Book 28 page 392: On Nov. 5 1825, Polly Henry of Iredell Co.N.C., lets William Hargrave of same, have her 1/6 part of land on both sides of Thompsons Mill Creek next the Mill place, Seckler & William McCollum, for \$130.00, witnessed by John McCane & Moses M. Lester & proved by the latter in Feb. term of 1826. (This was devised by the will of Thomas Thompson to his son Thomas Jr. who died intestate & is supposed to be 250 acres or 1/6 part of said tract which fell to Polly Henry as heir of Thomas Thompson Jr.).

May 6 1794: The will of Thomas Thomson proved by James Brandon. Elizabeth Thomson, John Brown & William McKnight qualified as Exrs. An inventory of the estate is returned. William McKnight is appointed guardian of Alexander Thomson- a minor orphan of Thomas & gave bond of 1000 pounds with Abram Gillean as security--also appointed guardian of Thomas under bond of 400 pounds with William Young as security.

Nov. 4 1794: "Polly Thomson, minor Orphan of Thomas Thomson being of lawful age came into Court and elected John Brown her Guardian for the security of a legacy left her by her Grand Mother. bound in 20.0".

The will of Thomas Thompson (Book E page 34) made Nov. 12 1793 & probated . Sons: James, Alexander, Thomas & John. Daughters: Nancy, Elizabeth, Mary Pamela & Eleanor. Children. Son-in-law William McKnite. Exrs: daughter Elizabeth, son-in-law William McKnite & John Brown. Test: James Brandon, John McNeely, Samuel Jinkins & John McLaughlin.

Thomas Thompson to Marey Stewart April 29 1768 signed by James Stewart.

The will of Elizabeth Stewart (Book D page 65) made Nov. 7 1792 & probated . Son Matthew Stuart (& his wife Elizabeth & children William & Mary). Daughter Mary Stewart. Grandchildren: Elizabeth, Pemilia & Mary Thomson: Eleonor Wood, Mary & Agness Stewart (Mary Stewart is to have the note on Thomas Thomson) & Agness McKnight. Exr: son Matthew. Test: Robert Cowan & William Cowan Jr.

Book 17 page 726: On June 9 1801, James Stewart--no wife signs--lets Esq. Francis Lock--both of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 47 acres on Grants Creek next James Stewart & William L. Alexander (now Francis Locke's), for \$141.00, witnessed by John Locke & William D. Crawford & proved by the latter in Aug. 1801. (This is part of a tract granted John Thompson, who let Andrew Allison have it, he let William Stewart have it & the commissioners of his real estate, let James Stewart have it).

Book 22 page 697 Or 797 (numbered twice) June 7 1808, William Gardner & wife Elonder let Matthew Hartt--all of Mecklenburg Co.N.C.--have their 1/6 of 640 acres in Rowan County which was divided by the will of deceased Thomas Thompson between his two sons Alexander & Thomas, for \$270.00, witnessed by John Neill & Robert J. Hartt & acknowledged.

HARTT Book 27 page 863( or numbered twice): July 9 1822, Pamela Toms, wife of William Thoms of Rutherford Co.N.C., lets Samuel Hart of Rowan Co.N.C., have their right & title to 1/6 part of the land of the deceased Thomas Thompson Jr. (who died without a will & to whom it was willed by his father Thomas Thompson Sr.) her brother, of whom she was the natural heir, being 250 acres on both sides of Thompson's Mill-creek next the mill-plantation & on the south end of the tract owned by deceased Thomas Thompson Sr., next --- Kistler, James Wood,---McCollum,---Seckler & east of ---McLaughland for \$166.00, witnessed by John Walk & acknowledged before Judge John Paxton & proved in July 1822.

Book 12 page 153: Aug. 2 1790, Matthew Stewart--no wife signs--lets Frederick Sickler (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 776 acres on east fork of Thompsons Mill-creek next Andrew McCollum for 300 pounds, witnessed by James Brandon & Walt Braly & acknowledged in Aug. 1790. (This is two tracts: one of 136 acres which James Stewart let Matthew Gillespie have & the other of 640 acres granted by The State to said James Stewart)  
See the will of James Stewart probated in Nov. 1779

Book 22 page 484: On Jan. 9 1809, Lee Walker--no wife signs--lets Robert Henry (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 200 acres on Buffaloe Creek next Alexander Donaldson, John Haggens & --- Hughs, for \$200.00, witnessed by Samuel Henry, & Hugh Braley & proved by the latter in may 1812. (This is land which William Thompson let Lee Walker have).

Book 25 page 458: On Nov. 12 1816, Robert Henry--no wife signs--lets William W. Swann of Caswell Co.N.C., have 200 acres on Buffelow Creek next Alexander Donaldson, John Huggins & ---Hughes, for \$350.00, witnessed by Sally C. & Hugh Braly & proved by latter in Aug. 1810. (Lee Walker let Robt. Henry have it)

Marriage bonds: Hugh Henry to Rosanna Robinson Sept. 4 1779 signed Jas. McBroom

Book 14 page 755 (or 855 numbered twice): Dec. 20 1791, The State grants (#2143 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to William Thompson 200 acres on Buffelow Creek next Alexander Donaldson, John Haggins & --- Hughes

Book 25 page 601: On Sept. 12 1818, William W. Swann--no wife signs--lets Lock Atwell (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 200 acres on head of Buffalo Creek next ---Donaldson, Thomas Smith & --- Upright, for \$325.00, witnessed by Sarah C. & Hugh Braly & proved by the latter in Nov. 1819. (This had been conveyed to William W. Swann by Robert Henry).

Book 21 page 174: Jan. 24 1807, William Thompson of Surk Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Lee Walker of Rowan Co.N.C., have 200 acres on Buffalow Creek next Alexander Donaldson & John Haggins, for 130 pounds, witnessed by Samuel Walker & Hu Braly & proved by the latter in May 1808. (This was granted said Thompson by The State).

Book 24 page 655: April 29 1818, John B. Thompson--no wife signs--lets Jacob Kistler (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have his 1/6 of the 335 acres which was willed by Thomas Thompson Sr. to Thomas Thompson Jr. who died intestate while a minor, which is next the mill-place --- McCollum & --- Seckler, for \$100.00, witnessed by James M. Knight & Hu Braly & proved by the latter in May 1818.

Book 15 page 107: Dec. 20 1791, The State grants (#2097) to William Thomson, 45 acres on a branch of Catheys Mill Creek next --- Hughes & --- Donelson.

Book 24 page 656: April 29 1818, James M. Knight, a hatter of Iredell Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets John B. Thompson of Rowan Co.N.C., have his 1/6 of 1/7 of the acres for \$150.00, this being

Book 19 page 465: Nov. 27 1805, Nancy McKnight lets Isaac Rains (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have her 1/7 part of 540 acres devised by Thomas Thompson to his two sons Alexander & Thomas, for \$200.00, witnessed by Jean Stanford & John Jones & acknowledged in Feb. 1806.

Book 26 page 500: Nov. 25 1816, Robert Steele Hart (as attorney of Matthew Hart of Mecklenburg Co.N.C.) lets Robert Henry of Rowan Co.N.C., have 1/6 of the undivided 1/7 part of the land on both sides Thompsons Mill Creek next the mill; --- Seckler, --- McCollum, for \$175.00, witnessed by Edward Archer & Hu Braly & proved by the latter in Aug. 1821. (This 1/6 & 1/7 were willed by Thomas Thompson Sr. to his son Thomas Thompson Jr. who died intestate).

Book 26 page 501: July 11 1821, Robert Henry--no wife signs--lets William Hargrave (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have the above land supposed to be 250 acres, for \$400.00, witnessed by Richard King & Hu Braly & proved by the latter in Aug. 1821.

Feb. 5 1796: "James Hart is appointed Guardian of Mary Thomson Orphan of Thomas Thomson deceased & gave bond with William McKnight and John McGlaughland Securities in the Sum of £200". Same day "John McGahey is appointed Guardian of Pamela Thomson Orphan of Thomas Thomson decd. and gave bond with John Gramam and John McGlaughland Securities in the Sum of £200".

RICHARD THOMASON

Book of Wills H, p. 288 - 1824.  
Rowan County, Salisbury, N. C.

In the name of God, amen, I, Richard Thomason, of the County of Rowan and State of North Carolina, being very weak and low in body, but in perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that gave and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executor and nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form:

1. I give and bequeath unto my son George Thomason, 75 acres of land, including his improvements.

2. I give and bequeath unto my son Bias Thomason and my son William Thomason my dwelling house and plantation, to be equally divided between them.

3. I give and bequeath unto my son-in-law, William Julian and Fanny Julian his wife, one-third of my moveable property after all my just debts are paid.

4. I give and bequeath unto my granddaughter, Hannah Kincaid and my grandson, Thomas Kincaid, and my grandson James Kincaid and my granddaughter Ann Kincaid, these four grand-children to have the balance of moveable property equally divided among them.

I also ordain my well beloved son George Thomason and my beloved friend, Benjamin Howard, Esq., executors of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby disallow, revoke, disannul all and every other form, testament, will, bequeath and executors by me in any manner willed and bequeathed, ratifying and conforming this and no other to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 4th day of September in the year of our Lord 1824.

May 8 1789 "Ordered that a Road be laid out the Nearest and best way from Linsters Foard to Second Creek Bridge & thence to Grants Creek Bridge at Fullenweders old Mill by the following Jury to be summoned by the Sheriff, to wit, Moses Linster, James Kincaide, James Geen, Daniel Biles, Jonathan Biles, Joseph Biles, George Tomerson, James Jones, John Hunter, Henry Trott Benjamin Leach & John Cross".

Aug. 4 1784: The will of Thomas Biles proved by Thomas Frohock. Elizabeth, Charles & Thomas Biles qualify as Exrs. The will of Thomas Biles (book D page 162), a "Wheelwright", made Sept. 13 1781 & probated. Wife Elizabeth. Sons: Joseph (land on Dails Creek), Daniel, Thomas, Charles & Jonathan. Daughters: Deborah & Doseya Ann. Exrs: wife & sons Thomas & Joseph. Witnesses: Thomas Frohock Jr? & Joshua Slene.

The will of Elizabeth Biles follows (book D page 167), is widow of Thomas & it is made Aug. 11 1792. Sons: Jonathan. Daughters. Deborah & Ann. Exrs: Samuel

May 8 1792. George Thomason proves the will of William Johnston. (Judith Johnston & Obediah Smith qualify as Exrs).

Saturday Aug. 11 1792. "Inventory of the Estate of George Thomason filed"

Feb. 12 1791 "On Petition, Ordered that the following Jury viz, Thomas Biles, Charles Biles, Joseph Biles, Richmd. Peirson, George Williams, George Thomerson, Richard Thomerson, John Hunter, John Montgomery, Joseph Williams, William Williams & Henry Trott mark and lay off a road the nearest & best way from where the road leading from Enoch's Ferry comes into the Shallow-foard-road to Capt Peirson's bridge on Second- Creek, from thence to Biles' Bridge on Grants Creek & from thence to the Town of Salisbury and make due return to our next County Court of their proceedings thereon"

May 9 1795: "George Thomason from Lexington to the old Guilford road" is appointed overseer of it.

Aug. 11 1798: "Zachariah Thomason orphan of George Thomason being of lawful age came into court & elected John Howard his guardian who gave bond with "William Thomison orphan of George being of lawful age Elected John Robley Guardian who gave bond with Charles Biles & Christian Cochenour Secu "400." The will of John Howard (Book H page 316) made April 6 1825 & probated in Aug. 1825. Wife Vinah. Sons: Matthew, John (Rounsevall's place), William (land next Benj. Howard over to Abner Hall's place). Daughters: Nancy, Lavinia (& her son Mathias the land after death of widow), Polly (her son William to have 75 acres to live on their lifetime & she is to have \$10.00 for 10 years with no claim from Andrew Kincaid), Katharine (\$1.00). Exrs: sons Benjamin & William & Matthew. Tests: A. Hall & Th. Craige.

The will of George Thomason (Book H page 238) made while "verry weak an low in body" on Sept. 4 1824 & probated in Nov. term of 1824. Sons: George (75 acres), Bias & William (the home plantation is to be divided among them). Son-in-law William Julan (whose wife is Fanny). Grandchildren: Hannah & Thomas, James & Ann Kincaid. Exrs: son George & friend Benjamin Howard. Tests: A. T? Horn & John Howard.

Book 28 page 335 shows that Esq. Benjamin Howard lets George Thomason have 9 acres of land on Jumping Run on Longs road next Thomason's land for \$88.00 on Aug. 12 1825 witnessed by S.W. Walton & Jo.E. Todd in Aug. 1825.

Book 13 page 977: On Feb. 11 1795, Benjamin Stockton of Union Co. N.C., lets John Biles of Rowan Co. N.C., have 280 acres on North Yadkin River about 25 poles below Horse Ford, (which had belonged to Col. Richmond Pearson & deceased David Stockton) for

Deed from Benjamin Stockton to John Biles for 280 acres Feb. 11 1795 approved by Obediah Smith.

Book 13 page 923: John Eelis(?) & wife Mary let John Boiles--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 62 1/2 acres on Dutchmans Creek next Jas. Reed, Ruth Willcockson & David Johnston, for 60 pounds in trade (paid by valentine Holderfield), witnessed by Jesse McCollister & David Johnston & proved by the latter in May 1795.

Feb. 8 1783: Edwd Stogdon was among those summoned to last Nov. Court (to show why their estates should not be confiscated) & made default.

The will of George Thomason (book C page 49) made while "very sick & weak" on June 22 1792. Wife Mary. Sons: Lande, Zachariah & William. Daughters: Elizabeth Pinxston & Mary. Exrs: friends Obadiah Smith & Moses Linster. Attests: Cha. Burrough, David Montgomery & John Hunter. (over)

Jane Thorn to Richard Thomason ( ) book 35 page 444 Book 35 page 444: On Feb. 4 1842, Jane Thorn lets Richard Thomason--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 42 acres next William Julian, Thomas Ford & "Meeting house land (Franklin)" for \$132.00, witnessed by Wm. P. Moore & John Thomason & proved by the latter in Feb. term of 1842.

(Refer to the will of John Howard who willed it to his son John in 1825).

Aug. 6 1796: Deed from John Howard to Richard Tomison for 153 acres Sept. 23 1795 is acknowledged.

Division of R. Thomason's estate between 1864-68 in book 43 page 410.

Book 43 page 410: The estate of R. Thomason deceased is divided on Jan. 16 , among the "Tenants in Common of the Lands descended to them as children and heirs. at law of Richard Thomason decd" who are the widow Mary E. who gets lot #1 or 110 acres; next George W. Thomason; lot #2 goes to Mary B. & is 35 acres next E. A. Propst; #3 goes to Margaret R. & is 44 acres next J. C. Miller; #4 goes to Sarah E. & is 34 1/4 acres next John C. Miller; #5 goes to George T. & is 40 acres next J. C. Miller; #6 goes to William T. & is 36 3/4 acres; #7 goes to Jacob A. & is 49 acres. All are Thomasons & the land was divided by John C. Miller, E. A. Propst, John Foster & Aaron Raney & proved in Feb. 1867.

Book 5 page 17: On Aug. 26 1762, Earl Granville lets Jacob Thomas of Rowan Co. N.C., have 529 acres vacant land on the east side of the Cataba River next Richard Lewis on the lower end, & a poplar on the river bank, for 10 shillings, witnessed

Aug. 10 1771: Esq. John Oliphant is the Justice for the east side of Cataba River.

Feb. 7 1772: George Clayton is appointed Constable instead of Jo Davison in Mr. Oliphant's district.

Feb. 3 1773: John Leech or Looch is appointed Constable in John Oliphant's district instead of George Claiton.

May 6 1774: William Young is appointed Constable instead of John Leach.

Feb. 9 1775: Jacob Thomas " " " " " William Young.

Book 31 page 326: On July 11 1825, Alexander H. Thomas--no wife signs--of Chesterfield Co. South Carolina, lets William Langhorn, of Bedford Co. Virginia, have for \$1.00 (whereas William Thomas late of Marlboro District, died in 1820 leaving two grandchildren, the above Alexander & William Thomas as heirs, and as the other grandson is dead without will or issue, so according to an order of court in Salisbury, March 1823), these tracts are : one of 550 acres called the Boonsford Plantation; one of 300 acres called Dr. Freeland's old place & one of 700 acres called Horseshoe Neck--in all 1550 acres, witnessed by William Julius Alexander & Richard H. Alexander & proved by the latter in Aug. 1831.

(Refer to Colonel Richmond Pearson Sr. for this land.)

In Lexington, Davidson Co. N.C., book 1 page 392, the will of Alexander Thomas a planter, made March 5 1842 & probated in Aug. 1842. Wife Hannah. Sons: Alexander; Isaac & William. Daughters: Hannah, Sarah Bunch, Susannah (who may be dead? & was the wife of John Aton, & her children). Exr: son William. Codicil: William Thomas & Manlove Raper are to lay off one year's provisions for daughter Hannah Thomas. Witnesses: William Raper Jr. & Joseph Spencer.

Book 13 page 785: Dec. 12 1794, Jacob Raper (Elizabeth makes her mark) lets Alexander Thomas--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 220 acres on both sides of Rich Fork & crossing it, next William Raper, for 189 pounds, witnessed by Joseph Davis, William Davis Jr. & James Clift & proved by the last named in Feb. 1795. (Said Jacob Raper's honoured father, William Raper, gave this to him).

Feb. 7 1795: Deed from Jacob Rape & wife to Alexander Thomas for 220 acres Dec. 12 1794 proved by Jas. Clift.

Book 19 page 339: On May 24 1804, Eliza Locke of the city of Philadelphia, Pa., (widow of & executrix of the deceased Esq. Matthew Locke) & his other executors (Matthew Brandon, Richard Locke & James Locke of Rowan Co. N.C.), let Lucy Hunt (wife of Jeshum Massey Thomas,) John Thomas, Peggy Thomas, Lethen Thomas & Francis Thomas--the heirs of the deceased John Thomas--have some land on Swearing Creek next Hugh Davis, witnessed by Mos. Bellah, Charles McKinzie & Rd. Trotter. (This land had belonged to Henry E. McCullough, but was sold by the Commissioners in 1782 (#15) & Esq. Matthew Locke sold 193 acres of it in his lifetime to John Thomas, on Sept. 7 1796, at \$4.00 the acre, 1/2 to be paid on Nov. 1 of ensuing year & other 1/2 with interest, to be paid when suitable to John Thomas.)

Exr: son? Massa Thomas. Witnesses: Henry Earnheart, Philip Brown & I. S. Myers

Book 33 page 468: Dec. 8 1837, Levi Butner--no wife signs--lets Jesse West (both of Rowan) have 248 acres on Crane Creek next Hugh Montgomery & H. E. McCulloh, for \$150.00. (Granted by The State to David Butner on July 11 1780).

Feb. 12 1791: Deed from John McCartey to John Thomas for 200 acres May 30 1788 proved by Robert Brothers.

Feb. 7 1795: Deed from William McClure to John Thomas for 150 acres Sept. 22 1789 proved by Evan Ellis Jr.
