N.C. Moravian Records (by Miss Frieze): vol. I. page 361 (1767?) "Nov. 22 Today at Bethania Br. Loesch married Martin Walk to Lisel Fiscus"; page 388: (1769) "March 12 "After the preaching there was a baptism, the four-weeks-old son of Peter Frey receiving the name of Joseph, and Martin Walk's two-weeks-old son that of Johannes" (This seems to have occurred in the Friedland or South-fork section called the Ens; page 409, from diary of South Fork Society "Nov. 18. At a meeting of the Society Martin Walk was unanimously elected Steward to succeed Adam Spach"; page 450, Dec. 19; "Peter Pfaff was elected Steward in place of Martin Walk"; page 494 in (1771) "Martin Walk and Elisabeth, m.n. Fiscus", "Peter Frey and Catharina m.n. Walk" members of this society; page 462: take oath of allegiance to the King.

Vol. II page 688: (1772) "Aug. 31. Br. and Sr. Graff returned from Friedberg, where they held the Communion for 17 members, in the felt presence of the Saviour. Martin Walk partook for the first time"; page 743: (1772) "Feb. 1 In Bethabara the two sons of the departed Johann Schor, Johannes and Heinrich, were bound to Christian Frey, until they should become of age, and the third son, Peter, was bound to Martin Walk."; page 744, (1772) "June 6. Martin Walk brought me 20 lbs. flour, all that he can give now. Flour is very scarce, and many have not even corn meal."; page 839: 1774, "Nov. 6. Matthew Weesner was elected Steward by the Society, in place of Martin Walk."; page 913, (1775), "March 29. We visited Martin Walk. He told me that there is a group of people who are opposed to the Brethren, and that they are planning to send a Petition to the Governor, through Justice Spurgeon, saying that the Herrnhuter¹ are claiming land to which they have no Deeds." (Note: "That is, the Moravians. The Brethren have often been called Herrnhuter because of the settlement at Herrnhut, Saxony.")

Book 26 page 104: On Jan. 2 1819, Martin Walk of Grayson Co. Va., lets Joseph Walk of Rowan Co. N.C. have his undivided $1/8$ of some land in Rowan for \$150.00, witnessed by George Sutlive & George Fry & proved by the latter in Aug. 1820. (This is part of the 477 $1/4$ acres which Peter Frye let Martin Walk Sr. have on Oct. 29 1789--see book 11 page 26 in Rowan--and he died owning and went to his 8 children (Hannah who married Phillip Mock Sr., Joseph Elizabeth who married Harmon Butner, Martin, Abraham, Mary who married Clodfeller, George & Rebecca who married Phillip Mock Jr.--all of whom became tenants-in-common with their mother owning her life-interest).

Book 24 page 684: On April 14 1814, George, Abraham, & Martin Walk, John Clodfelter & (wife) Mary Walk, Herman Butner & wife Elizabeth Walk, Philip Mock Sr. & wife Hannah Walk, Phillip Mock Jr. & wife Peggy Walk late of Rowan Co. N.C., let Jacob Walk of Rowan Co. N.C. (whereas Martin Walk Sr. died owning 144 $1/4$ acres on Peter Fry's Creek on south line of the Wachovia tract which he devised to his widow, Elizabeth until death & then to his eight children: Joseph, Martin, Abraham, George, Hannah (wife of Philip Mock Sr.), Elizabeth (wife of Herman Butner), Philip Mock Jr. & Mary (wife of The will of Martin Walk (book C page 44) made Oct. 15 1791. Wife Elizabeth $1/3$ of everything. Children. Exr: Philip Hoens. Witnesses: Jacob Hartman & Peter Seanor.

Nov. 7 1791: The will of Martin Walk is proved & Phillip Haines qualified as the Exr.

Martin Walke (Everets Branch)

Book 11 page 567: July 11 1788, The State grants (#1747 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Peter Fry 638 acres on the south side of Everets Branch next another tract of the said Fry & the Moravians.

-Book 11 page 170: Oct.25 1786, The State grants (#1169 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Peter Fry 200 acres on the south side of said Fry's homestead, a branch & the Moravian line.

Book 11 page 826: Oct.29 , Peter Fry--no wife signs lets Martin Walk (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 477 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres for 47 pounds, witnessed by John Mull & George Fry & proved by the latter in Nov. 1789. (The State granted this? being 638 acres or #1747 on July 11 1788--see book 11 page 567--also #1169 on Oct.25 1786--see book 11 page 170 making 838 acres).

; Deed from Peter Fry to Martin Walk for 477 $\frac{1}{4}$? acres Oct.29 1789 proved by George Fry.

Book 26 page 104: Jan.2 1819, Martin Walk of Grayson Co.Va.-- --lets Joseph Walk of Rowan Co.N.C., have his eighth of the undivided 477 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres which Peter Frye let the now deceased Martin Walk Sr. have on Oct.29 1789--see book 11 page 826--which is in Rowan Co.N.C. & went to his eight children (Hannah who married Philip Mock Sr., Joseph, Elizabeth who married Harmon Butner, Martin, Abraham, Mary who married Clodfelter, George & Rebecca who married Philip Mock Jr.--all becoming tenants-in-common with their mother who owned a life-interest), for \$150.00, witnessed by George Sutlive & George Fry & proved by the latter in Aug. 1820.

Mr. James J. Mock of Winston-Salem, N.C. made his family chart in 1936, as follows: John Mock, a passenger on the ship, St. Andrew, from Rotterdam qualifying at Penn. Sept. 23 1752, married Judith Ripple Webber (born Aug. 22 1714 died March 29 1792), the widow of Christian Ripple, for his second wife, by whom he had:

George Mock, member of Capt. James A. Wilson's Co. Sixth Battalion Penn. Militia in American Revolution.

Theobald Mock--see Bedford County Penn Archives.

Phillip Mock of Lancaster County, Penn., afterwards North Carolina 1784

Godlip Mock, soldier American Revolution, Member of Company of Capt. Henry Crist, later a Corporal and Sergeant of Lancaster Co. Militia.

Jacob Mock (born March 14 1753 died Jan. 26 1836) a soldier of American Revolution, member of Capt. Beatty Second Battalion, Chester Co. Militia in 1776, came to N.C. in 1784. This son married Julianna Kappus (born March 9 1767 died March 14 1836, daughter of Peter Kappus by wife Marie) by whom had:

Phillapinna (born Jan. 29 1786 died June 12 1854) married Peter Hartman (born March 20 1772 died Oct. 5 1848)

Phillip (born Jan. 30 1788 died Nov. 15 1851) married Rebecca Walk (born Feb. 14 1795 died Sept. 6 1845) *see father died - 1791 -*

Jacob Mock (born May 7 1790 died Nov. 18 1841) married Sarah Spach (born Aug. 10 1790 died Feb. 2 1843)

Adam (born Nov. 11 1792 died Nov. 7 1856) married 1st Sarah Pickett (born Dec. 27 1800 died Nov. 30 1834) married 2nd Nancy Ripple (born July 16 1817 died Aug. 10 1906)

Marrie (born Nov. 20 1794 died May 11 1844) married George Knouss (born May 15 1792 died Jan. 4 1853)

Catharine (born Jan. 11 1800 died Dec. 20 1856) married Johanna Spack (born Oct. 19 1797 died Dec. 21 1868)

Aug. 3 1778: Martin Walk is a non-juror or tory in Capt. Eakle's district.

Feb. 7 1789: Deed from Martin Walks to Richmond Pierson for 158 acres Feb. 5 1789 is acknowledged.

Book 11 page 615: Feb. 5 1789, Martin Walk or Wallox, a planter--no wife signs--lets Esq. Richmond Pierson have 79 acres or 158, on east side of Yadkin River "called by the Name of a Horse Shoe Neck" willed by the deceased Martin Wallox to the said Martin, (being the upper half of the land which deceased Michael Myers & wife Mary deeded to the also now deceased Martin Wallox on July 15 1768, ^{who willed it to said seller} for 120 pounds, witnessed by J. Stokes & Alexander Cairns & acknowledged in Feb. 1789.

Book 11 page 686: July 11 1788, The State grants (#1719 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Richmind Pearson 400 acres in Horse Shoe Neck on the west bank of Yadkin River opposite Widew Peeter's field, John Garret, down the river to Martin Wallox, Sollemen Wallox & Jeshua Steris.

Book 11 page 107: Sept. 21 1811. John Billing--no wife signs--lets George Walk (who has married Elizabeth the daughter of the said Billing)--all of Town Co. N.C.--have the house & lot in Lexington, N.C. (144 sq. poles of lot 86) on Main St. out of love, witnessed by E.T. Winters & John Burdett & proved by the latter in Feb. 1814. (This is what the executors of Dr. John Billing decessed) Billing & Jacob H. Billing for said

Feb. 8 1772: Frederick Beckle is appointed overseer of the road leading from Dobbs Parish to Reedy Creek, instead of George Hartman.

Feb. 9 1775: Martin Walk is appointed overseer of the road from the Moravian line to Reedy Creek on the Moravian road.

Book 23 page 107; Sept. 21 1811, John Billing--no wife signs--lets George Walk (who has married Elizabeth the daughter of the said Billing)--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have the houses & lot in Lexington, N.C. (144 sq. poles of lot #6) on Main St. out of leve, witnessed by E.P.N. Winelers & John Burkhardt & proved by the latter in Feb. 1814. (This is what the executors of Dr. John Billing deceased (Fred Billing & Jacob Miller) let said John Billing have)

Book 24 page 484; Jan.29 1818, Daniel Sharp--no wife signs--lets Jonathan Walk (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 92 acres on the east bank of the Yadkin River, for \$500.00, witnessed by Neal McGill & Benjamin Sherwood & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818.

Book 23 page 384; Jan.28 1814, Samuel Walk--no wife signs--lets Jonathan Walk (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 56 acres & 87 links on the Yadkin River next Solomon Wallox & the original line of Martin Wallox, for 5 shillings, witnessed by Neal McGill, Archar Womack & David Walk & proved by the last named in May 1815.

Martin Walk (Frys Creek)

Book 10 page 543: Dec.17 1785, The State grants (#1080 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Phillip Craver 500 acres on Frys Creek on the Moravian line next Henry Peeters.

Book 10 page 559: Jan.17 1787, Philip Craver (Sarah makes her mark) lets Tebold Mock--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 500 acres on Frys Creek on the Moravian line next Henry Petres, for 105 pounds, witnessed by R.Martin & Jacob Clinart & proven by the latter in Feb.1787. (The State granted this).

Book 13 page 27; March 16 1789, Devolt Mock (Pheby also signs) lets Thomas Perkins--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 500 acres on Frays Creek next the Moravians, John Monroe & Henry Petree, for 120 pounds, witnessed by William Simmons & Sion Daniel & acknowledged in Nov. 1792. (Philip Craver deeded this to Devolt Mock).

Book 13 page 339: Oct.7 1791, Thomas Perkins--no wife signs--lets Jacob Hartman (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 150 acres on Frys Creek next Henry Petree, for 60 pounds, witnessed by Chasber Hinkel & Jacob Clinert & proven by the latter in Nov. 1793. (This is part of the land which Devolt Mock let Thomas Perkins have).

Book 19 page 436: Aug. 10 1805, Peter Hinkle--no wife signs--lets Martain Walk (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 150 acres on Frys Creek next Henry Peters & the Moravian line, for ---- pounds, witnessed by ? & J.Willson & proven by the latter in Feb. 1806. (This is part?of the land which Jacob Hartman bought of Thomas Perkins who bought it of Devolt Mock).

Book 22 page 14; Aug. 28 1810, Martin Walk-- --lets Mary Waggoner (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 150 acres on Freys Creek next Henry Peters, & the Moravian line, for \$300.00, witnessed by J.Willson, John Delapp & Alexander Caldoleugh & proved by the last named in Nov. 1810. (This is part of the land which Devolt Mock sold Thomas Perkins & it was lately conveyed to Joseph Hoidmore

Book 24 page 492: Jan. 29 1818, Daniel Sharp--no wife signs--lets Jonathan Walk (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 81 acres on the waters of the Yadkin River, beginning at a dead pine & going east 20 chains to a hickory, north 40 chains to a black oak, west 20 chains to a stake, then north to the beginning, for \$100.00, witnessed by Neal McGill & B.Sherwood & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818.

Jonathan Walk (East bank of the Yadkin River)

Book 24 page 484: Jan. 29 1818, Daniel Sharp--no wife signs--lets Jonathan Walk (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 92 acres beginning on the east bank of the Yadkin River at a locust & going south 85 degrees east 4 chains & 50 links to a sweet gum, south 77 degrees east 2 chains & 70 links to a white oak, south 55 degrees east 5 chains to a pine, south 42 chains to a pine, west 27 chains to a hickory, north 20 chains to an ash on the river bank, then up the river to the beginning, for \$500.00, witnessed by Neal McGill & B.Sherwood & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818.

Martin Walk (Frys Creek

Book 11 page 170: Oct. 25 1786, The State grants (#1169 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Peter Fry 200 acres on Frys Creek on the south side of said Fry's homestead plantation, beginning on its southwest corner, going south 10 chains to a stake, east 40 chains to a maple by a branch, south 10 chains to a black oak, east 20 chains to a stake, south 17 chains to a white oak, west 45 chains to a stake, north 32 chains to a white oak, west 20 chains to a stake, south 15 chains to a white oak, then west 50 chains to the beginning.

Martin Walk (Waters of Rocky Creek)

Book 11 page 243: Aug. 9 1787, The State grants (#1525 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Martin Walk 250 acres on the waters of Rocky Creek, beginning on the corner of Aaron Luckey Speeks at a black oak; going south 28 degrees east 130 poles to a post oak, north 12 degrees east 80 poles to a hollow post oak, south 78 degrees east 130 poles to a post oak, south 12 degrees west 120 poles to a post oak in a hollow, then to the beginning.

Solomon Wallox (North side of the Yadkin River)
Book 10 page 370; Oct.---1783, The State grants (#726 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Solomon Wallox 98 acres on the north side of the Yadkin River next Martin Wallox. It begins on the line of Martin Wallox at a pine & goes east 30 chains to a maple near a branch, south 40 chains to a stake near a white oak, west 19 chains to a white oak on the line of the said Martin Wallox, then with the same to the beginning.

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Book 11 page 898: July 11 1788, The State grants (#1754 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Martin Wallox 114 acres next said Martin & Solomon Wallox.

Book 10 page 370: Oct.-- 1783, The State grants (#726 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Solomon Wallox 98 acres on the north side of the Yadkin River next Martin Wallox. It begins on the line of Martin Wallox at a pine & goes east 30 chains to a maple near a branch, south 40 chains to a stake near a white oak, west 19 chains to a white oak on the line of the said Martin Wallox, then with the same to the beginning.

Book 13 page 692: April 1 1794, Henry Ripple--no wife signs--lets Christian Broe (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 63 acres on Frys Creek next Jacob Mock, Martin Wallox, George Fry & Peter Fulse, for 20 pounds, witnessed by George Odam & Peter Hartman & acknowledged in Aug. 1794. (This is part of the tract granted said Ripple by The State on Nov. 20 1791).

Book 13 page 364: Dec. 30? 1791, The State grants (#2126) to Henry Ripple 63 acres on Frys Creek next Jacob Mock, Martin Wollox, George Fry & Peter Fultz
