Book 23 page 260: On April 6 1822, Willie Jones--no wife signs--lets John Sheek--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 74 1/4 acres on main Yadkin River on the water edge next ---Atcherson & ---Ward, for \$900.00, witnessed by George C. Bromel & James Thomas & proved by the latter in Nov. 1825.

George Savits signs the marriage bonds of; Mary Savits to Henry Bullinger on Dec. 20 1778; Catey Savits to Jacob Bullinger on June 15 1784;

Henry Bear signs like a German. This deed refers to page 842--one from Jacob Waggoner Sr. to Jacob Waggoner Jr.

Book 11 page 845: On Jan 26 1790, Andrew Bostian (a farmer) lets Henry Bear have 199 acres on the east side of Cold Water Creek next Charles Wood & John Campbell, for 30 pounds, witnessed by ? & John Brandon in Feb. term of 1790. (This refers to page 842 --a deed from Jacob Waggoner Sr. to Jacob Waggoner Jr.).

Feb. 7 1777: Deed from George Sevits & wife Rosanna to Daniel Boger for 335 acres May 18 1774 proved by Matthew Lock.

Feb. 7 1777: Deed from Daniel Boger to John Apple for 335 acres May.18 1774 proved by Matthew Lock.  
Marriage bond: Mary Boger to Matthias Barringer Sept.13 1794 signed Daniel? Boger? (in German?)

Book 12 page 87: On Sept. 26 1786, Robert Bell lets Absolam Baker have 200 acres of land on Coldwater & Buffalo Creeks next James Brown & James Huit for 100 pounds, witnessed by James Brandon & John Brevard in Aug. term of 1790.

Book 24 page 527: On Feb. 10 1818, George Sefred lets John Sloop have 35 acres on Cold Water Creek next John Patterson, John Correll & John Sloop, for \$125.00, witnessed by William Miller ( a tanner) & Andrew Bostian in Feb. court of 1818. (This was originally granted by the State to Robert Bell & was next Jacob Correll, ----Nixon & ---Phifer).

May 6 1772: "Hugh Lynn Appointed Oversear of the Road from John Graham to the County Line of the Road, Leading to John Fifers".

Book 9 page 19: On Nov. 13 1778 ? George Sevitz Jr. & wife Katerin let George Sevitz Sr. have 179 acres on McCutcheons Creek of Cold Water next Samuel Cochran, for 700 pounds. This was conveyed by lease & release from Robert Rodgers on April 7 1774 & he got it from Thos. Lytte on Jan. 25 1766

Gheen, ---Overman, crossing Deals Creek twice, Lewis Jacobs, Andrew Shuping & ---Kincaid; also 110 a (being lot #1 in tract of Thomas Gheen) but does not include the acre conveyed to the school-house, on Deals Creek, for \$700.00, acknowledged on the next day. (This is part of the land which Obadiah Woodson let J.B. Sheets have--see book 48 page 630--& was mortgaged by said Sheets on Oct. 24 1865 to the said Johnston--see book 2 page 448).

Book 48 page 65: July 6 1872, William E. Dunham & wife Susan A., let Junius B. Sheets--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 164 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres next George H. Gheen, lot #1, ---Overman, Louis Jacobs, crossing Deals Creek & Andrew Shuping, for \$600.00, acknowledged on the same day.

Book 48 page 63: Nov. 8 1871, Obadiah Woodson & wife A. Maria let J.B. Sheets--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 110 acres (being lot #1) but subject to the dower of Margaret Gheen for life, on Deals Creek next D.J. Sheets, ---Kincaid, Joseph Gheen, George H. Gheen & lot #2 (also excepting the acre which Thomas Gheen let the school-house committee have on Oct. 20 1847), for \$350.00, acknowledged on the same day.

Book 72 page 76: May 10 1888, J.B.Sheets (as the trustee of H.A.Kanup & Crissy Canup who mortgaged this to him on Feb.2 1886 for \$320.37--see book 3 page 36--& failed to pay so he sold it on May 5 1888) lets D.M.Miller have 26 acres next ---Sheets & the dower-lot (but excepts 1 acre which Thomas Gheen let the school committee have) for \$130.00

Book 68 page 532: Dec. 5 1744. J.B.Sheets & wife Louisa let Henry Knup--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 26 acres beginning on the corner of --- Sheet & going south  $87\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 16.40 chains to a pine knot. south  $1\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 15.85 chains to a stake on the dower-lot, north  $87\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 14.40 chains to a stake on the line & corner of the dowerlot. north  $1\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 15.85 chains to the beginning (but excepts the acre which Thomas Gheen conveyed to the schoolhouse location in the School District #19 on Oct. 20 1847, acknowledged by them Dec. 5 1874.

Book 24 page 133: On April 13 1825, Tobias Klutts, of Cabarrus Co. N.C., lets Samuel, Jacob, Peggy & Elizabeth Klutts (heirs of Jacob Klutts), have 361 acres in Rowan Co. on Irish Buffelow & Grants Creeks for \$300.00 witnessed by P. Barringer & J.H. Brandon in May term of 1817 & acknowledged by Tobias Klutts. This land is on both sides of the main road leading from Salisbury to Baties Ford on the Catawba, next that of John Sevitz (belonging to George Savits in 1815), Conrad Sloop, John Semianer, John Albright (belonging to Geo. Smith in 1815), Wm. Brown (belonging to Jacob Freeze) & what was Benjamin Baker.
