Rowan County Pensioners beginning with March 4 1831: Frederick Menius aged 76 years got \$120.00 for service as a private in N.C.Militia. (See elsewhere).

Muster Roll of the detached militia organized in Aug. 1814, of which Montfort Stokes was Major General, Jeremiah Slade & Jesse A.Pearson brigadier-generals, of which the Sixth Regiment was formed from Rowan, Montgomery, Mecklenburg, Cabarrus & Iredell counties, in the War of 1812, see page 120: #68 was Fred Menos of Rowan County 1st regiment (of above sixth regiment) under Capt. Thomas Matthews, Lieutenant Truth Woods, Lieutenant Richman Hughes, Lieutenant Johnsten Neblock & Ensign David Cowan

(Alexander Lentz sold this to them).

Book 96 page 136: Jan. 14 1903, Joseph H.Mingus & wife Ida G., let Elizabeth Cornelison---all of Rowan Co., N.C.-- have 209 acres (as on this day Elizabeth Cornelison let the said Joseph H.Mingus have a deed of similar import), beginning on Second Creek at a stake, going north 45 degrees west 19 chains with a new line to a pine, west 50 chains to a stake on the old line, north 2 degrees east 20 chains to a black oak stump, east 13.60 chains to a stake, north 2 degrees east 14.50 chains to a stone, south 69 degrees east 19.50 chains to a stake, south 80 degrees east 23 chains to a stake, south 64 degrees east 34.50 chains to a white oak stump near the mouth of a branch, up the creek as it meanders to the beginning (being part of the home place of the late Joseph Mingus Sr. which had been conveyed to Joseph Mingus Jr. & wife Elizabeth--who is now Elizabeth Cornelison-- by the will of Joseph Mingus Sr.--see the will of Joseph Mingus Sr. in book 1 page 553--was divided by J.C.Barnhart as C.S., D.Peninger, H.C.Gilligan & R.Culbertson, between the two devisees, had allotted this to the said Elizabeth Cornelison, but it was not probated & registered by law, so this is a quit-claim to the said tract), for witnessed by J.C.Miller & acknowledged on Jan. 16 1903.

Mrs. Van Ross (daughter of the above Joseph H.Mingus by Ida G.Miller) says the above mentioned Joseph H.Mingus had a sister, Lizzie, who married John Cornelison & moved to Los Angeles, Cal.,--she wished an old age pension, so wrote back about two years ago for a copy of her marriage certificate &c. They had a brother, Whitfield Calvin Minis (father of Mrs. Haskins, by wife who died early & John Earnhart--now at the County Home in Rowan--took Mrs. Haskins, but she ran away & later married well).

The grandparents of these were Joseph H.Mingus Sr. & second wife, Elizabeth A. Glascock, who lived three miles of Woodleaf & eight miles from Salisbury, on a large farm (now owned by Mrs. Van Ross), with slaves & plenty to make them very comfortable. Grandfather, Joseph H. Mingus Sr. is buried at Unity Presbyterian Church.



Reference is made to your letter in which you request information in regard to Frederick Menius, who served in the North Carolina Militia during the Revolutionary War and received a pension for his services.

The data which follows were obtained from the papers on file in Revolutionary War pension claim, W.3848, based upon the military service in that war of Frederick Menius.

Frederick Menius (the name also appears as Fredrick Menis and John Frederick Menius) was born in Germany, date not given, and came to Rowan County, North Carolina, about 1778. It is not shown that he deserted from the British. Frederick Menius enlisted in Salisbury, North Carolina, sometime in 1782, exact date not shown, for eighteen months, served as a private in Captain Sharpe's Company, Colonel Idel's North Carolina Regiment and was stationed on an island near Charleston, South Carolina; length of service until the close of the war.

He was allowed pension on his application executed October 8, 1832, while residing in Rowan County, North Carolina, and aged seventy-four years. He died in Rowan County, North Carolina January 14 or 16 (both dates are given), 1835. The soldier married October 6, 1789, in Rowan County, North Carolina, Rosannah or Rosanna Hartman. Soldier's widow, Rosanna, was allowed pension on her application executed August 3, 1840, while a resident of Rowan County, North Carolina. She then gave her age as sixty-eight years, but

My notes were cold & vague when I tried to read them--the mother made signs which the daughter interpreted, but something may be gleaned from them with other aid. 
