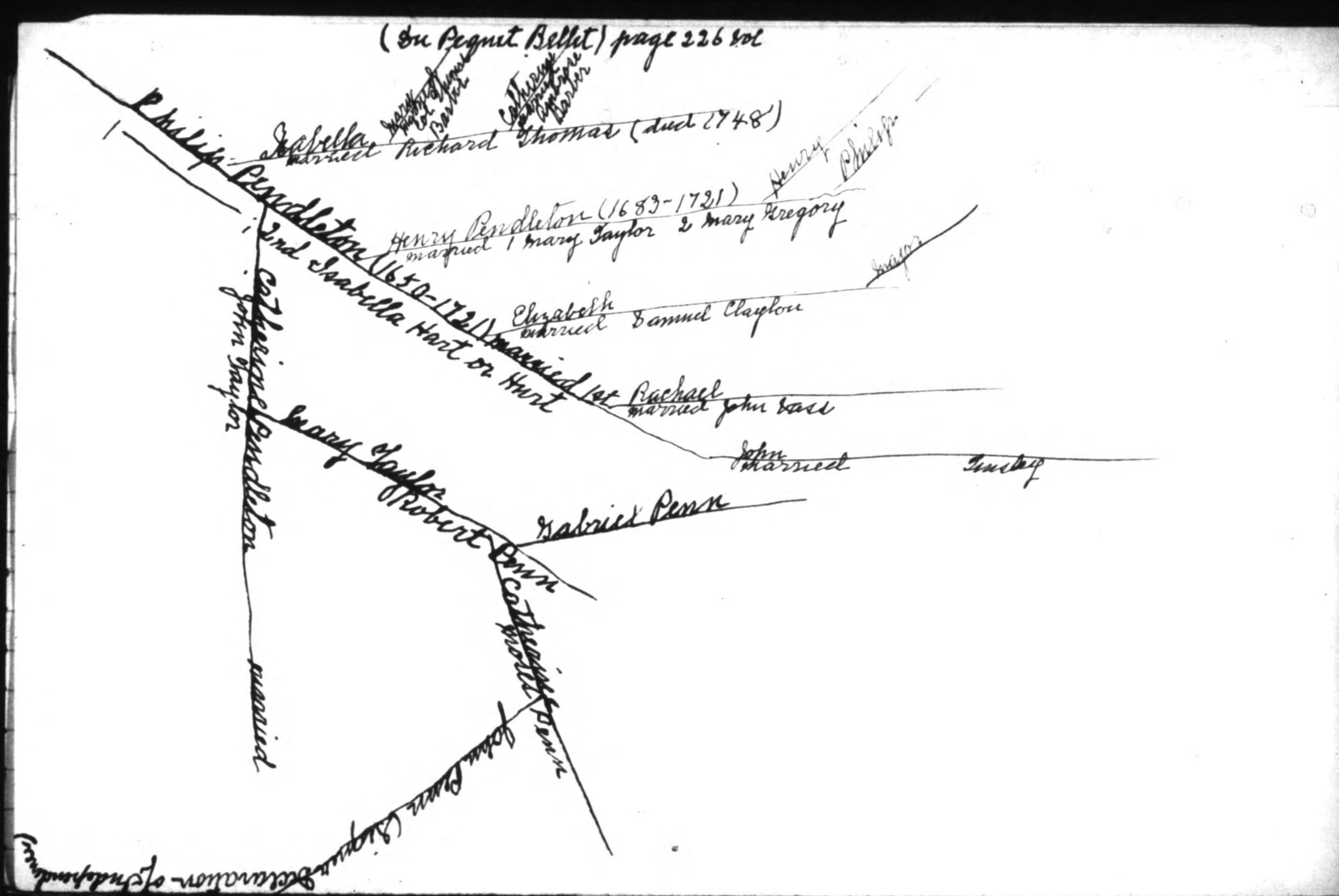

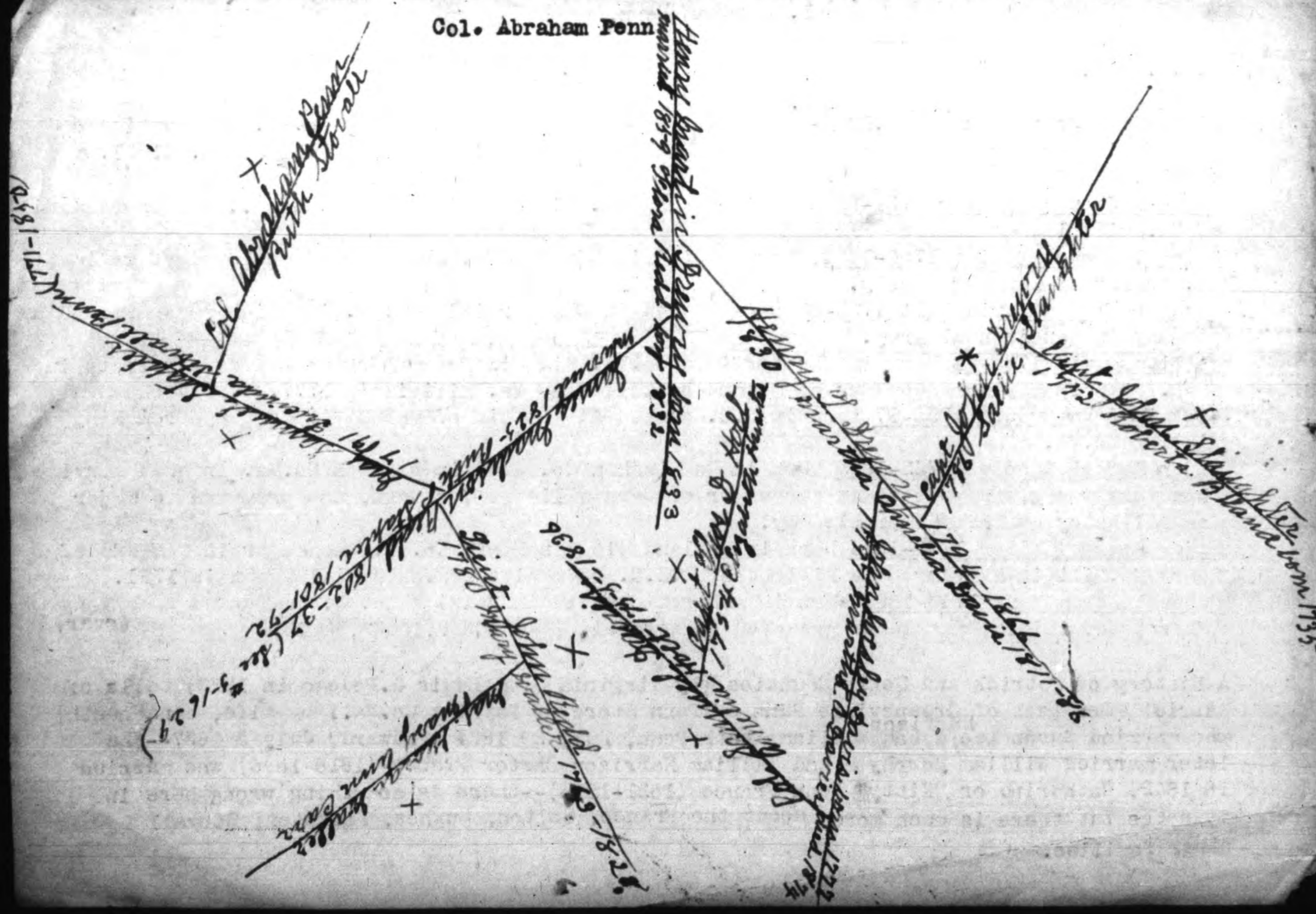

Biographical Sketches of the Signers, published in 1828 in Pennsylvania--five volumes-- John Penn (born May 17, 1741, died in his 47th year in Sept., 1788) was the only child of Moses Penn by wife Catherine (a daughter of John Taylor of the same County). He at the age 18 years, became his own guardian at the death of his father "His nearest relative having removed to the province of North Carolina, Mr. Penn followed their example in the year 1774, became representative of North Carolina, 1775, to fill the vacancy of Mr. Caswell, resigned. He married on July 28 1763, Susannah Lyne by whom he had three children, two of whom died unmarried.
