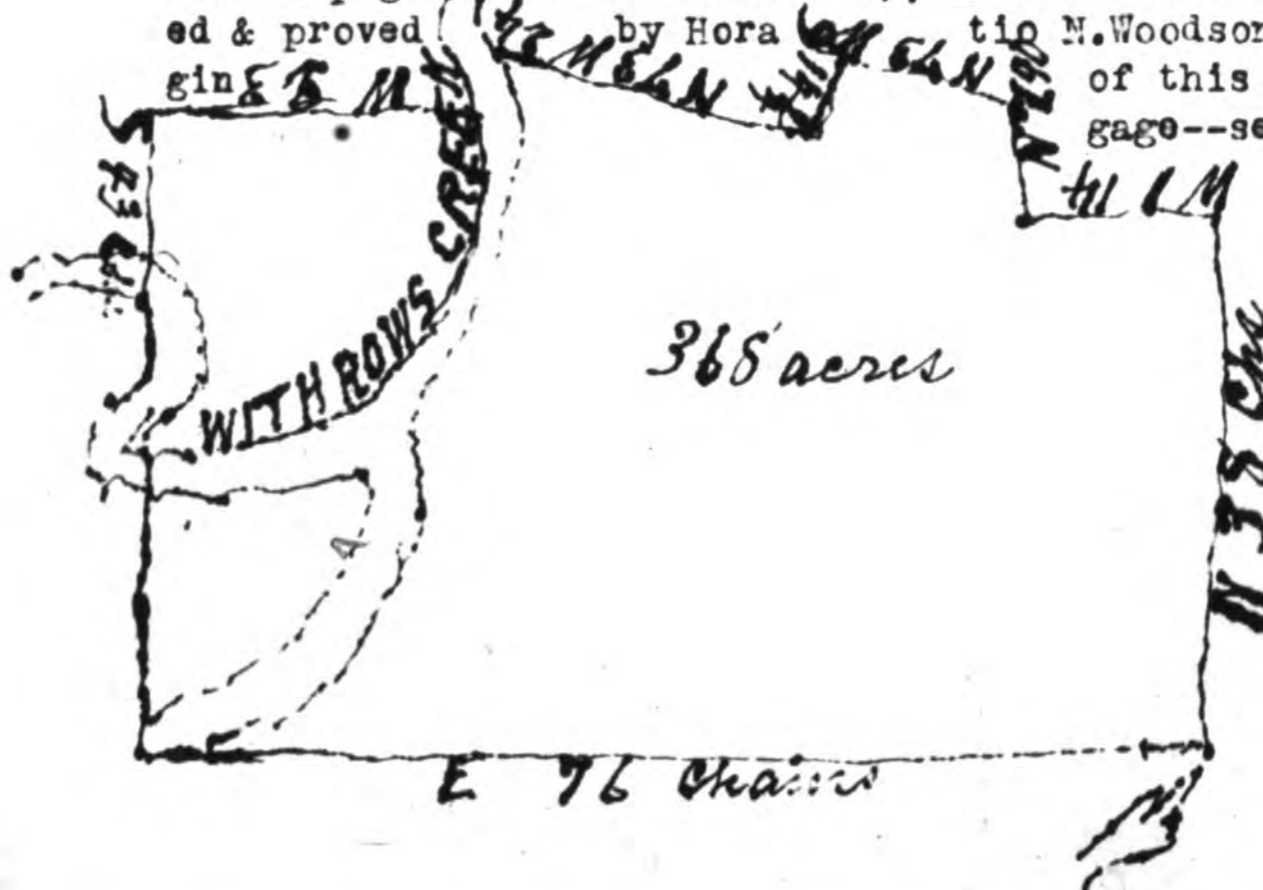

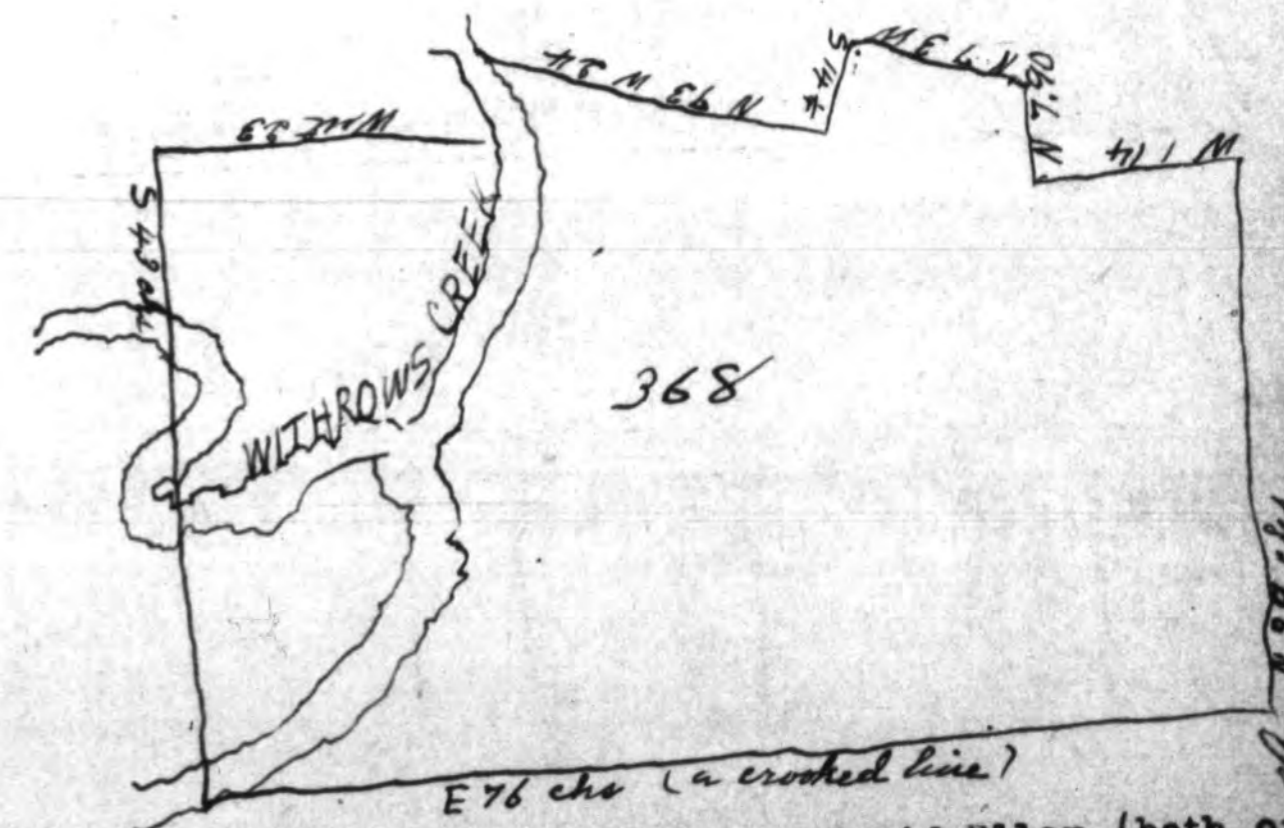
