Martha Cunningham

Mrs. Colvert of Bellemont, near Jersey Church & Linwood, Davidson Co.N.C., gave me her lineage. A letter from James Madison Moore says the marriage certificate of Martha Cunningham to Robert Moore. She was of Earl Township, Lancaster Co.Pa. & the ceremony was performed on Dec. 29 1763 by the minister, Alexander Murry.

Robert Moore came from Ireland in 1763, well attended, within the bounds of the congregation & may be admitted to any congregation (written by James Proudfoot, the minister of Pequa, Ireland, on Oct. 21 1765).

The children of Martha Cunningham & husband Robert Moore who were married Dec. 29 1763, were; William Moore, born about 1 in the day of Monday, Feb. 11 1765

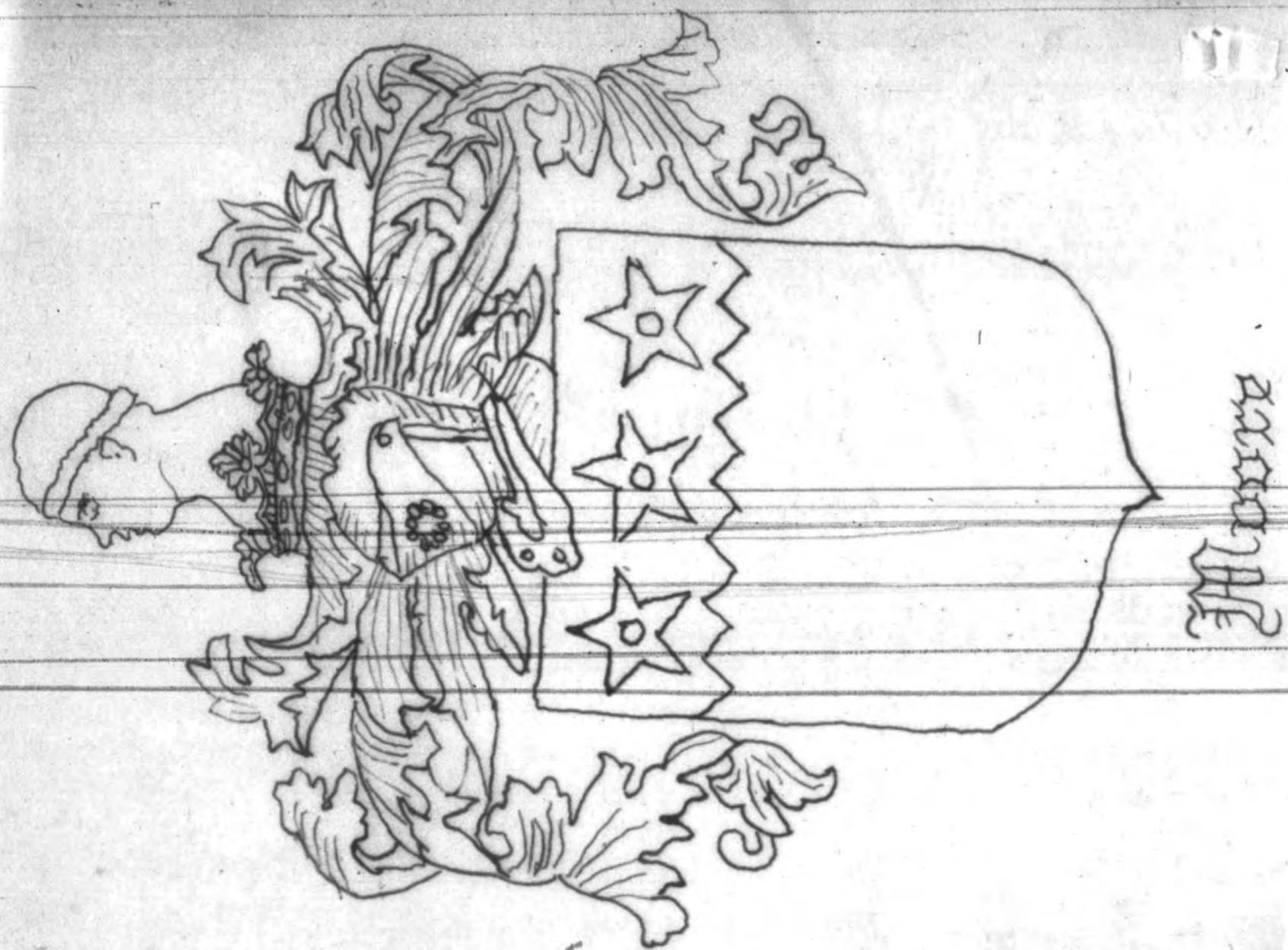

- I "Pioneers of Old Hopewell" by Ralph Edge: the first record of the Howell name is Howel Dda or Howel the Good who flourished A.D. 900-950. It is a Welch tradition of many generations that "Howel Dda" loved peace, feared God & governed conscientiously. See also the Genealogy of Reading, Howell & other families published by Prof. J.G. Leach L.L.D. in 1898. The Howells of Westbury, Marsh Gibbon, County of Bucks, England, descend from Howel, the prince of Caerleon-upon-Uske, in Monmouthshire, England, whose coat-of-arms they bore.
- II William Howell of Wedon, Waygate, is descended of the said prince. He died in Nov. 1557, leaving wife Anne & children: John, Henry, Jacob, Isabell, Jane, Cecil, Agnes, Anne, Joane & Alice. Leaving legacies to his family he also included the poor of six neighboring parishes & to his own church at Hardwick where he requested burial in the chancel before the high altar.
- III Henry Howell lived at the Manor of Westbury (bought by his father William in 1536) but when he died July 7 1625, his son Edward got it, signing "Gent" after his name at Greveill-thorpe, County York, Eng. on June 8 1639, when it was sold.
- IV Edward Howell's first wife was Frances ---- (she died before he left England) his second was _____ (a daughter of Edward Bryan of Connecticut, America, coming to America about 1639, Edward located at Lynn, Mass., where he held 500 acres, but removed to Southampton, L.I. in 1640, where he was one of her founders, & a member of the Governor's Council of Conn. from 1647-1655. Dying in 1655
- V His daughter Margaret, born at Marsh Gibbon, England, where she was baptized Nov. 24 1622 (supposedly her date of birth). She became the wife of Rev. John Moore (over for this). Her brother, John, two years younger, died at Southampton, L.I. in 1696 & upon his tombstone is cut "The Howel". (See Howells of Southampton & Colonial Records of Connecticut).

Rev. John Moore (Colonial Service)

From "Annals of Newton (Elmhurst) Long Island also Southampton L.I. records, Rev. John Moore was born in Kent, England, came to America on the good ship "Defiance" resided awhile in New York. The first record of him on Long Island was in 1641. In Oct. 1644, he was appointed deputy to negotiate the terms of union with the New England colonies, & in the same month appointed to collect subscriptions for the scholars of Harvard College.

Licensed to preach prior to 1649, he was preaching at Southampton in that year, became the second pastor of the church at Hempstead, L.I. & records show that he was the first pastor of the Presbyterian Church at Newton, L.I. in 1652 & he died while in service on Sept. 17 1657. Either prior or just after reaching America, he was married to Margaret, the daughter of Edward Howell of Wedon, Bucks Co., England, (of the noted English family from which all of that name in America descend, & can be traced back 1000 years.)

Rev. John Moore & wife Margaret had at least five children: John, Gershom, Joseph, Samuel, & Elizabeth--the last named became the wife of Capt. Content Titus of Newton L.I.

The above mentioned son, Captain Samuel Moore, was born in 1645 at Newton, L.I. also died there 1717. Granted land there Dec. 4 1666, he was elected a freeholder & served constantly for the next thirty years holding many offices of trust & responsibility.

On Oct. 3 1662, he with others, bought Plummers Neck, near Jamaica, L.I., from the Indian chiefs Womalupa, Wonoze & Powatahuma. He married Mary, (the daughter of Thomas Reed who built the home & church of Rev. John Moore in 1655) by whom had; Samuel, Joseph, Benjamin, Nathaniel, Mary, Elizabeth & Sarah. (See Pioneers of Old Hopewell, by Edge).
