Sodowick Alford of North Carolina + Georgia

- G.A.R. Lineage Vol 105, page 58: Mrs. Henry King, (Hale Cox), born in Atlanta, Georgia, joined as #104168, from the services of Sodowick Alford, (1715-1789), born in Wake Co., N.C., where he was a Representative in the North Carolina Assembly in 1778, died in Georgia;
- William Bentley (born in Fairfax Co. Virginia, died near Atlanta, Georgia, in 1802), who was a Lieutenant + Captain in the Virginia Line + received a land grant in Wilkes Co., Georgia in 1783;
- John Milner (1746-1812), born in England, died in Wilkes Co., Georgia, who was a Whig, suffered from his poor neighbors, + served in the militia;
- John Holmes (born in died in 1806 in Wilkes Co. Ga., in 1806), who came to Georgia in 1760, + was Chaplain in the Brigade of Gen. Sachlan vs. British - see #90448;
- Thomas Ewing (born in Baltimore in died in Cecil Co. Maryland), who was Colonel of the Third Battalion of the Maryland Flying Camp - see also #100557;
- Robert Morrow (1742-1782), born in Ireland, died in Cecil Co., Maryland, who was an Ensign in the Second Maryland Battalion of the Flying Camp; + of William Cox (born in 1755 in Fauquier Co., Virginia, died in Putnam Co., Georgia), who signed a Petition to North Carolina Legislature "To have his lands joined to the State and thereby aid in the cause of Liberty" she is the daughter of
